The American people are greatly indebted to you for your courageous efforts to stop inflation by control of consumer and commercial credit, through the Federal Reserve Board.


Sen Douglas' Committee on Money, Credit and Fiscal Policies, fortunately accepted your viewpoint, as sound statesmanship.
