New Counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve Note

*To all Banks, Trust Companies and Savings Banks
in the Second Federal Reserve District:*

The Treasury Department in its circular letter No. 520 describes a new counterfeit \$10 Federal Reserve note as follows:

“On the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City, Mo., check letter D; plate number indistinct; D. F. Houston, Secretary of the Treasury; John Burke, Treasurer of the United States; portrait of Jackson.

“This counterfeit is apparently printed from very crudely etched plates on two pieces of paper, between which a few silk threads have been distributed. The number of the specimen at hand is J9160574A. The counterfeit is so poor that it should be immediately detected by anyone accustomed to handling money.”
