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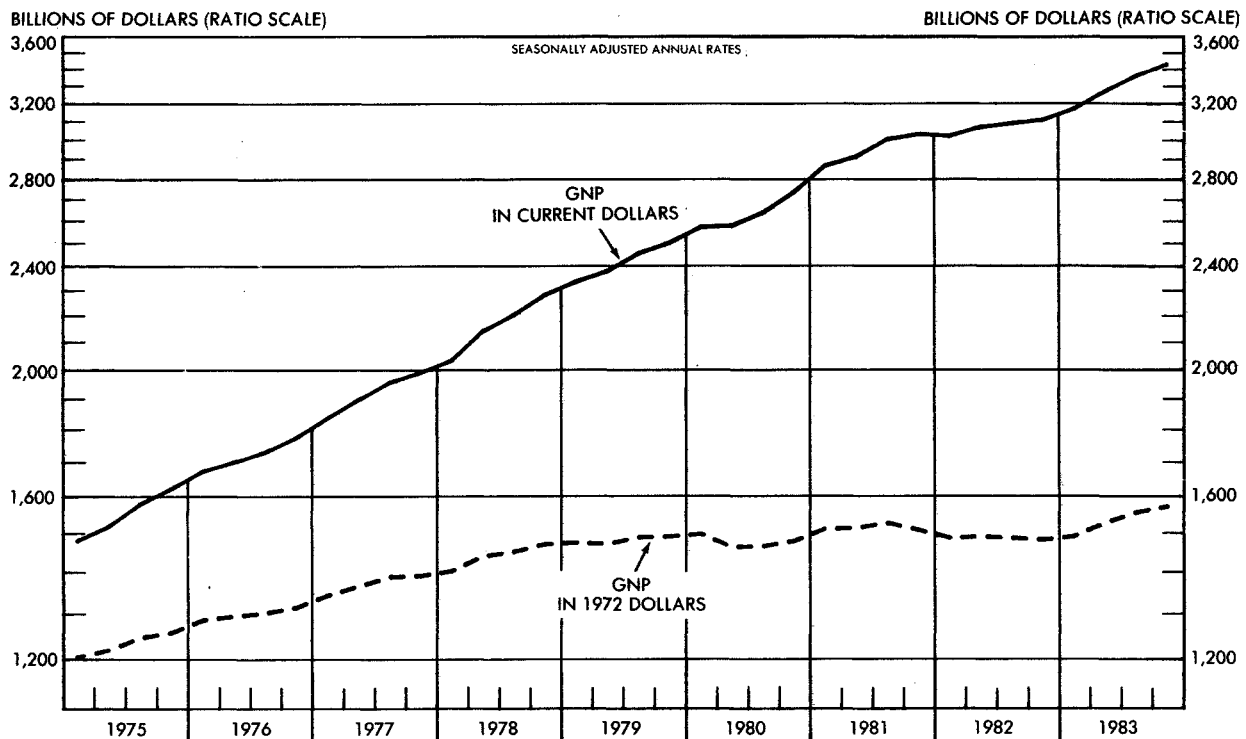
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to revised estimates for the fourth quarter of 1983, gross national product rose \$75.1 billion or 9.2 percent, both at annual rates. Real output (GNP adjusted for price changes) rose 4.9 percent (annual rate) and the implicit price deflator rose at a 4.2 percent annual rate.

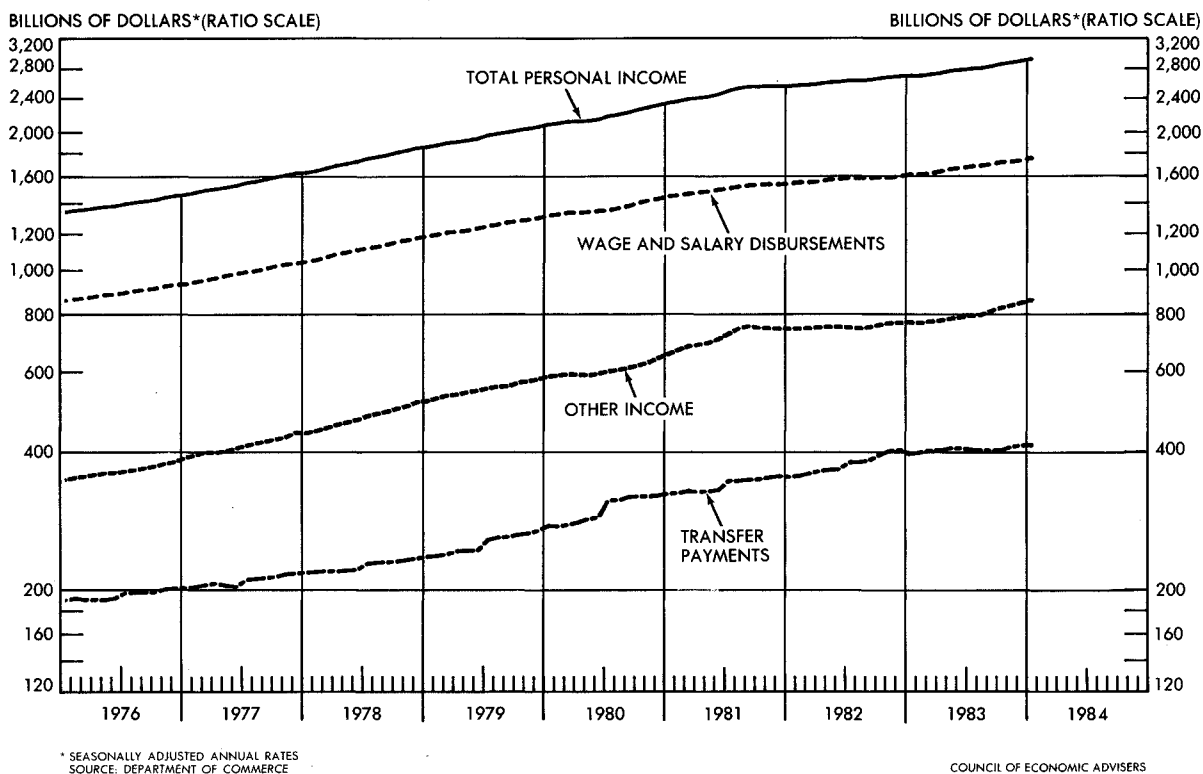

SOURCES OF PERSONAL INCOME

Personal income increased \$30.8 billion (annual rate) in January, following a rise of \$22.9 billion in December. Wages and salaries rose \$22.8 billion in January compared to a rise of \$10.0 billion in December.

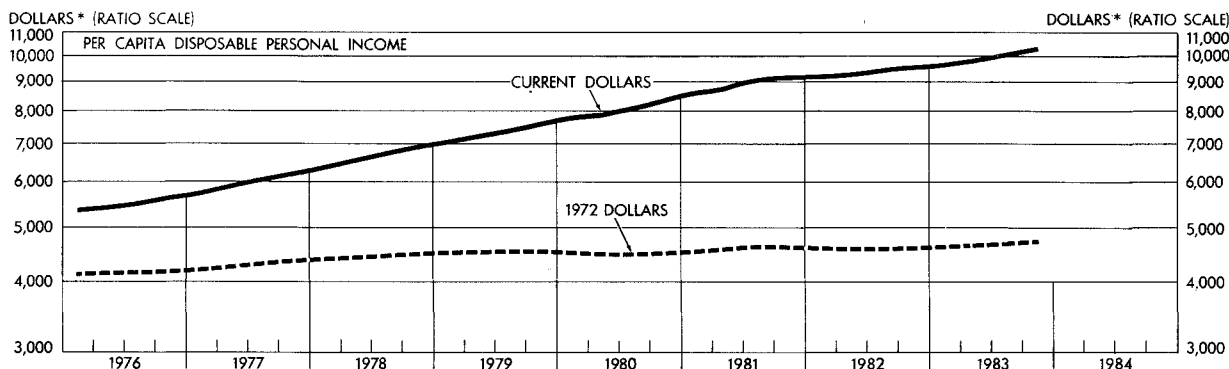
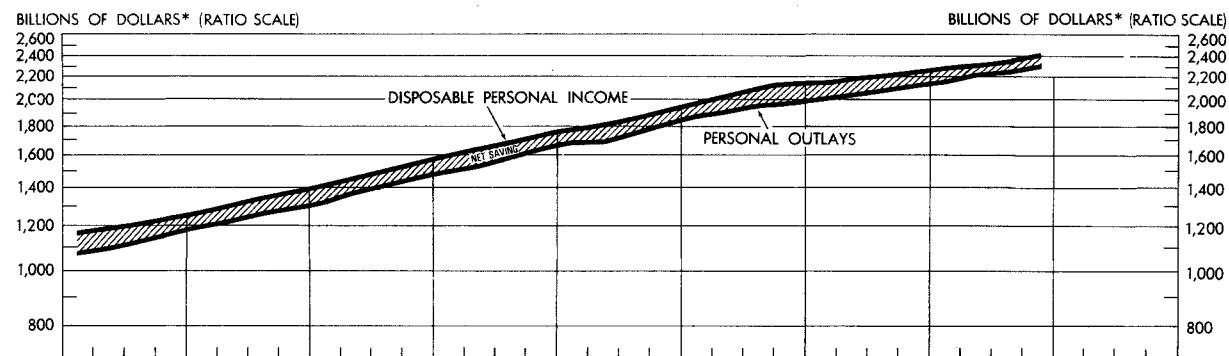

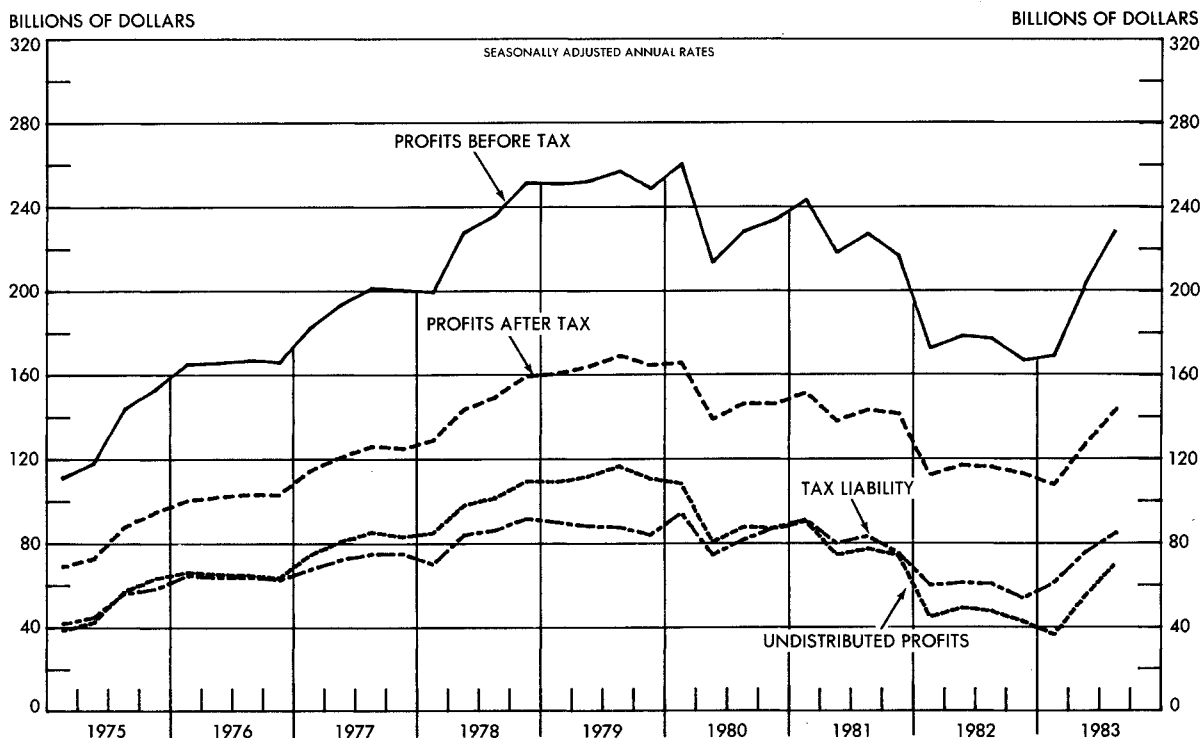

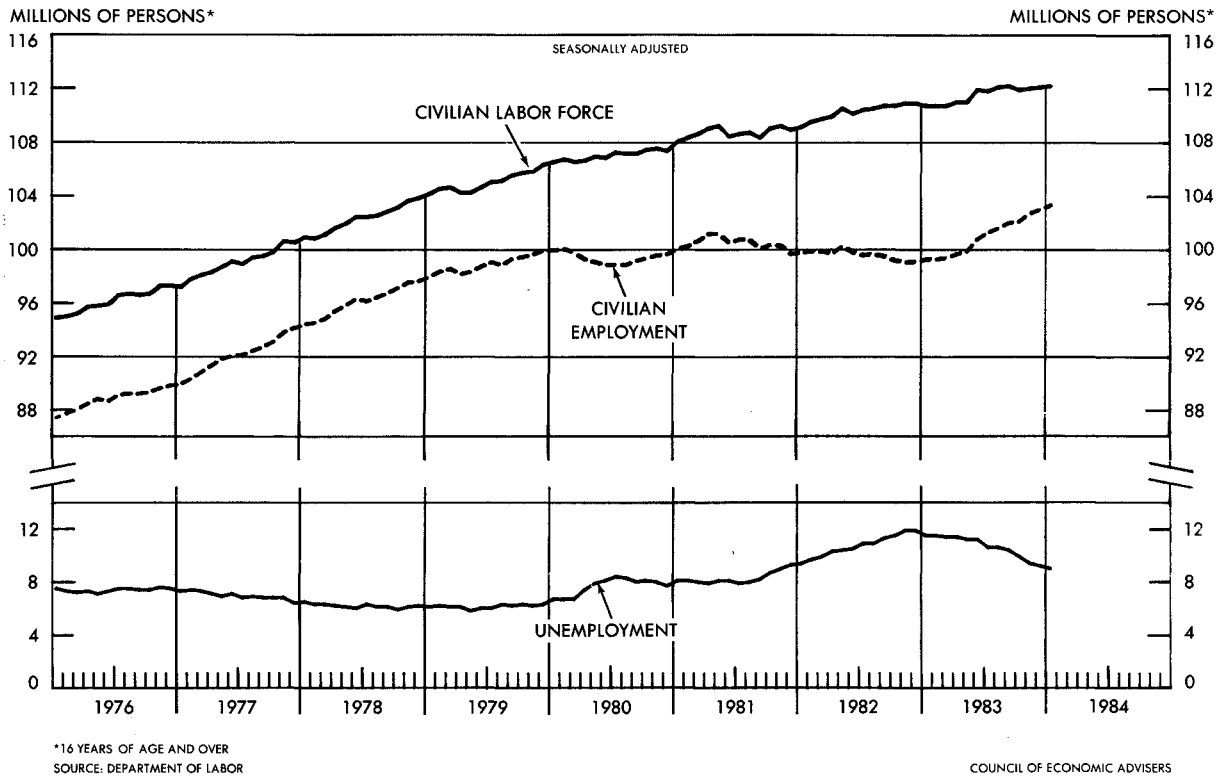

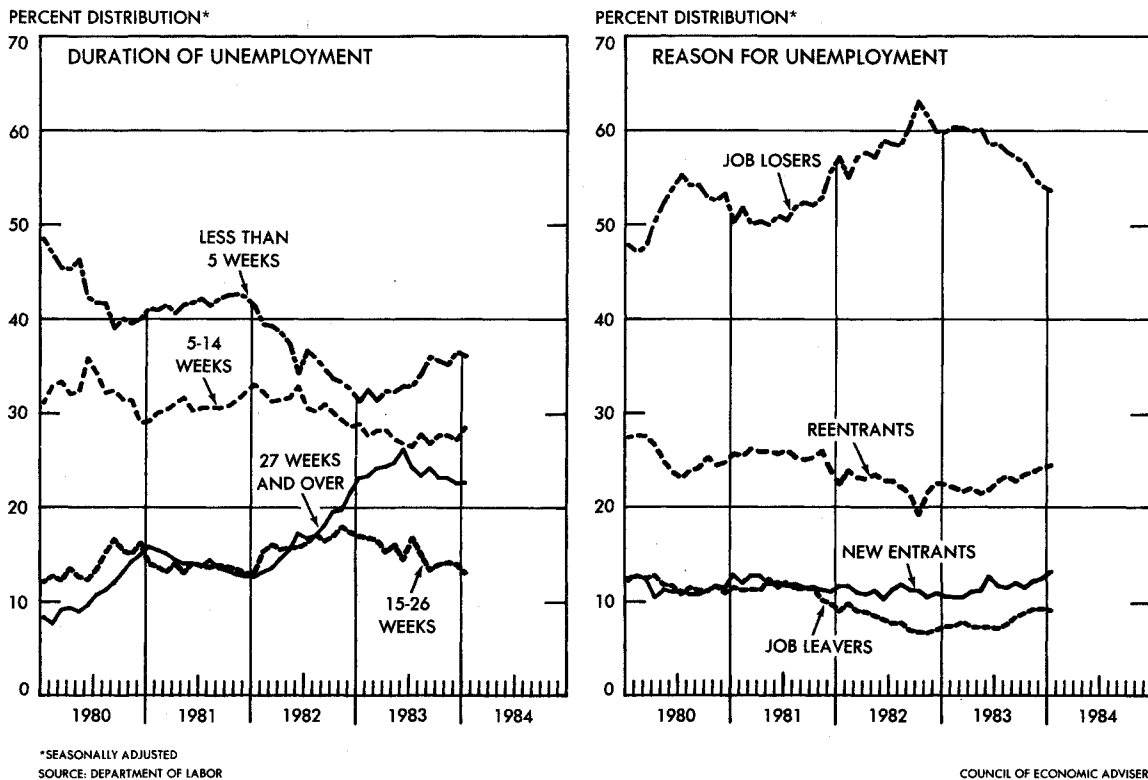

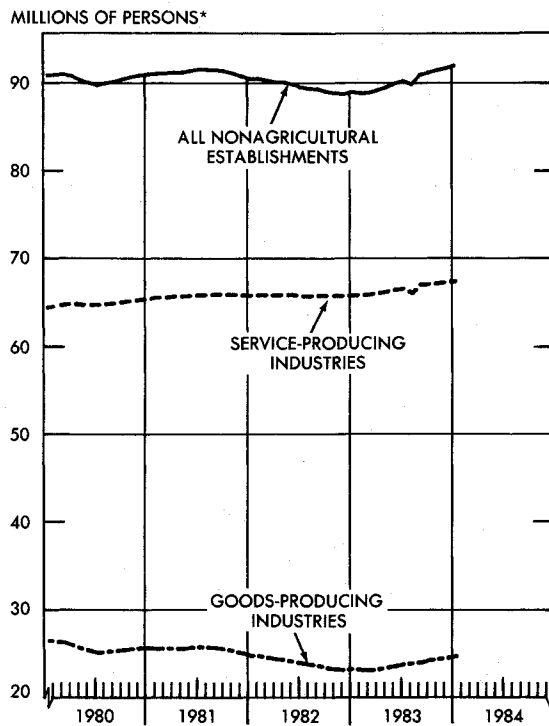

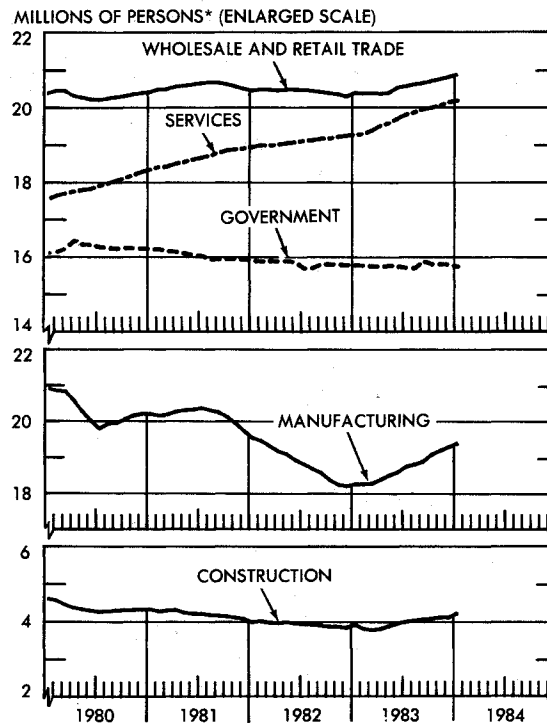

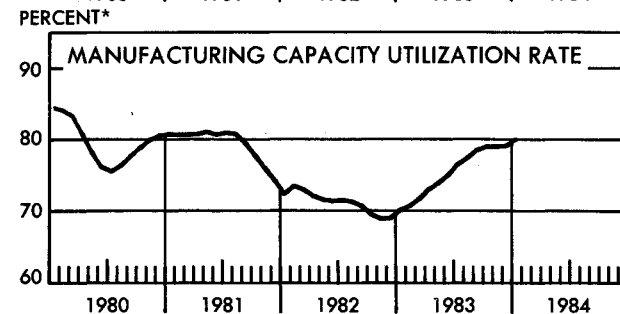
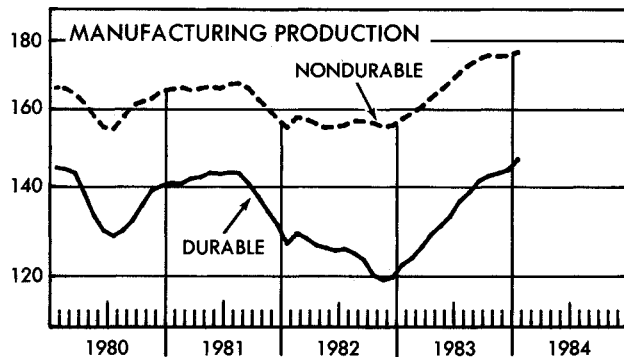
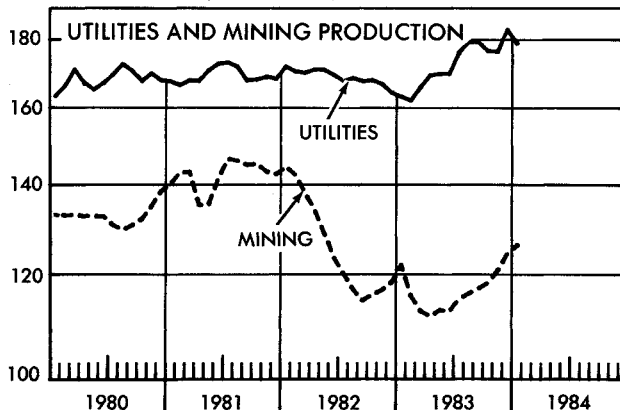
INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

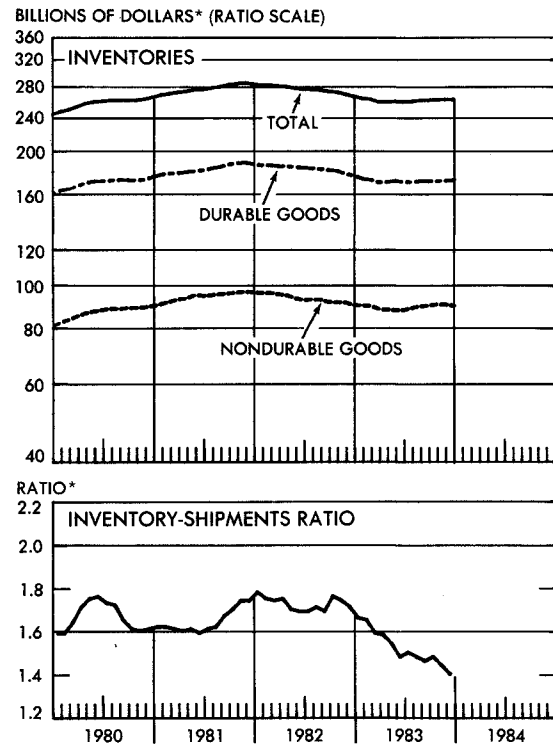

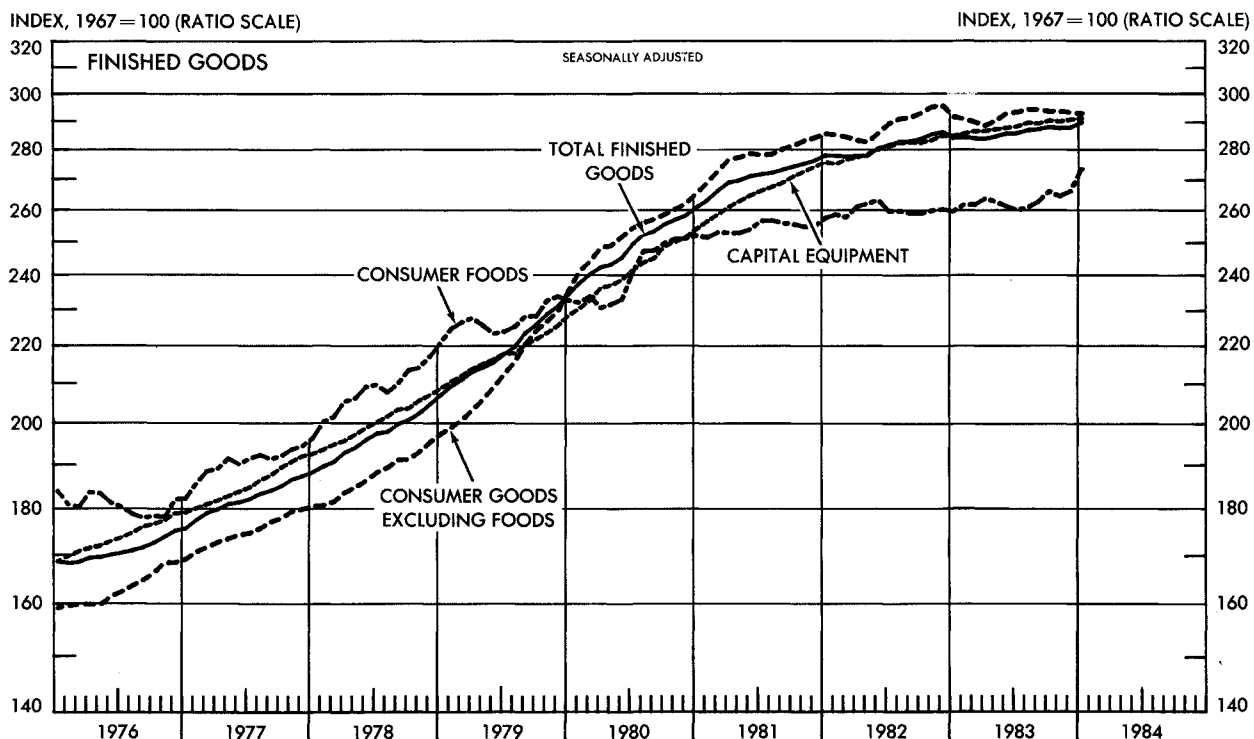

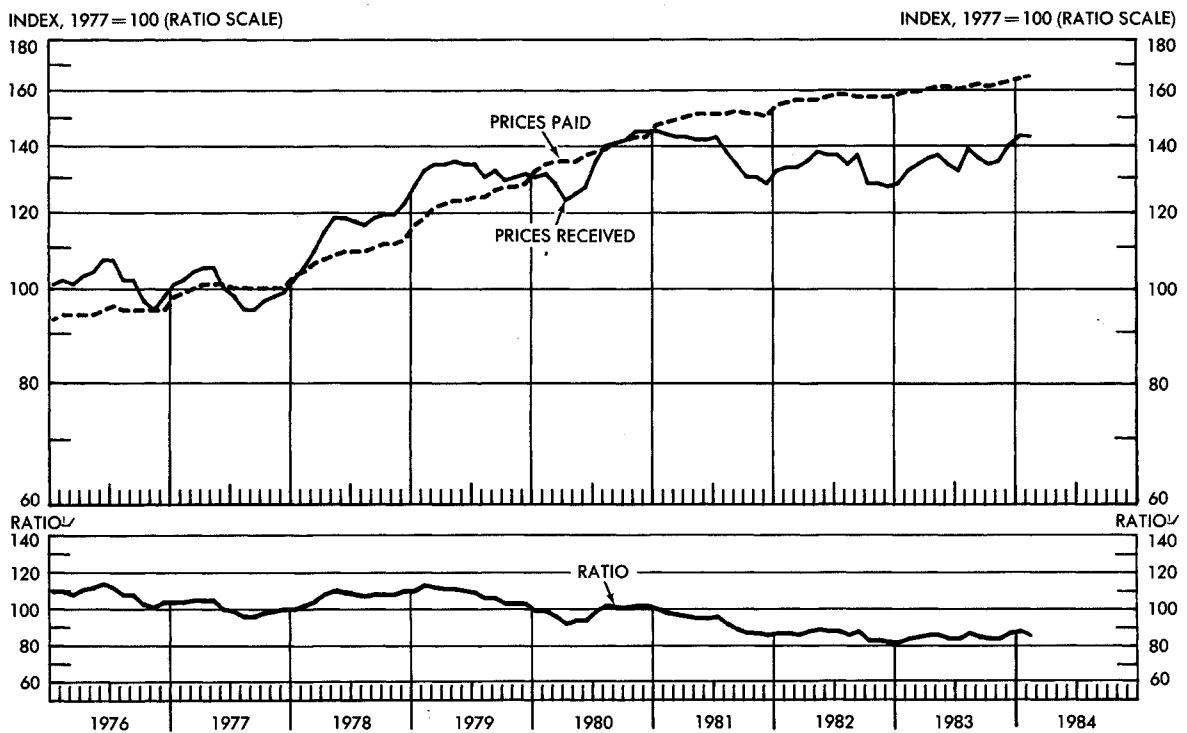

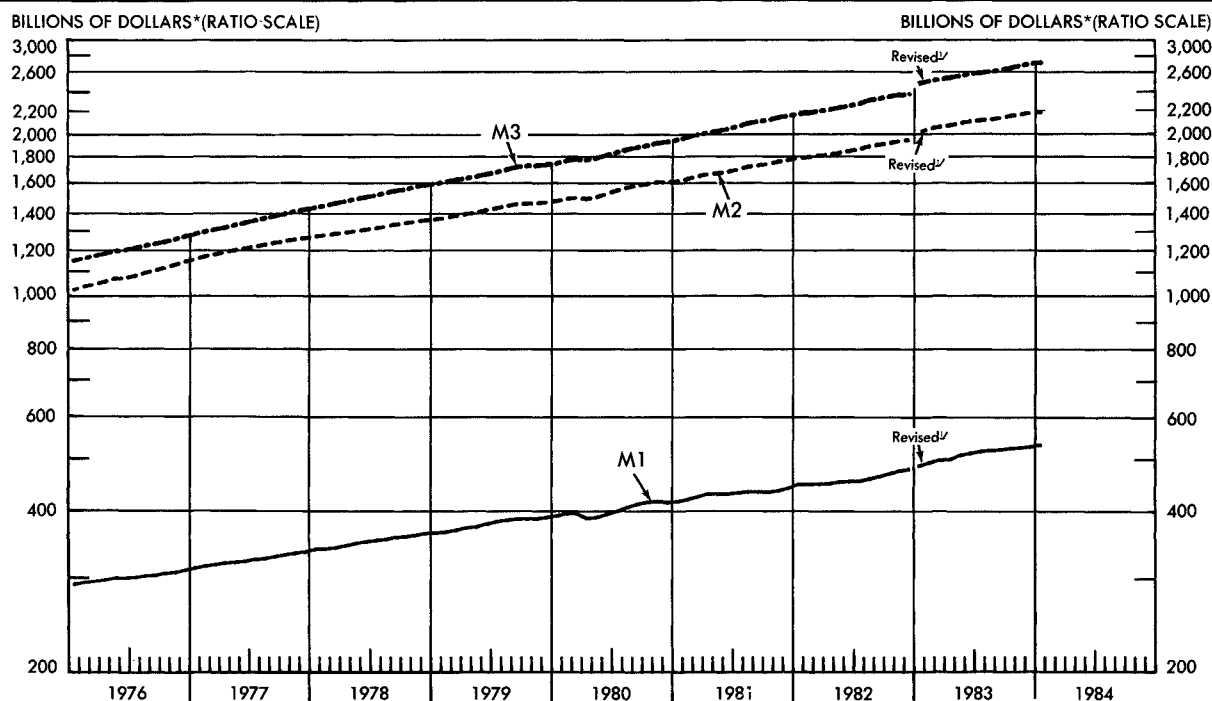

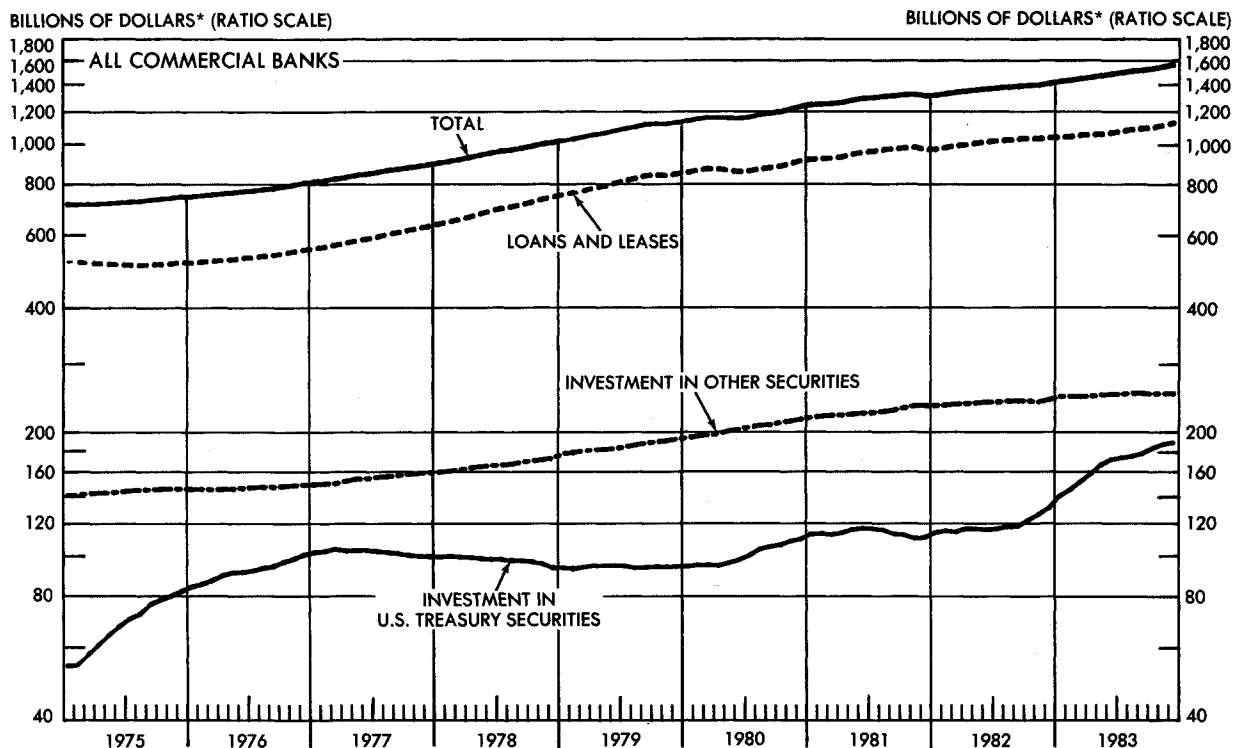

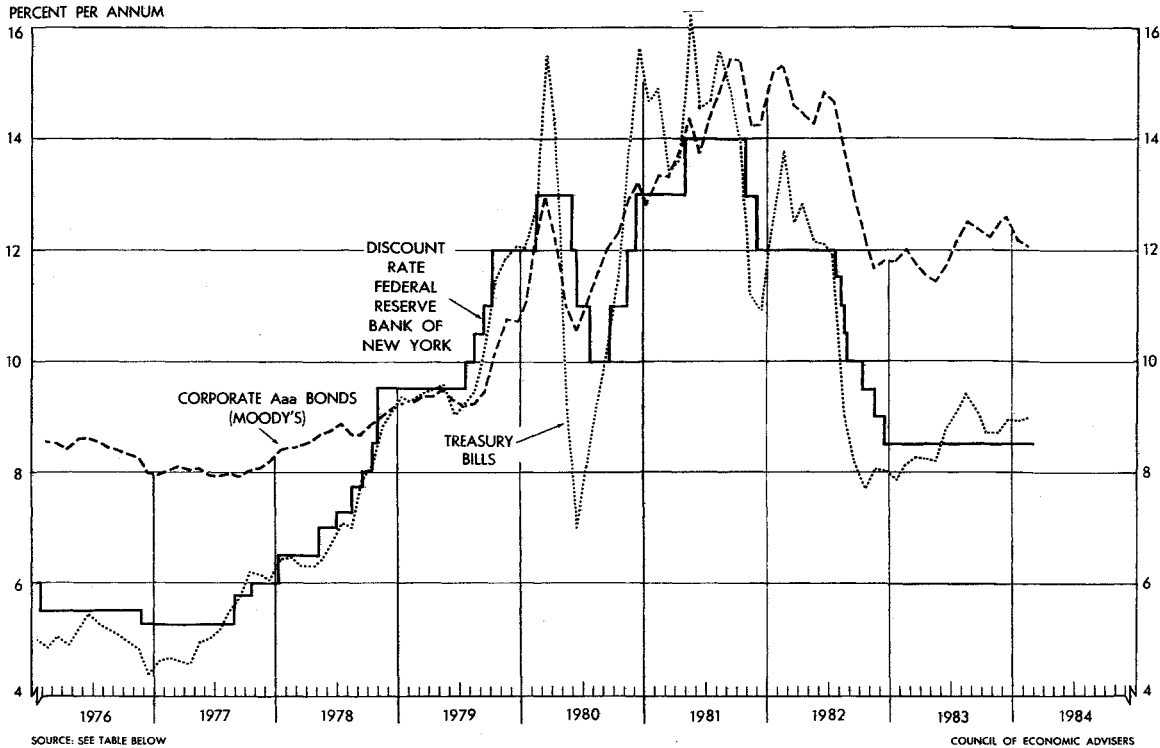

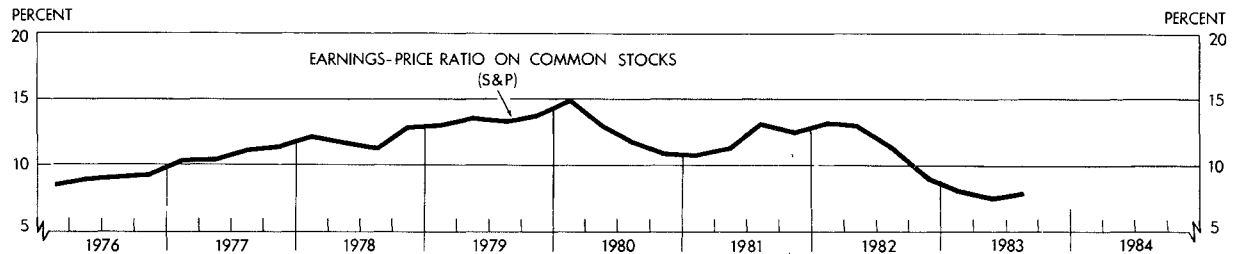
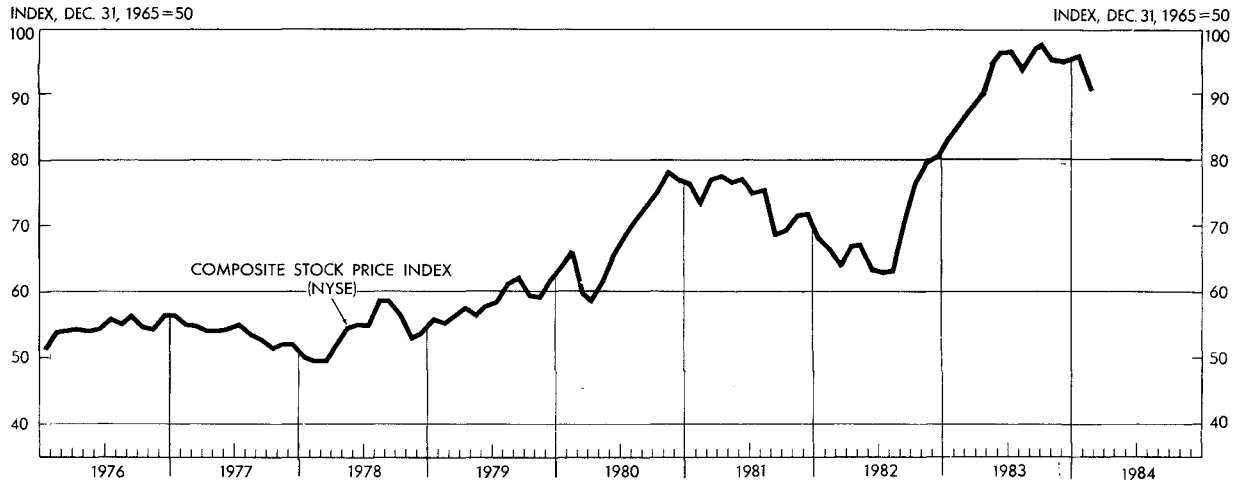

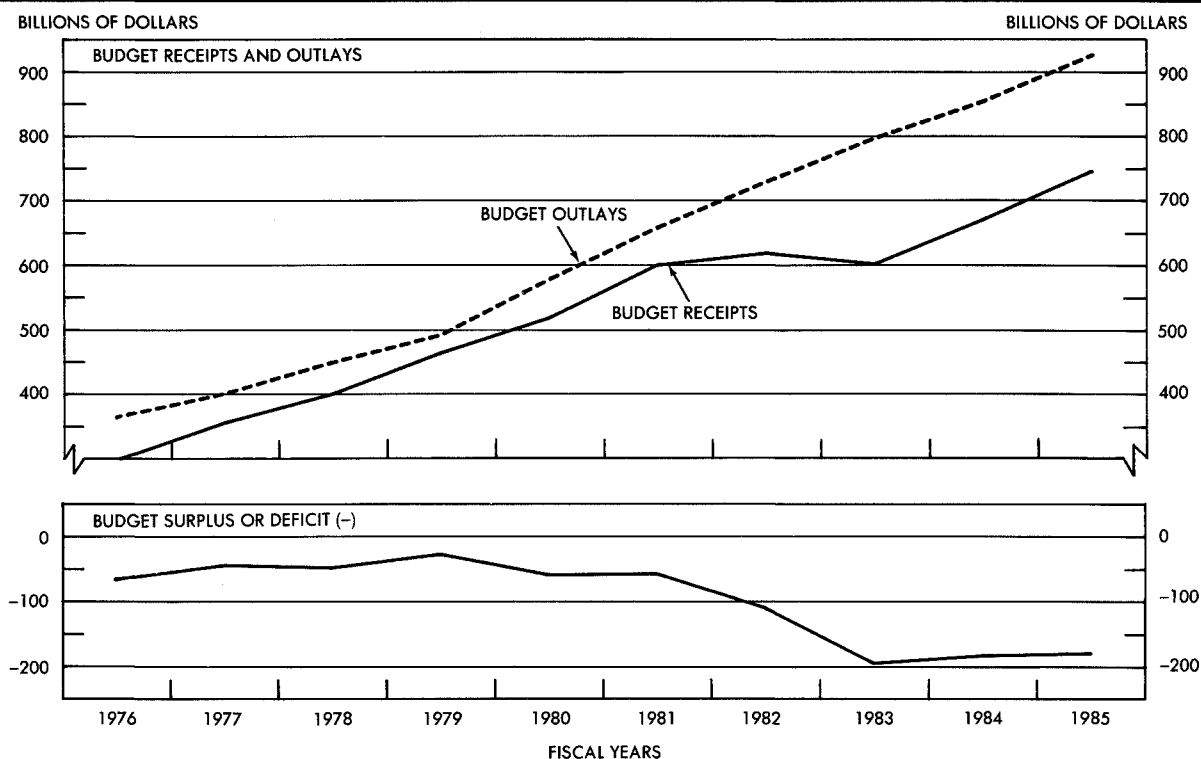

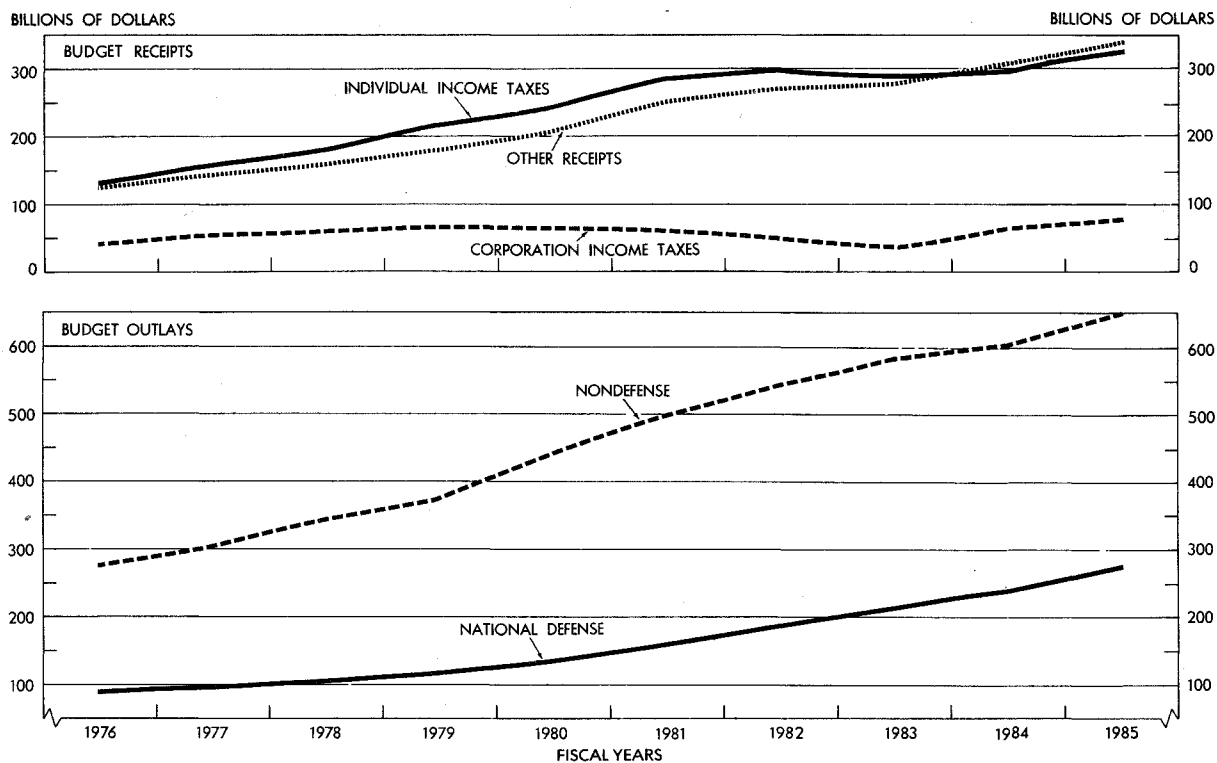

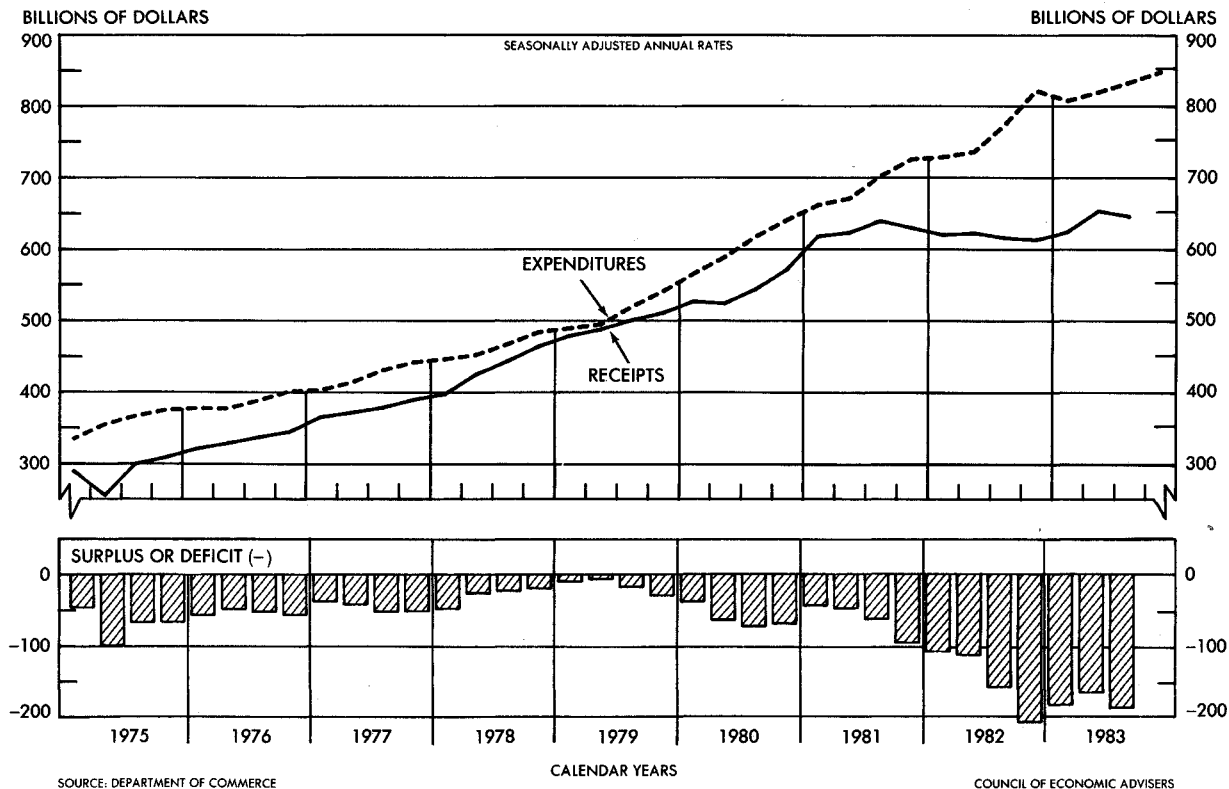

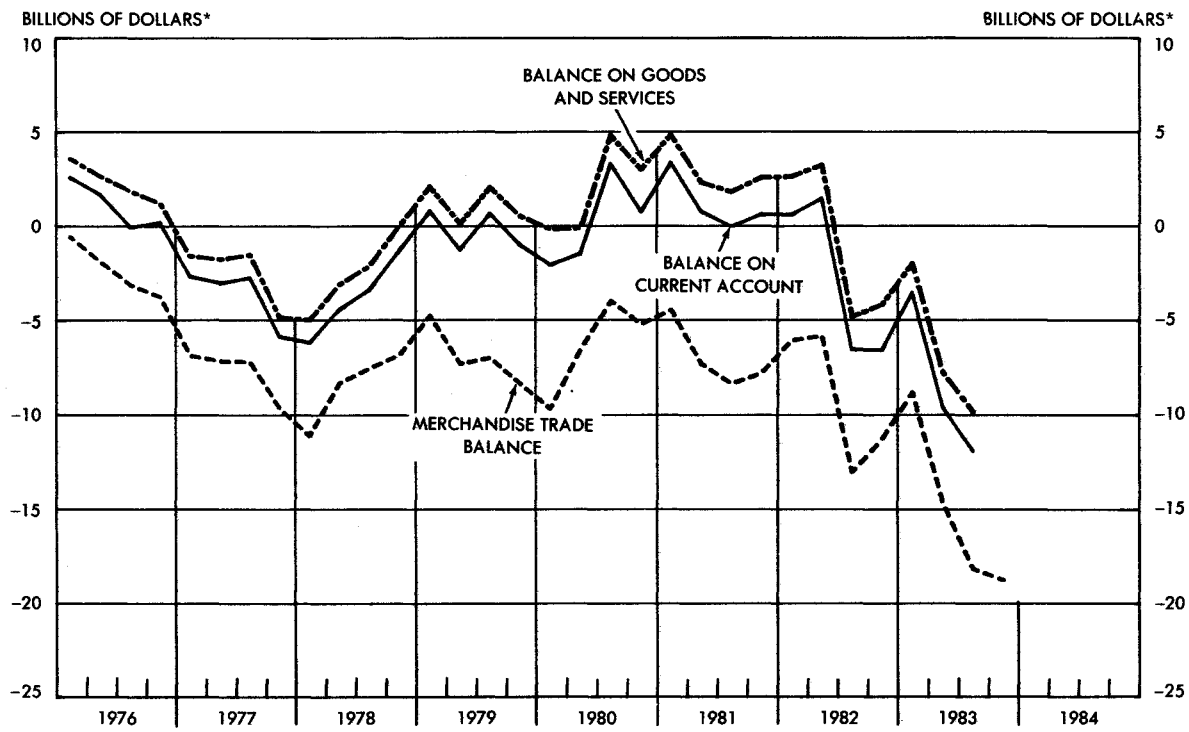

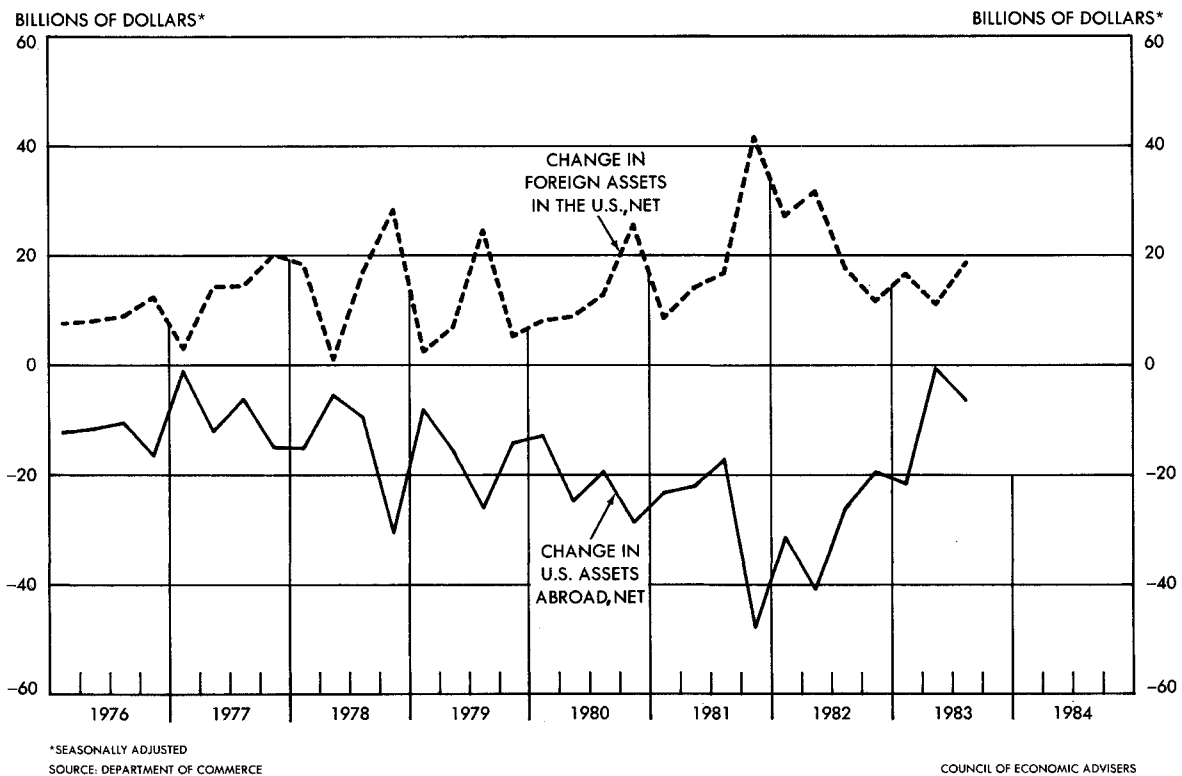

In the capital accounts, claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks increased \$0.5 billion in the third quarter compared to a decrease of \$5.2 billion in the second quarter. Liabilities to foreigners and international financial institutions reported by U.S. banks increased \$17.4 billion compared to a \$4.0 billion increase in the second quarter.
