JOINT RESOLUTION [S.J. Res. 55]

To print the monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators"

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Joint Economic Committee be authorized to issue a monthly publication entitled "Economic Indicators," and that a sufficient quantity be printed to furnish one copy to each Member of Congress; the Secretary and the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate; the Clerk, Sergeant at Arms, and Doorkeeper of the House of Representatives; two copies to the libraries of the Senate and House, and the Congressional Library; seven hundred copies to the Joint Economic Committee; and the required numbers of copies to the Superintendent of Documents for distribution to depository libraries; and that the Superintendent of Documents be authorized to have copies printed for sale to the public.

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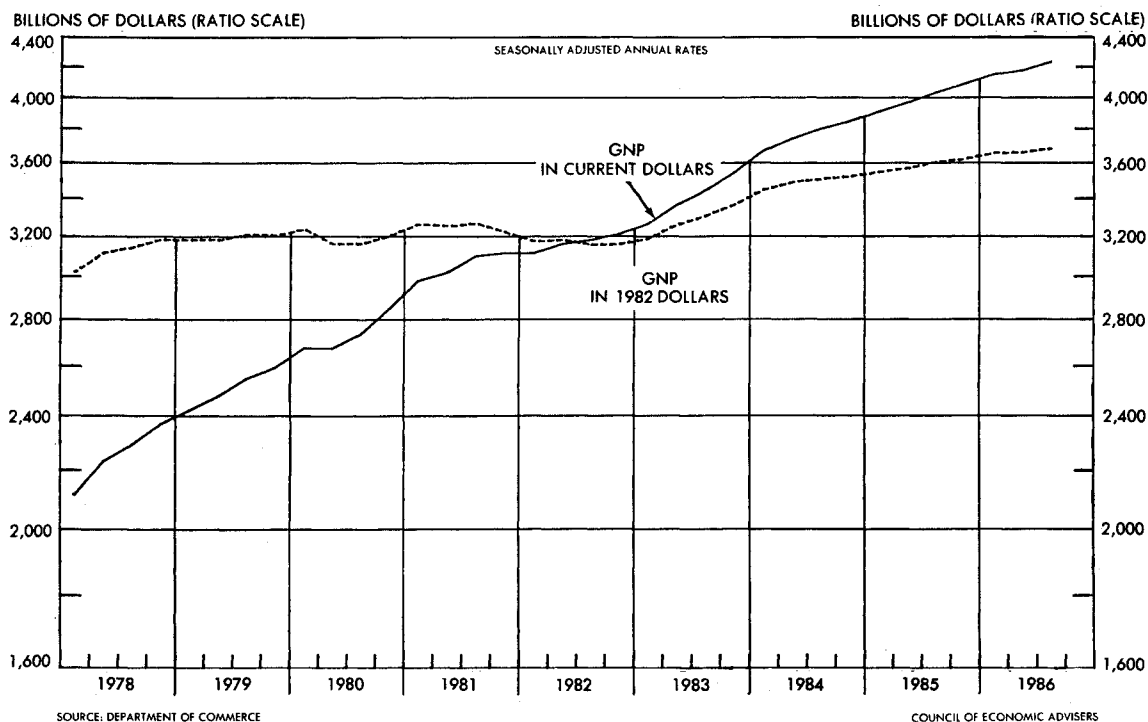
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

According to revised estimates for the third quarter of 1986, current-dollar gross national product (GNP) rose 6.4 percent (annual rate) or \$65.1 billion. Real GNP (GNP adjusted for price changes) rose 2.8 percent and the implicit price deflator rose 3.6 percent.

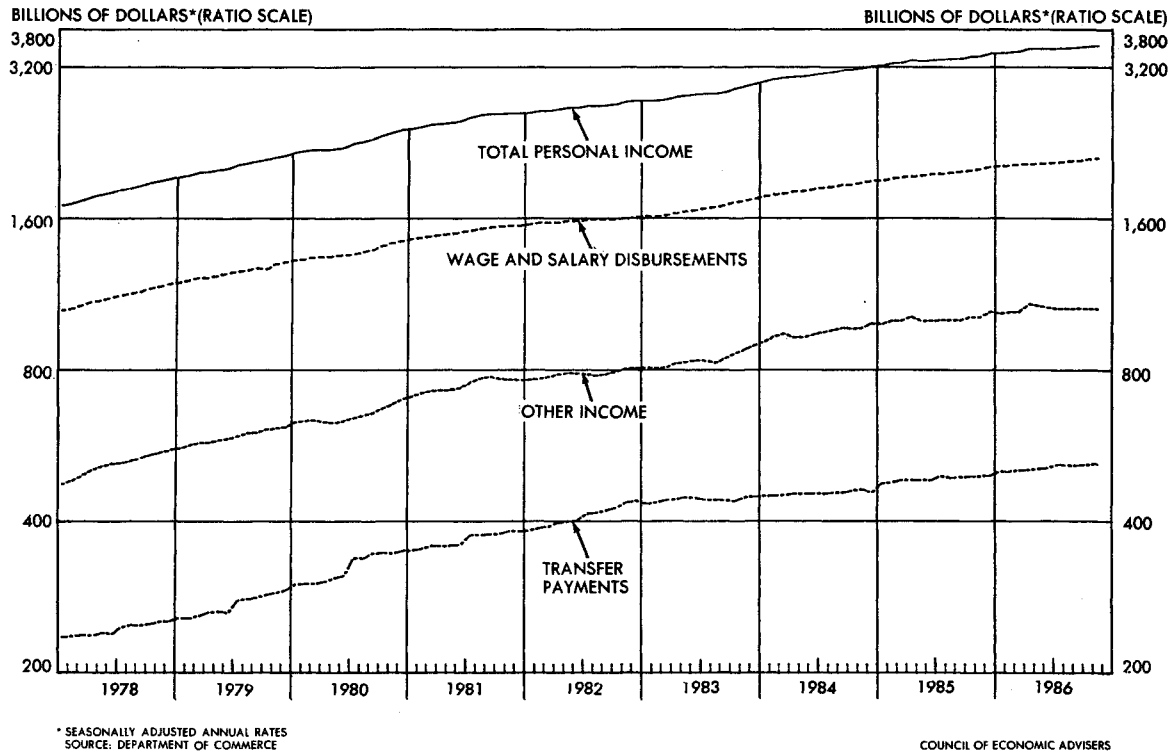

SOURCES OF PERSONAL INCOME

Personal income rose \$10.7 billion (annual rate) in November, following a rise of \$12.4 billion in October. The increases were affected by two special factors: bonus payments in October to employees in the automobile industry (which lowered the November increases and raised the October increases) and decreases in subsidy payments to farmers (which lowered the increases in both months). Excluding the effect of these factors, personal income rose \$19.1 billion in November and \$9.8 billion in October.

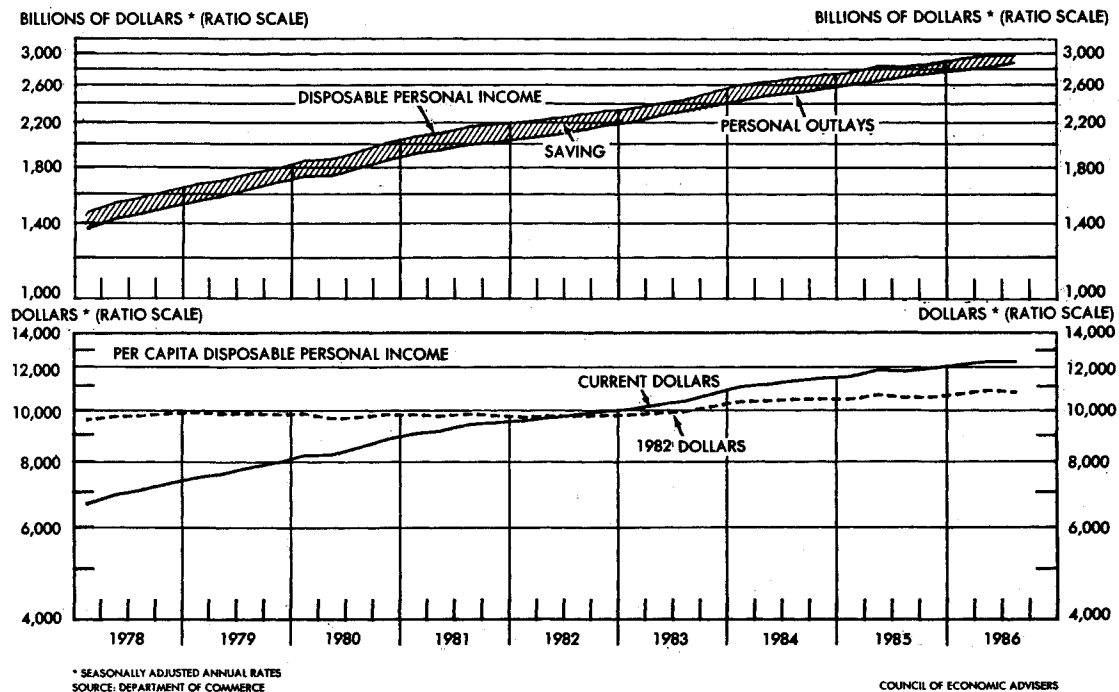

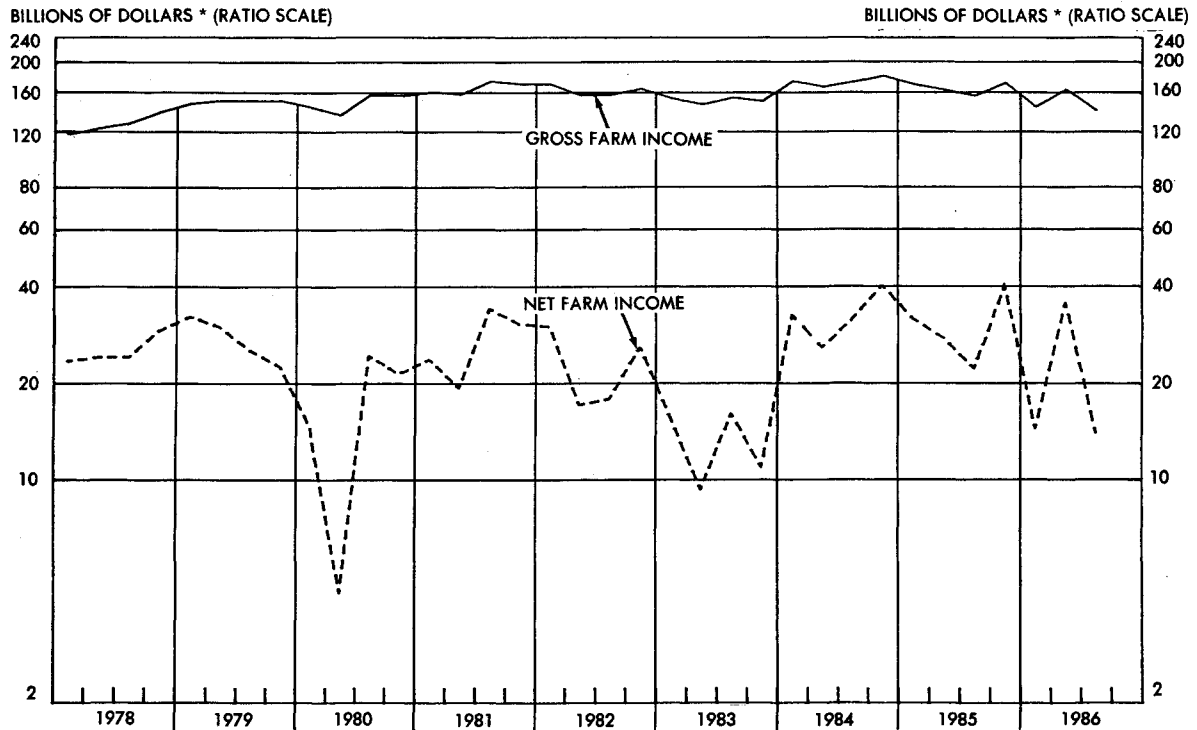

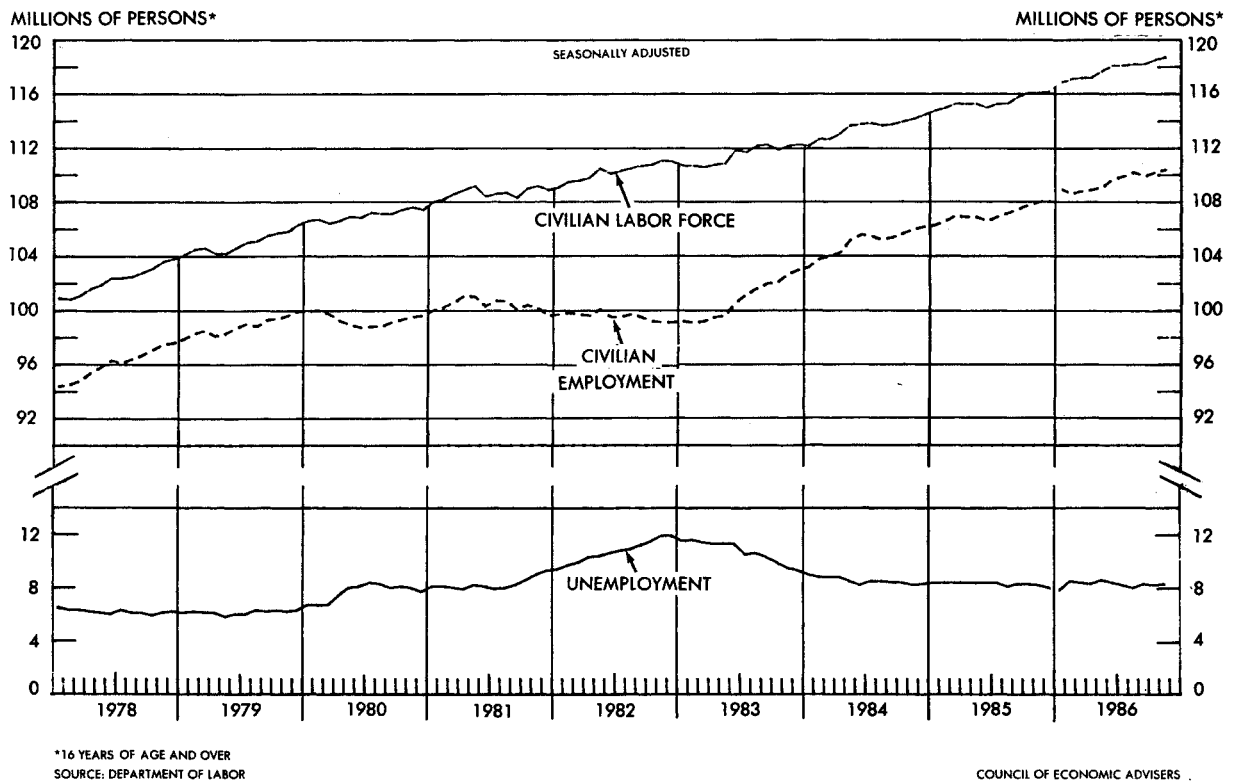

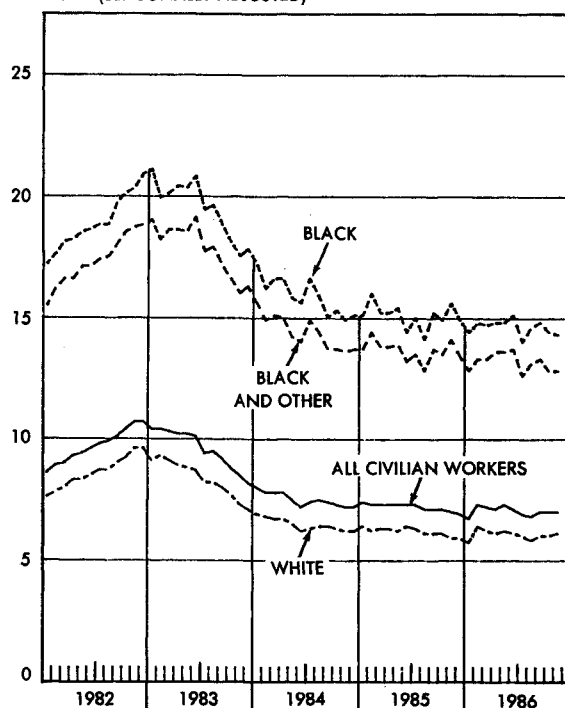

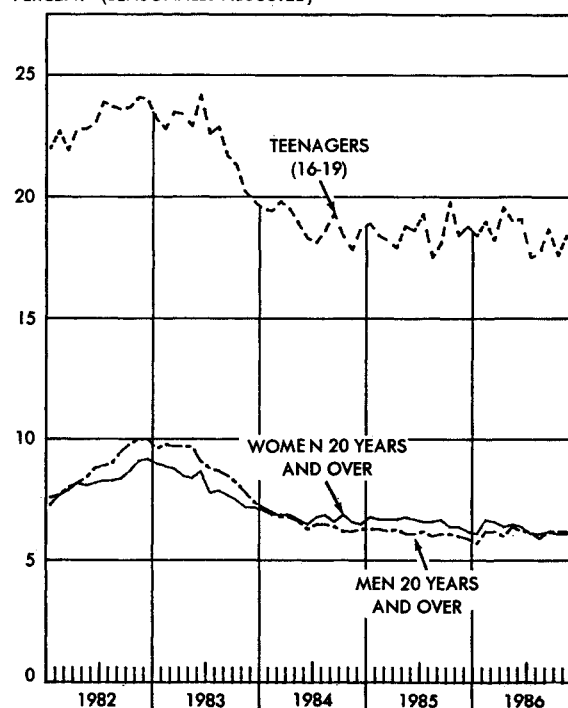
SELECTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATES

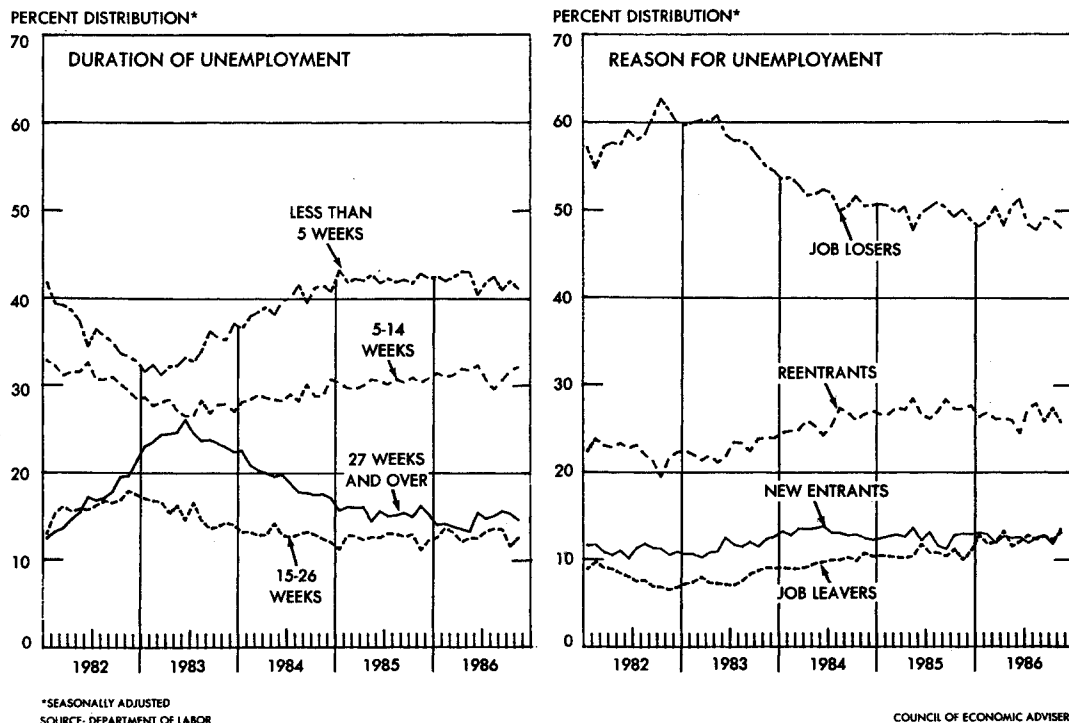

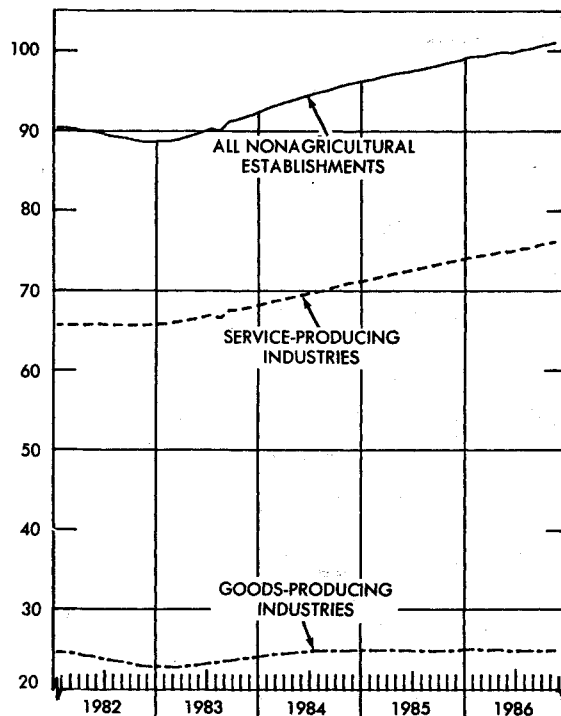

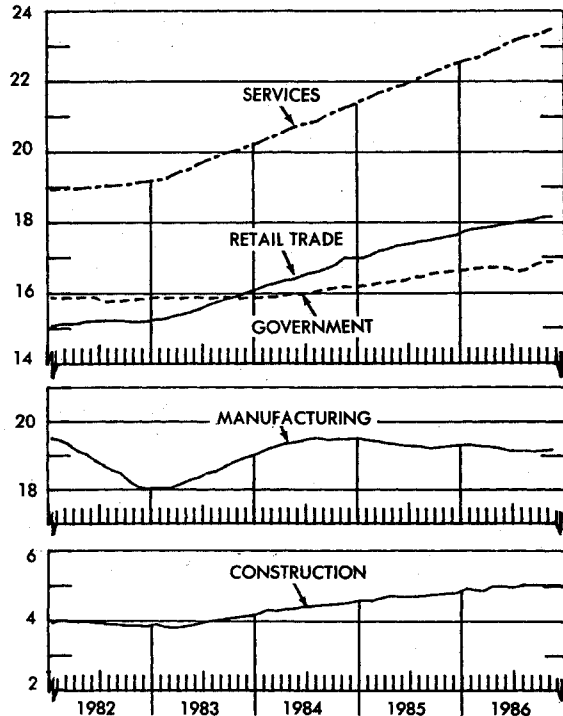

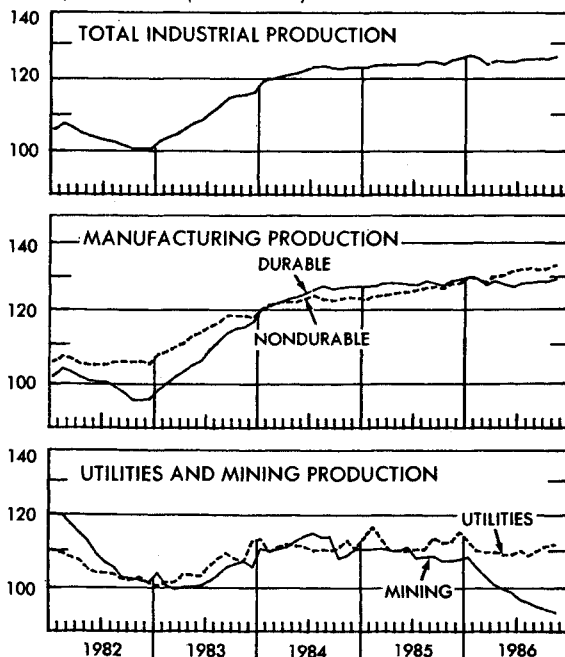

INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION AND CAPACITY UTILIZATION

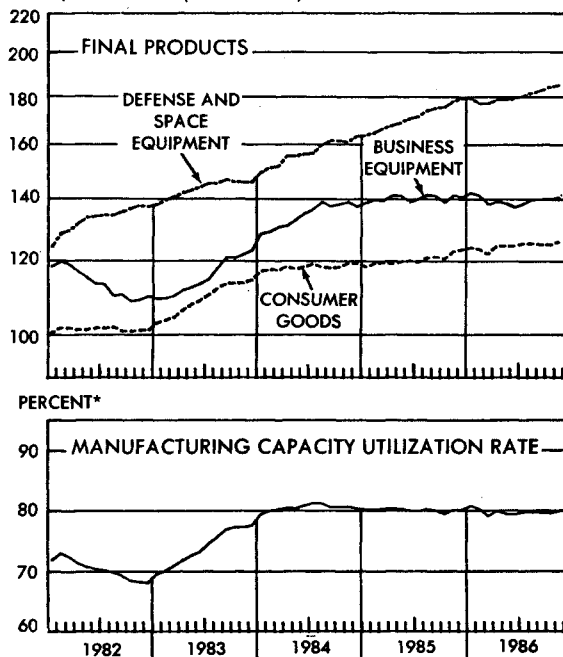
Industrial production rose 0.6 percent in November, following virtually no change in the previous 3 months. The index for November was 0.8 percent above its year-earlier level.

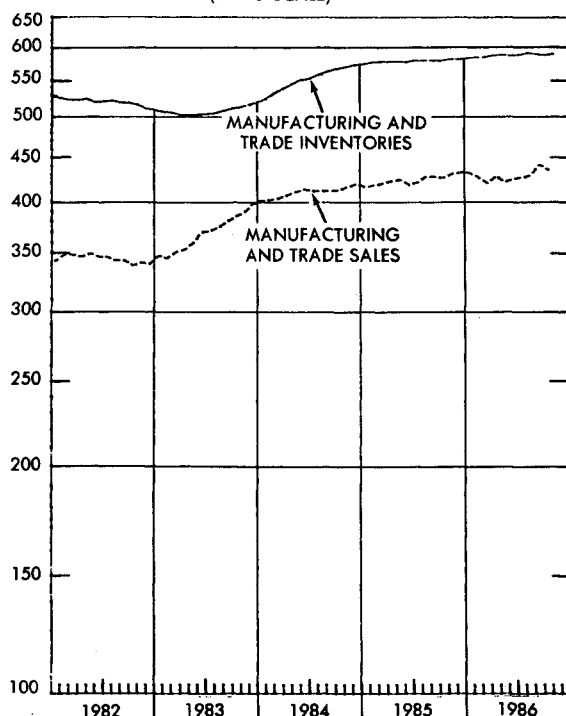

BUSINESS SALES AND INVENTORIES—Manufacturing and Trade

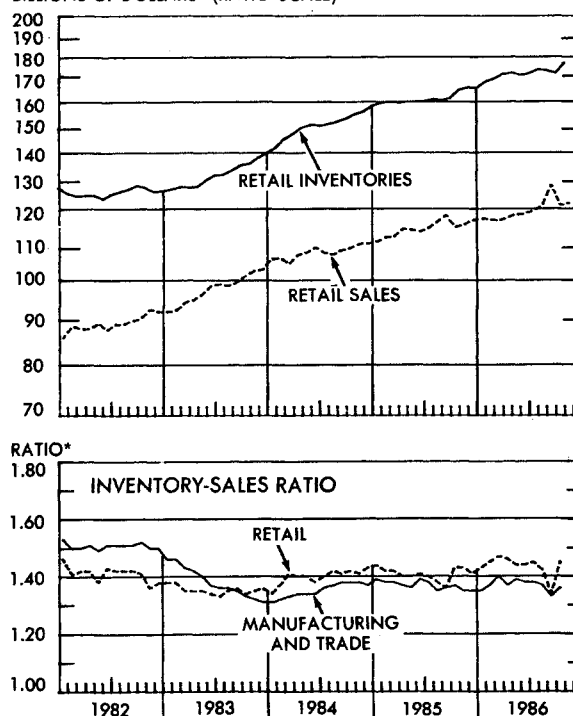

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)



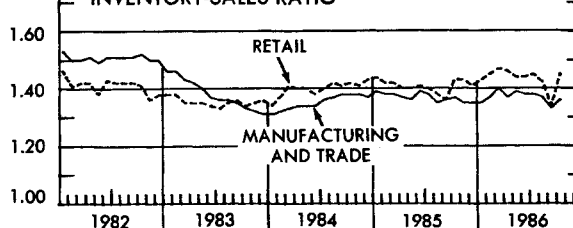

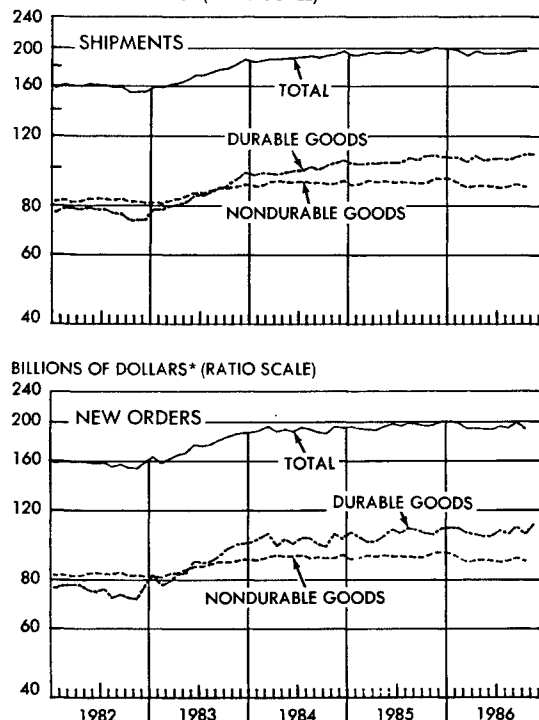

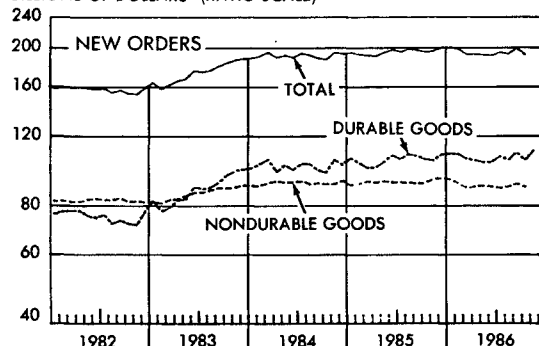

In October, manufacturers' shipments were unchanged, while inventories and orders fell. In November, according to advance data, durable goods shipments were about unchanged and new orders rose.

BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

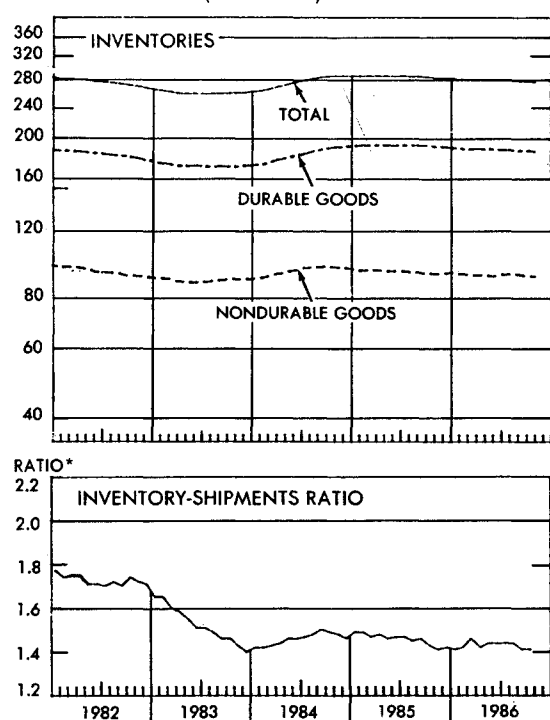


BILLIONS OF DOLLARS* (RATIO SCALE)

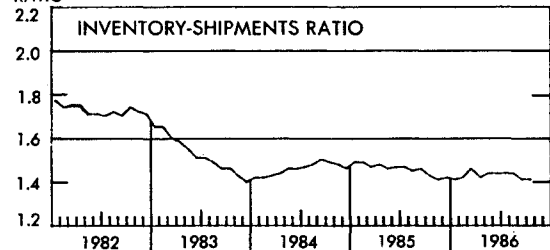

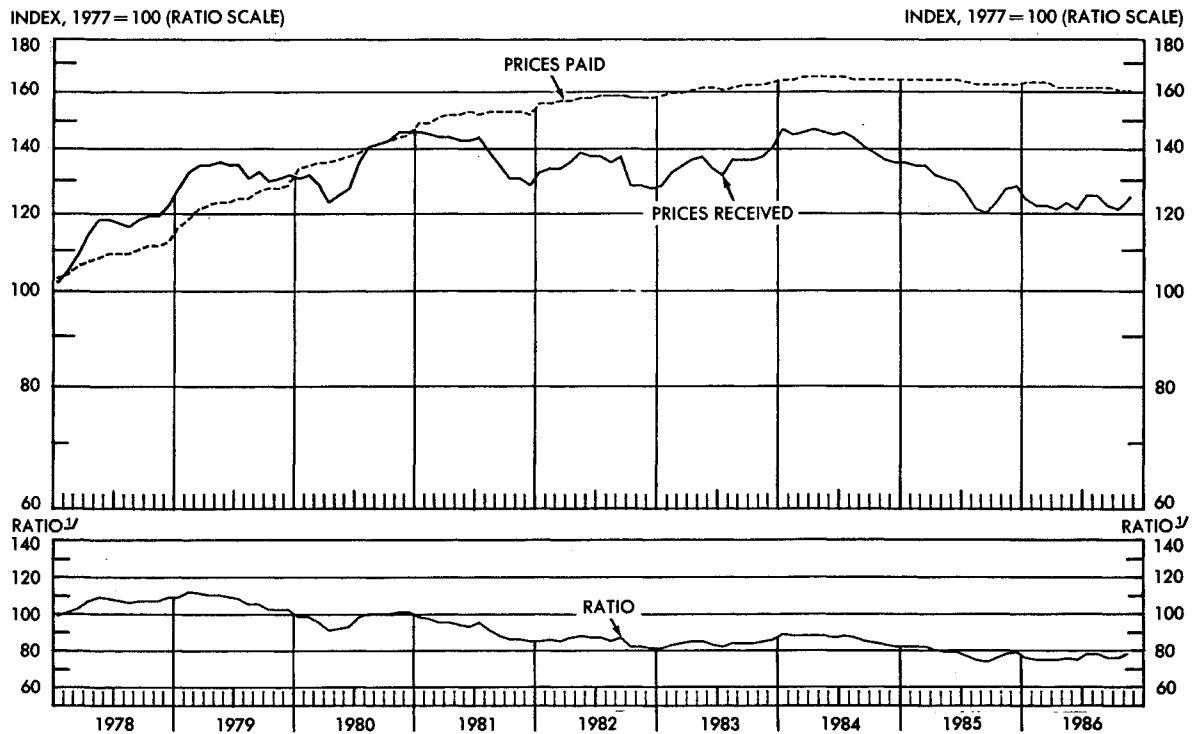

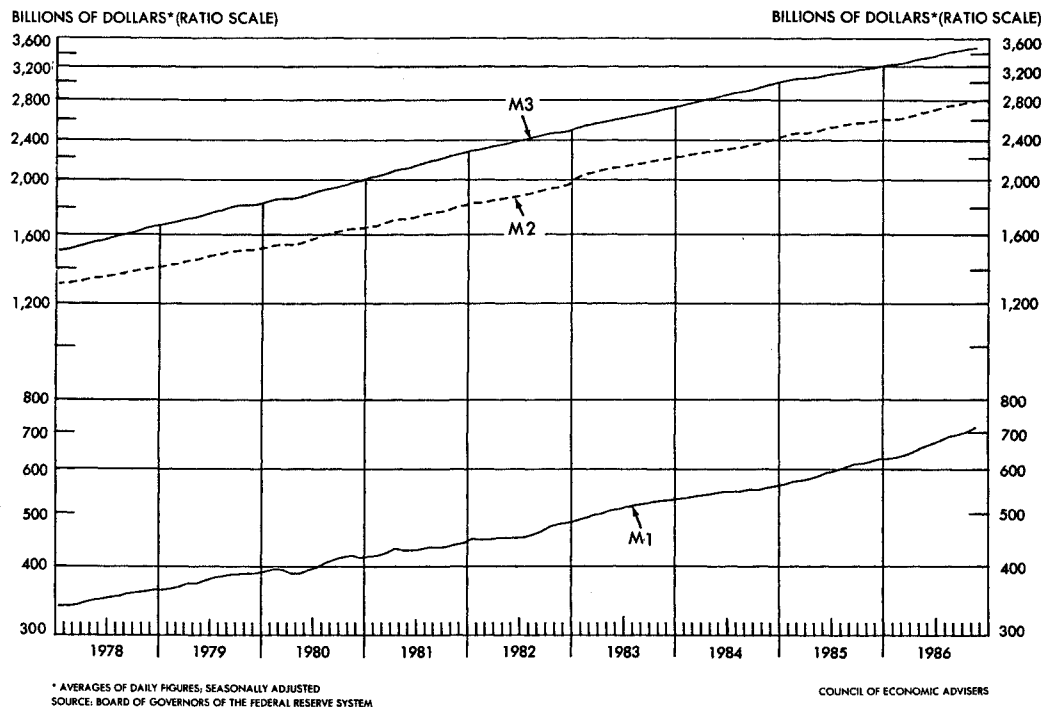

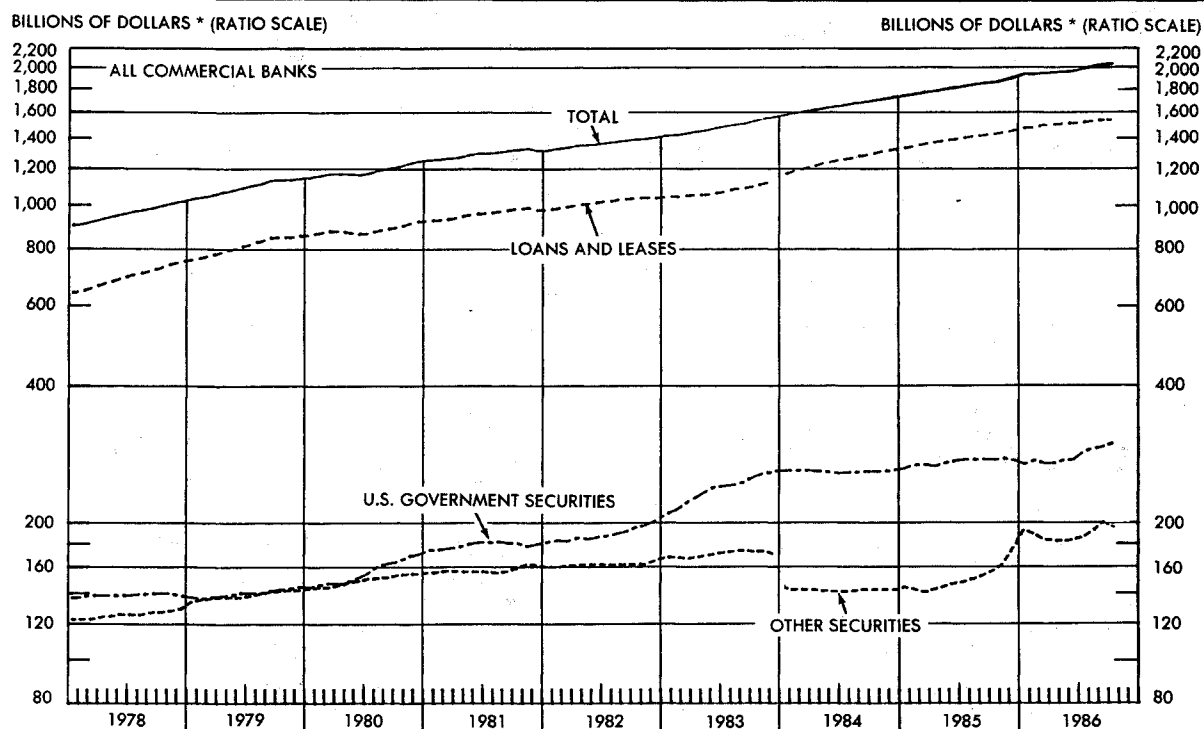

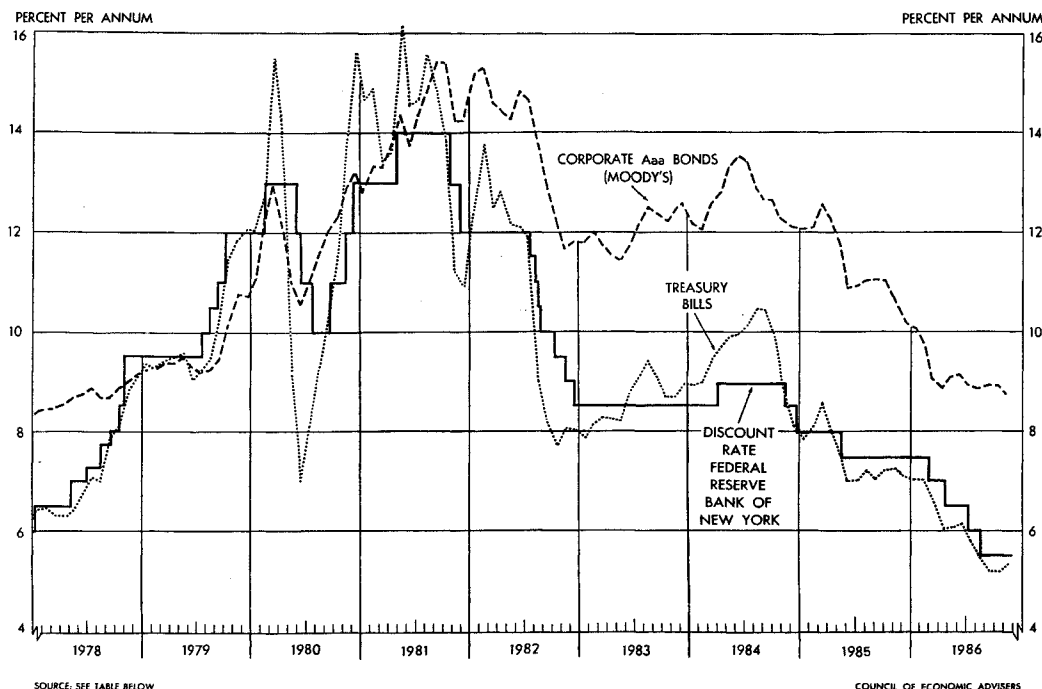

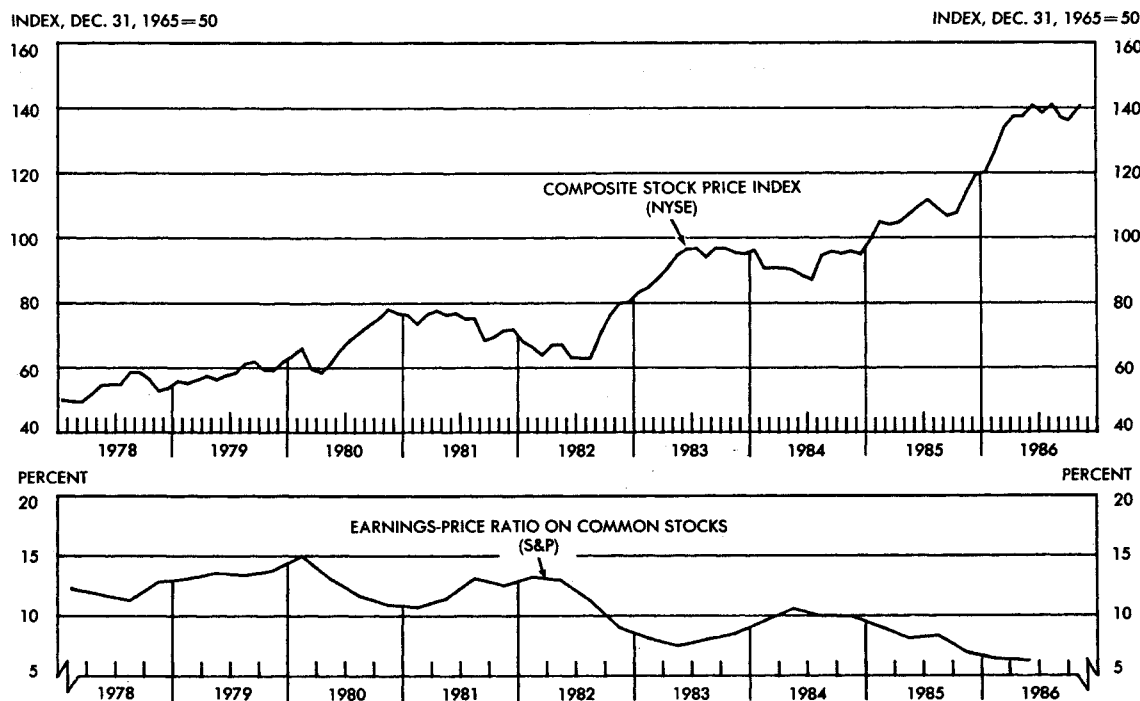

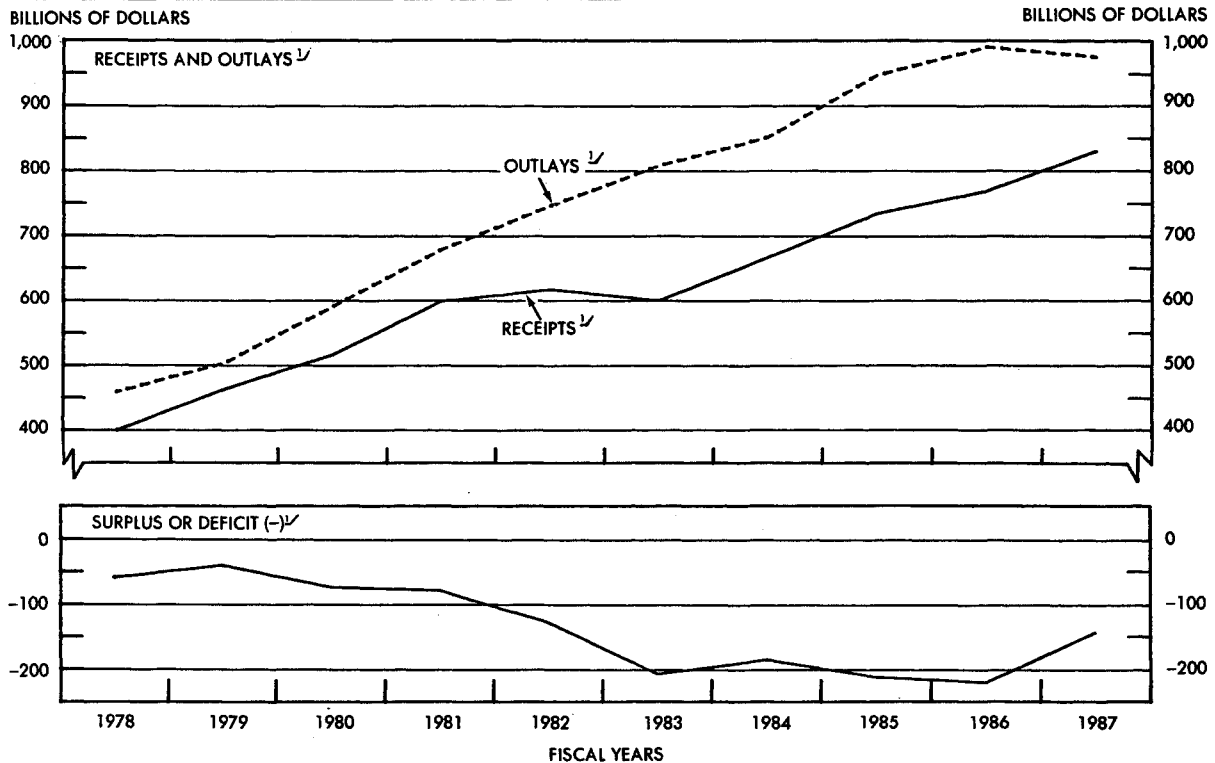

FEDERAL RECEIPTS, OUTLAYS, AND DEBT

In the first 2 months of fiscal 1987, there was a deficit of \$52.3 billion compared with a deficit of \$60.5 billion a year earlier.

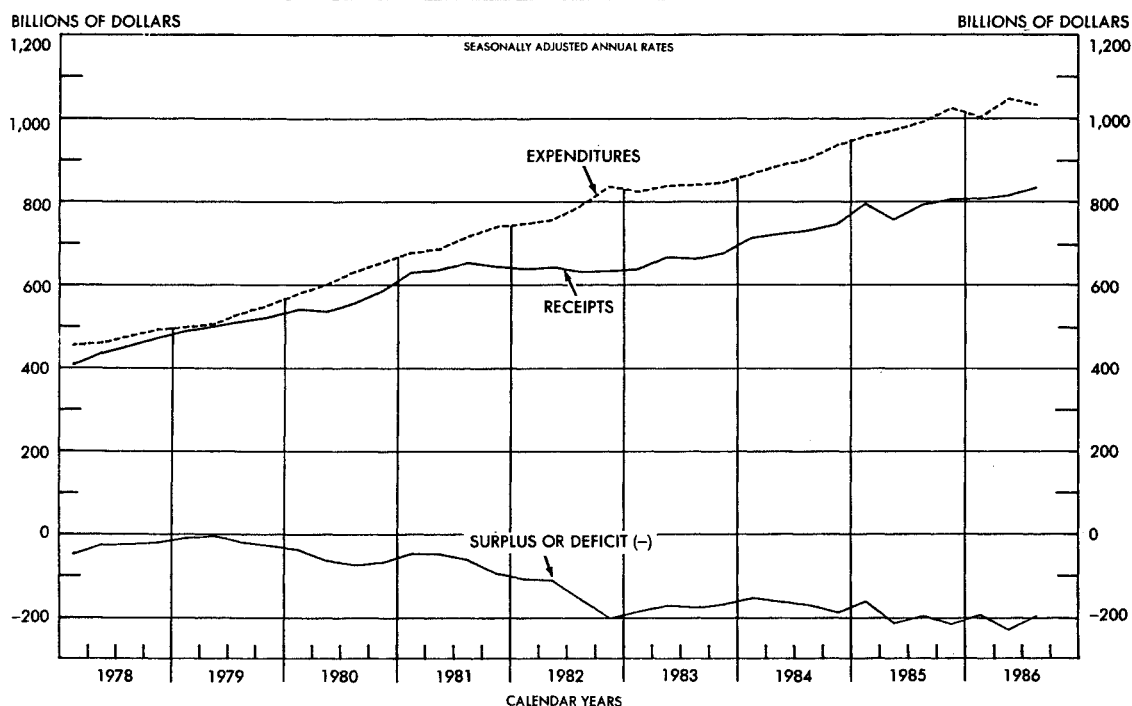

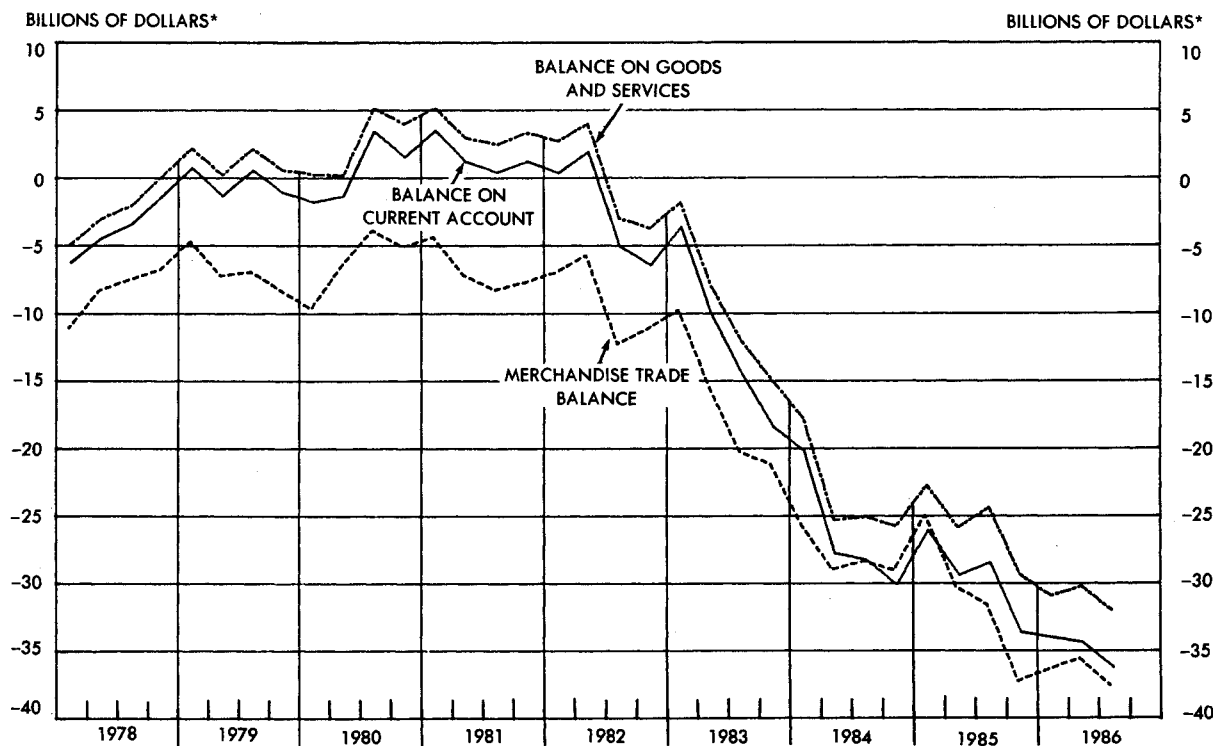

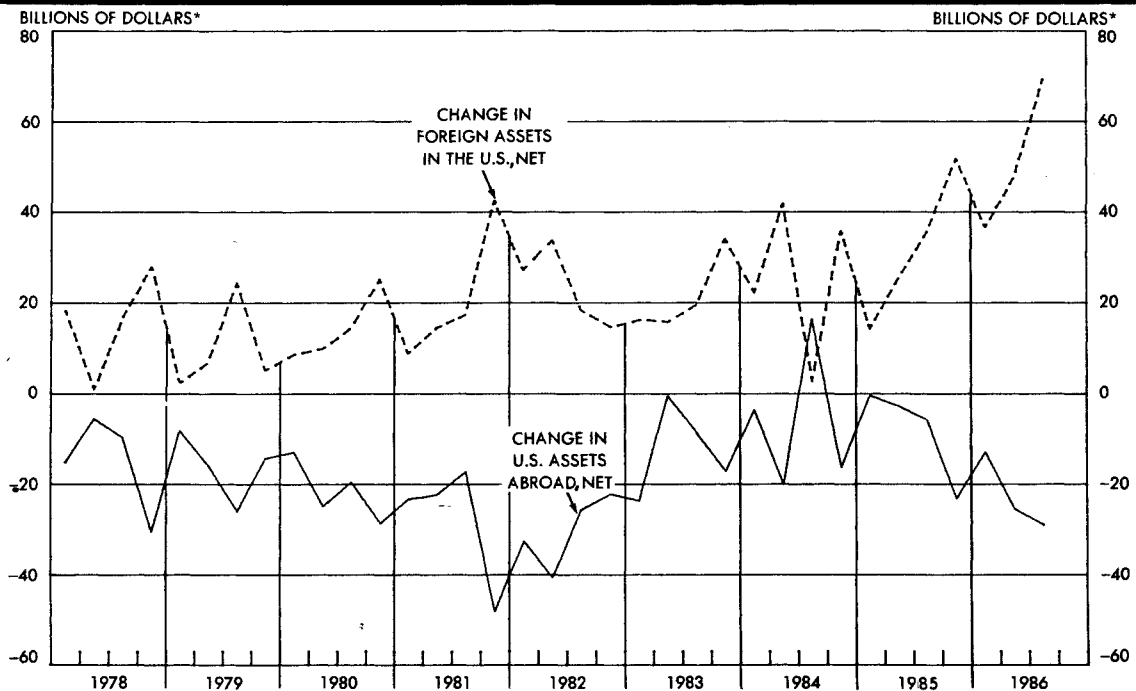
