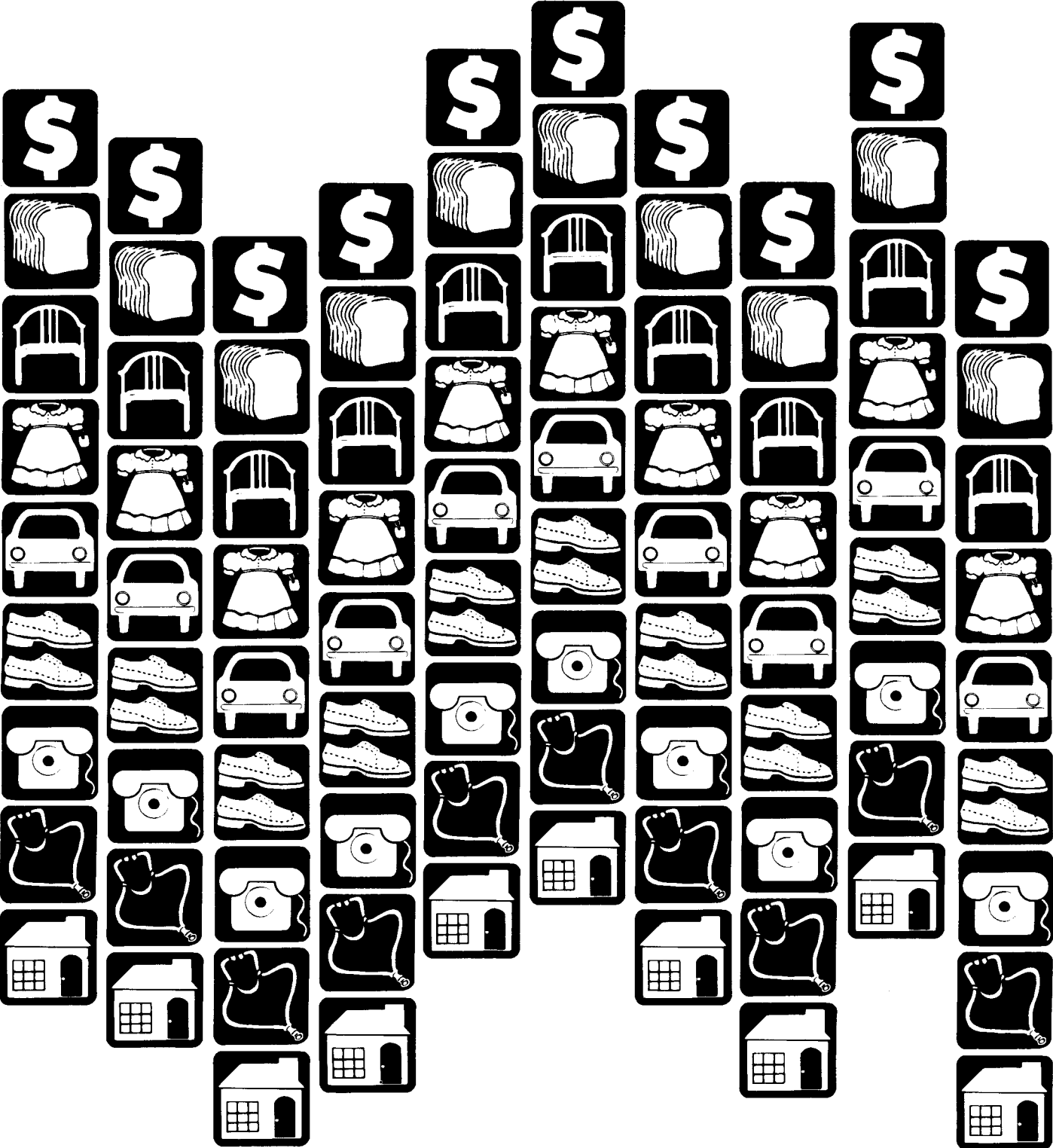

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The CPI Detailed Report is a monthly report on consumer price movements, including statistical tables and technical notes. The report covers two indexes, the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) and the Consumer Price Index for Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). The indexes reflect data for the U.S. city average and selected areas.

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CPI Detailed Report

Data for December 1982

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Price Movements

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) declined 0.4 percent in December before seasonal adjustment. Prior to seasonal adjustment, the All Items experimental measure using a rental equivalence approach (CPI-U, X-1) advanced 0.1 percent, and the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) declined 0.4 percent. On a 1967=100 basis, the CPI-U declined to a level of 292.4, and the CPI-W to 292.0, while the CPI-U, X-1 rose to 268.6. Compared with their levels in December 1981, both the CPI-U and the CPI-W were 3.9 percent higher, and the CPI-U, X-1 was 5.0 percent higher.

CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for All Urban Consumers declined 0.3 percent, while the experimental CPI-U, X-1 advanced 0.3 percent.

The decline of 0.3 percent in the official CPI-U in December follows an increase of 0.1 percent in November and, with March 1982, was only the second decline in the seasonally adjusted index since August 1965. The decrease in the housing index, due to a sharp drop in mortgage interest rates, was primarily responsible for the decrease in the overall CPI. The food and beverage and apparel and upkeep components also registered declines, while the indexes for transportation and en-

tertainment were virtually unchanged in December. Significant increases, however, were recorded for the other goods and services and medical care components.

For the 12 months ended in December 1982, the CPI-U rose 3.9 percent; this compares with a rise of 8.9 percent in 1981. The increase in 1982 was the smallest December-to-December rise since the 3.4 percent in 1972. While the slowdown in 1982 was broadly based, it was most apparent in those components which had been largely responsible for the substantial increases in the last several years. In particular, the decline in mortgage interest costs and the moderation in energy prices accounted for about three-fourths of the overall slowdown recorded for 1982.

The housing component declined 0.8 percent in December. A 1.7 percent decline in homeownership costs was partially offset by moderate increases in the indexes for fuel and utilities, household furnishings and operations, and rent. Within homeownership, home financing costs decreased 4.6 percent, reflecting a sharp decline in mortgage interest rates and a small increase in house prices. Over the past 4 months, interest rates have dropped 10.6 percent. The rent index rose 0.3 percent, less than in recent months. The index for fuel and other utilities also moderated, registering a 0.7 percent increase. Fuel oil prices declined, following large increases in each of the 2 preceding months. The index for electricity recorded a much smaller increase than in November. Charges for natural gas, however, con-

tinued to increase sharply—up over 25 percent during the past 12 months.

The index for food and beverages registered a decline of 0.1 percent in December. Grocery store food prices—down 0.5 percent—declined for the second consecutive month, largely as a result of a decrease in the index for meats, poultry, fish, and eggs. Beef, pork, poultry, and egg prices all registered sharp declines. The index for fruits and vegetables also declined as lower prices for fresh fruits and processed fruits and vegetables were partially offset by a sharp increase in fresh vegetable prices. Other major grocery store food groups recorded only small changes in December. The two remaining components of the food and beverage index—restaurant meals and alcoholic beverages—rose 0.6 and 0.1 percent, respectively.

The transportation component was unchanged in December, following an increase of 0.3 percent in November. Increases in car prices—both new and used—were offset by decreases in gasoline prices and charges for public transportation and automobile financing. Used car prices rose 1.5 percent in December and have increased 8.5 percent over the past 6 months. New car prices, which had declined in October and November, rose 0.4 percent. On the other hand, the index for gasoline registered a decline of 0.9 percent. As of December, gasoline prices were 7.6 percent below their peak level of March 1981. Automobile finance charges—down 2.9 percent—declined for the fifth consecutive month. The index for public transportation declined 0.1 percent, the same as in November, as a decrease in airline fares offset increases in intercity bus and train fares.

The 0.7 percent advance in the medical care component in December was the smallest increase since February. The index for medical care commodities, which includes prescription and nonprescription drugs and

medical supplies, increased 0.3 percent. The index for medical care services rose 0.8 percent.

The index for apparel and upkeep declined 0.4 percent in December, following a 0.2 percent decrease in November. Apparel commodity prices declined 0.5 percent as almost all clothing items recorded declines. The index for apparel services rose 0.3 percent, the smallest increase in 10 months.

The index for other goods and services registered its fourth consecutive large monthly increase—rising 1.2 percent in December—as increases in cigarette prices again accounted for most of the advance. The index for entertainment rose 0.1 percent in December, following no change in November.

CPI-U Experimental Measure

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rent substitution (X-1) rose 0.3 percent in December. The official CPI-U declined 0.3 percent. The difference in December reflects the different treatment of homeownership costs in the two indexes. The CPI-U, X-1 uses rental charges to represent movement in shelter costs of homeowners. Rental charges increased 0.3 percent in December. The official CPI-U employs house prices, mortgage interest rates, property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repair costs. This latter measure of homeownership declined 1.7 percent in December.

For the 12 months ended in December 1982, the CPI-U, X-1 rose 5.0 percent; this compares with a rise of 8.5 percent in 1981. The official CPI-U rose 3.9 percent in 1982 and 8.9 percent in 1981. During 1982 the homeownership component for the CPI-U, X-1 rose more than the homeownership in the official CPI-U—6.6 percent versus only 1.4 percent. In contrast the official measure rose faster during 1981—10.1 percent compared with 8.5 percent for the experimental measure.

CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W)—seasonally adjusted changes

On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers declined 0.3 percent in December, following an increase of 0.1 percent in November. A decline of 0.8 percent in the housing component was largely responsible for the decrease. Declines in the food and beverage (down 0.1 percent)

and apparel and upkeep (down 0.3 percent) components also contributed to the decrease in the overall CPI. On the other hand, small increases were recorded for transportation (0.1 percent) and entertainment (0.3 percent). The medical care component advanced 0.6 percent. The index for other goods and services rose substantially—up 1.4 percent.

Homeownership Changes

As announced on October 27, 1981, the Bureau of Labor Statistics will change the way in which homeownership costs are measured in the CPI. Effective with release of data for January 1983, on February 25, the homeownership component of the official CPI-U will be a rental equivalence measure, similar to the present CPI-U, X-1 experimental measure, but with some refinements. Effective with data for January 1985, the CPI-W will be revised to a rental equivalence measure. Monthly publication of the CPI experimental alternative homeownership measures CPI-U, X-1 through CPI-U, X-5 will cease at the time the change to a rental equivalence measure is made in the official CPI-U.

The new homeownership component will be introduced into the CPI in such a manner that the indexes

using the old and new methodologies will be equal in the so-called link month—December 1982 for the CPI-U and December 1984 for the CPI-W. This technical procedure has been used in previous revisions of the CPI. In accordance with historical practice, BLS will make available to users, for a 6-month overlap period after the change in the official indexes, calculations based on the current treatment of homeownership. In the case of the CPI-U, the overlap period will run from January to June 1983; for the CPI-W, the overlap period will run from January to June 1985.

Three refinements in procedures and calculation methods now used in the current experimental measure CPI-U, X-1 will be introduced in the CPI-U beginning with data for January 1983. First, BLS is reweighting

the individual rental units in the CPI sample so that they will represent owner-occupied housing units instead of renter-occupied units. The current sample of rental units was selected, using a probability-based technique, from the renter-occupied units in selected neighborhoods in each CPI pricing area. New weights will be assigned to the housing units in the sample so that they will represent the owner-occupied housing units in their neighborhoods, CPI areas, and, ultimately, all urban places in the United States.

Second, the expenditure weight for rental equivalence, which for the experimental index, X-1, was calculated by means of a short-cut method, is being recalculated using the complex statistical estimating procedure used for weights in the official CPI. In addition, the weights associated with other homeowner expenditures for such things as insurance, appliances, and maintenance and repairs are being modified to be consistent with the rental equivalence concept. This enhancement

will improve the quality of the national CPI's rental equivalence weight and will provide weights for computation of local area CPI-U's using the rental equivalence approach.

Finally, the computer system which produces the CPI each month is being expanded to accommodate the calculation, with complete item and geographic detail, of a CPI-U, which employs the rental equivalence approach.

The Bureau is also augmenting the rent sample in order to enhance the rental equivalence measure. This new sampling will be concentrated in areas where the housing is predominantly owner-occupied in order to increase the proportion of rental units that have characteristics similar to owner-occupied units. In addition, BLS will continue to work on refinements in the statistical estimating techniques used in the rental equivalence measure.

Homeownership Costs

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has announced a plan to change the way the Consumer Price Index measures homeownership costs. Here are some questions and answers about the change.

1. Why is the change in the homeownership component being made?

The change is being made to improve the CPI. The cost of owning a home is a large part of a family's expenses. People buy houses to live in and because houses are important investments. The CPI should include the price of the shelter provided by the home but should exclude the change in the value of the house as an asset. The new approach will do that.

2. Will the change result in lower inflation figures?

There is no way of knowing whether the new measure will produce higher or lower inflation figures. In the past an experimental measure similar to the one to be adopted rose more slowly than the CPI.

3. Was politics involved in the decision to change the CPI?

The decision to change the homeownership component was made entirely on technical grounds by the Commissioner of Labor Statistics. The CPI is widely used to adjust benefits under government programs and payments under private contracts. Any change in the index naturally is of concern to those who have a stake in these payments, both as payers and recipients. Because of these concerns, decisions about CPI measurement are carefully insulated from politics.

4. How does the present CPI measure homeownership?

The present CPI reflects the cost of the purchase of a house as an asset. The index includes the net price of the house purchased, the total amount of mortgage interest contracted for over half the life of the mortgage, property taxes, insurance, and home maintenance and repairs. The current CPI represents the expenditures of only those who purchased houses in the base period,

roughly 6 percent of all consumers covered by the index. All other consumers living in their own homes are assumed to have no home purchase and mortgage interest cost at all.

5. What is wrong with the current approach?

From a practical point of view, accurate data needed to support the current approach are becoming increasingly difficult to obtain. The scarcity of long-term mortgage financing, the growth of seller financing, and the advent of variable rate mortgages have combined to make the current approach unrepresentative of the marketplace.

Furthermore, the current approach is based upon the purchase of an asset rather than the price of the shelter consumed. The index reflects shelter costs incurred only by those who purchased homes in the base period and does not cover shelter costs incurred by others who lived in homes purchased in earlier years.

6. How will the new homeownership measure differ?

A new measure of rental equivalence will be used to represent the cost of the shelter consumed by the homeowner. BLS agents will collect information on rents for housing units that are similar to those that are owned. The change in these rents will represent the change in the amount that a homeowner would have to pay each month to live in a home like the one he owns.

7. How will the change to rental equivalence affect the weight of homeownership in the CPI?

Homeownership costs make up about 25 percent of the present CPI. In an experimental rental equivalence measure produced by BLS, homeownership accounted for about 14 percent.

8. How will the rental equivalence measure differ from the CPI rent measure?

The rental equivalence measure will consist of rents for a sample of homes for which sample weights represent owned units. Thus, in each sampling area, the

housing units will represent the proportion of owner-occupied houses rather than the proportion of rental units.

9. How do other countries measure homeownership?

Most other countries use a rental equivalence approach; some measure user cost more directly; and some exclude homeownership completely from the index. The United States is the only country in the world which includes the asset value of a house in the CPI.

10. Why did BLS wait so long to make the change?

The CPI is an important statistical series which affects the incomes of a large number of people. It must have public credibility and it must be understood. The BLS raised the measurement issue publicly more than 10 years ago, published papers on the subject, calculated alternative measures, and encouraged public discussion of the issues involved. It took time for people to understand the issue.

11. Why is there so much advance notice of the change?

A major change in an important index like the CPI cannot be made without advance notice. Approximately 1 year of notice is being provided for the change in the CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), which has only existed since 1978. The CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W), however, has been used for indexation since World War I. It is used in a large number of major collective bargaining agreements, many of which last for 3 years. For this reason, longer notice is being given for the CPI-W. Thus, the CPI-U will be changed beginning with data for January 1983 and the CPI-W beginning with data for January 1985.

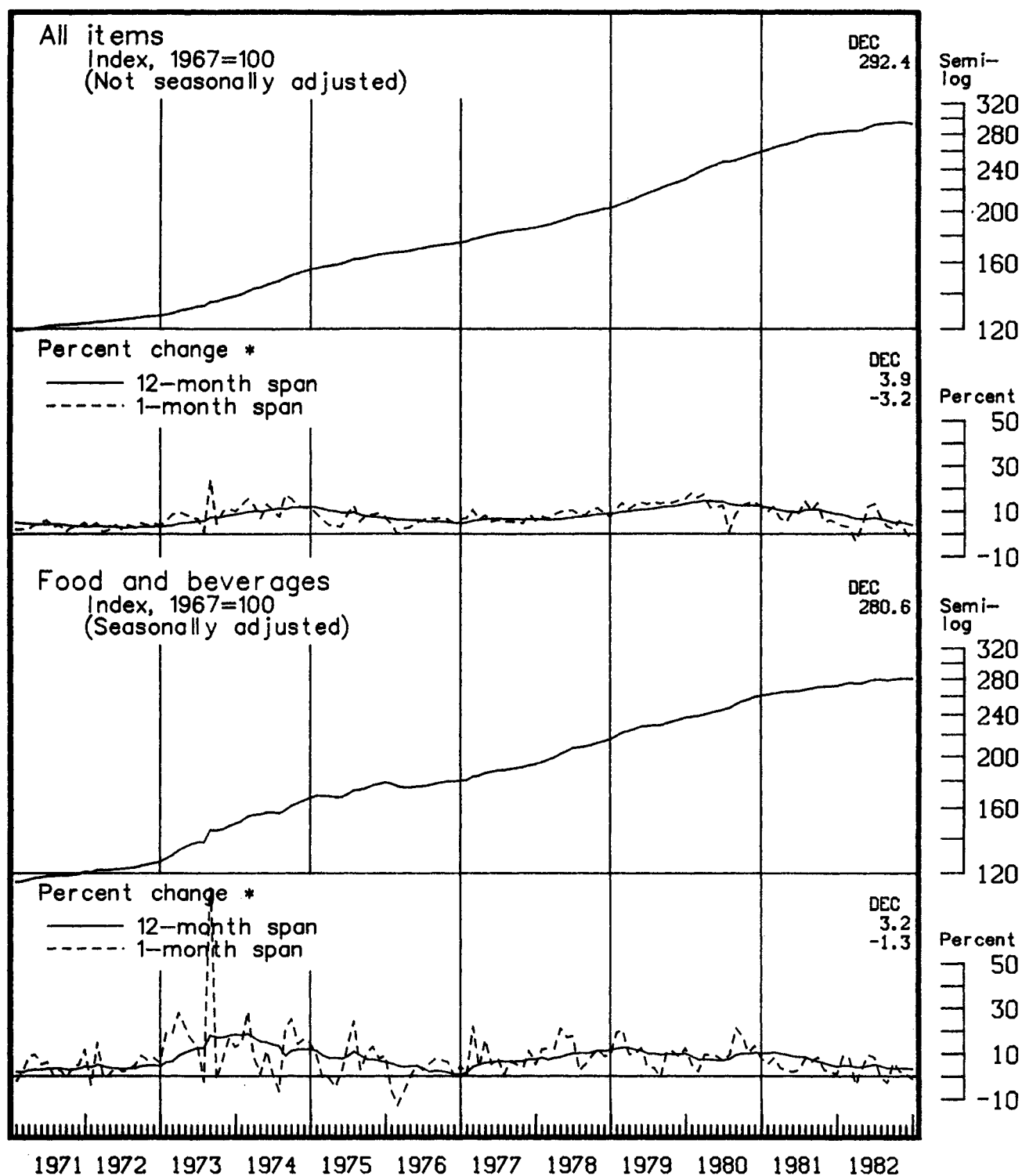
12. Where can I obtain CPI information regularly?

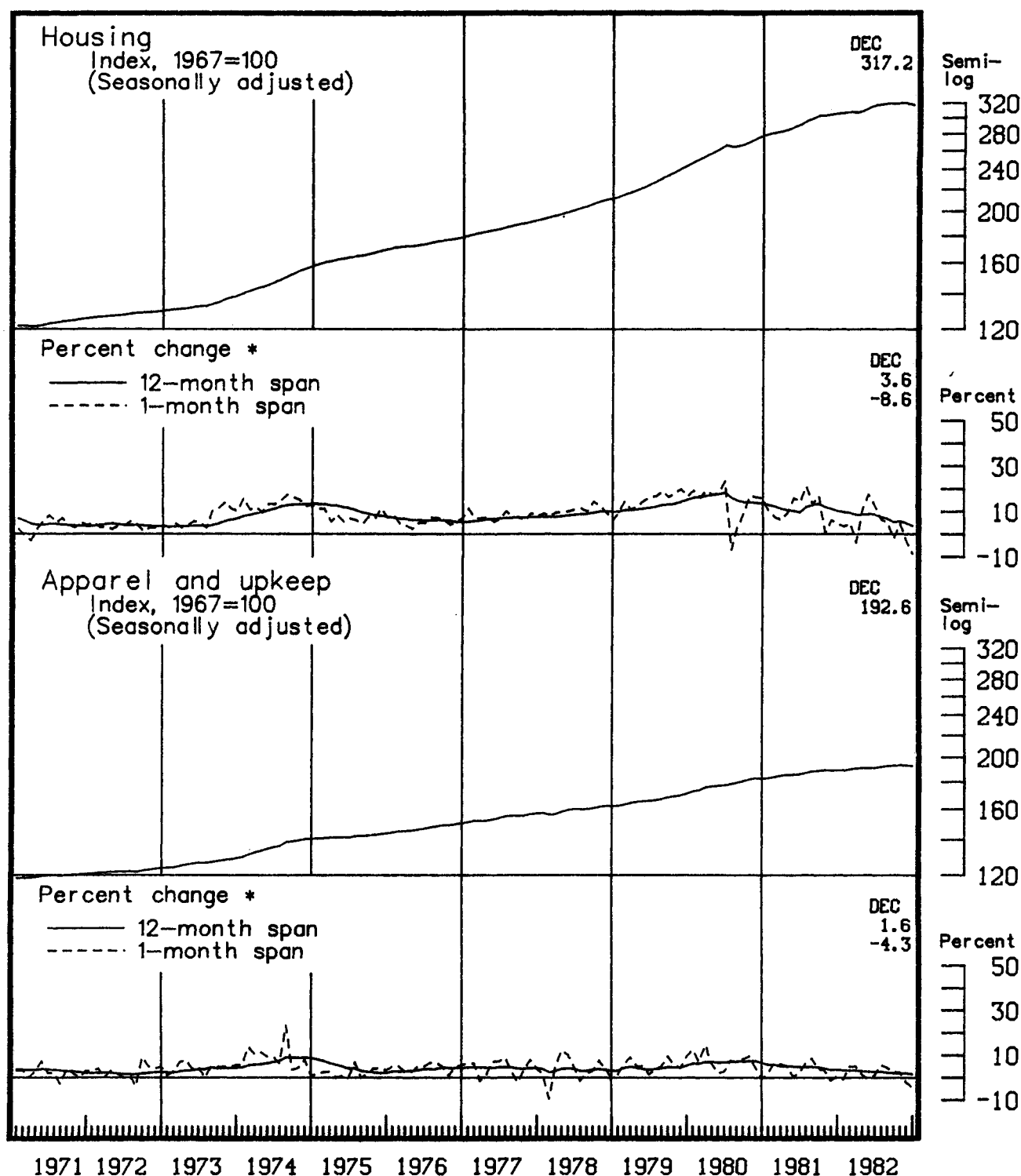

Chart 1. CPI-U: All items, food and beverages, 1971-82



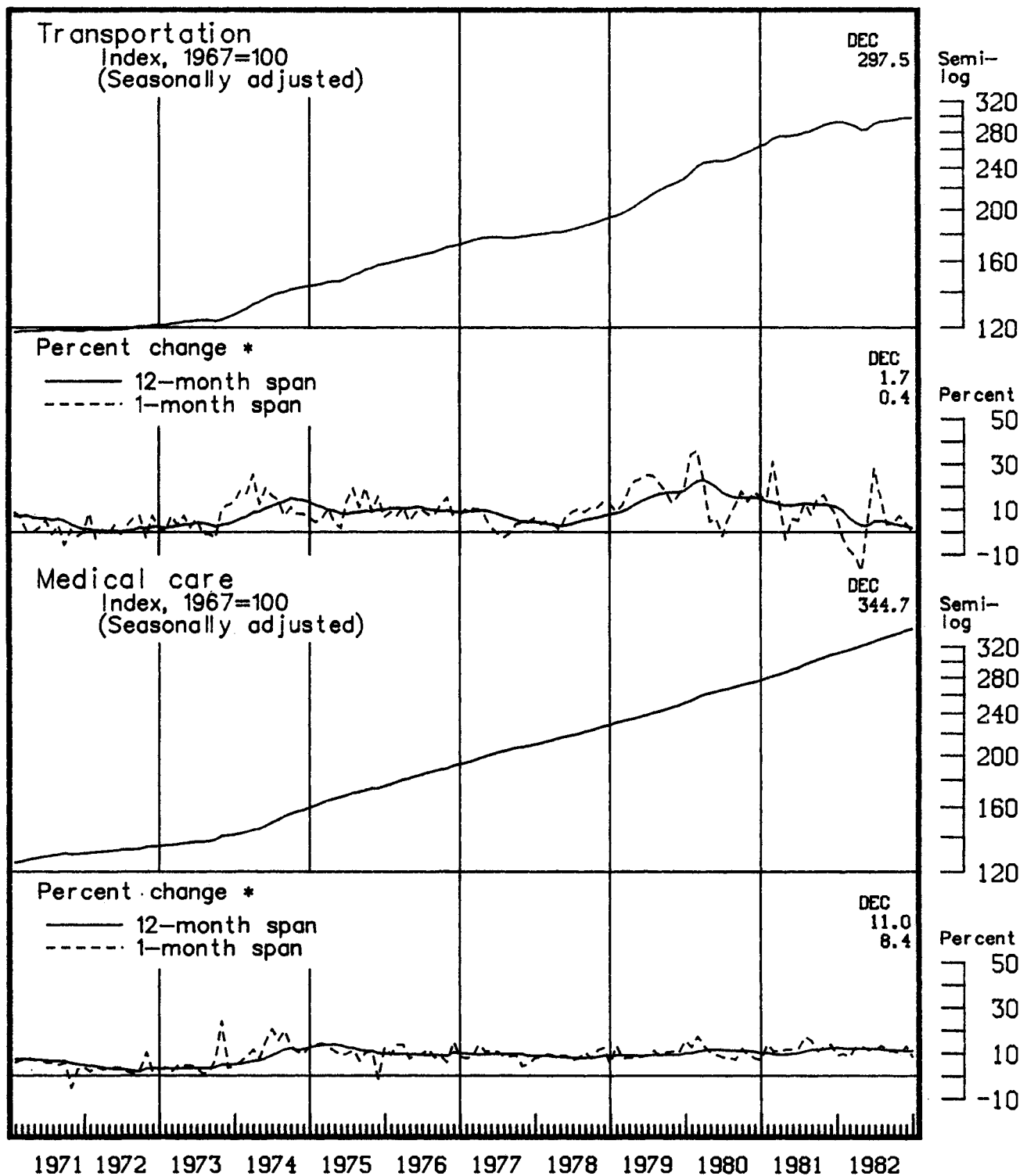
* Percent changes over 12-month spans are calculated from unadjusted data. Percent changes over 1-month spans are annual rates calculated from seasonally adjusted data.

Chart 2. CPI-U: Housing, apparel and upkeep, 1971-82



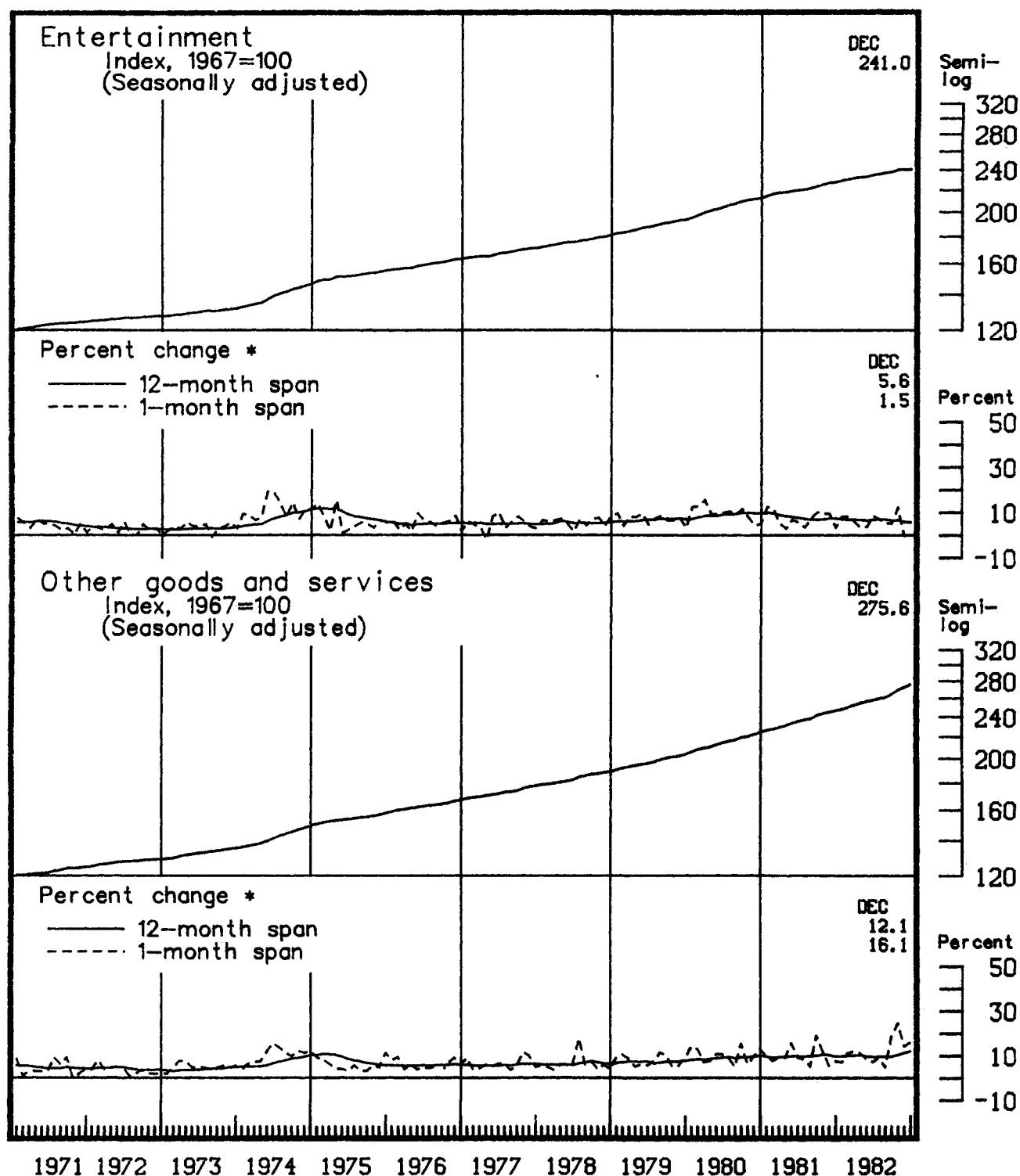
* Percent changes over 12-month spans are calculated from unadjusted data. Percent changes over 1-month spans are annual rates calculated from seasonally adjusted data.

Technical Notes

Brief Explanation of the CPI

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. Effective with the January 1978 index, the Bureau of Labor Statistics began publishing CPI's for two population groups: (1) a new CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 80 percent of the total noninstitutional civilian population; and (2) a revised CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which represents about half the population covered by the CPI-U. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups which historically have been excluded from CPI coverage, such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Prices are collected in 85 urban areas across the country from about 18,000 tenants, 18,000 housing units for property taxes, and about 24,000 establishments—grocery and department stores, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index. Prices of food, fuels, and a few other items are obtained every month in all 85 locations. Prices of most other commodities and services are collected every month in the five largest geographic areas and every other month in other areas. Prices of most goods and services are obtained by personal visits of the Bureau's trained representatives. Mail questionnaires are used to obtain public utility rates, some fuel prices, and certain other items.

In calculating the index, price changes for the various items in each location are averaged together with weights which represent their importance in the spending of the appropriate population group. Local data are then combined to obtain a U.S. city average. Separate indexes are also published by size of city, by region of the country, for cross-classifications of regions and population-size classes, and for 28 local areas. Area indexes do not measure differences in the level of prices among cities; they only measure the average change in prices for each area since the base period.

The index measures price changes from a designated reference date—1967—which equals 100.0. An increase of 122 percent, for example, is shown as 222.0. This change can also be expressed in dollars as follows: The price of a base period "market basket" of goods and services in the CPI has risen from \$10 in 1967 to \$22.20.

A Note About Calculating Index Changes

Movements of the indexes from one month to another are usually expressed as percent changes rather than changes in index points because index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period while percent changes are not. The example in the accompanying box illustrates the computation of index point and percent changes.

Percent changes for 3-month and 6-month periods are expressed as annual rates and are computed according to the standard formula for compound growth rates. These data indicate what the percent change would be if the current rate were maintained for a 12-month period.

Seasonally Adjusted and Unadjusted Data

Because price data are used for different purposes by different groups, the Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes seasonally adjusted as well as unadjusted changes each month.

For analyzing general price trends in the economy, seasonally adjusted changes are usually preferred since they eliminate the effect of changes that normally occur at the same time and in about the same magnitude every year—such as price movements resulting from changing climatic conditions, production cycles, model changeovers, holidays, and sales.

The unadjusted data are of primary interest to consumers concerned about the prices they actually pay. Unadjusted data are also used extensively for escalation purposes. Many collective bargaining contract agreements and pension plans, for example, tie compensation changes to the Consumer Price Index unadjusted for seasonal variation.

Seasonal factors used to compute the seasonally adjusted indexes are derived by the X-11 Variant of the Census Method II Seasonal Adjustment Program. Annual updates replace 5 years of seasonal data, e.g., data from 1977 through 1981 were replaced at the end of 1981. The seasonal movement of all items and 35 other aggregations is derived by combining the seasonal movement of 45 selected components. Each year the seasonal status of every series is reevaluated based upon certain statistical criteria. If any of the 45 selected components changes its seasonal status, seasonal data from 1967 forward for the all-items and for any of the 35 other aggregations that have that series as a component, are replaced.

Explanation of Homeownership Measures

Official CPI-U includes five components. The weights for property taxes, property insurance, and home maintenance and repairs represent expenditures of all homeowners in the base period. The weights for house prices and contracted mortgage interest cost represent only those homeowners who actually purchased a home in the base period. Included are the total price paid for the home and the total amount of interest expected to be paid over half the stated life of the mortgage. Current monthly prices are used for each of these components.

Experimental Measure X-1: The weight for this rental equivalence measure is the estimate of the rental value of all owner-occupied homes in the base period compiled from a specific question asked on the 1972-73 Consumer Expenditure Survey. This covers the entire stock of owned homes. Prices used are the current rents

collected for the residential rent component of the CPI. The CPI rent component is designed to represent changes in residential rents for all types of housing units, not just changes in rents for units that are typically owner occupied. The CPI rent component is, therefore, not appropriate for this measure.

Experimental Measure X-2: The weight for this user cost method includes expenditures for mortgage interest, property taxes, property insurance, maintenance and repairs, the estimated base-period cost of homeowners' equity in their houses, and the offset to shelter costs resulting from the estimated appreciation of house values in the base period. This measure covers the entire stock of owned houses. To derive the weights for mortgage interest costs and equity costs, the total value of the housing stock in the base period was apportioned into its debt and equity components. The debt component equals the amount owed and the equity component is the amount owned, i.e., payments on principal plus appreciation from the time of purchase to the base period. Each component was subsequently multiplied by the average mortgage interest rate in the base period to determine its cost. Prices used are current ones except for the appreciation term which uses a 5-year moving average of the changes in appreciation rates.

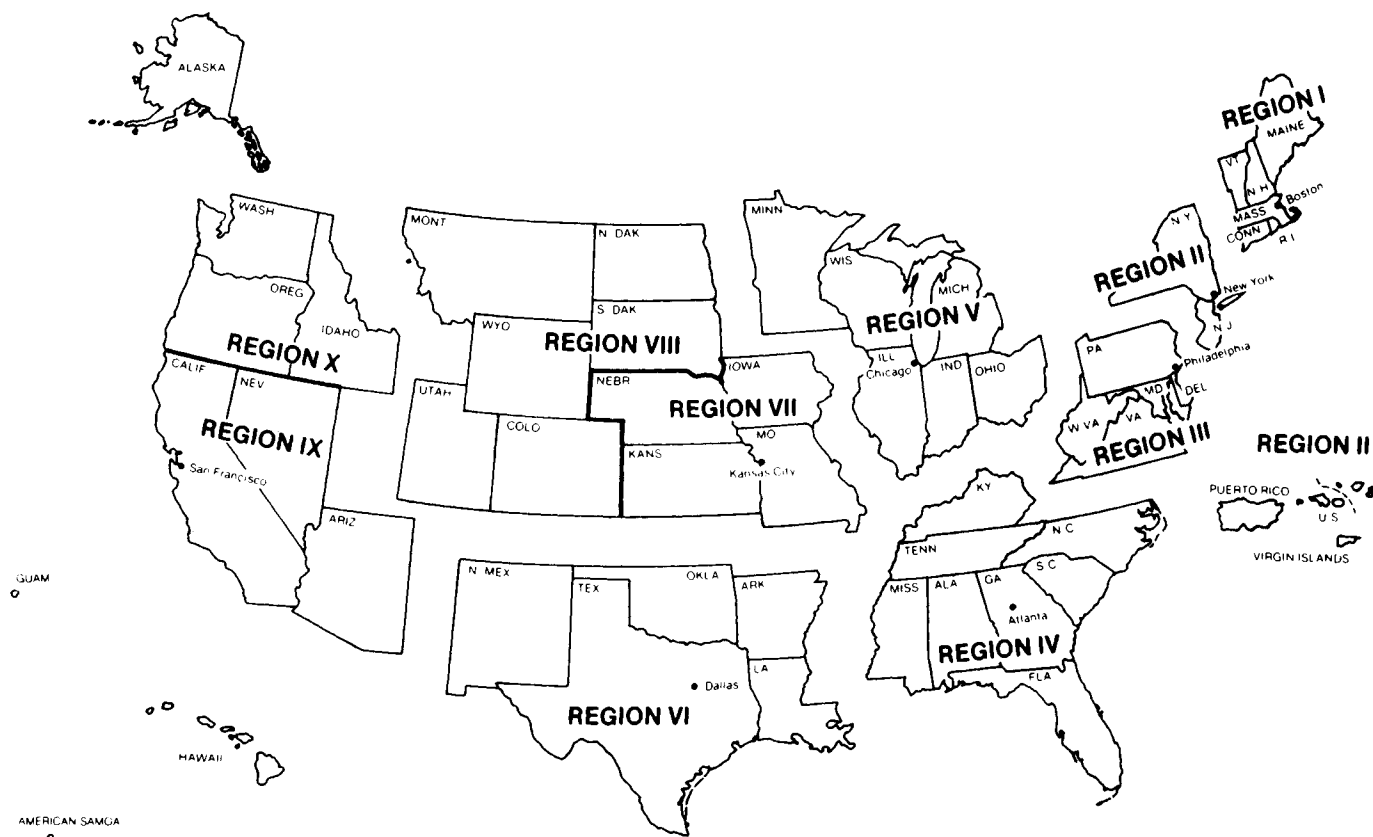
Experimental Measure X-3: The weights are the same as in Experimental Measure X-2, except that mortgage interest costs are calculated as the total interest amount *paid out* by homeowners in the base period. As in X-1 and in X-2, this measure covers the entire homeowner population. The prices for all components except mortgage interest costs and appreciation are current monthly prices. As in X-2, appreciation is represented by a 5-year moving average of the changes in house prices. However, X-3 uses past and current mortgage interest costs in a 15-year weighted moving average which reflects the base-period age distribution of mortgage loans.

Experimental Measure X-4: The weights for this outlays approach include expenditures actually made in the base period for property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repairs. The weight for the mortgage interest term is calculated in the same manner as in X-2. However, no appreciation or equity terms are included. Not all homeowners are represented in this measure because those who made no mortgage debt payment in the base period are excluded. The prices used for each of these items are current ones.

Experimental Measure X-5: The weights for this outlays approach include, as in X-4, expenditures actually made in the base period for property taxes, property insurance, and maintenance and repairs. The weight for the mortgage interest cost term is the same as for the X-3. No appreciation or equity elements are used. As in X-4, not all homeowners are represented in this measure because those who made no mortgage debt payment in the base period are excluded. Current prices are used in X-5 except for mortgage interest which uses the 15-year weighted moving average also used in the X-3.

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
