There is in the library at the Federal Reserve Board a substantial number ^{of items} perhaps fifteen cards, listing material which Mr. Miller left. This includes speeches and some published material. We should have a record of that. Mr. Miller's widow still lives but is not well and should not be approached. Her address is 2230 S Street, N. W.; the telephone there is North 7-8433. I talked with Mrs. Miller over the telephone but found that she was in that unfortunate state of one who cannot focus on things she has known very well. I am told that a former secretary of Dr. Miller, Mr. Louis G. Ficks would know where his papers are. His address is c/o Miss Elizabeth Hess at 3306 Fessenden Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.; the telephone is EMerson 2-6166. Mr. Ficks is at present in the hospital and I could therefore not call him. This is said to be only a temporary illness and he should be written to very shortly.

Dr. Miller was on the Planning Committee of the present board building; he was also on the Board of the Library of Congress. His interest in libraries led him to plan the building with a special library for the Board of Governors, but that is at present used only as a subsidiary library. The great majority of Board material is centralized in the Board's library.
