Consumer Price Movements

June 1983

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.3 percent before seasonal adjustment in June. The June level of 298.1 (1967=100) was 2.6 percent higher than the index in June 1982.

The Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) also rose 0.3 percent in June, prior to seasonal adjustment, to a level of 297.2 (1967=100). For the 12-month period ended in June, the CPI-W has increased 2.4 percent. The CPI-W is used for indexing Social Security and some other Federal payments. It is also commonly used as an escalator in collective bargaining agreements.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers rose 0.2 percent in June. This advance follows increases of 0.6 and 0.5 percent in April and May, respectively, and is the same as the average monthly increase for the 12-month period ended in June. The slowdown from May was largely attributable to a moderation in the rise in energy costs and a drop in food prices. Gasoline prices, which had risen sharply in both April and May, rose moderately in June. The drop in the food index was due largely to lower prices for beef, pork, and fresh vegetables.

During the first 6 months of 1983, the CPI-U increased at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 2.9 percent. During the first quarter prices rose at an annual rate of only 0.4 percent, while in the second they rose

at a 5.4 percent rate. The sharp reversal in energy costs, which had declined in the first 3 months, was largely responsible for the second quarter acceleration. The transportation component rose at a 11.7 percent annual rate in the second quarter, reflecting the sharp increase in gasoline prices (including an additional 5 cent a gallon excise tax), following a 8.9 percent rate of decline in the first. A reversal in household fuel prices coupled with a somewhat faster advance in shelter costs was responsible for the acceleration in the housing component. The apparel and upkeep component also registered a modest acceleration in the second quarter. On the other hand, the food, medical care, entertainment, and other goods and services components all recorded smaller increases in the second quarter.

The transportation component advanced 0.4 percent in June, following sharp increases in each of the preceding 2 months. The moderation was attributable to the slowdown in gasoline prices, which advanced 0.7 percent in June after increasing a total of 8.3 percent in April and May. As of June, gasoline prices were 9.8 percent below their peak level of March 1981. On the other hand, prices for used cars rose sharply for the second consecutive month. The indexes for new cars and public transportation, which had declined in May, rose 0.1 and 0.6 percent respectively. Automobile finance charges continued to decline, but by somewhat less than in recent months.

The food and beverage component registered a decline of 0.3 percent in June, following an increase of

0.3 percent in May. Grocery store food prices declined 0.6 percent, largely as a result of decreases in the indexes for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs and fruits and vegetables. The June drop in both beef and pork prices brought their levels below that of a year ago. Despite an increase this June, poultry prices were also lower than in June 1982. The June decline brought the index for fruits and vegetables to a point below its year-earlier level, despite the substantial increases recorded in each of the previous 3 months. Among the other major grocery store food groups, the dairy products and the other food at home components also declined in June while the index for cereal and bakery products registered a small increase. Restaurant meals and alcoholic beverages rose 0.3 and 0.4 percent, respectively.

The housing component rose 0.2 percent in June, following an increase of 0.3 percent in May. The index for fuel and other utilities was unchanged in June. Moderate increases in charges for electricity and telephone services were offset by decreases in fuel oil prices and charges for natural gas. The June decline in the index for natural gas follows a 21 month period during which it rose at an annual rate of 22.5 percent. Shelter costs increased 0.3 percent, the same as in May. Within the shelter component, homeowners' costs rose 0.2 percent, renters' costs increased 0.3 percent, and the index for maintenance and repairs, which pertains to both renters and homeowners, increased 0.2 percent. The index for household furnishings and operations increased 0.1 percent.

The June increase of 0.5 percent in the medical care component was about the same as in each of the previous 3 months. The index for medical care commodities, which includes prescription and non-prescription drugs and medical supplies, increased 0.3 percent. Within medical care services, charges for professional services and hospital rooms rose 0.7 and 0.4 percent, respectively.

The index for apparel and upkeep advanced 0.4 percent in June, following an increase of 0.7 percent in

May. The entertainment index rose 0.4 percent and the other goods and services component registered a 0.6 percent increase.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers rose 0.2 percent in June, following a 0.4 percent increase in May. The slowdown from May was largely due to the sharp deceleration in the transportation component—primarily as a result of a much smaller increase in gasoline prices—and the decline in food prices.

The 0.2 percent rise in the CPI-W was the same as in the CPI-U. The CPI-U uses a new rental equivalence measure, which rose 0.2 percent in June, to measure shelter costs of homeowners. Homeownership in the CPI-W, which uses house prices, mortgage interest rates, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair costs, rose 0.1 percent in June. Increases in mortgage interest rates—the first since August 1982—property insurance, property taxes, and maintenance and repair costs offset a small decline in house prices.

Announcement to Users: Homeownership changes

Effective with release of the index for January 1983, the Bureau of Labor Statistics changed the way homeowner costs are measured in the CPI-U to rental equivalence. The rental equivalence approach calculates homeowner costs of the shelter based on the implicit rent owners would have to pay to rent the homes they own. The old method calculated homeowner costs as home purchase, mortgage interest costs, property taxes, property insurance and maintenance and repair.

As previously announced, the CPI-W will be changed to rental equivalence effective with data for January 1985. The CPI experimental measures, known as the

CPI-U, X-1 through CPI-U, X-5 are no longer being published.

The new homeowners' cost component has been introduced into the CPI-U in such a manner that the indexes using the old and new methodologies are equal in the so-called link month—December 1982. A similar technique will be employed for the CPI-W in December 1984. This technical procedure has been used in previous revisions of the CPI. In accordance with historical practice, BLS will make available to users, for a 6-month overlap period, calculations based on the old method of homeownership. In the case of the CPI-U, the overlap period will run from January to June 1983; for the CPI-W, the overlap period will run from January to June 1985.

The new homeowners' cost component is similar to the one used in the CPI-U, X-1, with 4 important refinements. First, BLS has calculated a set of owner weights for the individual units in the CPI rent sample. These new weights make the rent sample represent owner occupied housing and permit the calculation of a rent change estimate for homeowners.

Second, the Bureau has augmented the rent sample in order to enhance the rental equivalence measure. This new sampling is concentrated in areas where the housing is predominantly owner-occupied in order to

increase the proportion of rental units that have characteristics similar to owner-occupied units.

Third, the expenditure weight for rental equivalence, which for the experimental index, X-1, was calculated by means of a short-cut method, has been recalculated using the complex statistical estimating procedure used for weights in the official CPI. In addition, the weights associated with other homeowner expenditures for such things as insurance, appliances, and maintenance and repairs have been modified to be consistent with the rental equivalence concept. This enhancement has improved the quality of the national CPI's rental equivalence weight and provides weights for computation of local area CPI-U's using the rental equivalence approach.

Finally, the computer system which produces the CPI each month has been expanded to accommodate the calculation, with complete item and geographic detail, and with proper geographic weighting for the rental equivalence approach. BLS will continue to work on other refinements in the statistical estimating techniques used in the rental equivalence measure. See tables C and D for a description of changes in the index structure. 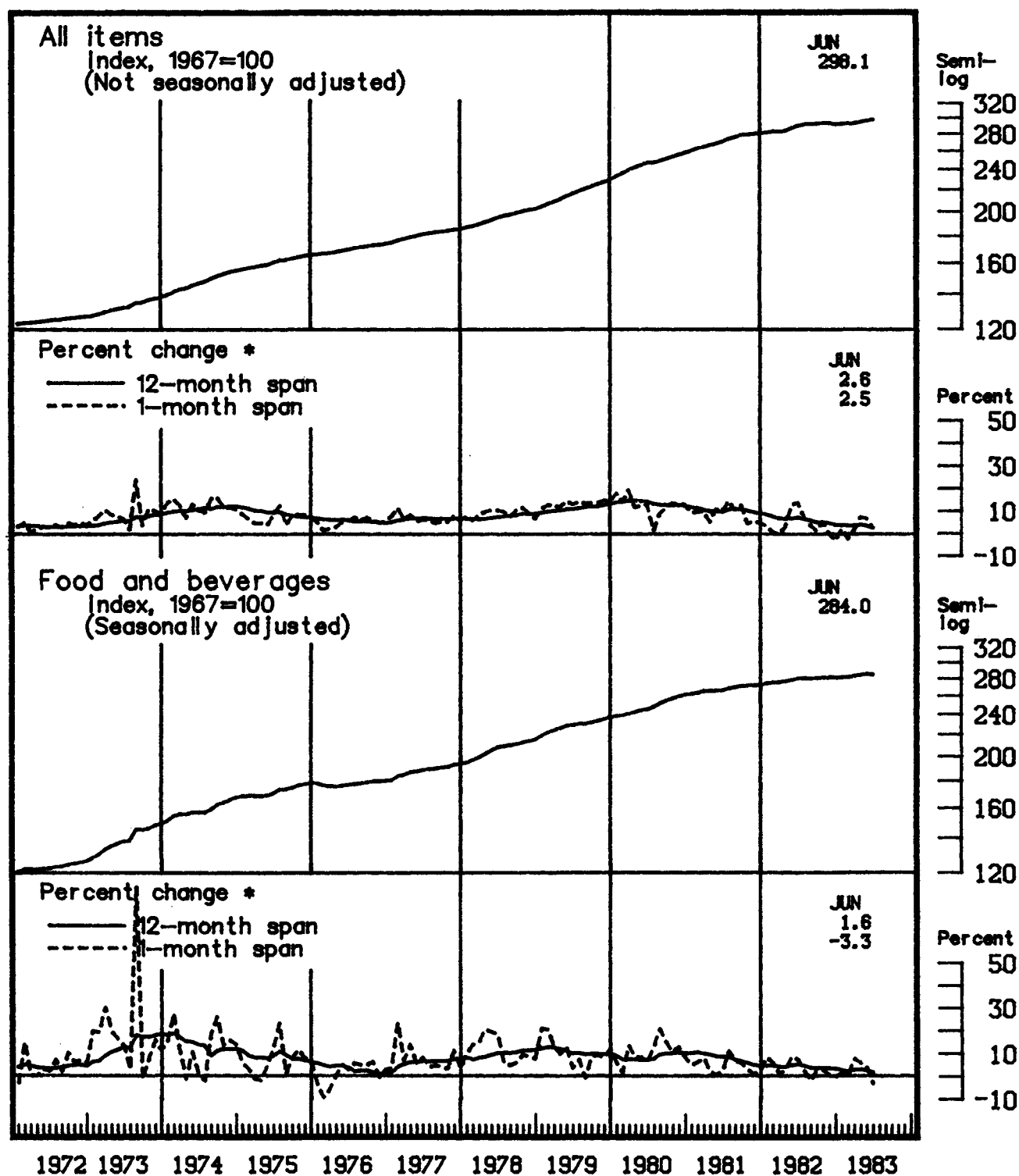

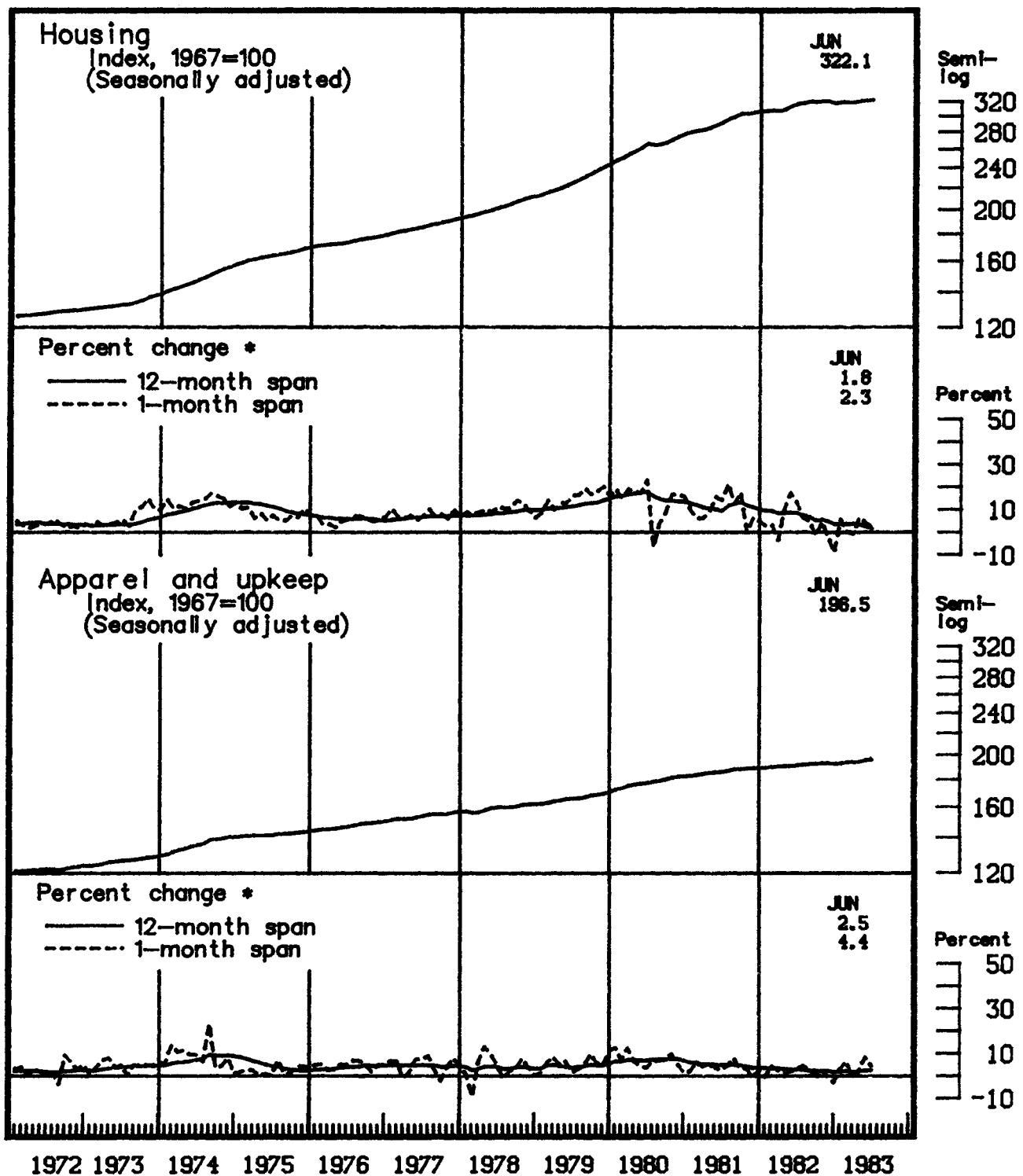

Chart 1. CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1972-83



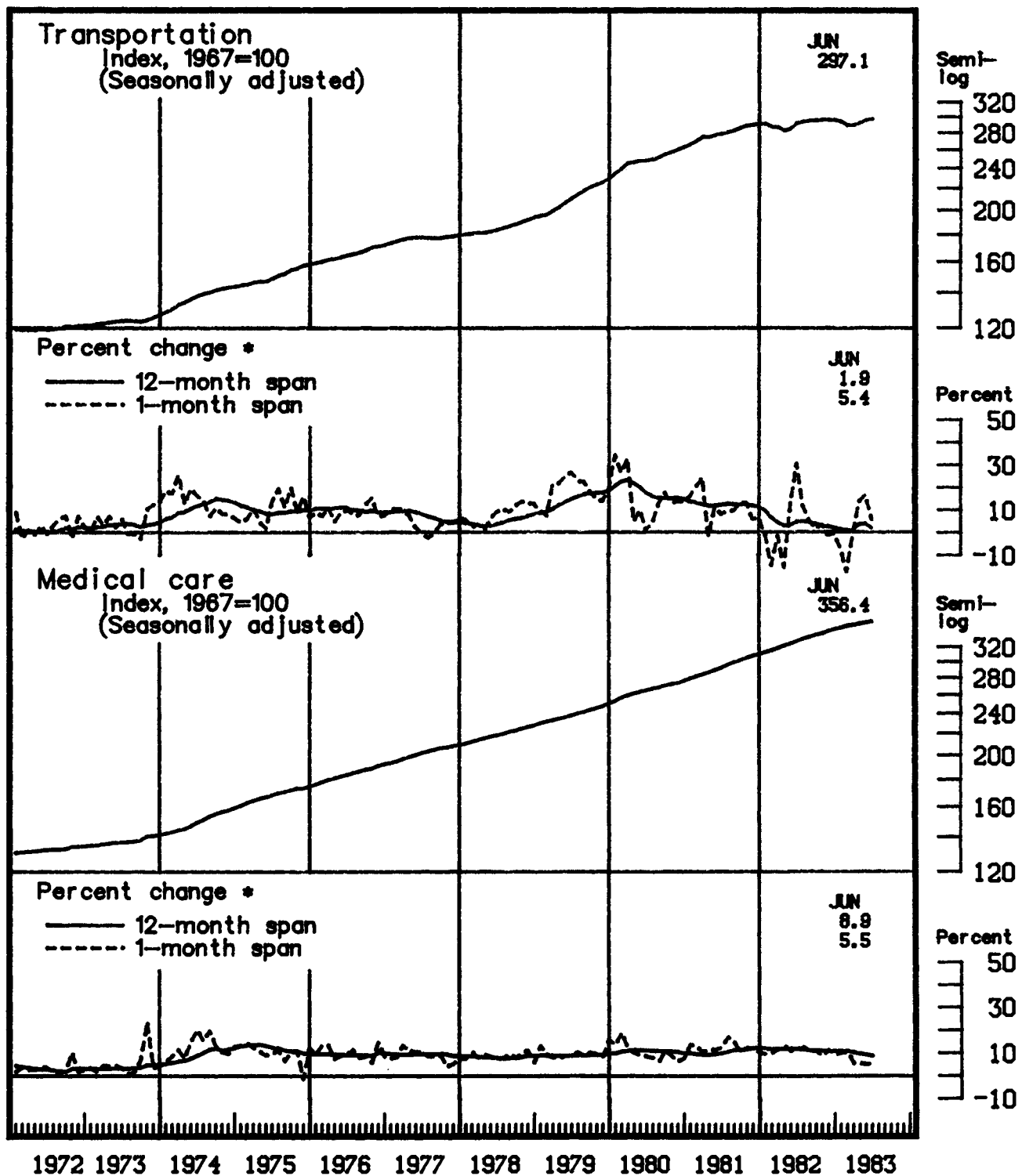

Chart 2. CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1972-83



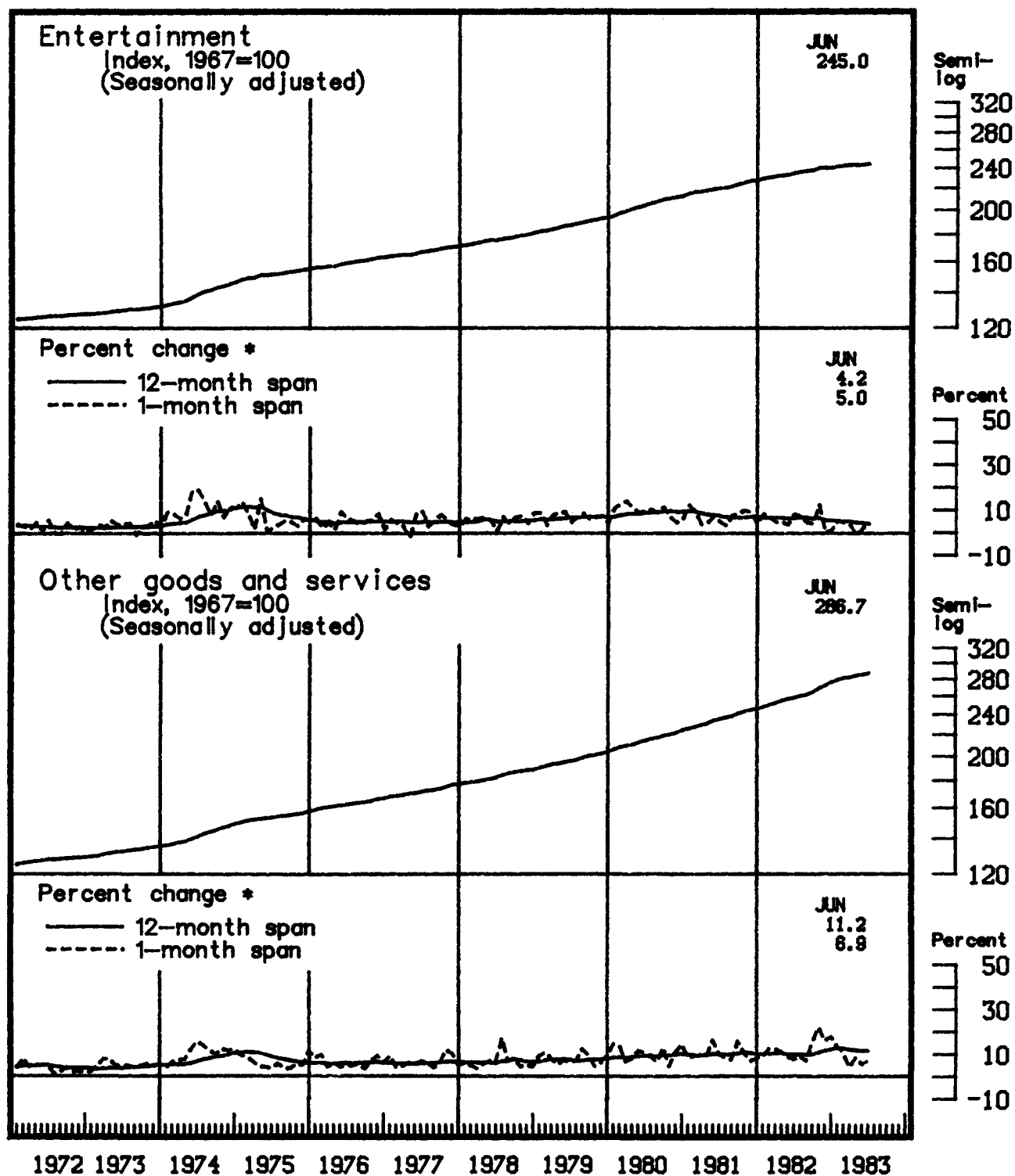

NOTE: Local area CPI indexes are by-products of the national CPI program. Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

NOTE: Local area CPI indexes are by-products of the national CPI program. Because each local index is a small subset of the national index, it has a smaller sample size and is, therefore, subject to substantially more sampling and other measurement error than the national index. As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar.

Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

As a result, local area indexes show greater volatility than the national index, although their long-term trends are quite similar. Therefore, the Bureau of Labor Statistics strongly urges users to consider adopting the national average CPI for use in escalator clauses.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. Effective with the January 1978 index, the Bureau of Labor Statistics began publishing CPI's for two population groups: (1) a new CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a revised CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups which historically have been excluded from CPI coverage, such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 18,000 tenants, 18,000 housing units for property taxes, and about 24,000 establishments—grocery and department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities; they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 122 percent, for example, is shown as 222.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$22.20.

A Note About Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

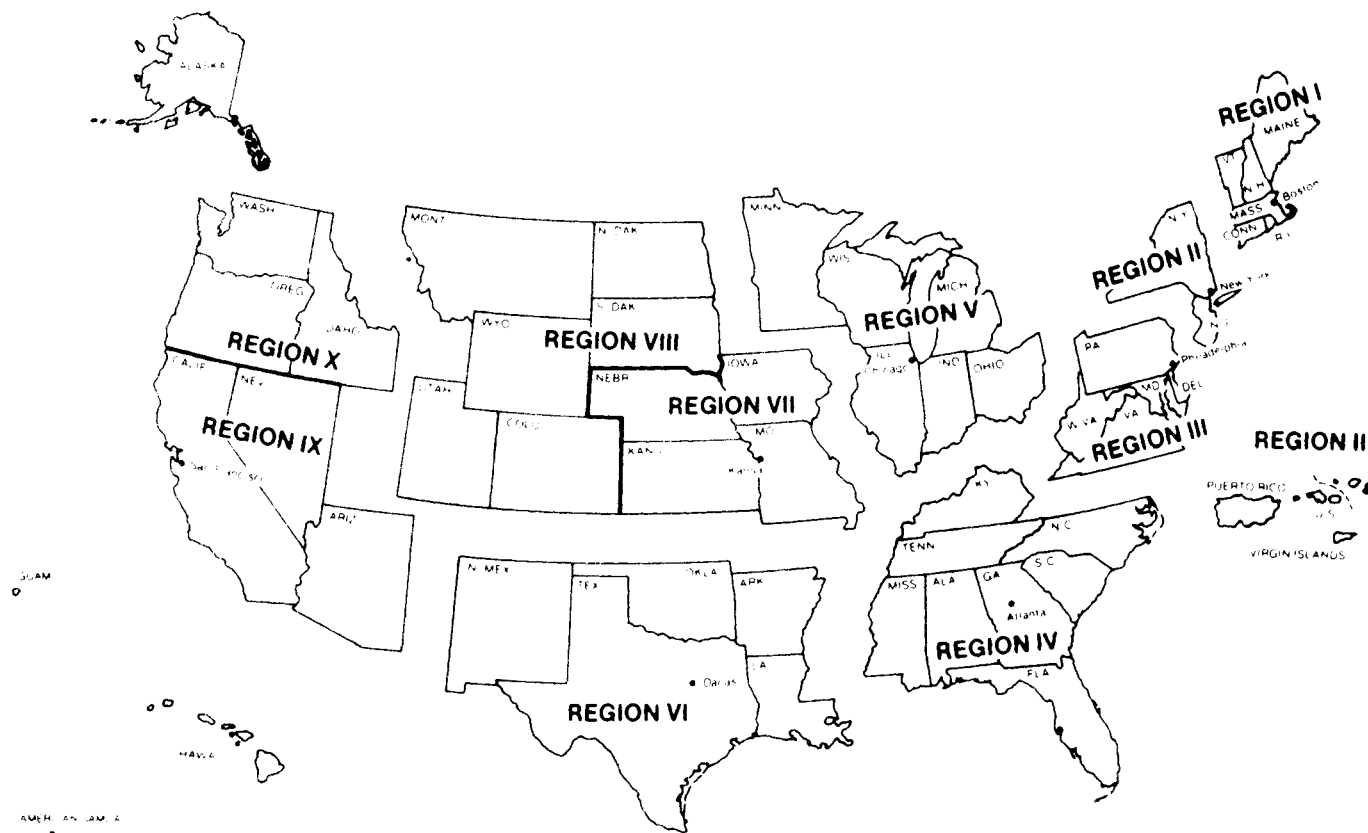
The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data are also used extensively for escalation

purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used to compute the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11 Variant of the Census Method II Seasonal Adjustment Program. Annual updates replace 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1977 through 1981 were replaced at the end of 1981. The seasonal movement of all items and 35 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 45 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 45 selected components changes its seasonal status, seasonal data from 1967 forward for the all-items and for any of the 35 other aggregations that have that series as a component, are replaced.

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
