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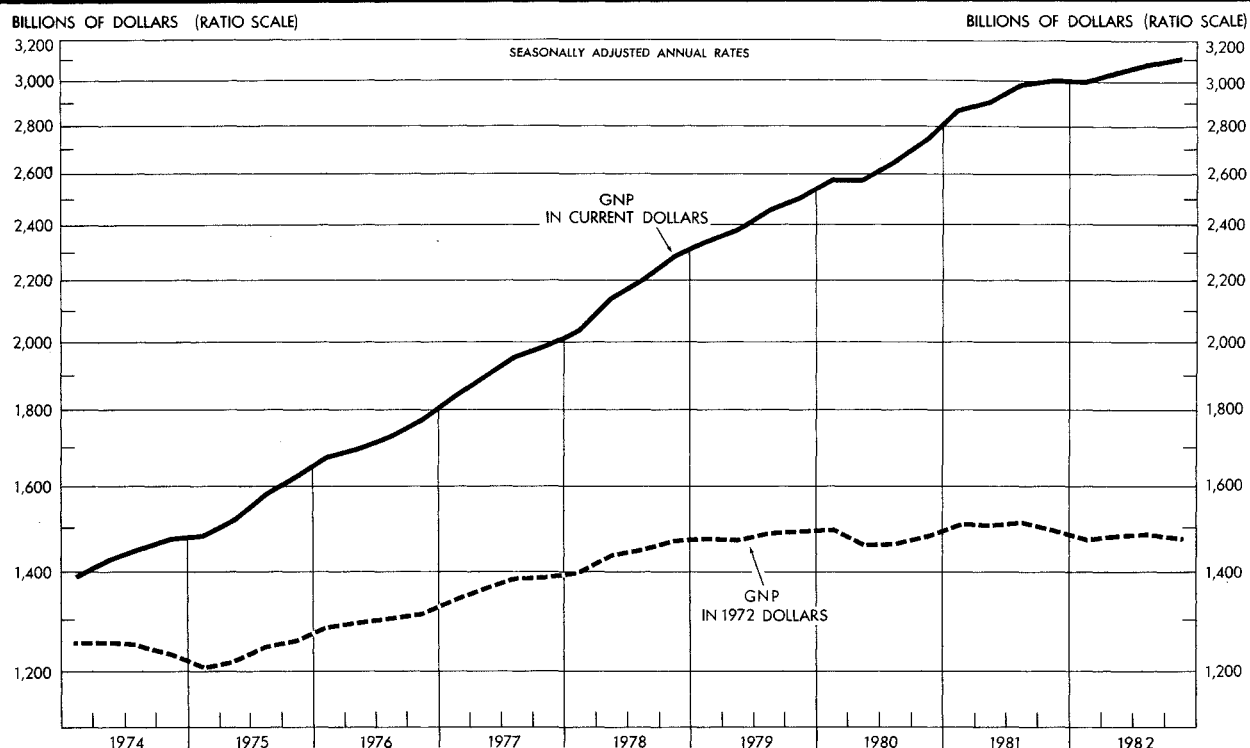
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to revised estimates for the fourth quarter of 1982, gross national product rose \$13.2 billion or 1.7 percent, both at annual rates. Real output (GNP adjusted for price changes) fell 1.9 percent (annual rate) and the implicit price deflator rose at a 3.7 percent annual rate.

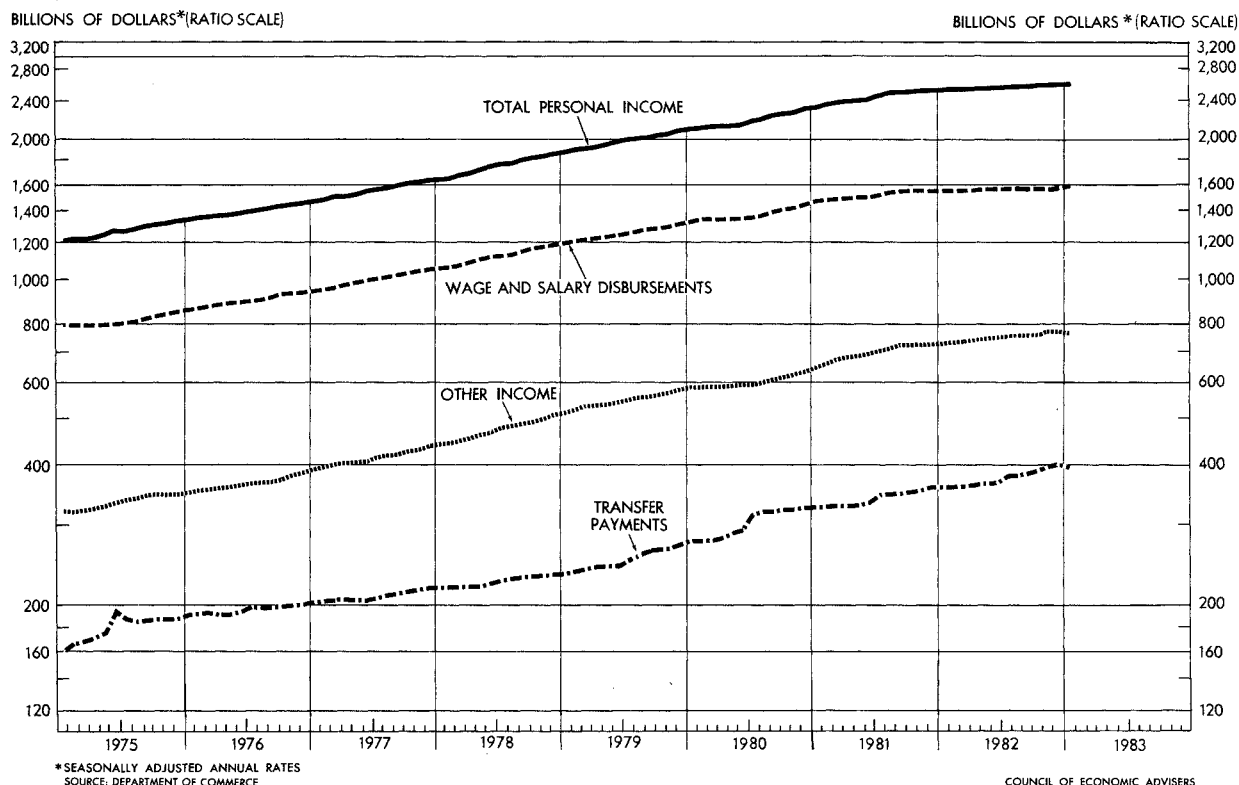

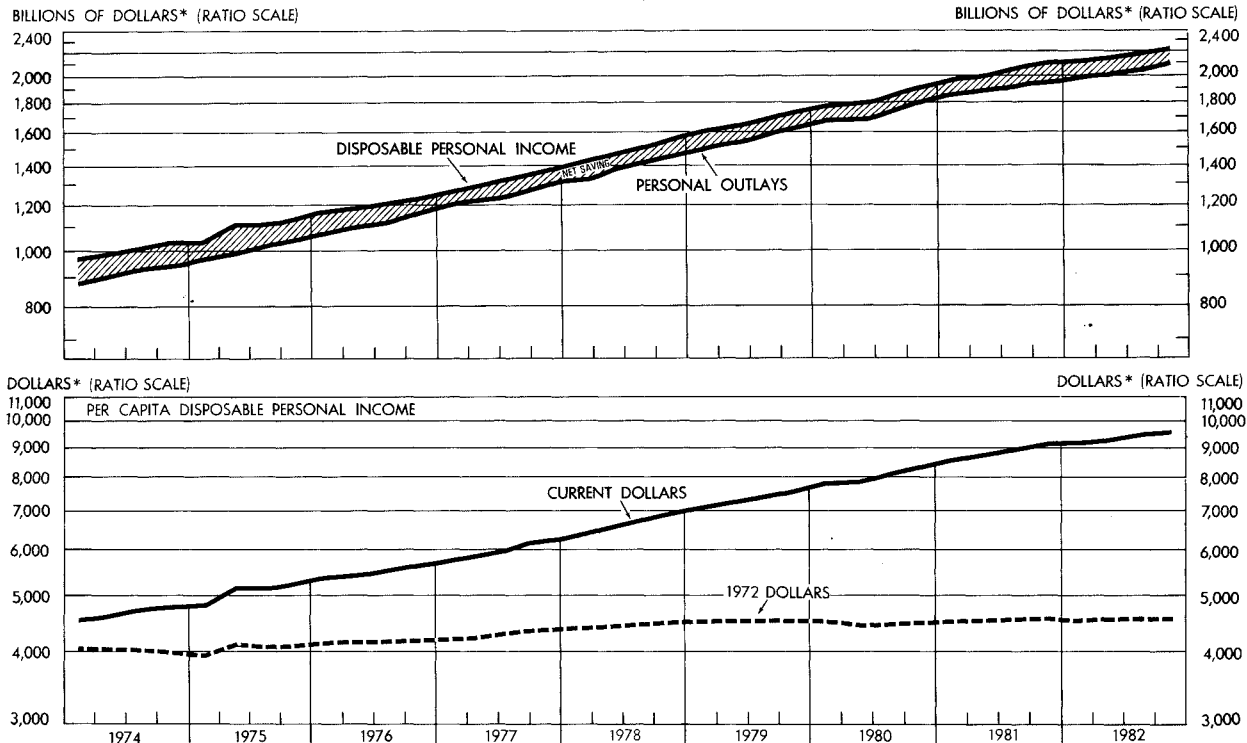

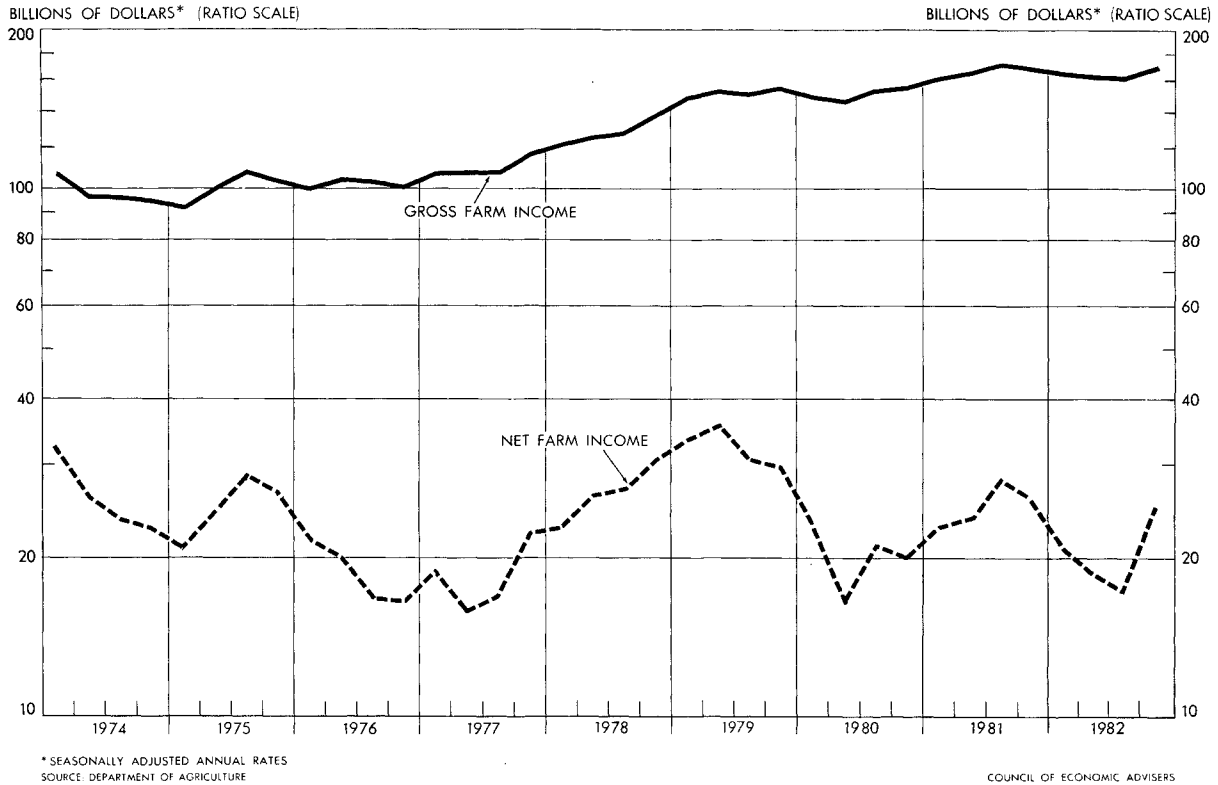

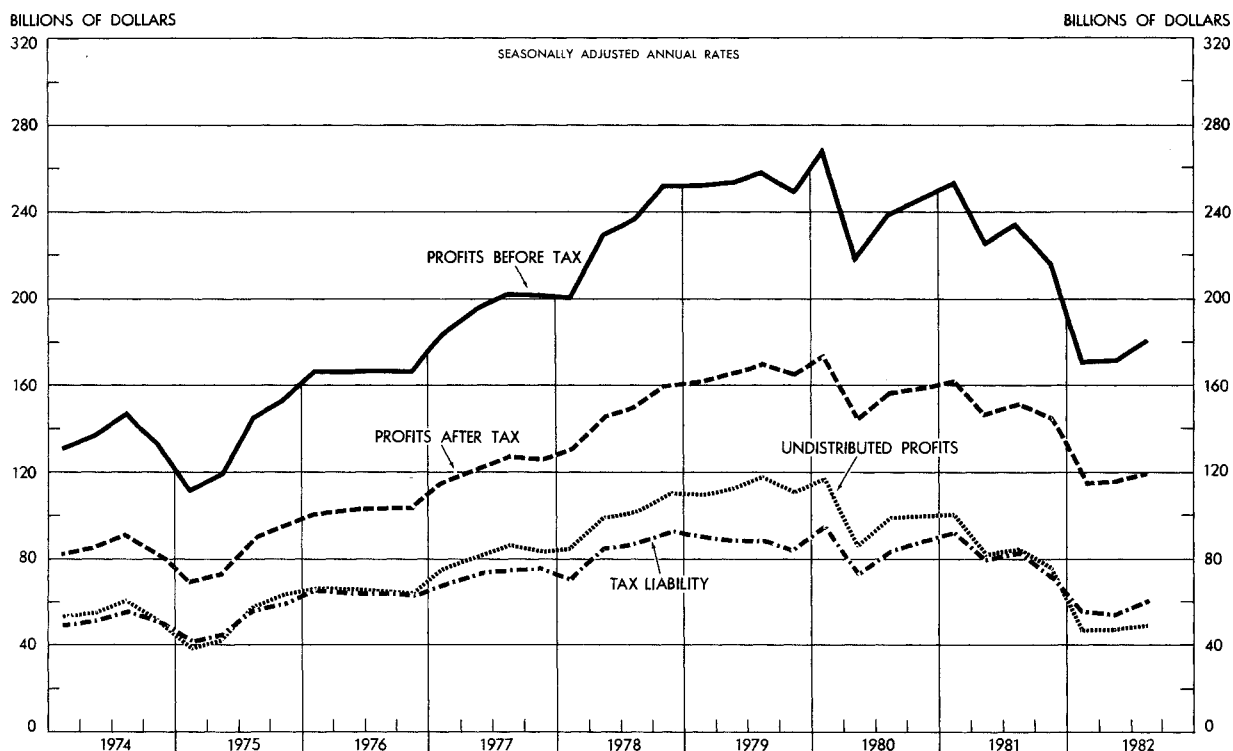

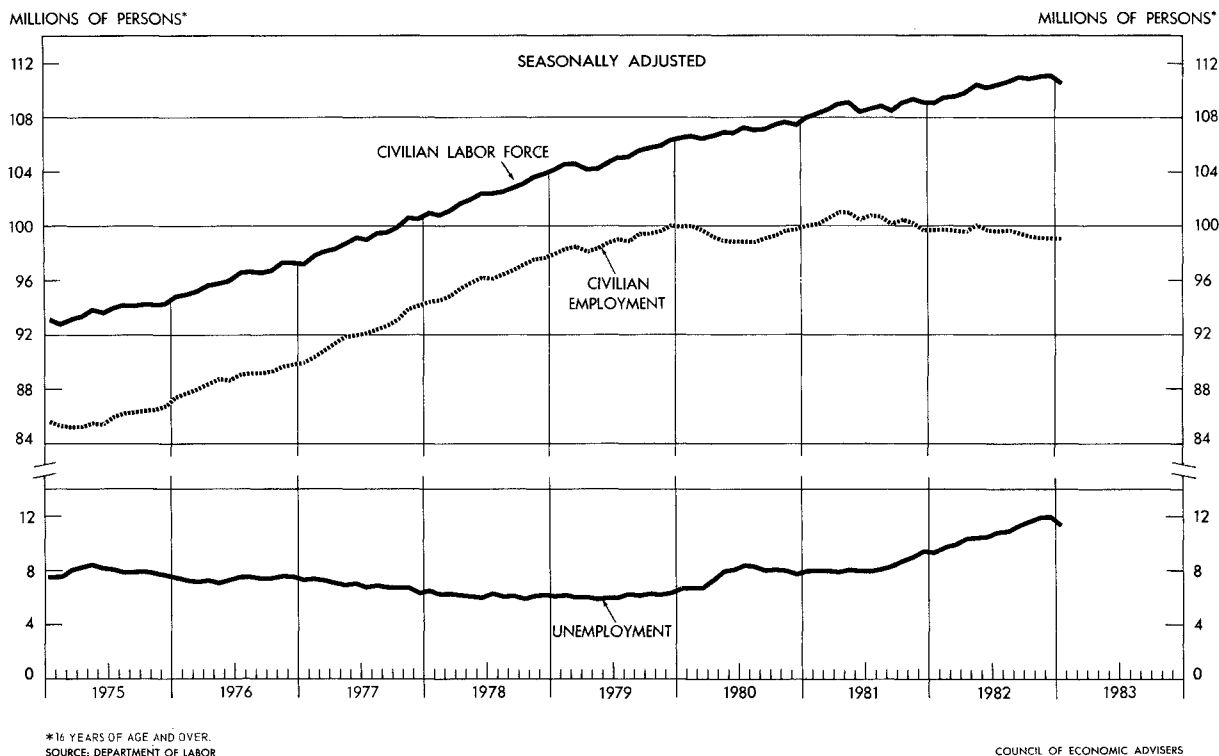

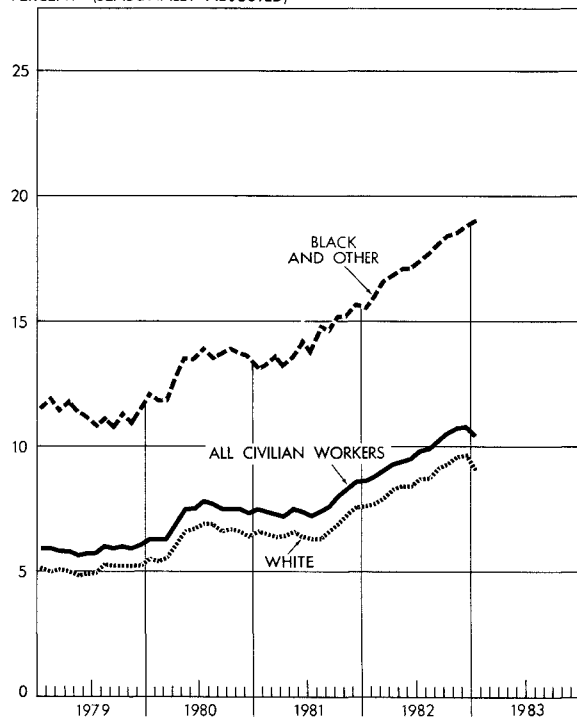

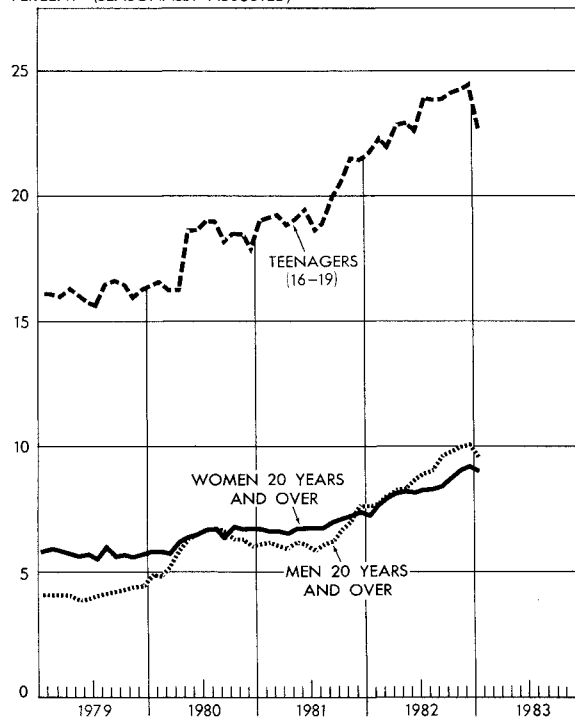

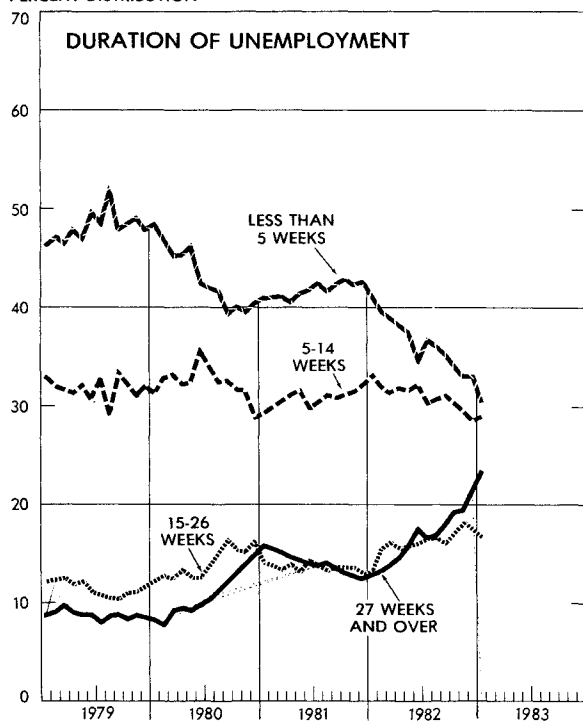

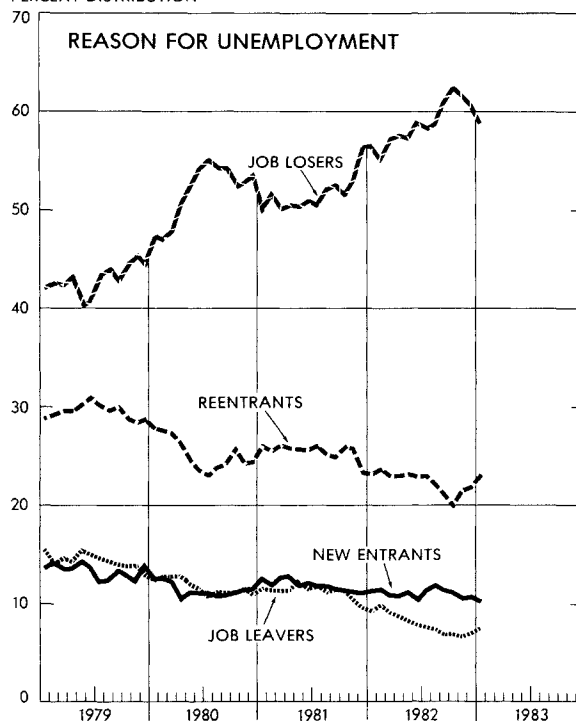
In December and January, the percentage of unemployed persons who had been out of work for more than 15 weeks continued to rise, and the percentage out of work for less than 15 weeks fell again.

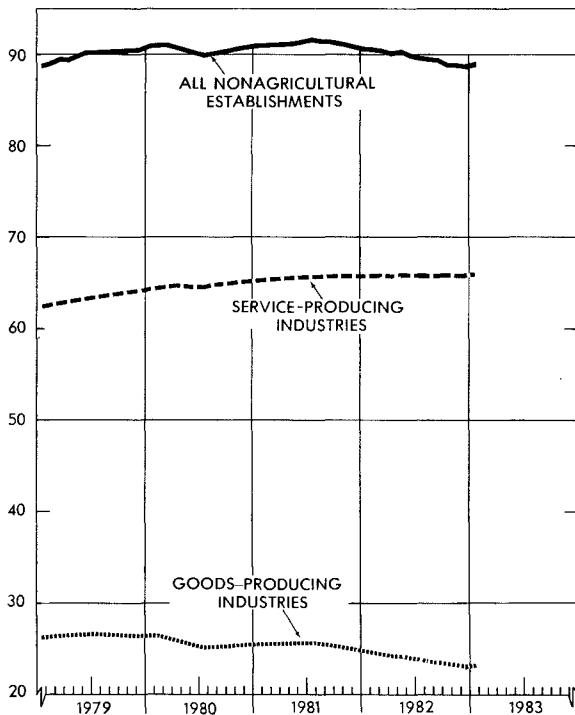

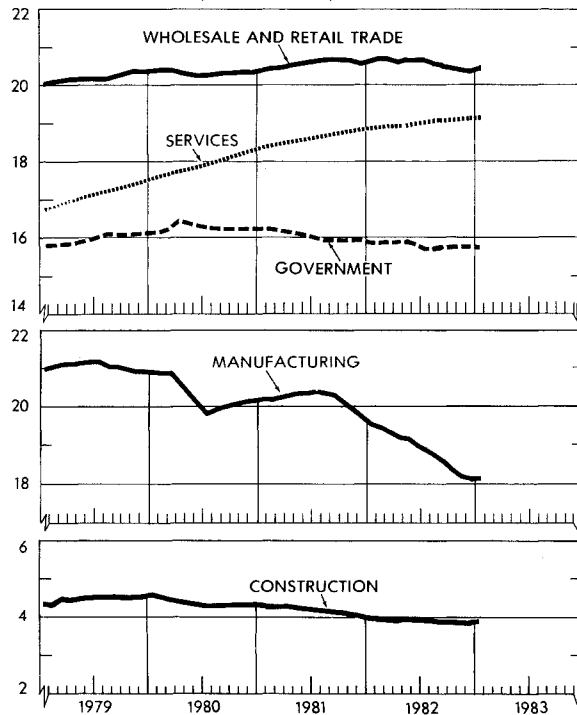

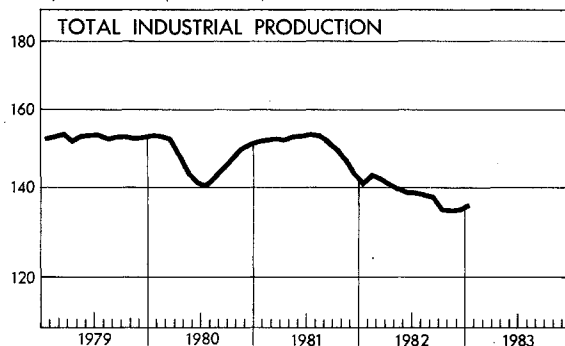

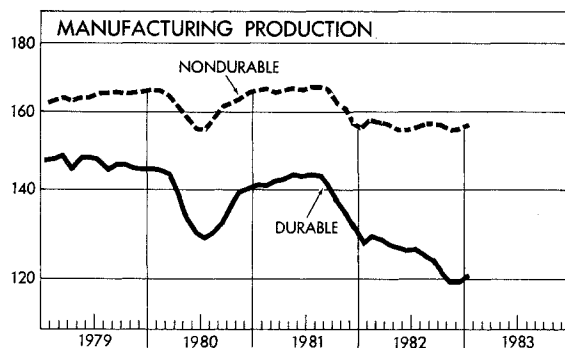
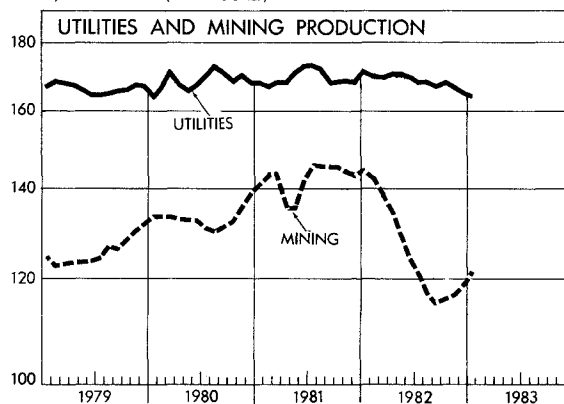
INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

Industrial production rose 0.9 percent in January following a 0.1 percent increase in December. The index for January was 3.2 percent below its year earlier level.

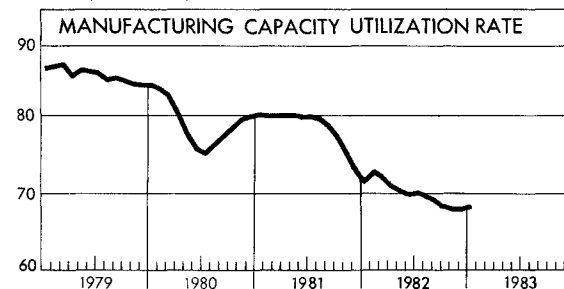
INDEX, 1967 = 100* (RATIO SCALE)

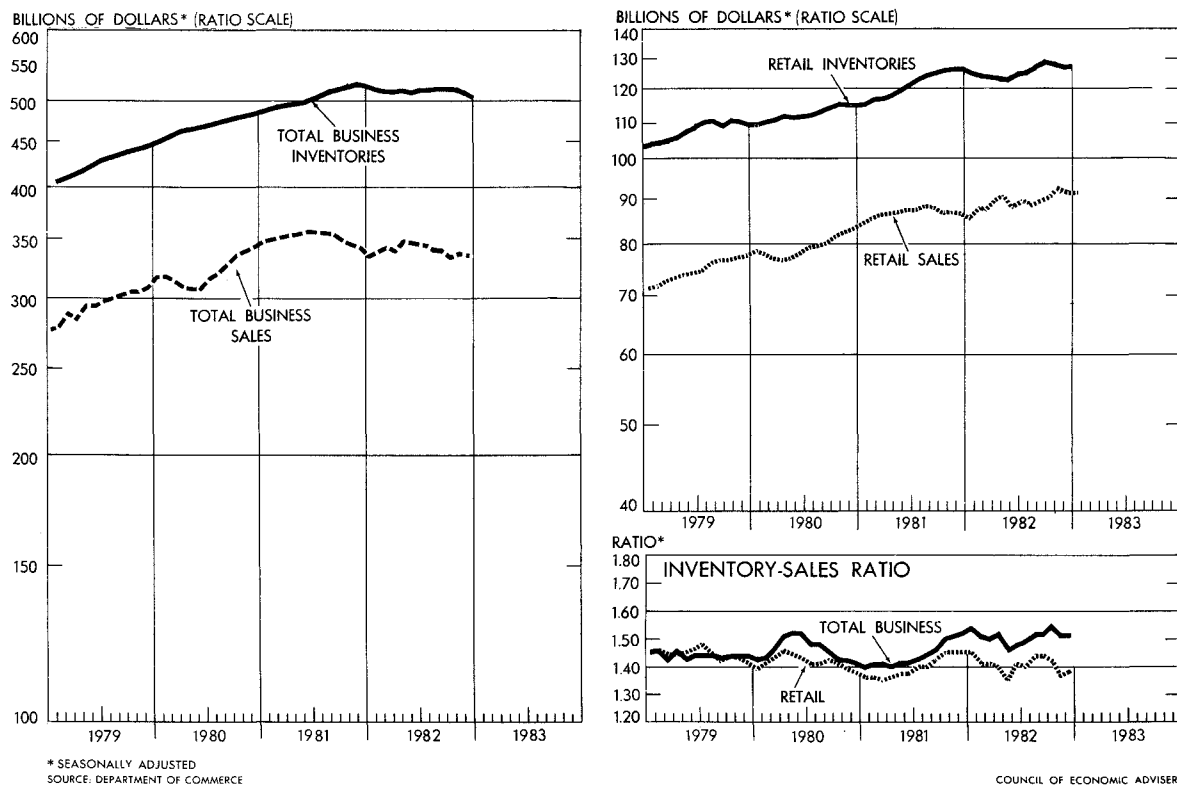

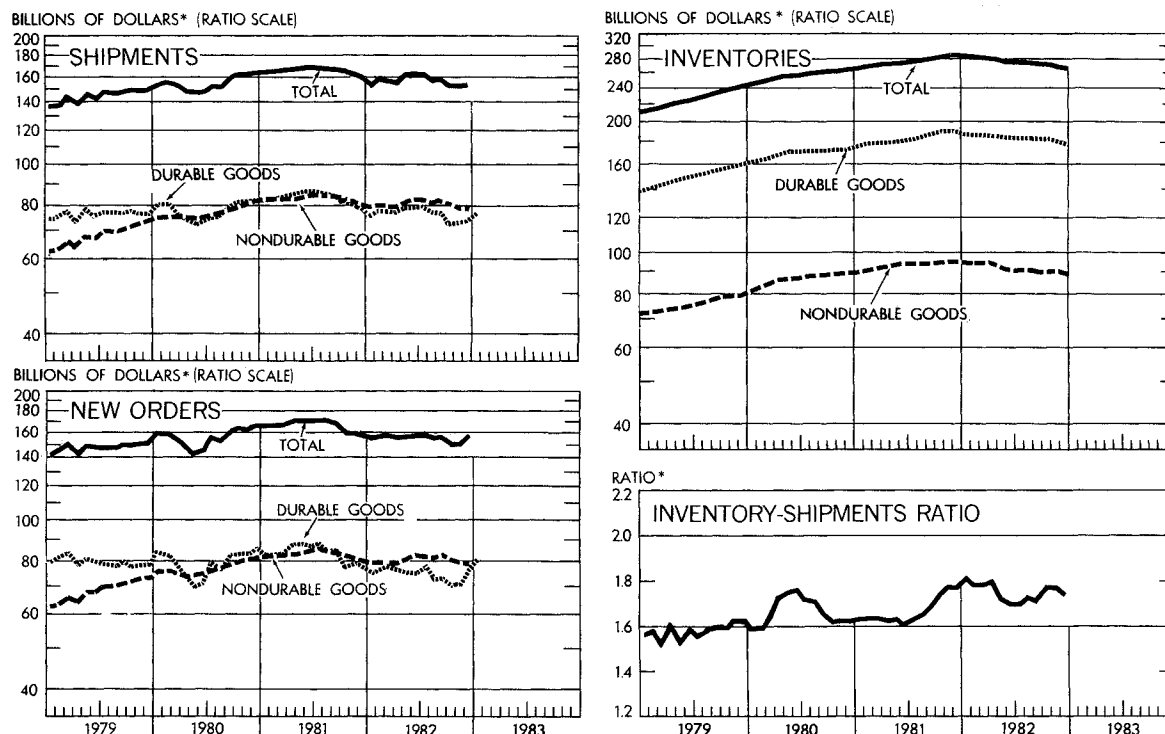

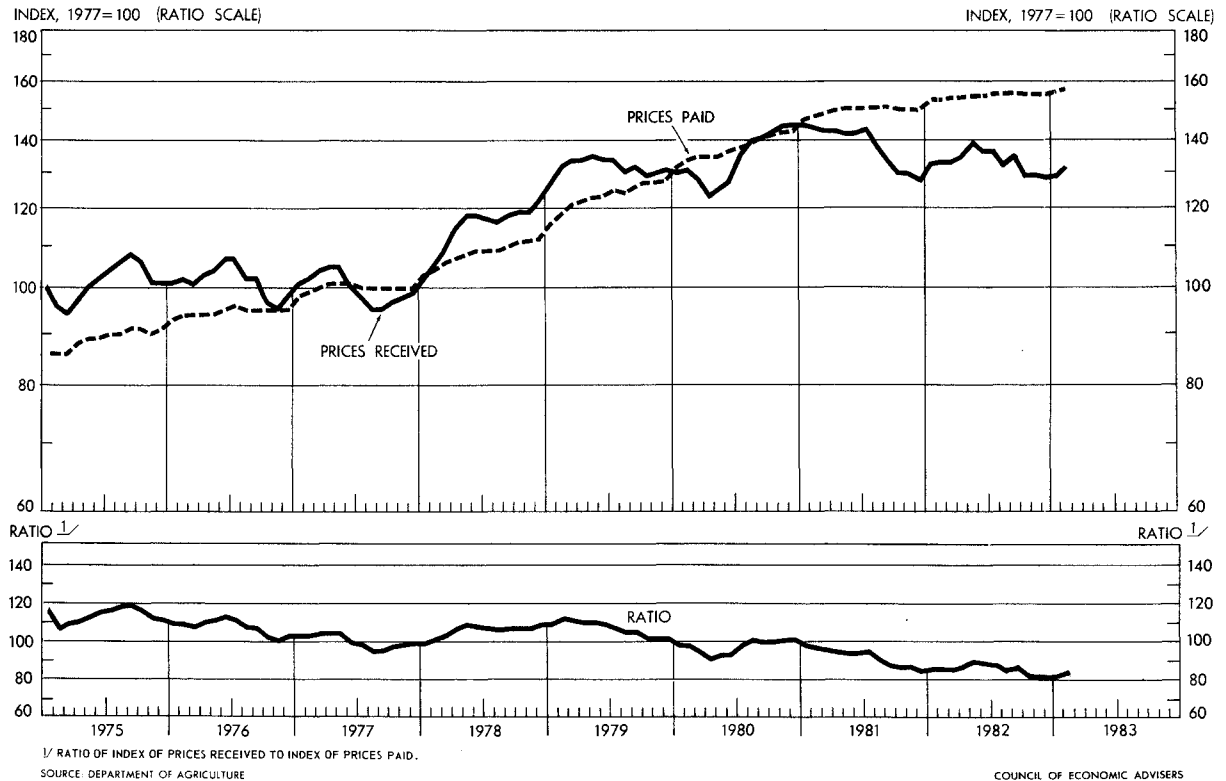

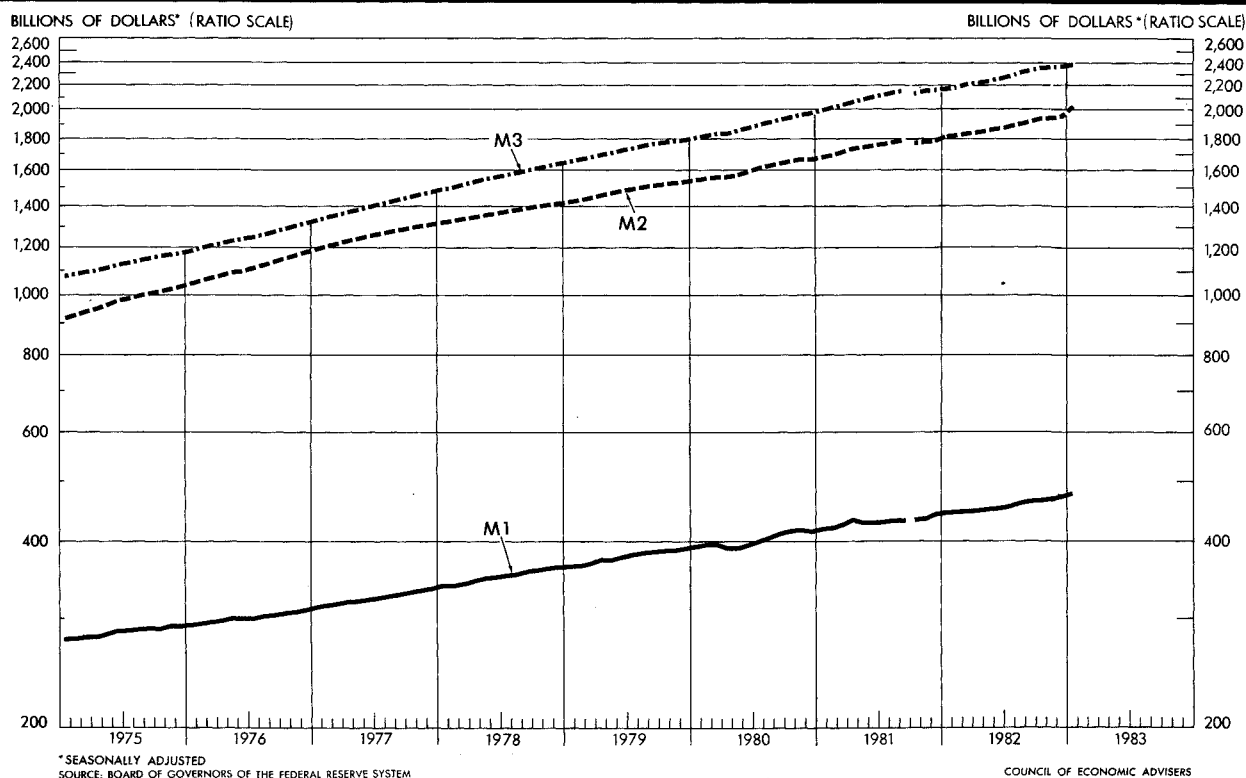

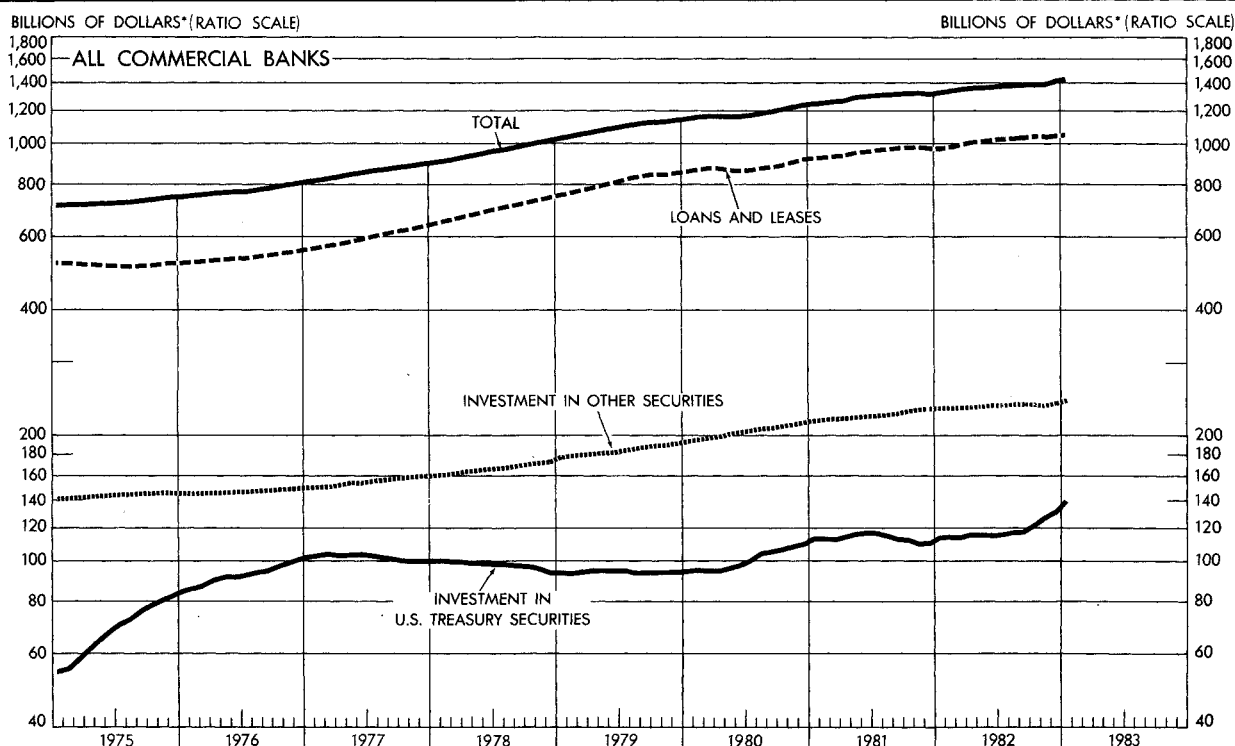

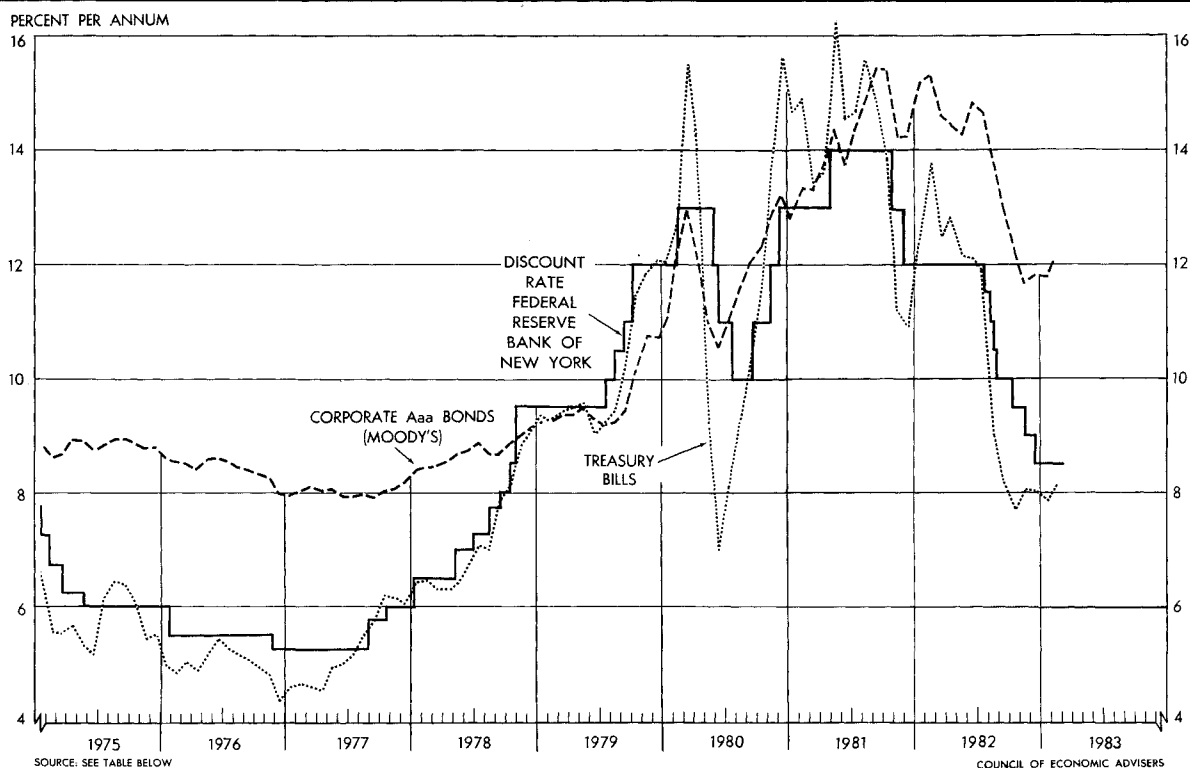

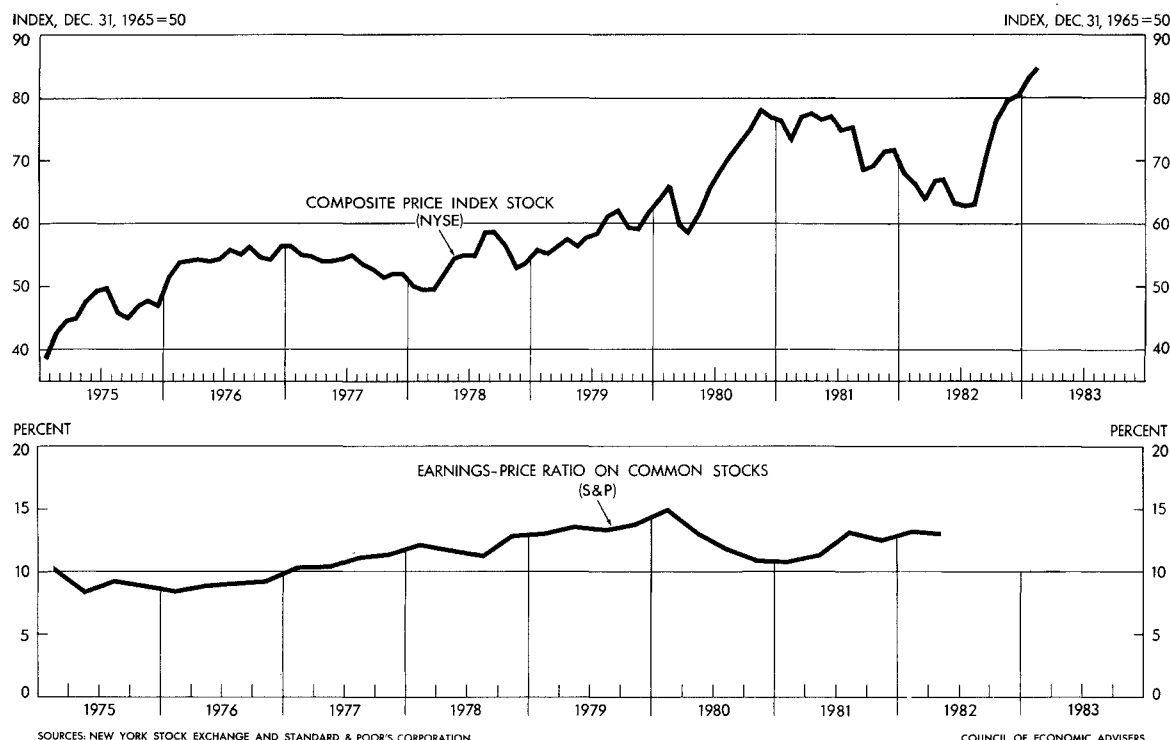

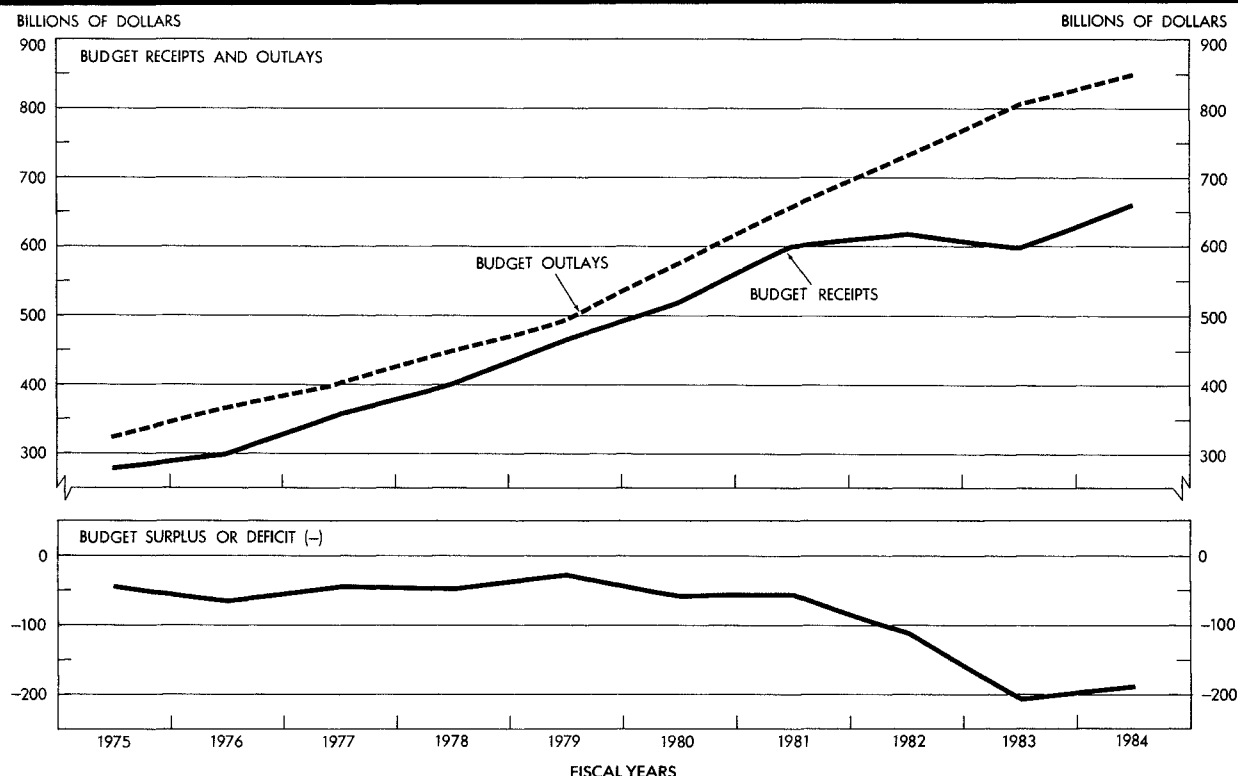

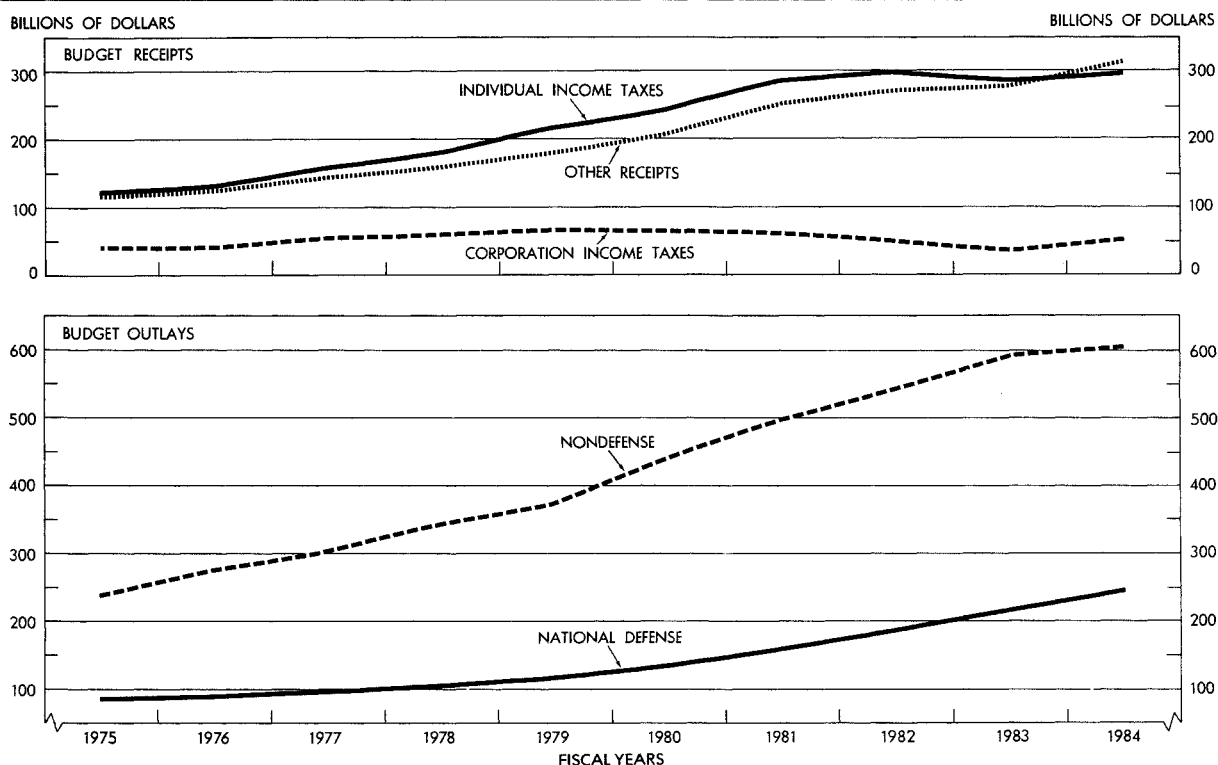

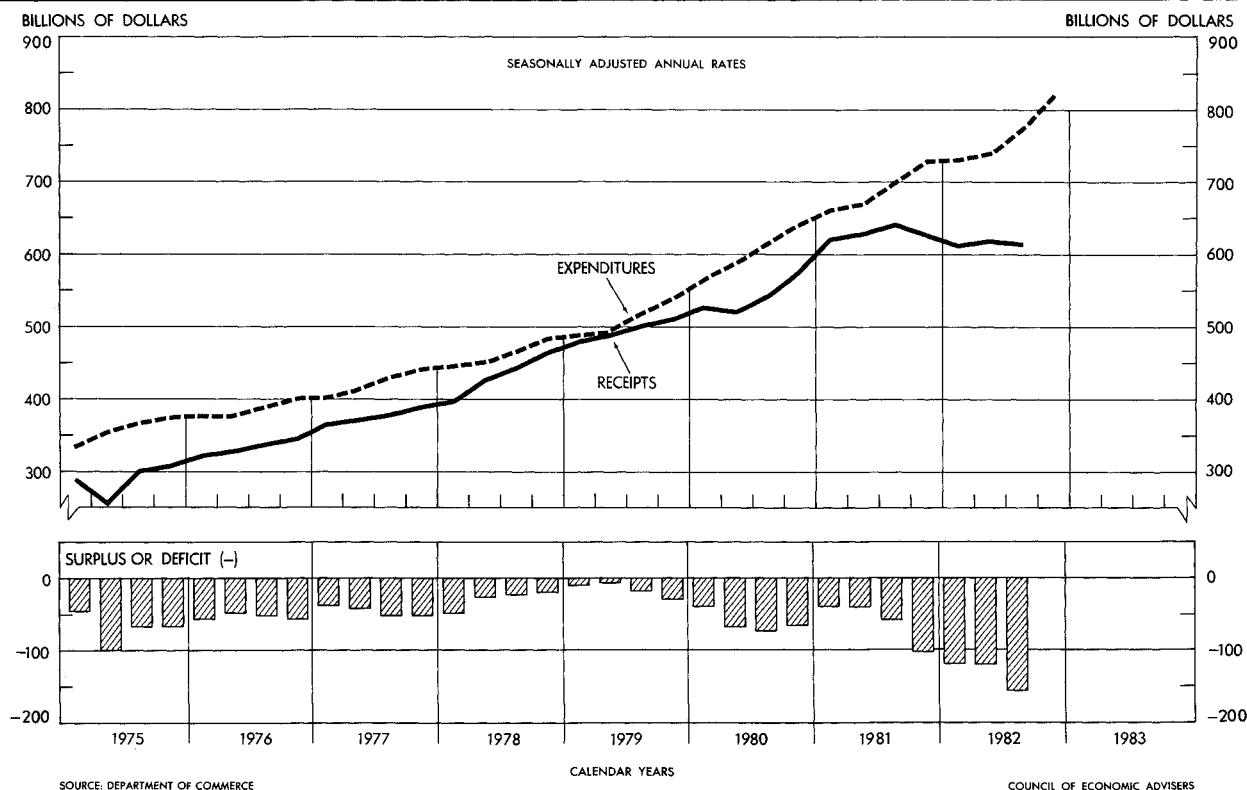

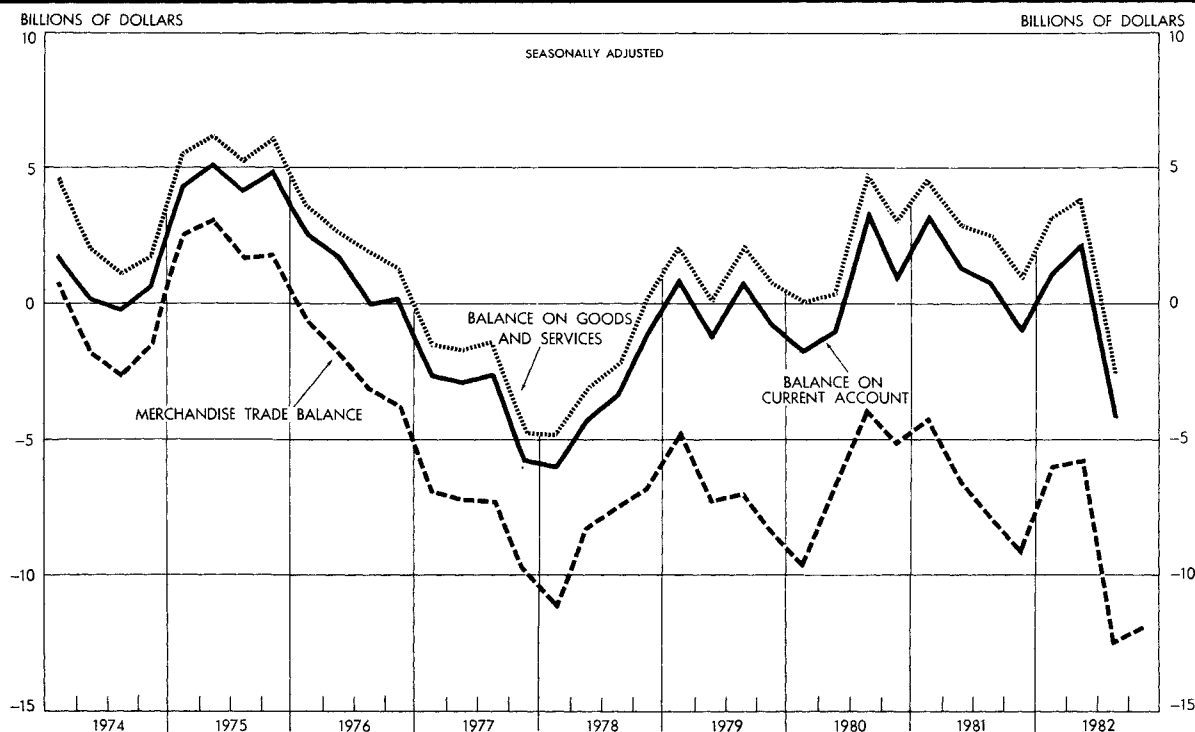

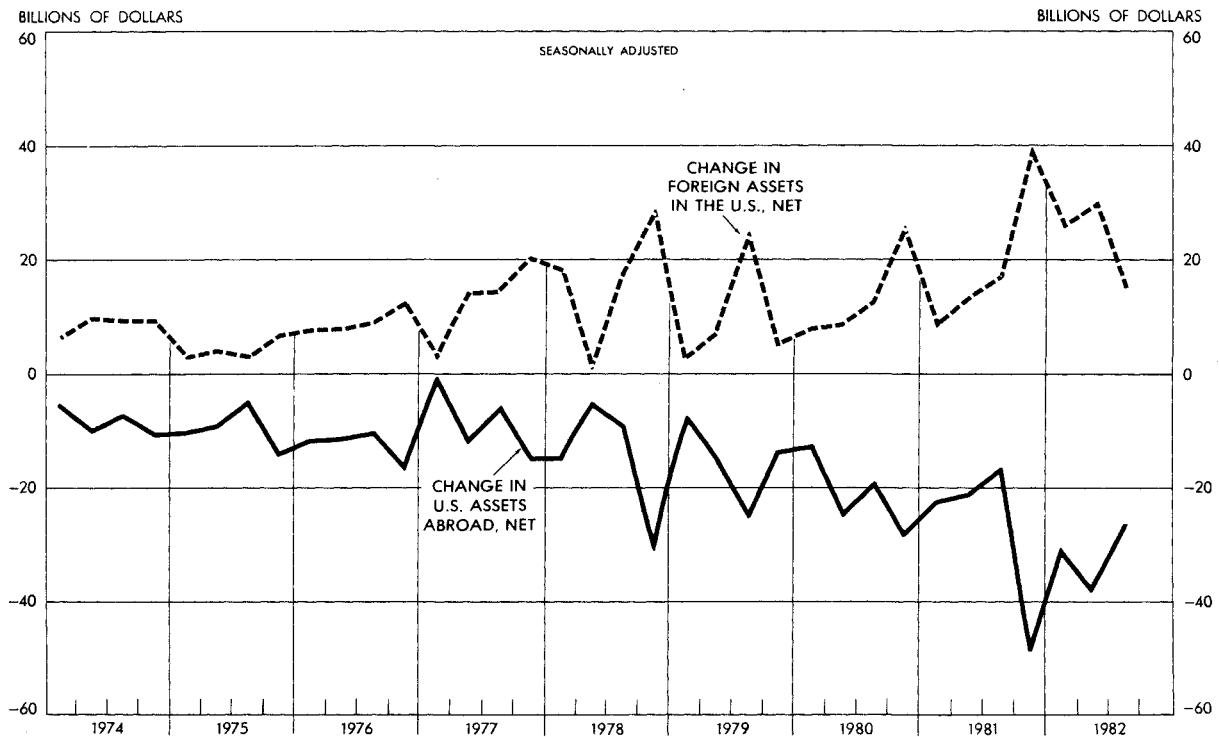

In the capital accounts, claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$21.0 billion in the third quarter, compared with an increase of \$36.9 billion in the second quarter. Liabilities to private foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$11.5 billion in the third quarter, following an increase of \$24.6 billion in the second quarter.
