Elliot rules that power to purchase acceptances under Sec. 14
is limited to import and export acceptances. 197

C.S.H. says under Warburg's views, state banks and private bankers would have a right to discount acceptances when indorsed by member bank, as discounts under sec. 13 are a matter of right. 198

Warburg believes state banks and private bankers can discount acceptances under Sec. 13 as a regular operation. 198 warburg originally limited purchases under Sec. 14 to acceptances indorsed by member banks. 199

Gov. Strong protested. 199

Warburg then broadened the power. 199

Federal Advisory Council advised that the purchase of state bank and private bankers acceptances should be limited to acceptances indorsed by member banks. 199

Warburg finally compromised by including Sec. 13 and 14 together but with a somewhat narrower construction. 199

C.S.H. and Willis accept this on condition that it be stated that the spirit of the F.R. Act limits purchases of acceptances to (a) member banks acceptances, or (b) to acceptances indorsed by member banks. 199

C.S.H. claimed that some limit, basedon a fixed percentage of net assets, should be imposed on purchase of acceptances of state banks or private bankers not indorsed by a member bank. 199

Warburg opposed this. 199
