BANK DEBITS

Bank debits for the week ending July 11 totaled \$9,782,000,000, or about 3 per cent below the total of \$10,089,000,000 for the preceding week, with its large volume of end-of-month and end-of-fiscal-year settlements. The decline for the week was most notable in New York City and Boston, both of which report reductions of about 9 per cent from the previous week's totals. Smaller totals are also shown for Philadelphia, Newark, Pittsburgh, Richmond, Washington and Chicago.

As compared with the week ending July 12 of last year total debits for the week under review show an increase of \$615,000,000, or 6.7 per cent. Increases over last year's figures are reported for all important centers, except New York City. Los Angeles reports an increase over the corresponding 1922 total of over 46 per cent, Pittsburgh - an increase of 28 per cent, Cincinnati - an increase of 22 per cent, and Boston - an increase of about 15 per cent. For New York City the decrease, as compared with last year's total was \$117,000,000, or about 2.5 per cent.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in 250 centers, of which 246 are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
