TIME LIMIT ON TELEGRAPHIC TRANSFERS.

TO THE CASHIER:

In order to enable us to transfer funds each day by telegraph for member banks to other Federal reserve districts, in time for the transactions to be completed on the same day at the other end by the various Federal reserve banks and their branches, banks in this district desiring to make such telegraphic transfers should arrange to have their instructions reach this bank as indicated in the following schedule:

District No. 9—Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis.....	3:00 p. m.
