BANK DEBITS

Bank debits for the week ending February 21 totaled \$9,993,000,000 compared with \$8,347,000,000 for the preceding week, which included Lincoln's birthday and in most districts was composed of only five business days. Larger figures are shown for practically all the more important financial centers, New York City alone reporting an increase of \$984,000,000, or nearly 60 per cent of the total increase for the week.

Last year February 22, Washington's birthday, fell on Wednesday and the report week ended Tuesday, February 21, the week thus being composed of only five business days. Accordingly, total debits for the report week this year are about 35 per cent larger than for the corresponding week in 1922. About the same rate of increase is shown for New York City, while more than average rates of increase over last year's level are reported for Buffalo, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, Detroit, St. Louis, Kansas City and Los Angeles.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in 243 centers, of which 229 are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
