

SUMMARY OF COSTS OF UNITED STATES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM  
TO GREECE AND TURKEY UNTIL JUNE 30, 1946.

1. Greece.

On the basis of present information, the cost to the United States of military and civilian assistance required to assure stability and tranquility in Greece would be \$254 million for the remainder of fiscal year 1947 and all of fiscal year 1948. Of this sum \$154 million is for military supplies which Greece needs from abroad; the remainder consists of \$20 million for relief and \$80 million for rehabilitation and reconstruction. The total of \$254 million does not include an amount of approximately \$50 million which it is hoped will become available in 1947 from the Post-UNRRA appropriation request now before Congress. These figures are itemized on the attached sheet.

2. TURKEY

Turkey does not need assistance for relief, rehabilitation or reconstruction. It is not believed that special appropriations should be requested to meet her substantial needs for industrial development. Turkey should first seek development credits from the International Bank and other sources. However, Turkey is in need of financial assistance to help modernize and maintain an adequate defensive force. While detailed information remains to be developed, it is probable that an adequate program would cost not more than \$150 million.
