JOINT RESOLUTION [S.J. Res. 55]

To print the monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators"

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.

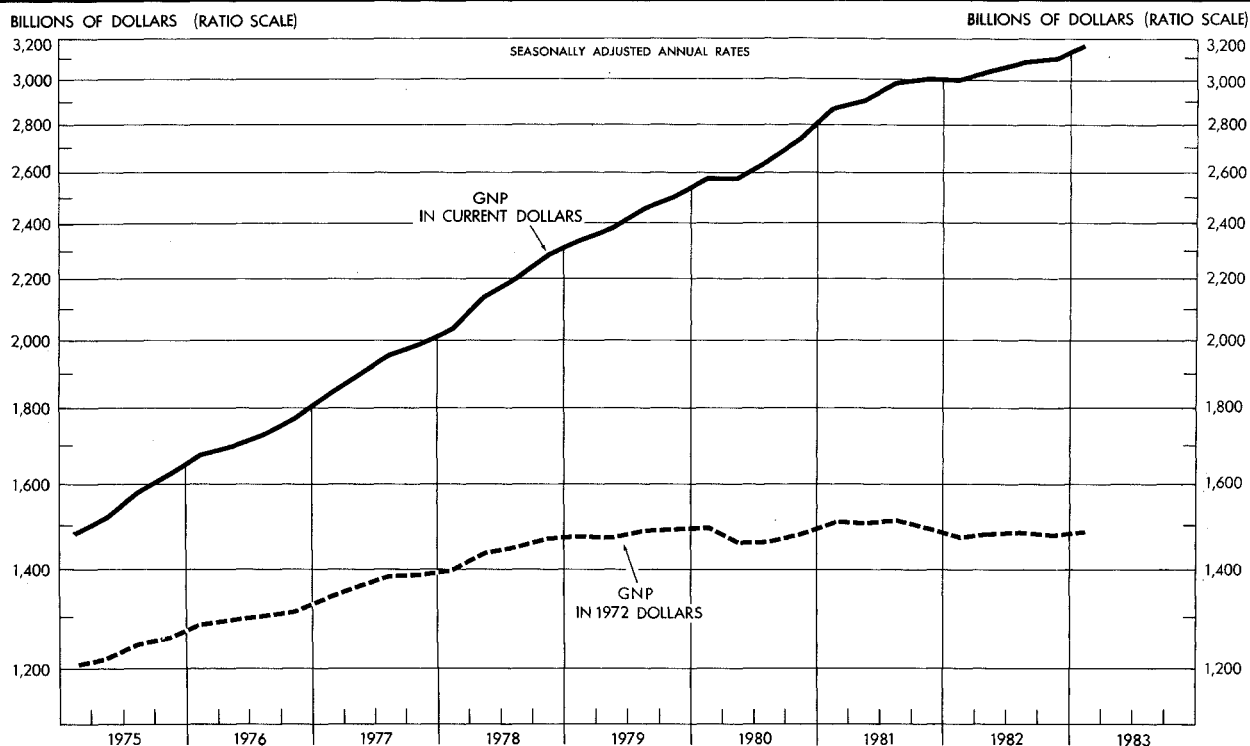

TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to revised estimates for the first quarter of 1983, gross national product rose \$62.7 billion or 8.3 percent, both at annual rates. Real output (GNP adjusted for price changes) rose 2.5 percent (annual rate) and the implicit price deflator rose at a 5.7 percent annual rate.

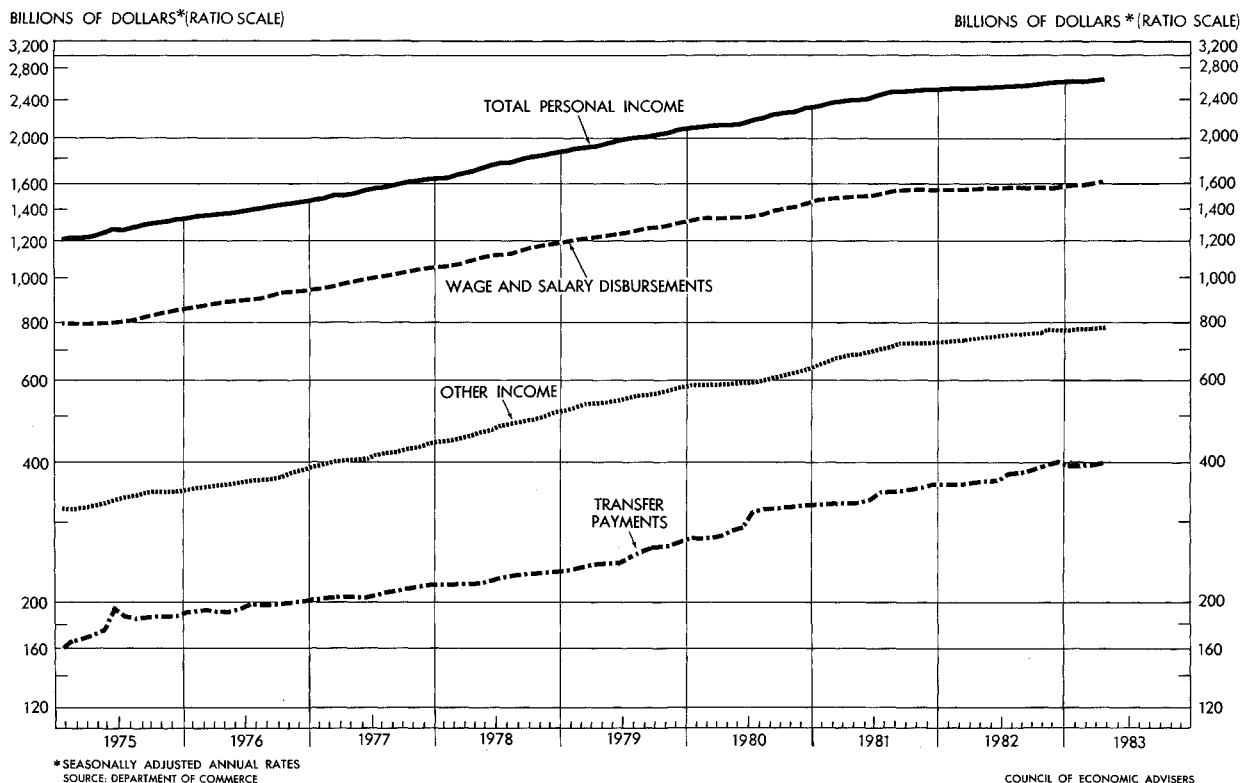

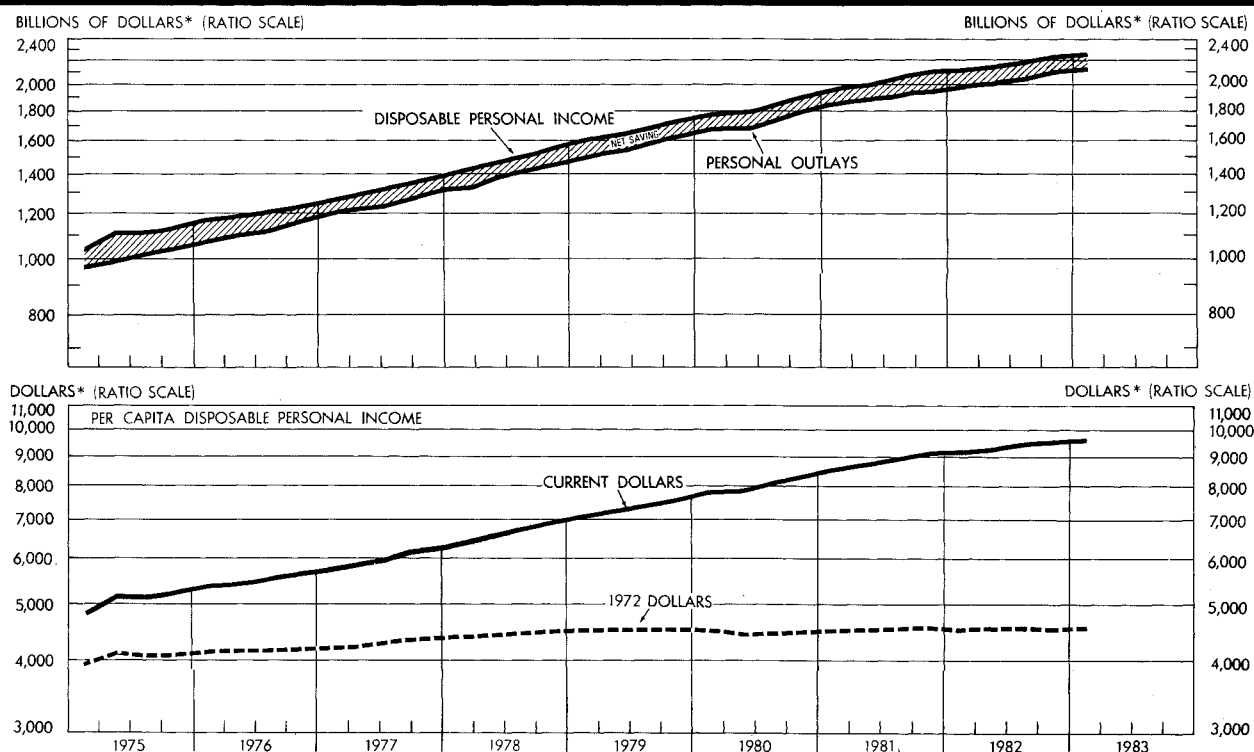

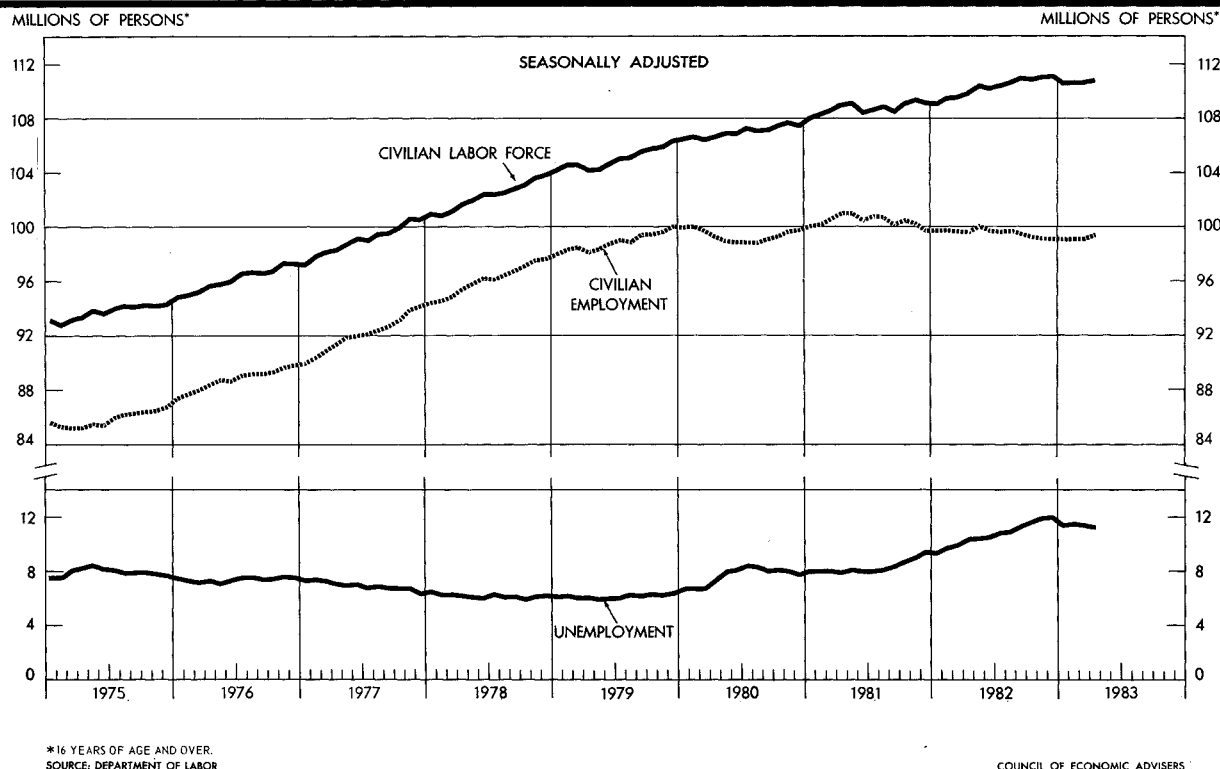

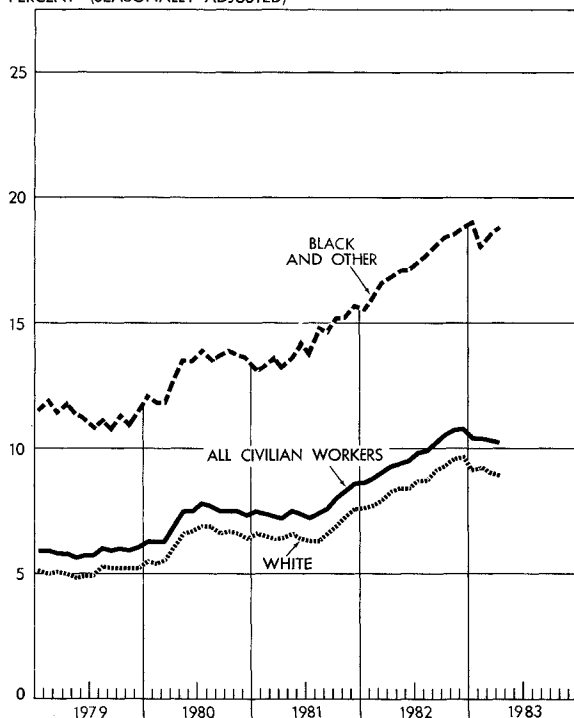

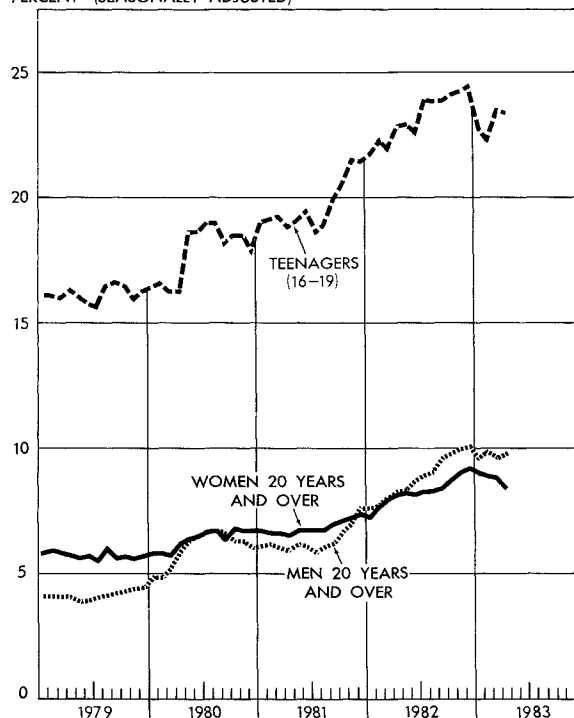

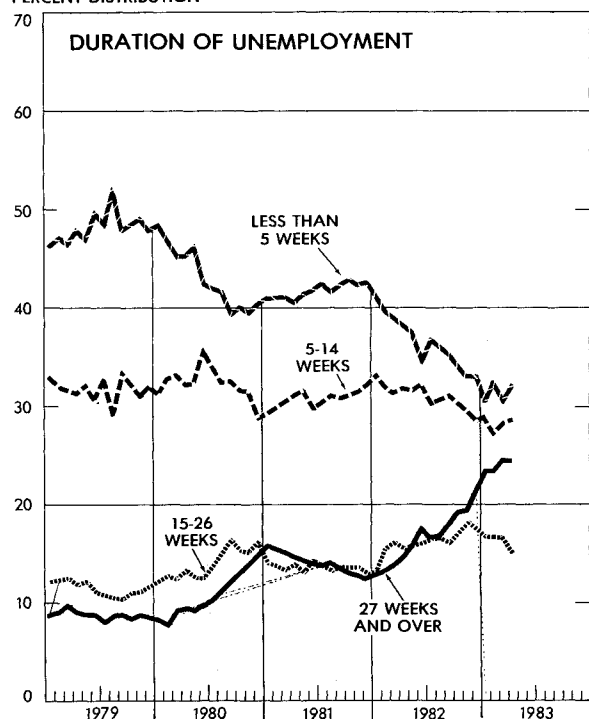

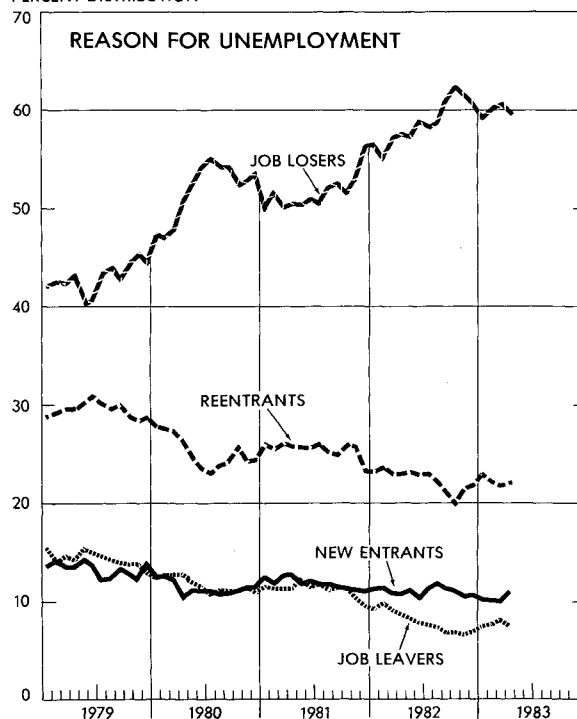
In April, the percentage of unemployed persons who had been out of work for more than 15 weeks fell, and the percentage out of work for less than 15 weeks rose.

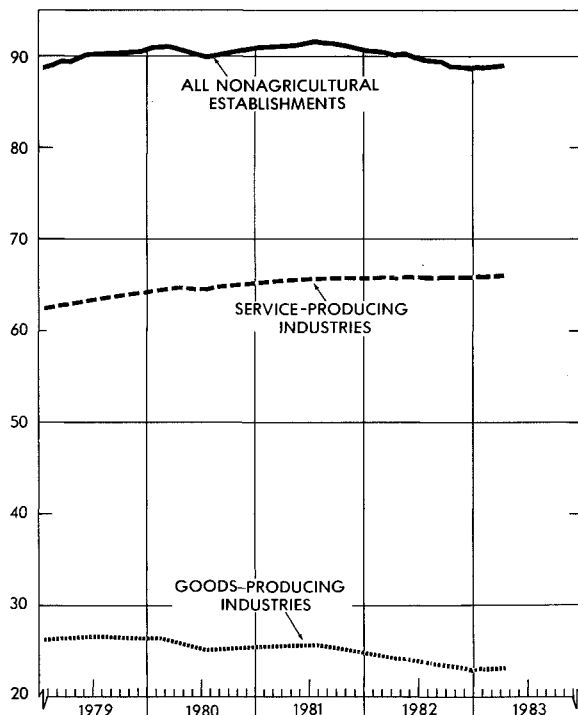

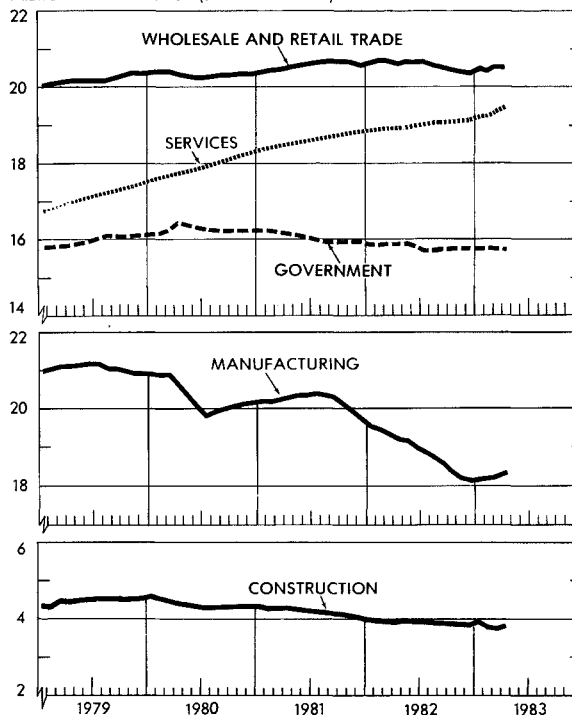

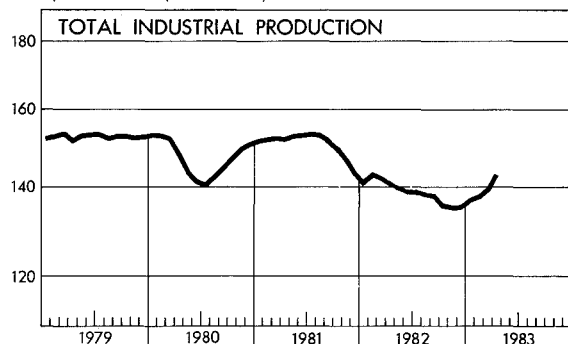

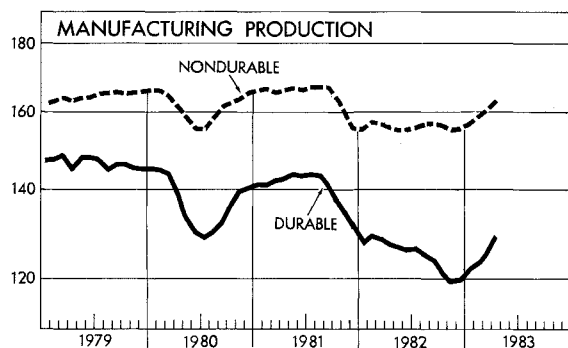
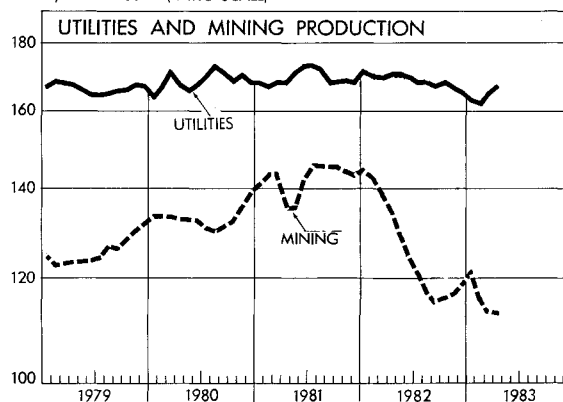
INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

Industrial production rose 2.1 percent in April following a rise of 1.2 percent in March. The index for April was 1.7 percent above its year earlier level.

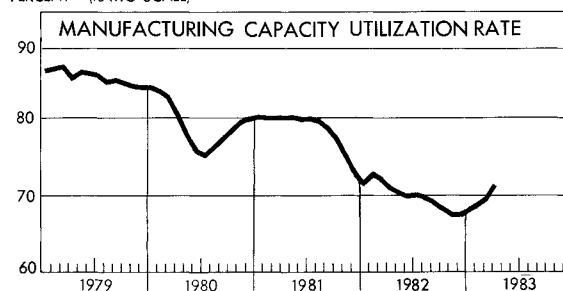
INDEX, 1967=100* (RATIO SCALE)

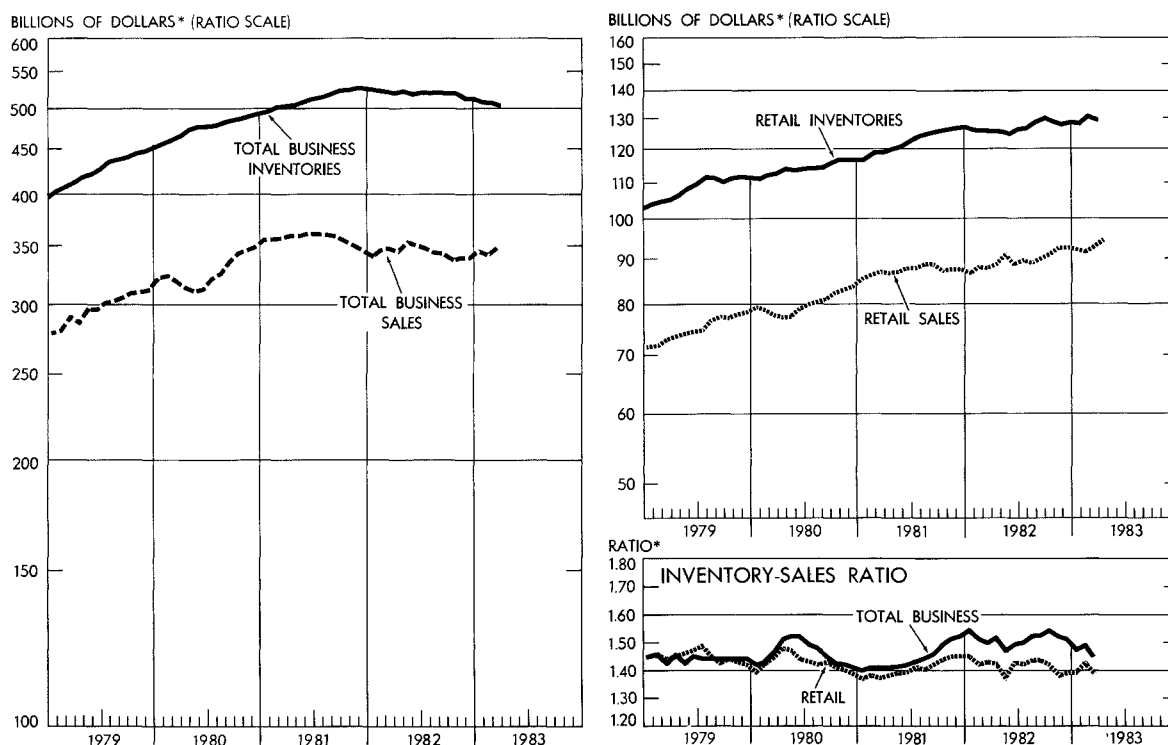

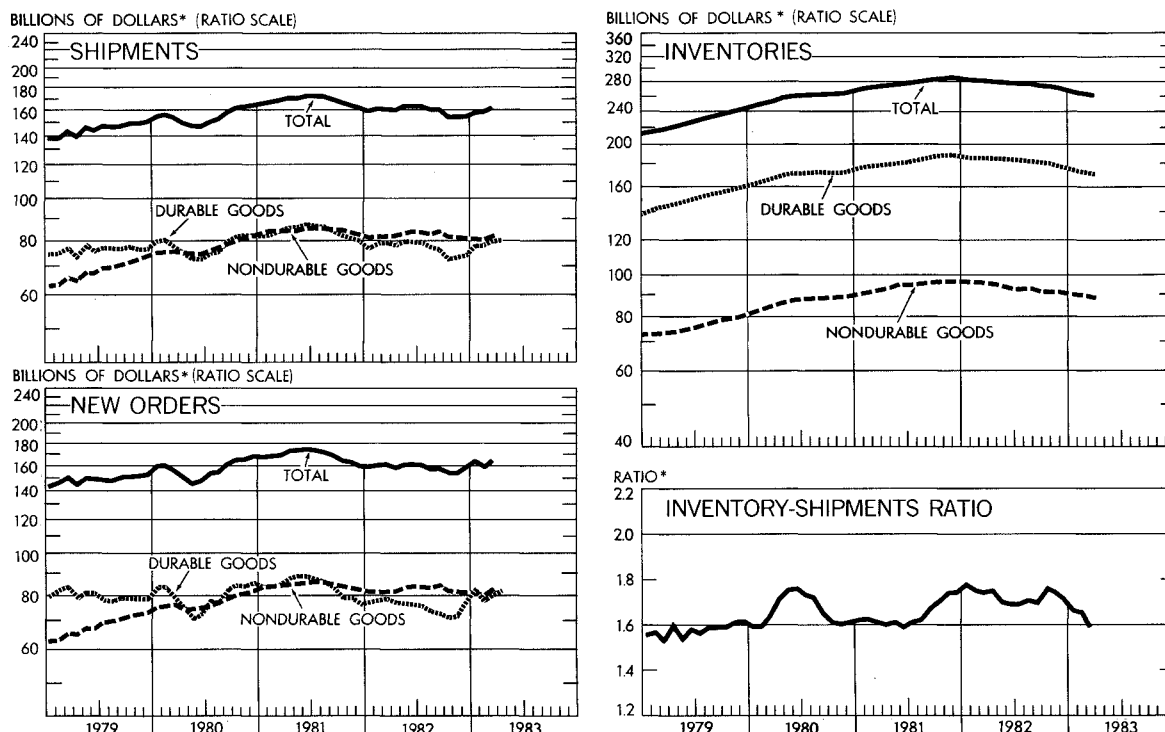

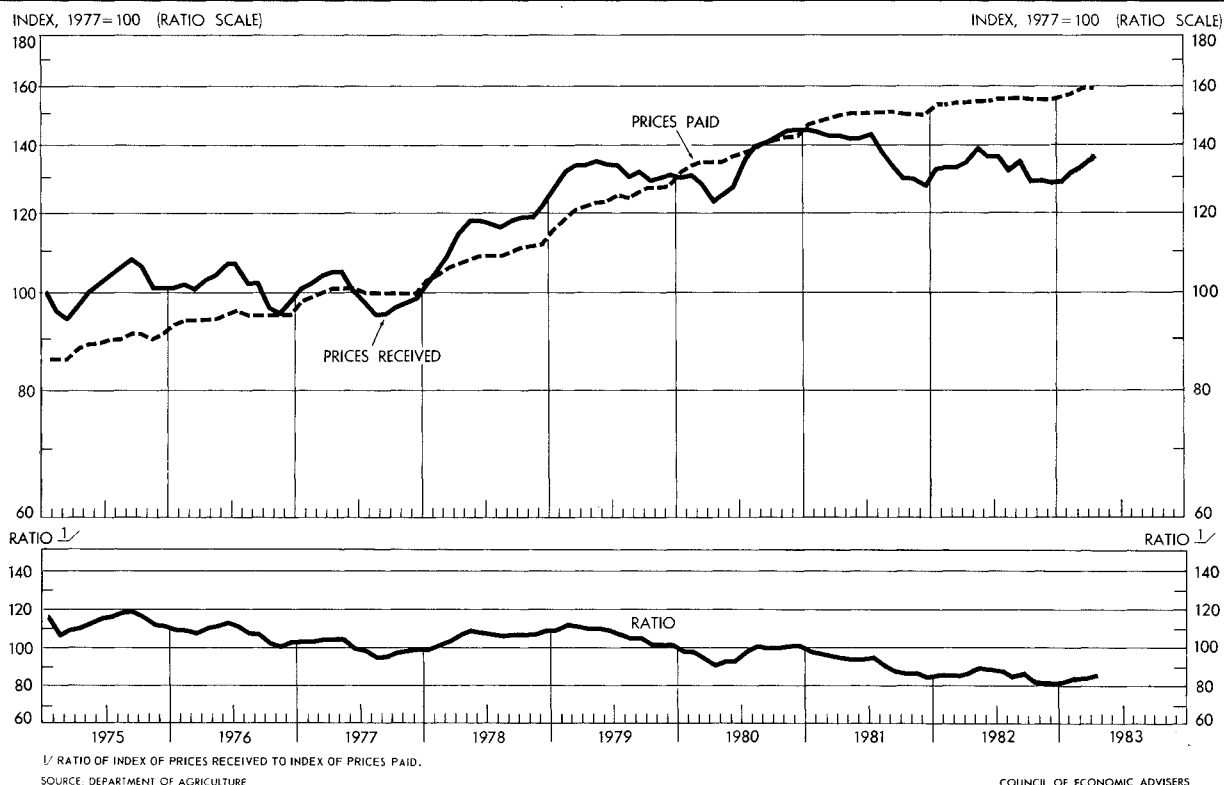

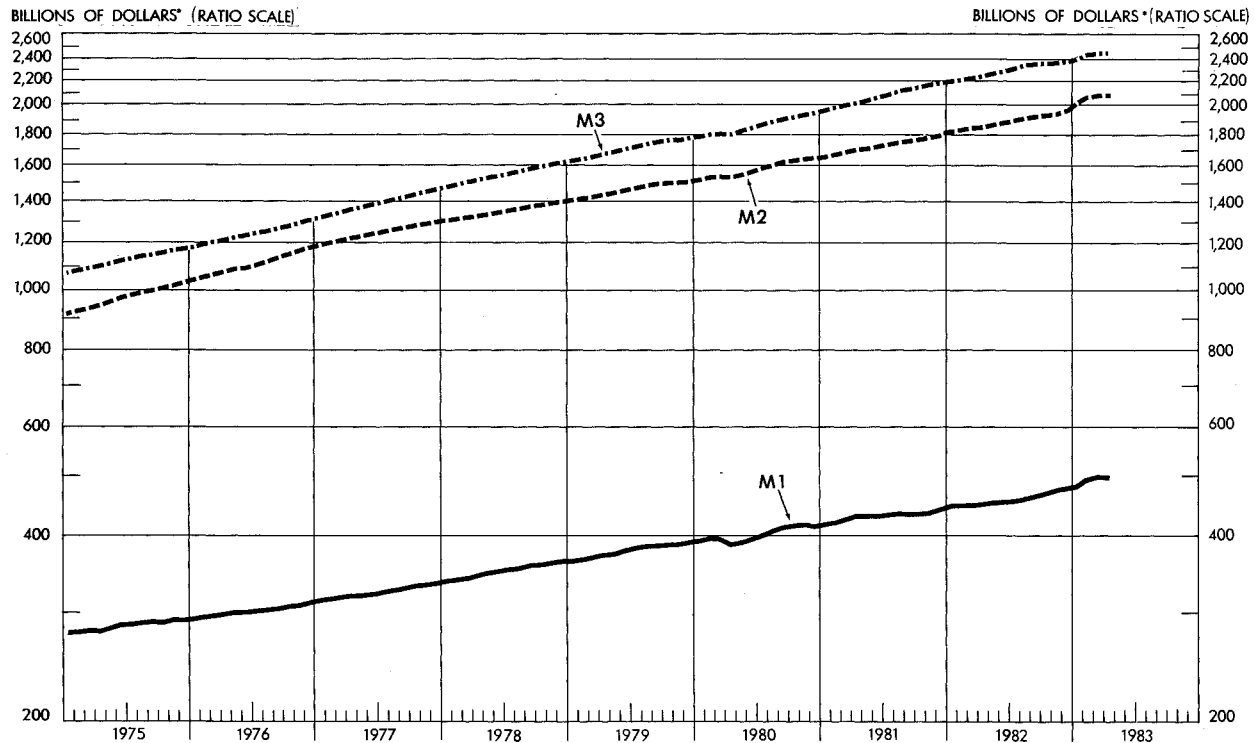

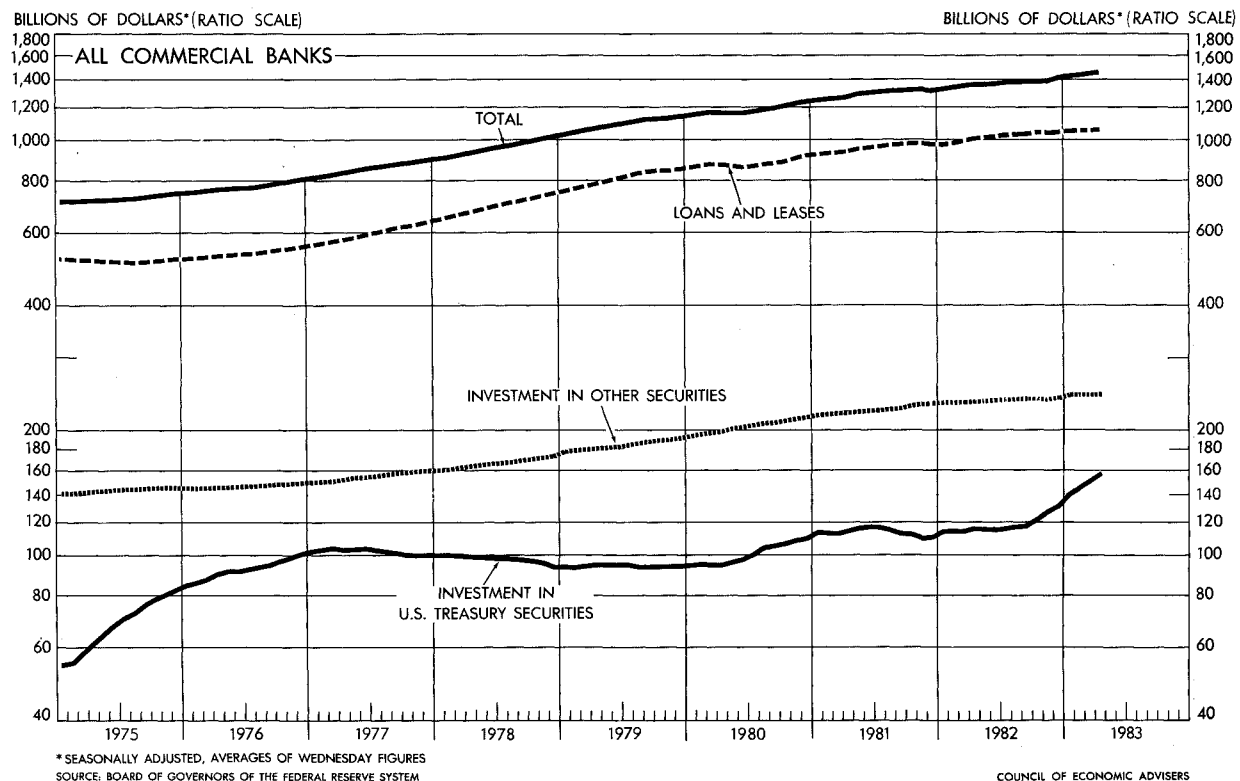

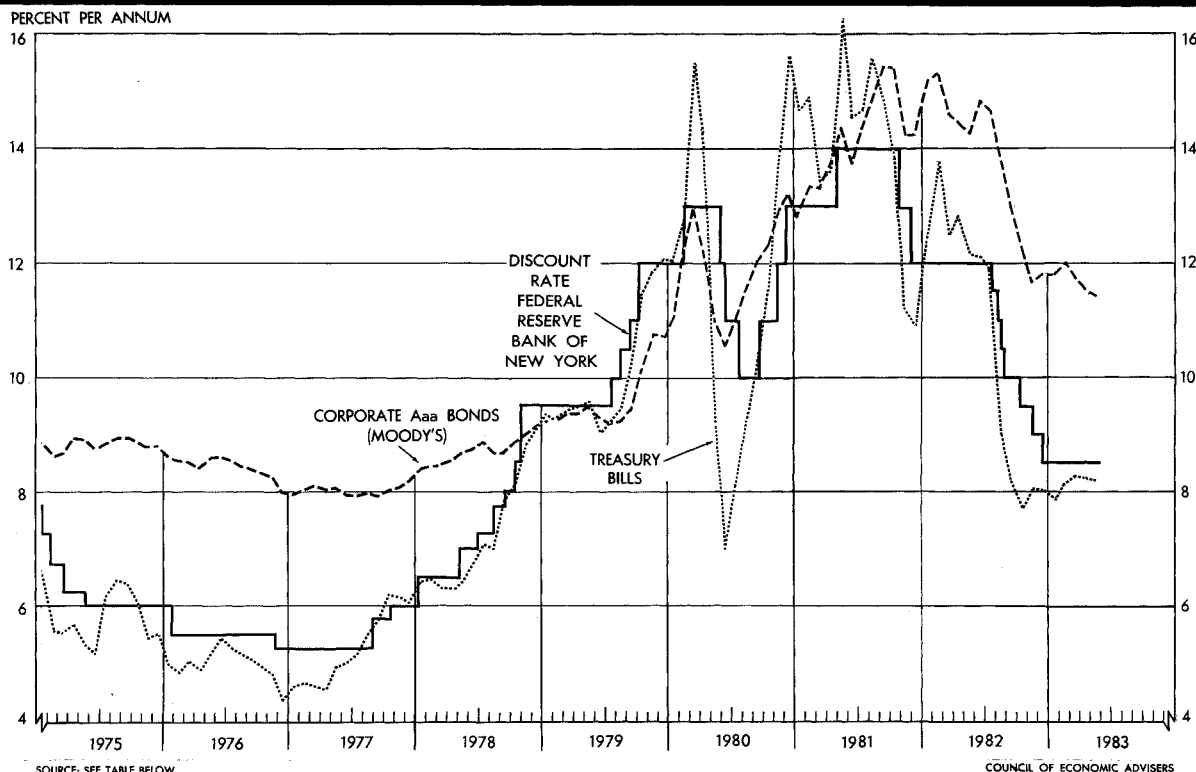

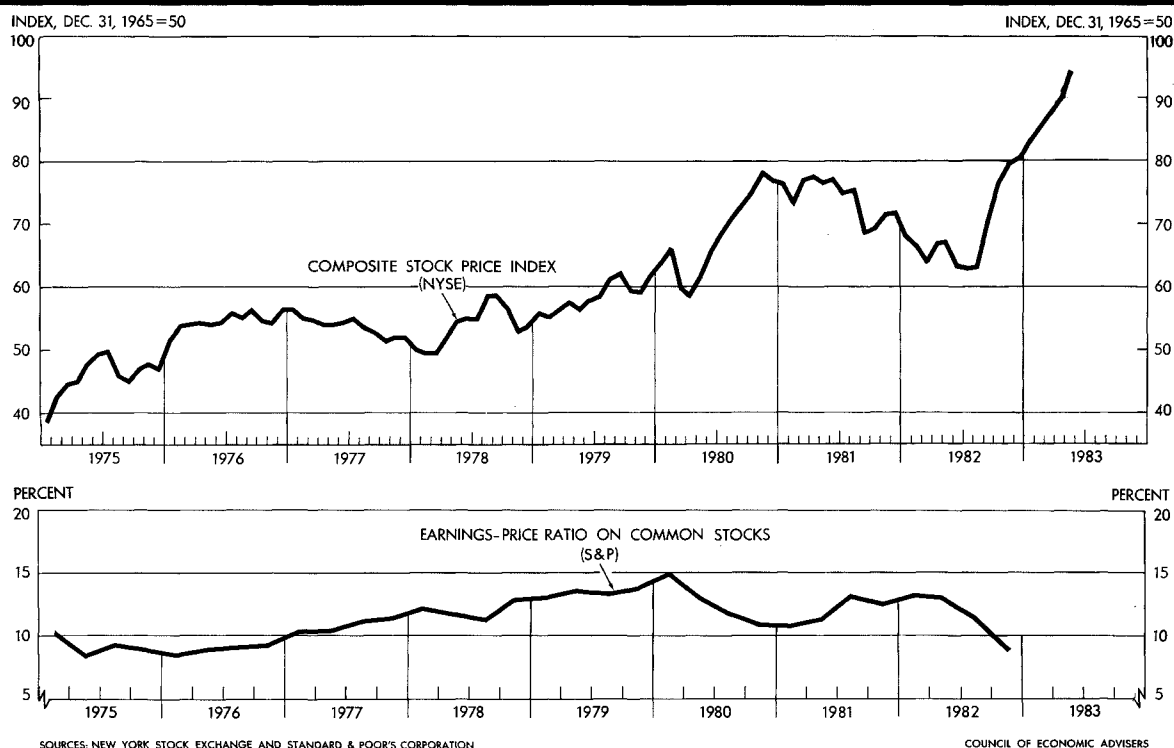

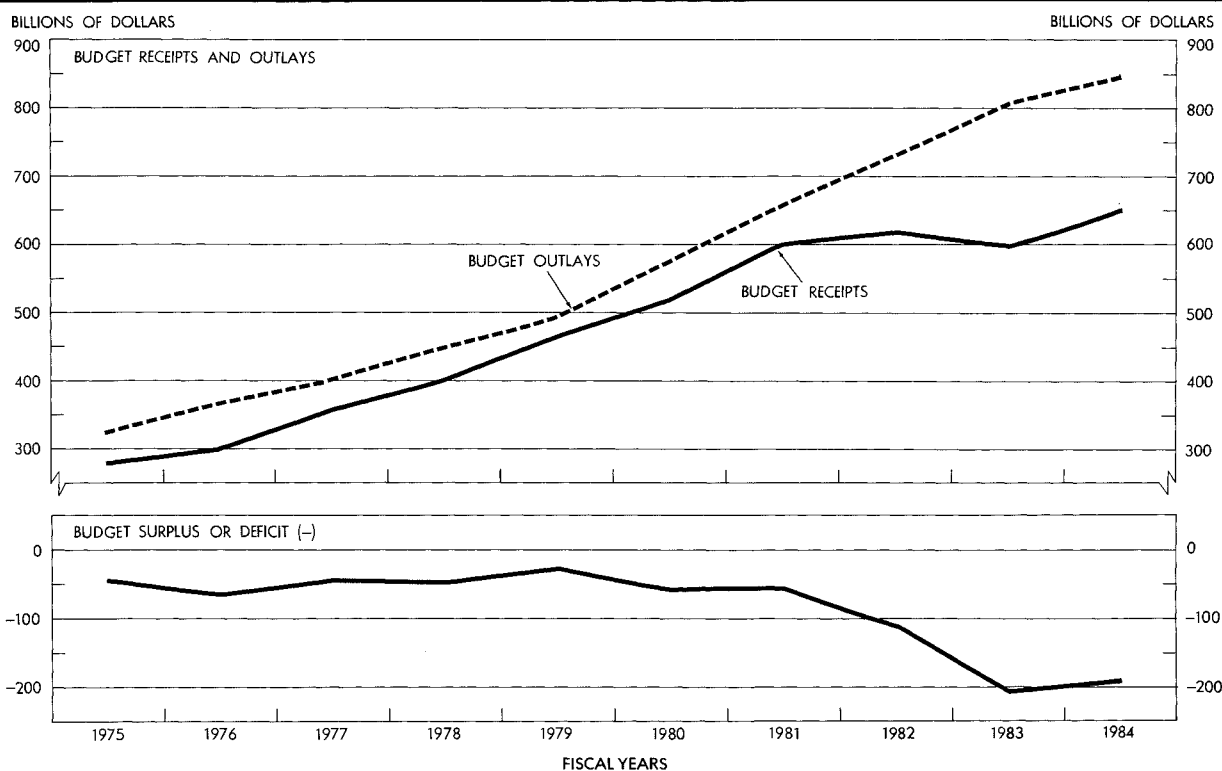

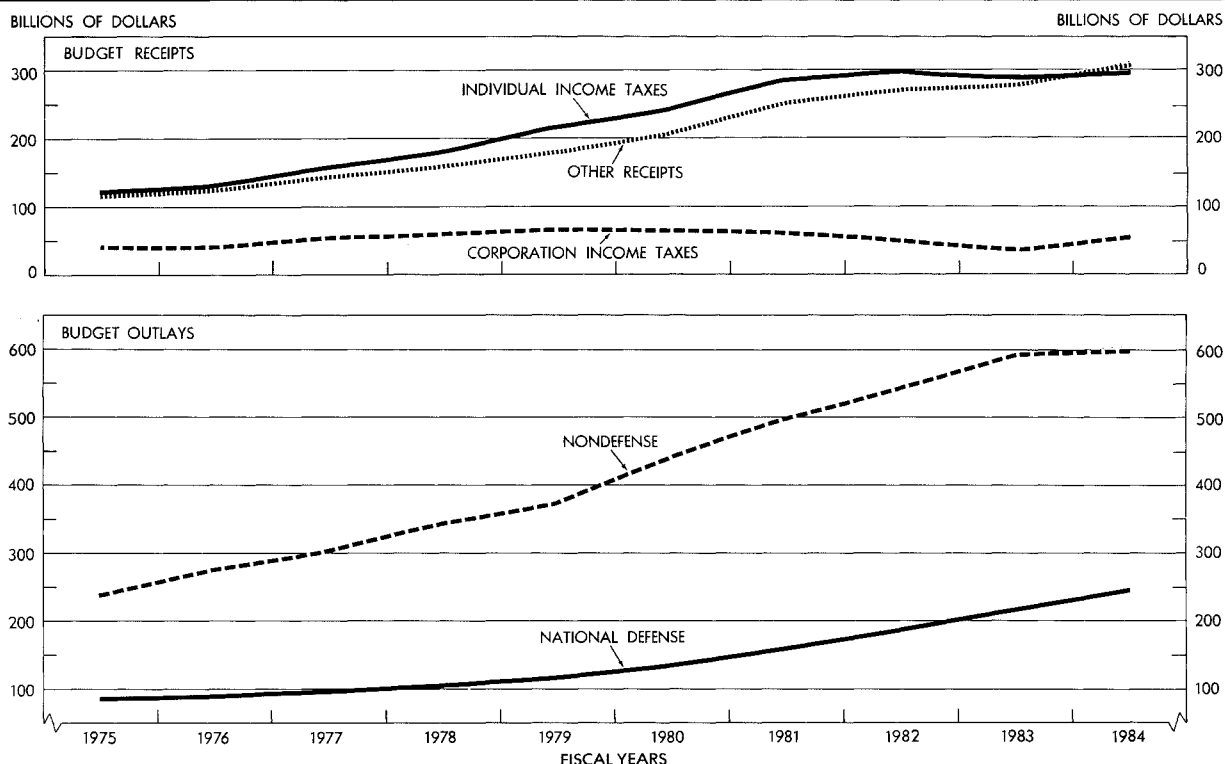

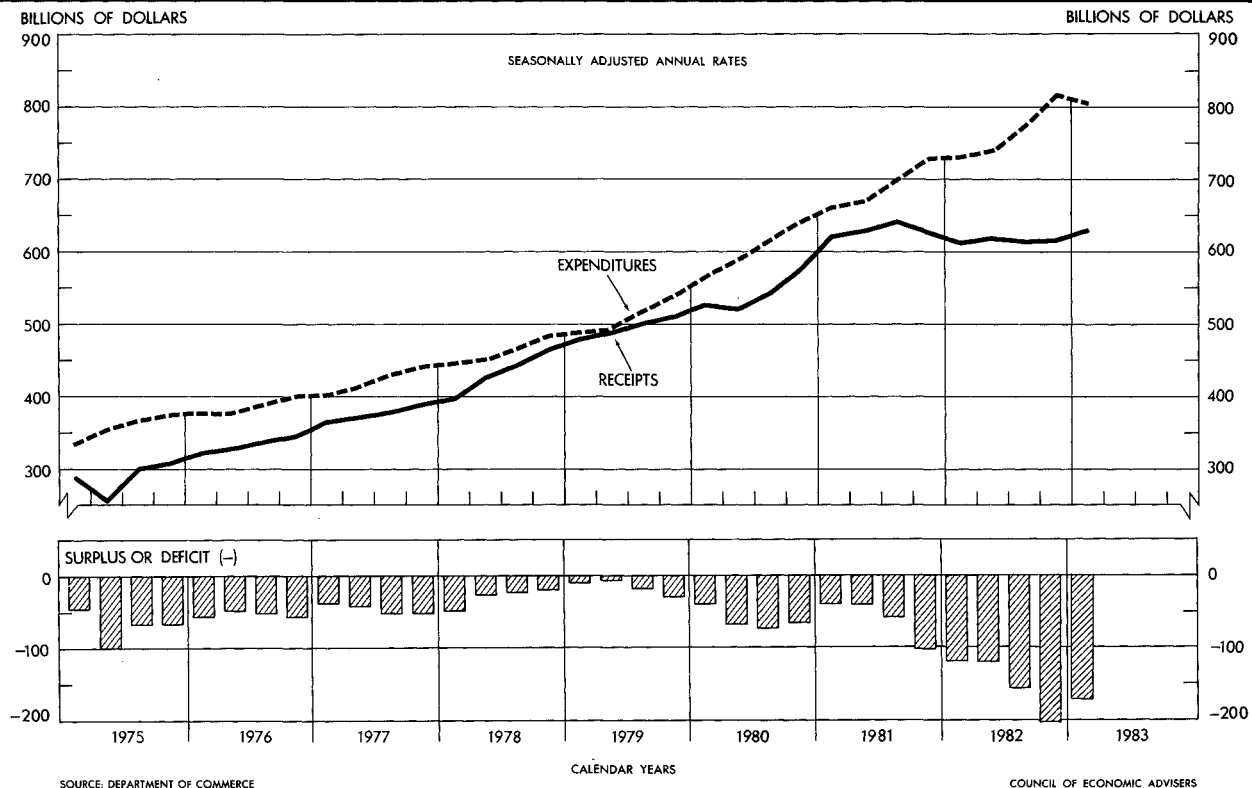

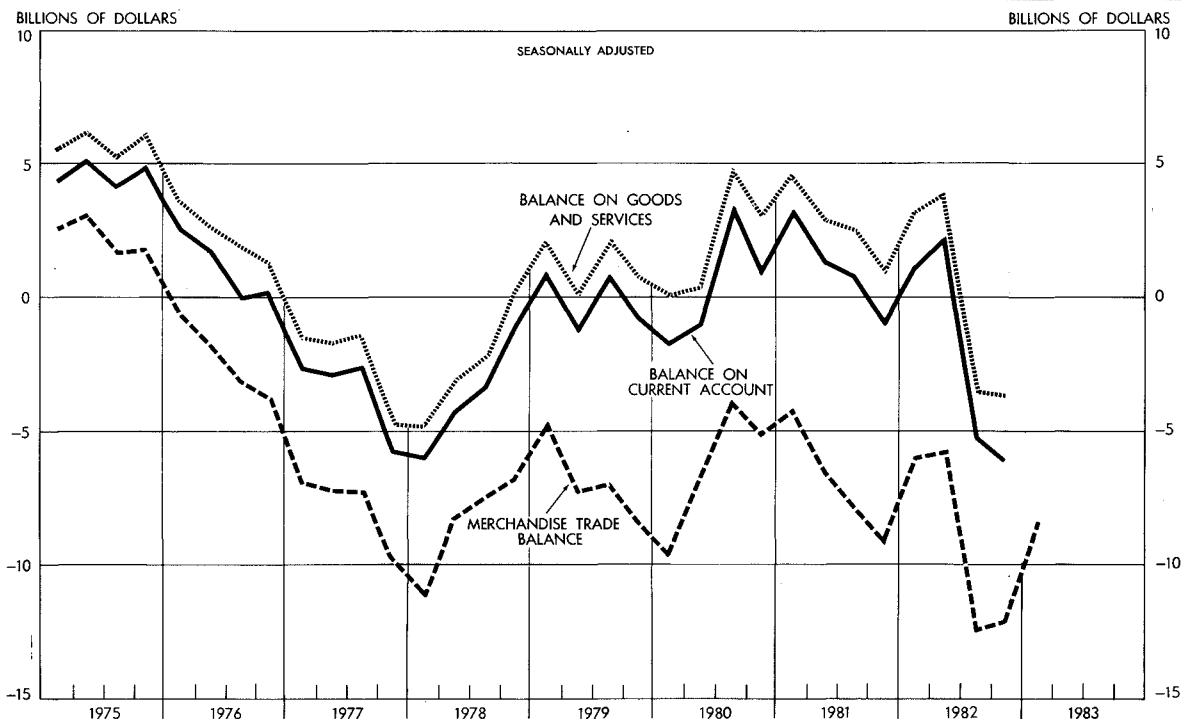

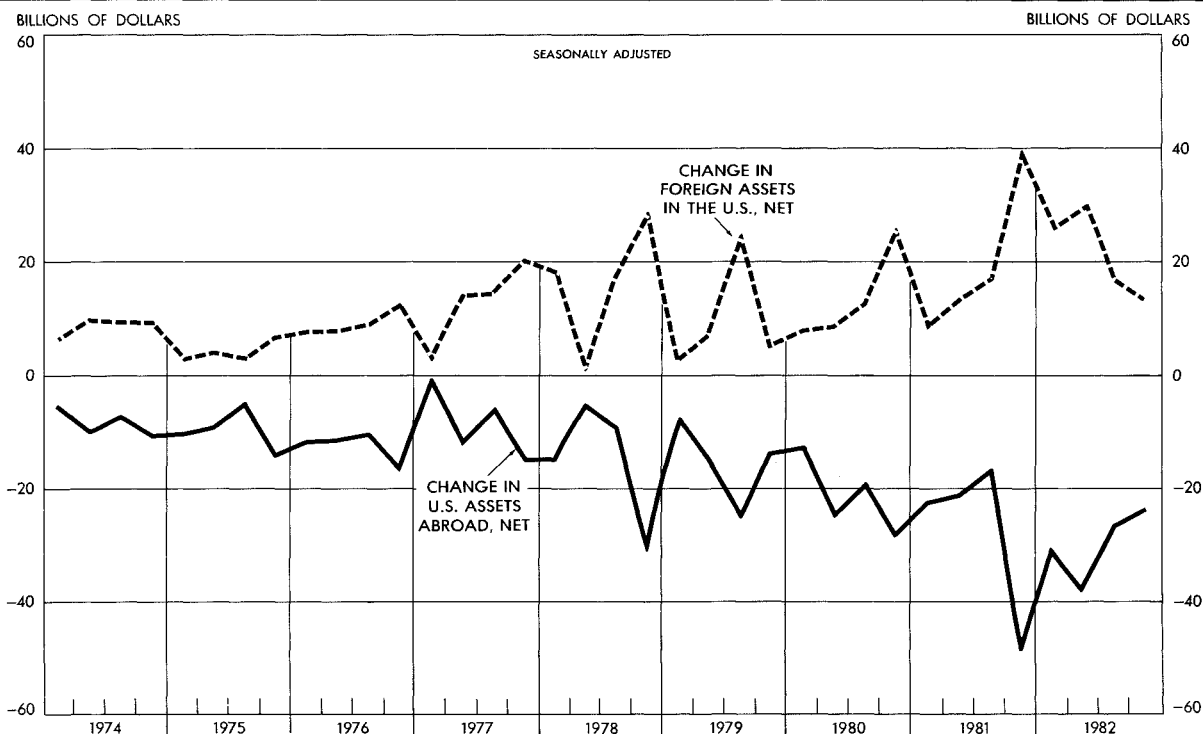

Among capital account transactions, U.S. claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$106.7 billion in 1982, compared with an \$84.5 billion increase in 1981. U.S. liabilities to private foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$69.8 billion in 1982, compared with a \$44.2 billion increase in 1981.
