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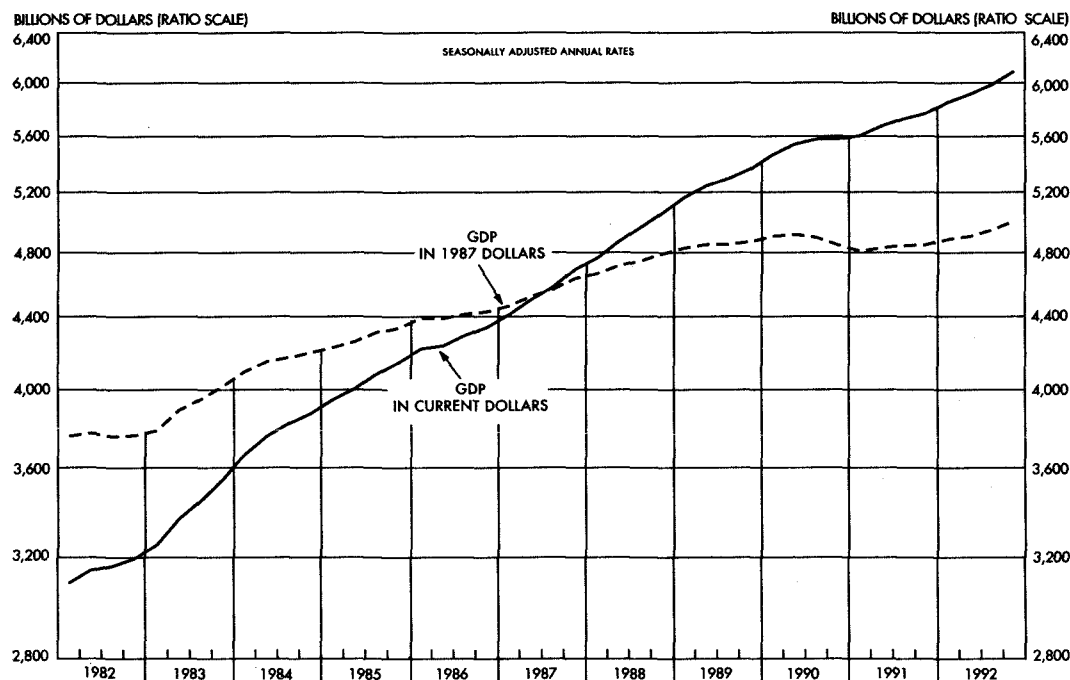
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

In the fourth quarter of 1992, according to revised estimates, current-dollar gross domestic product (GDP) rose 7.1 percent (annual rate), real GDP (GDP in 1987 dollars) rose 4.8 percent, and the implicit price deflator rose 2.0 percent.

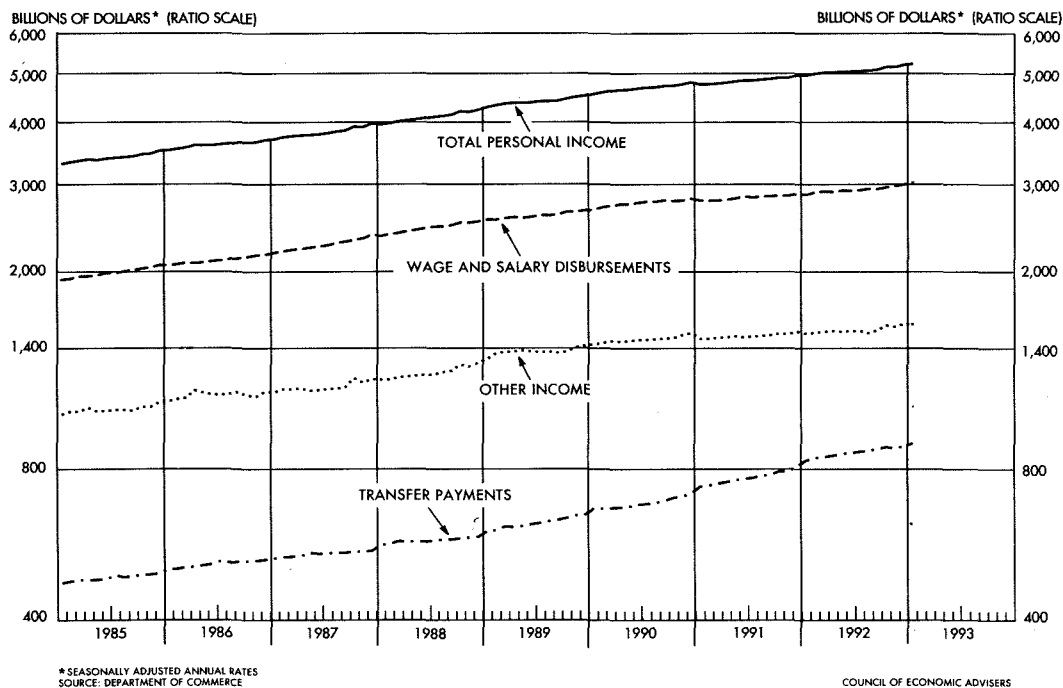

SOURCES OF PERSONAL INCOME

Personal income increased \$24.5 billion (annual rate) in January, after rising \$48.9 billion in December. The December change was boosted by bonus payments to employees in the securities and motor vehicle industries, farm subsidy payments, and retroactive social security payments. The January change was boosted by cost-of-living adjustments to several Federal transfer payment programs, retirement incentive payments to Postal Service employees, and a Federal pay raise. It was reduced by a decrease in farm subsidies and by program changes in personal contributions for social insurance, as well as by the motor vehicle industry bonuses and retroactive social security payments in December. The January change was not affected by the December accelerated bonus payments to securities industry employees, because January payrolls included higher-than-normal bonuses of an equal magnitude. Excluding these special factors, personal income increased \$13.7 billion in December; the effects of the special factors on the January change were offsetting.

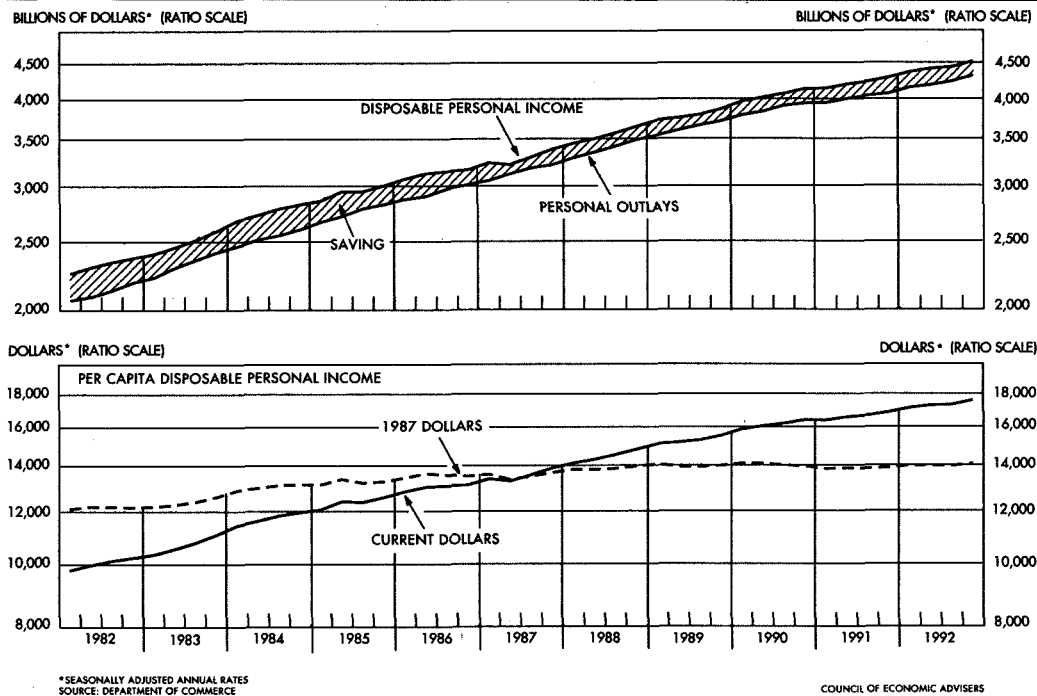

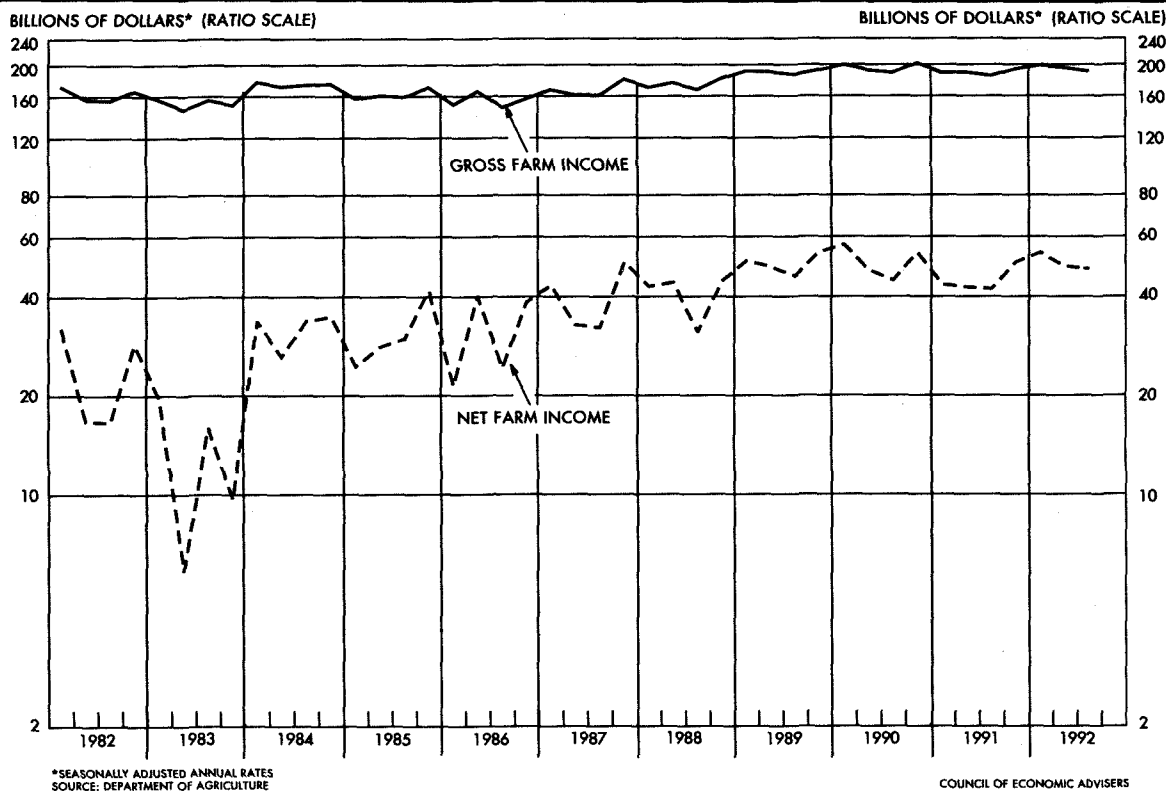

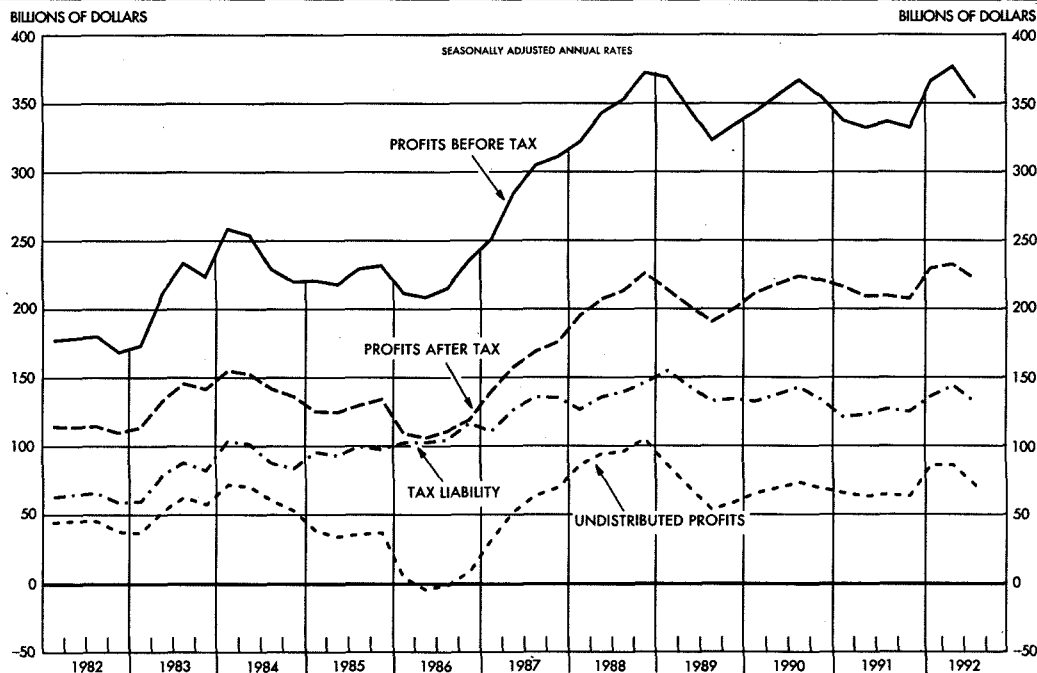

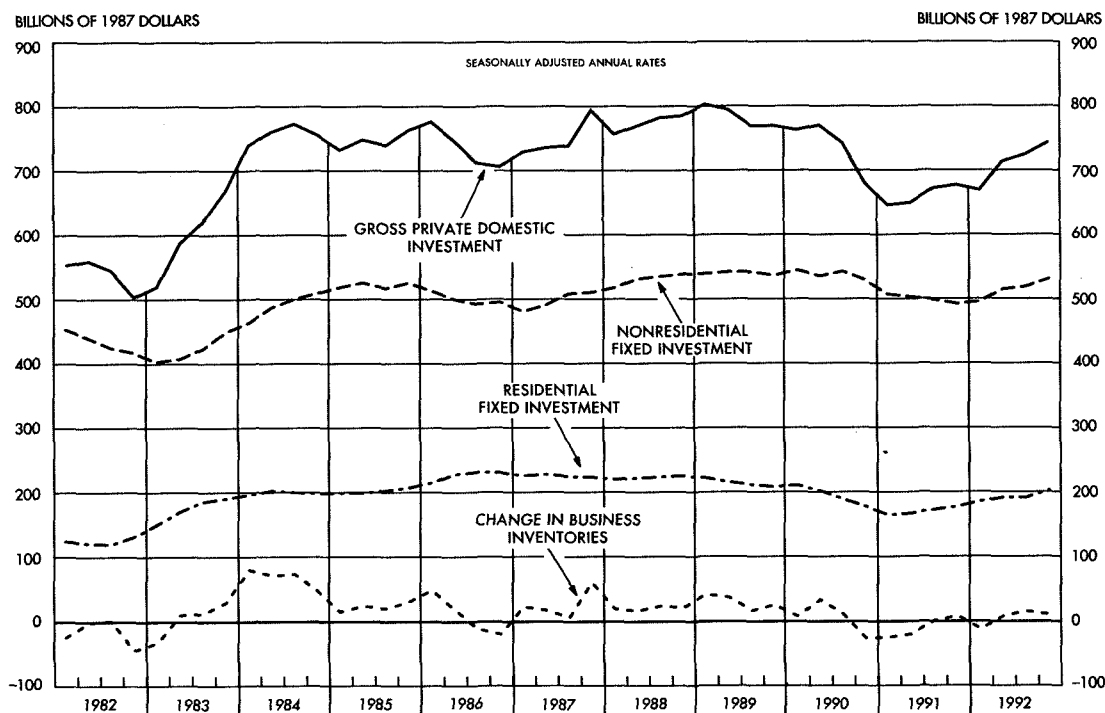

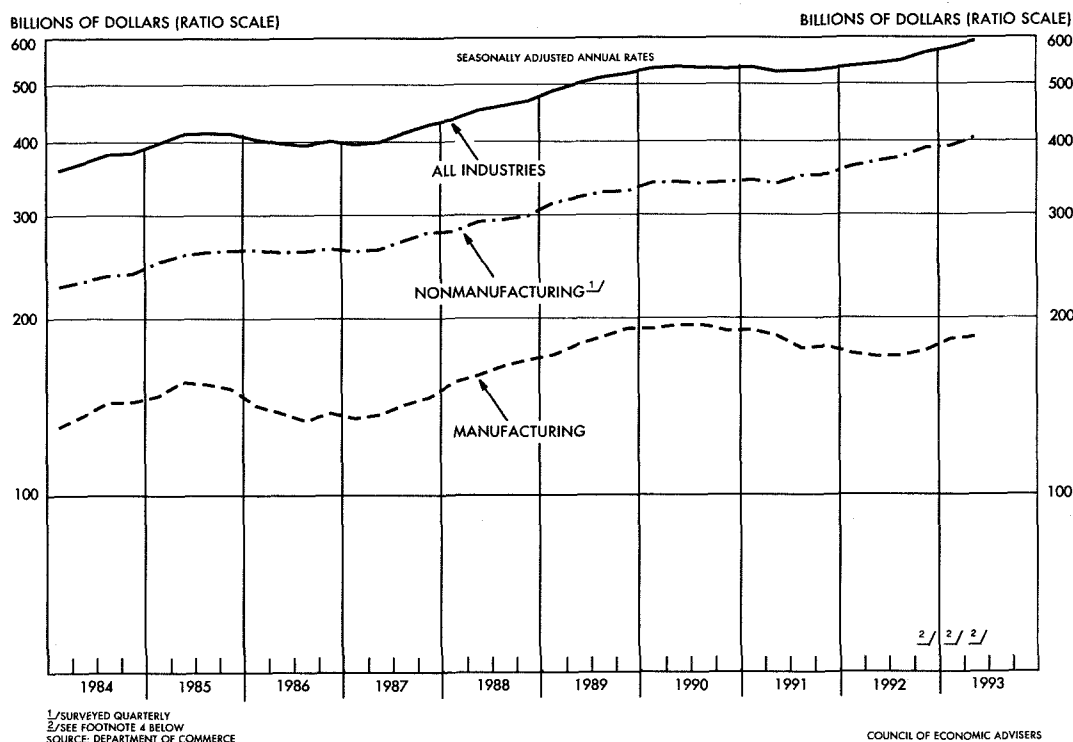

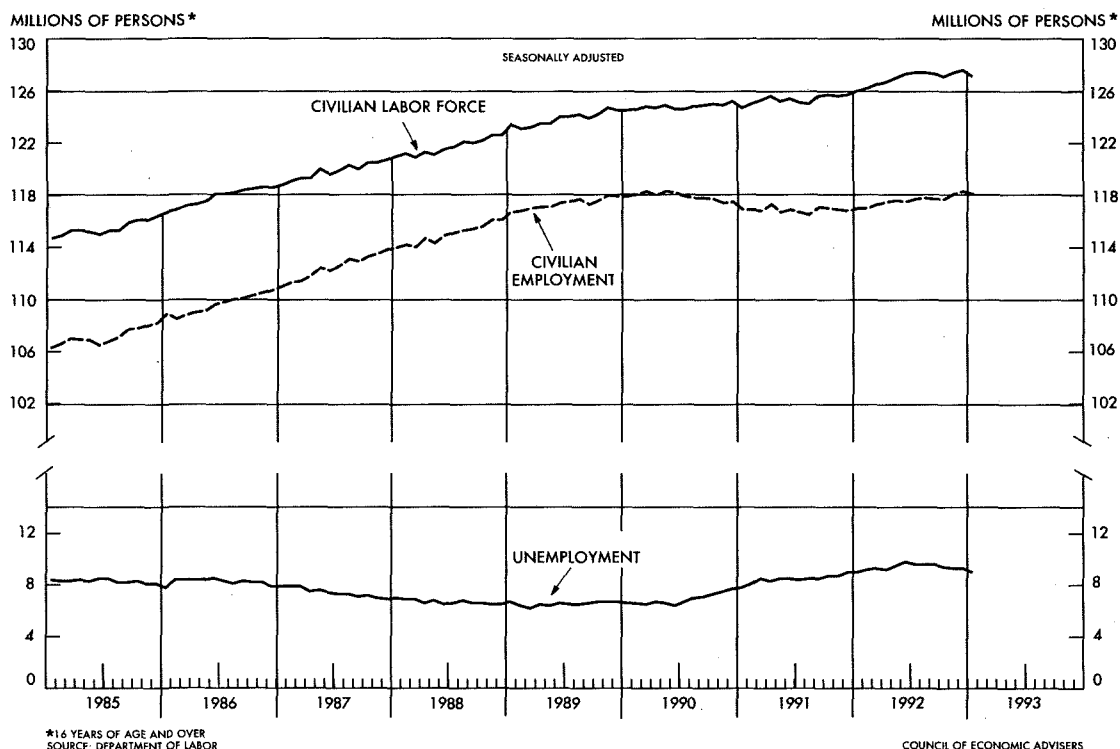

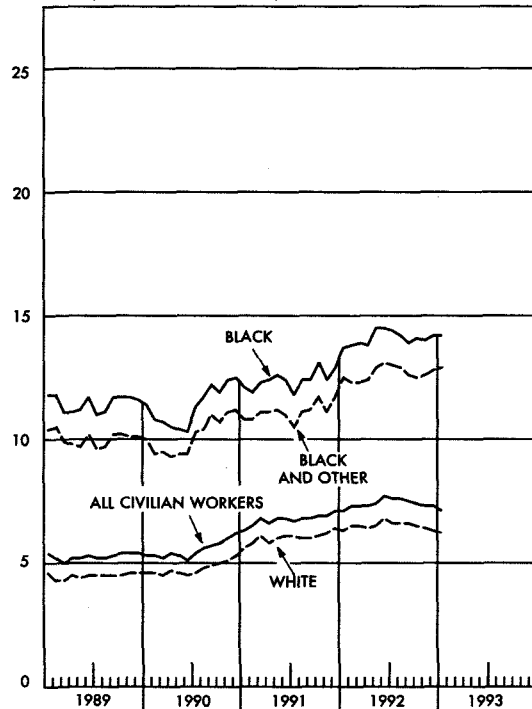

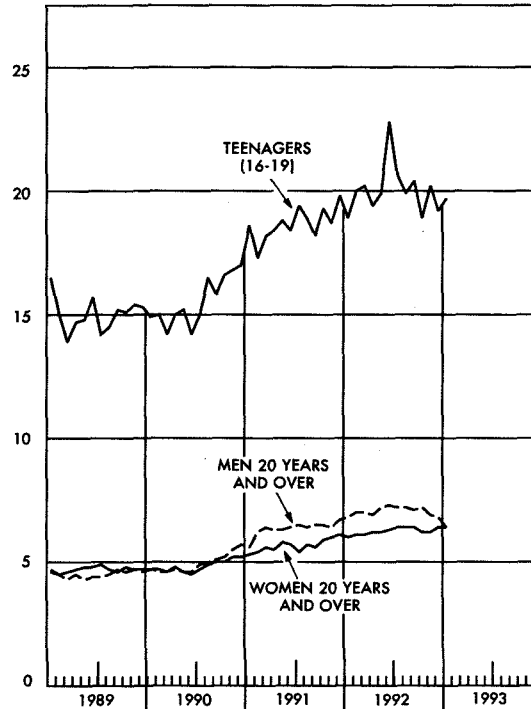

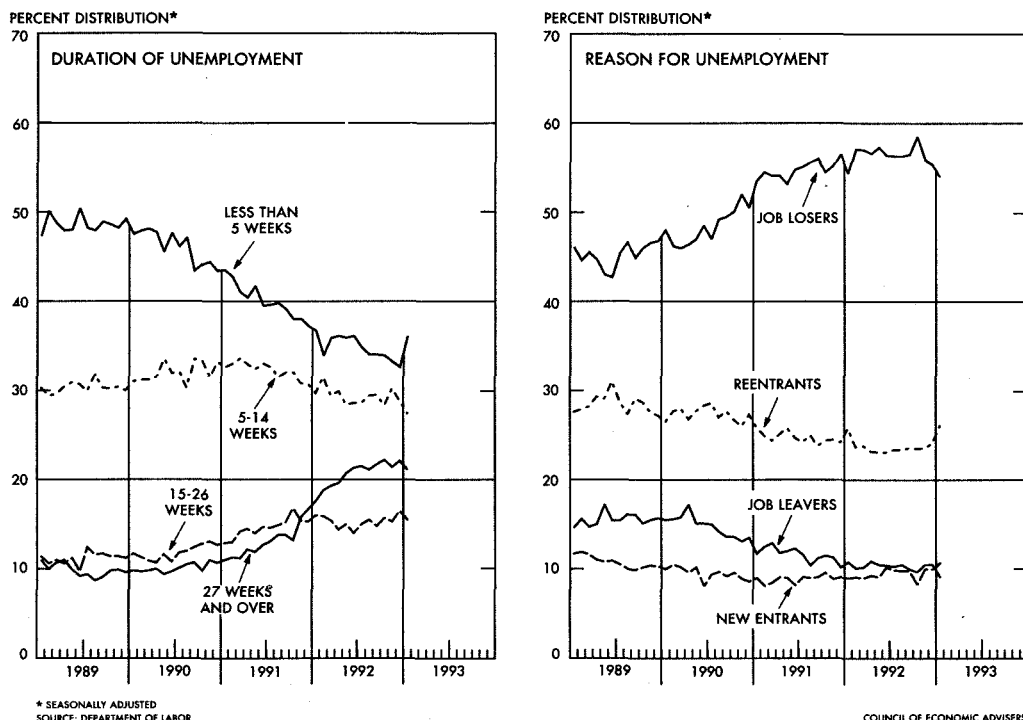

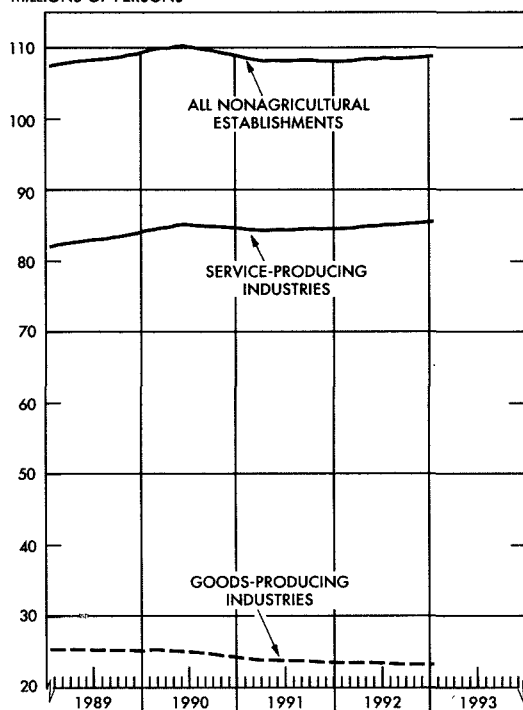

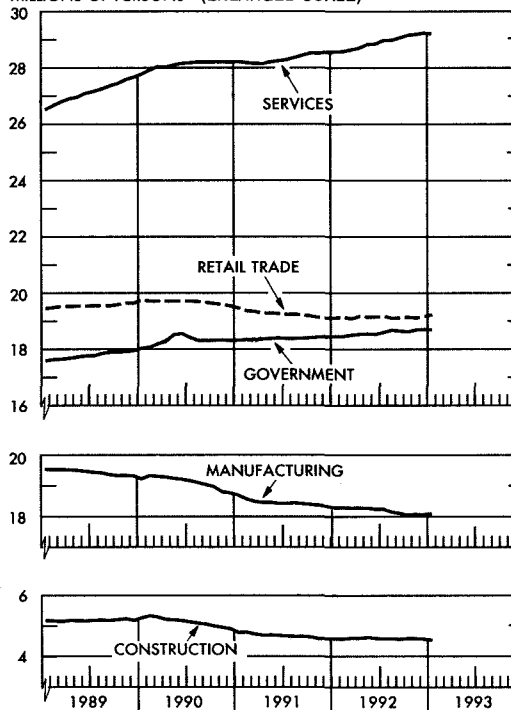

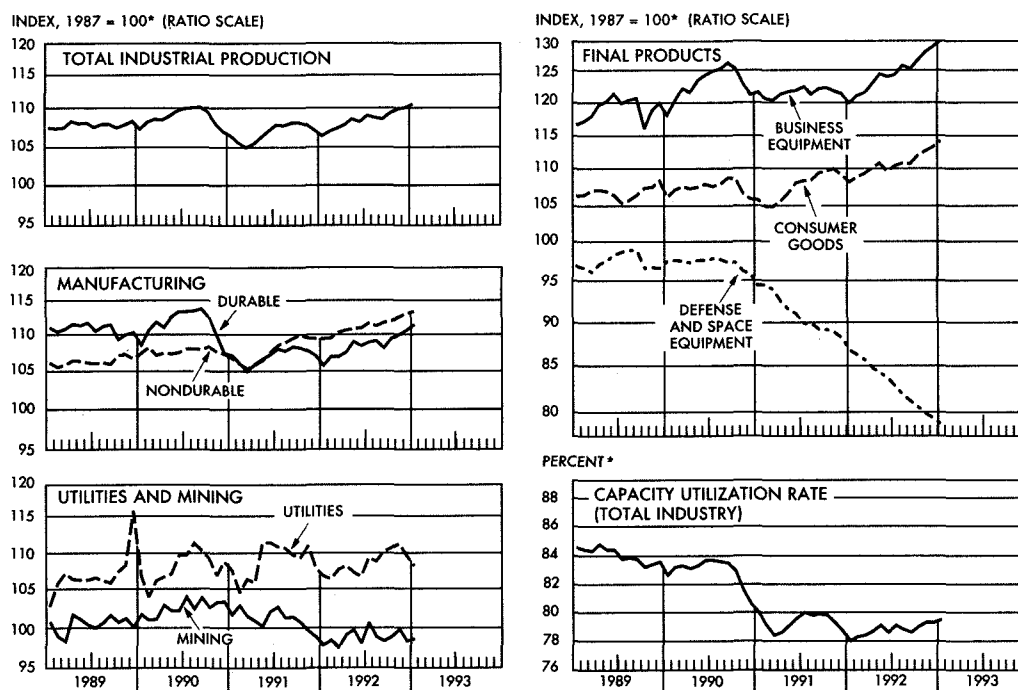

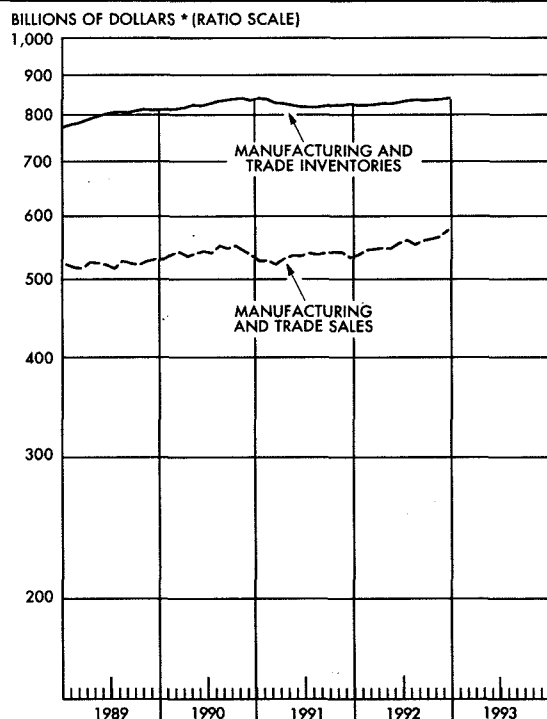

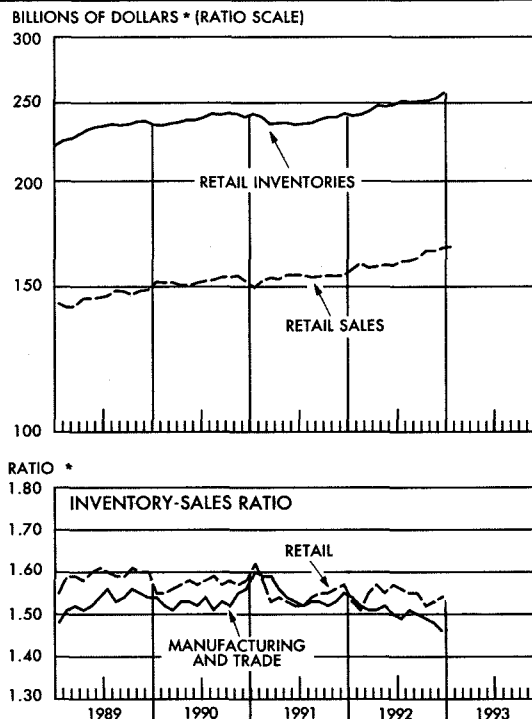

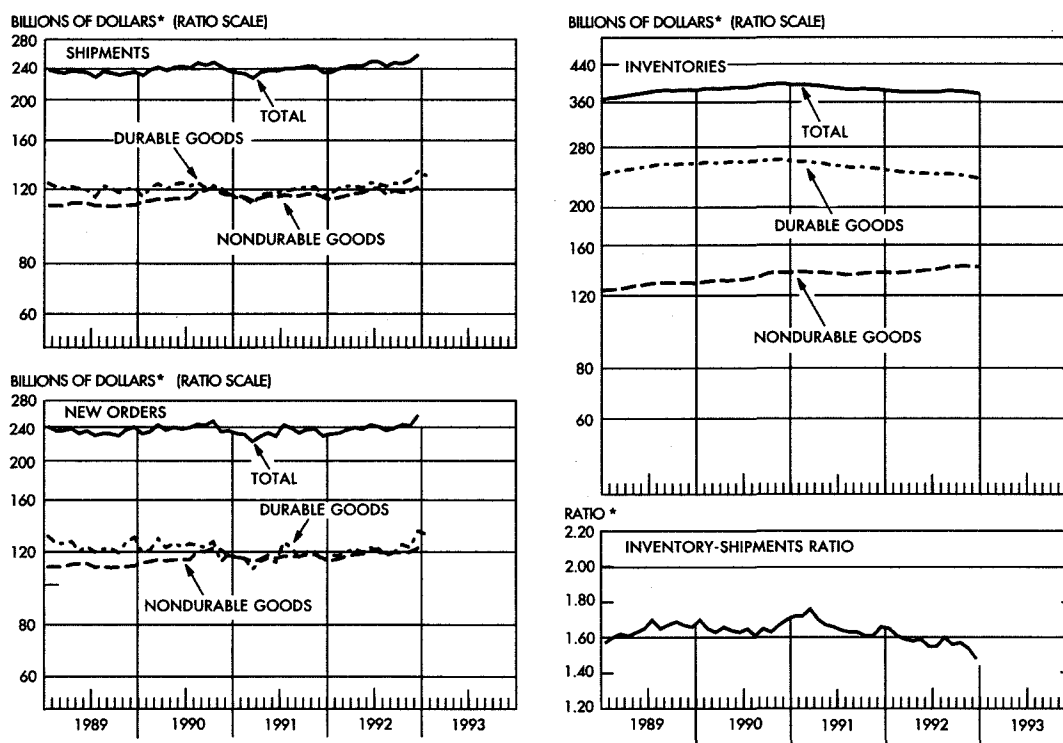

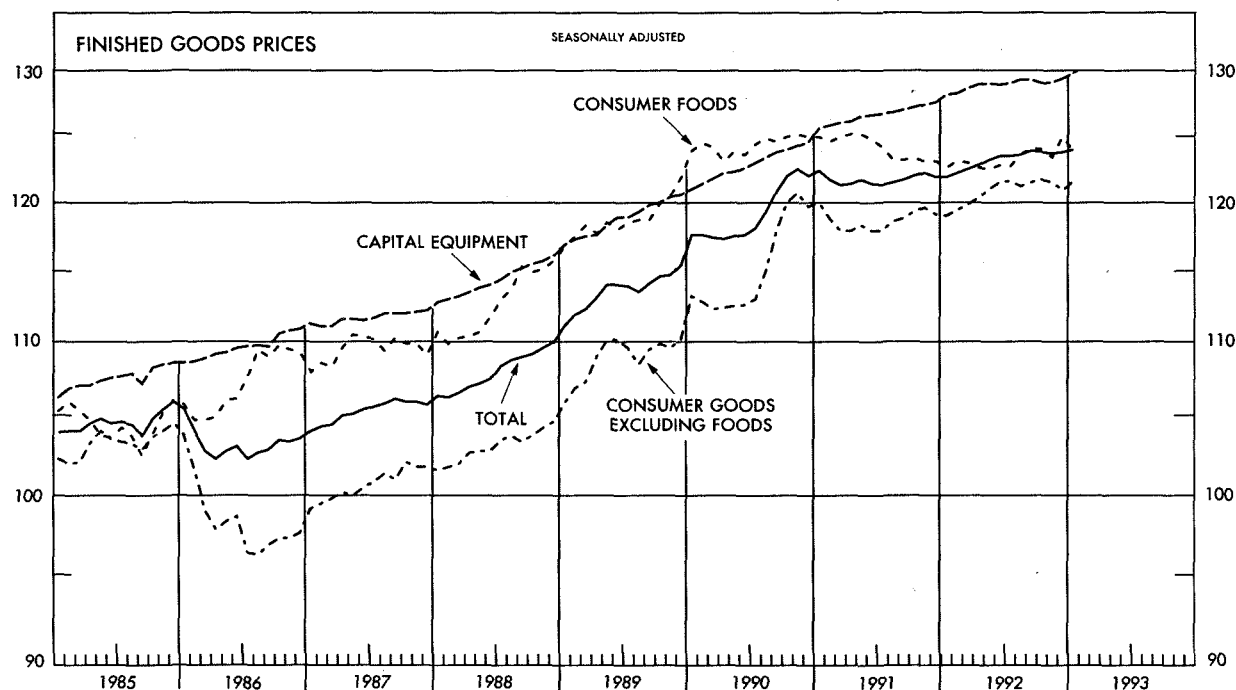

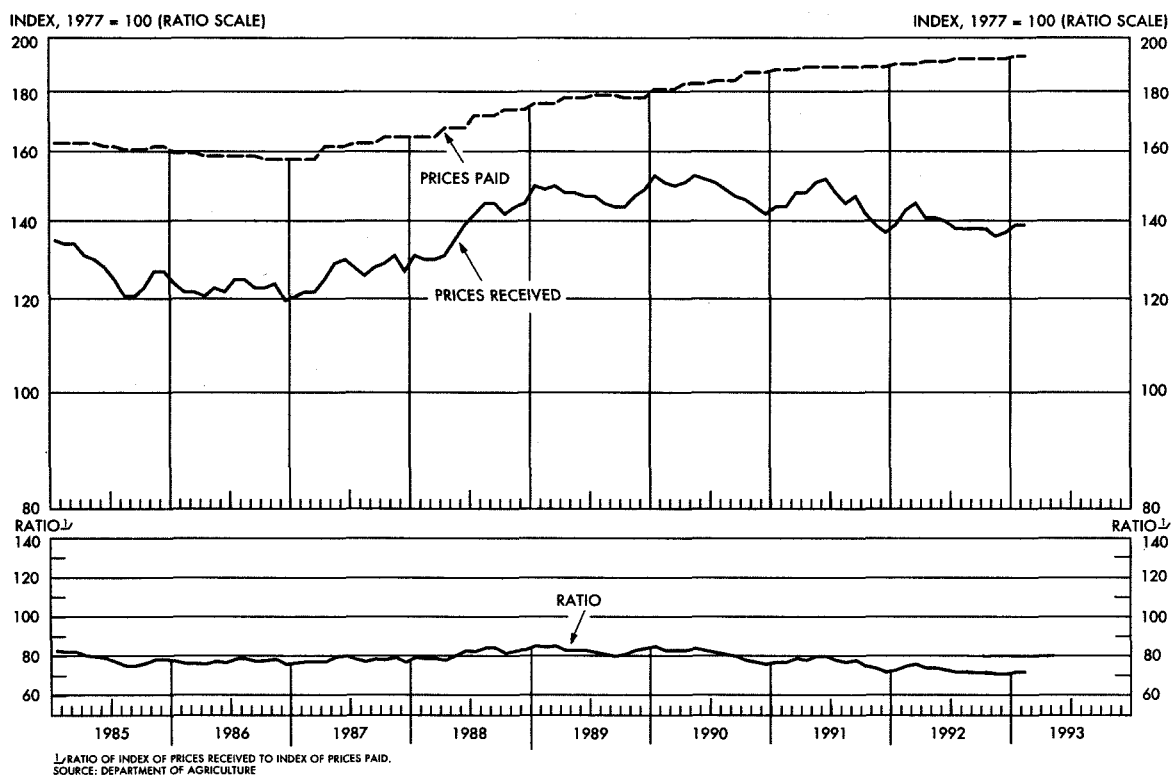

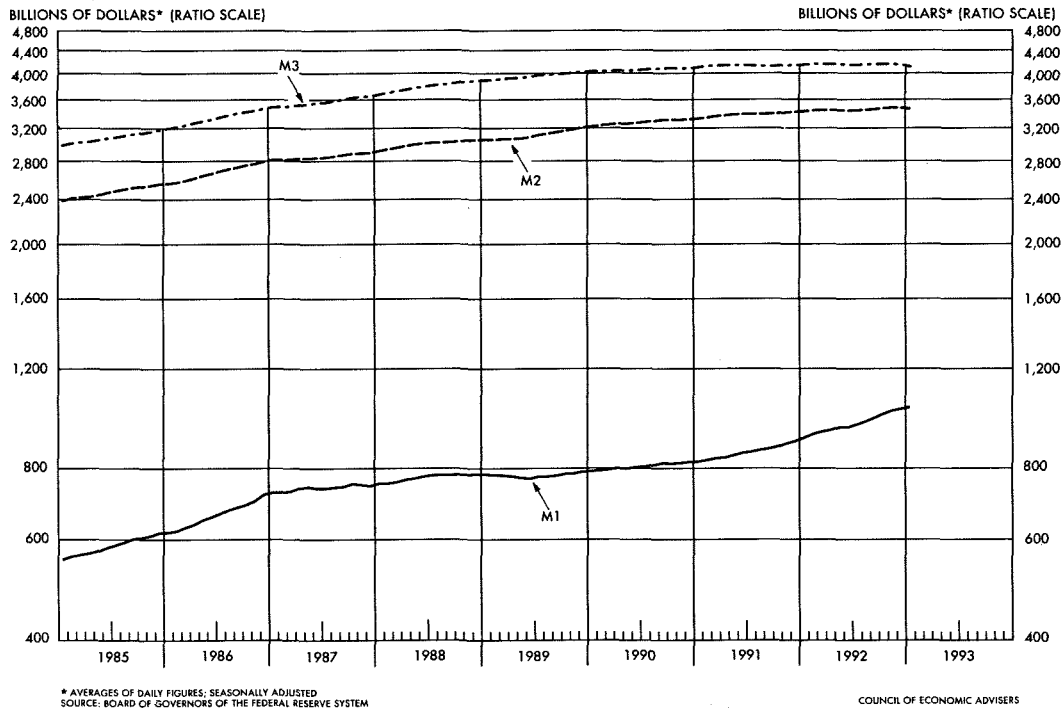

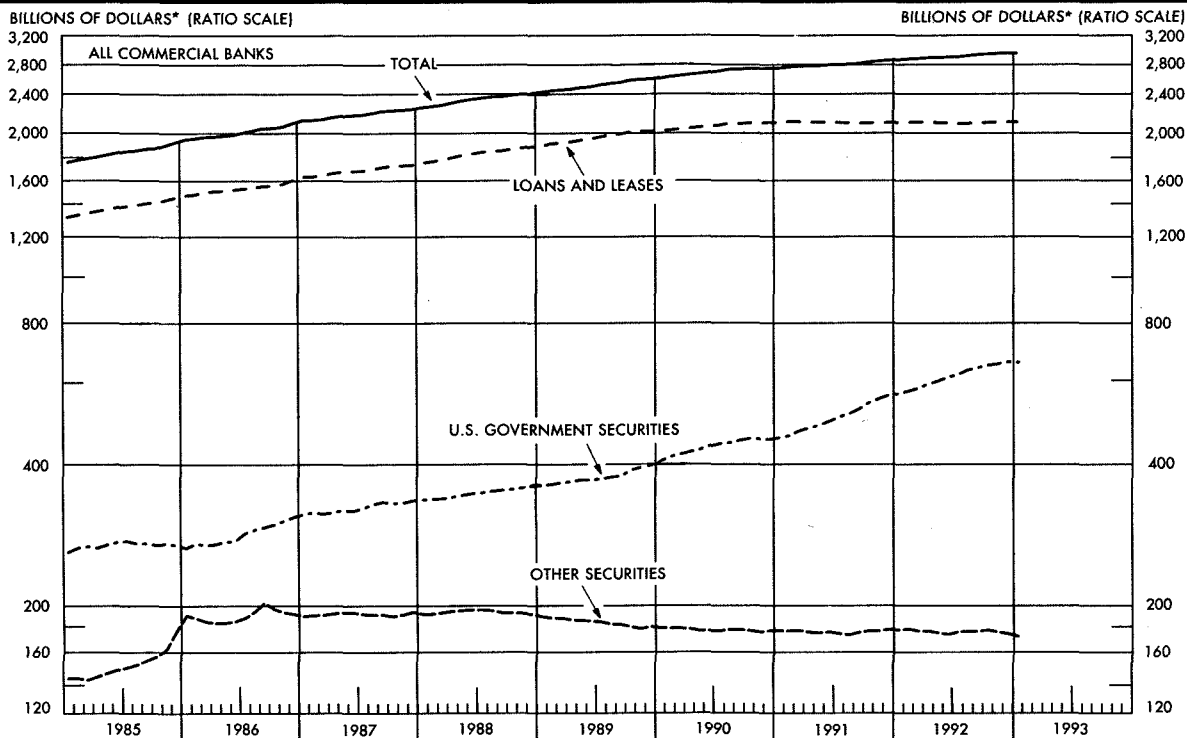

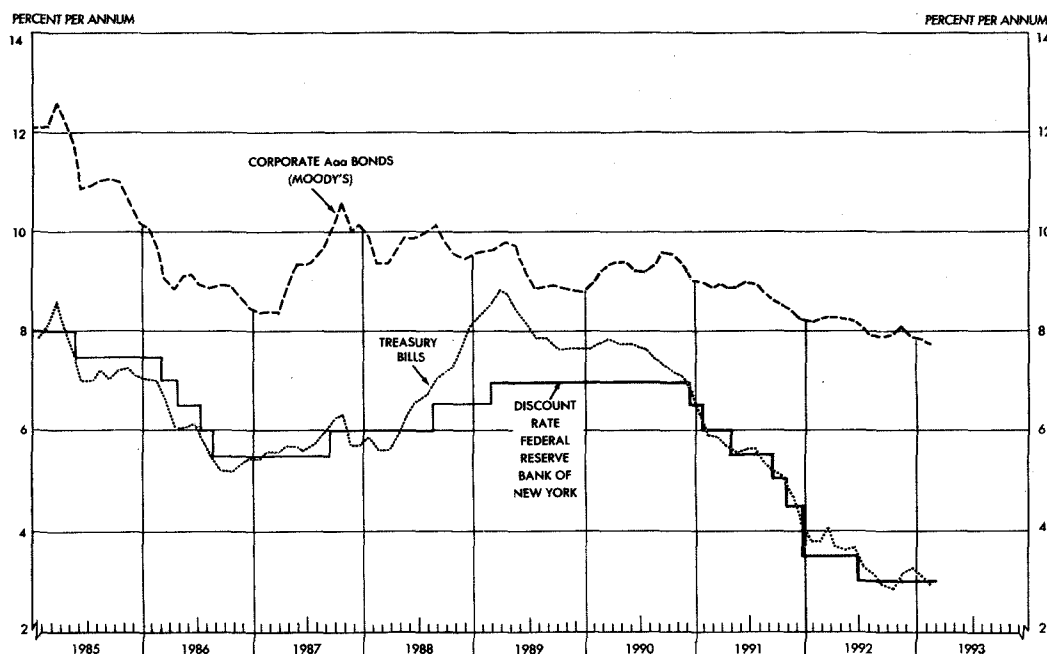

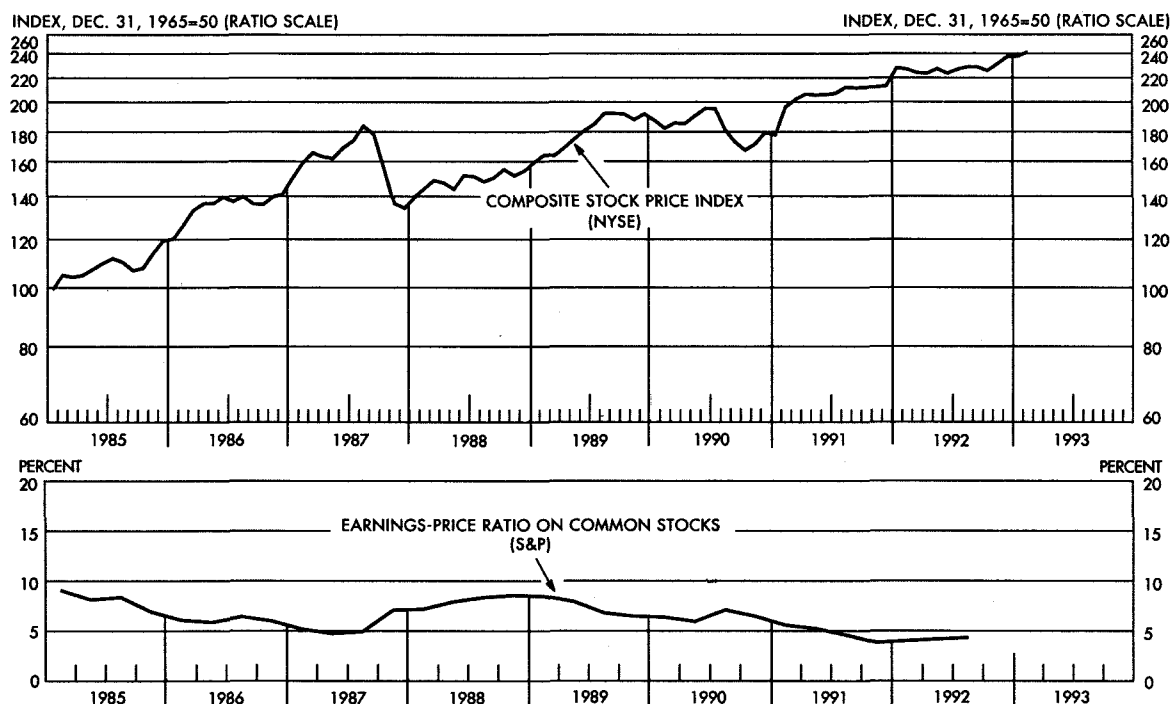

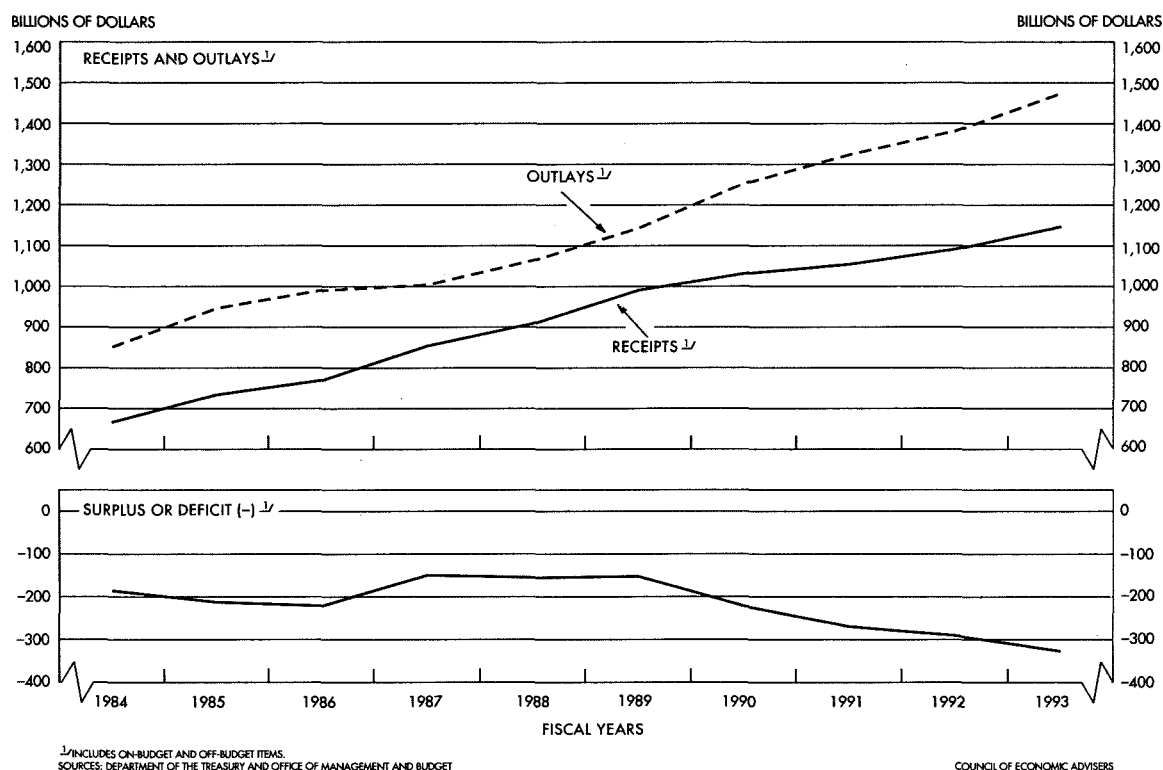

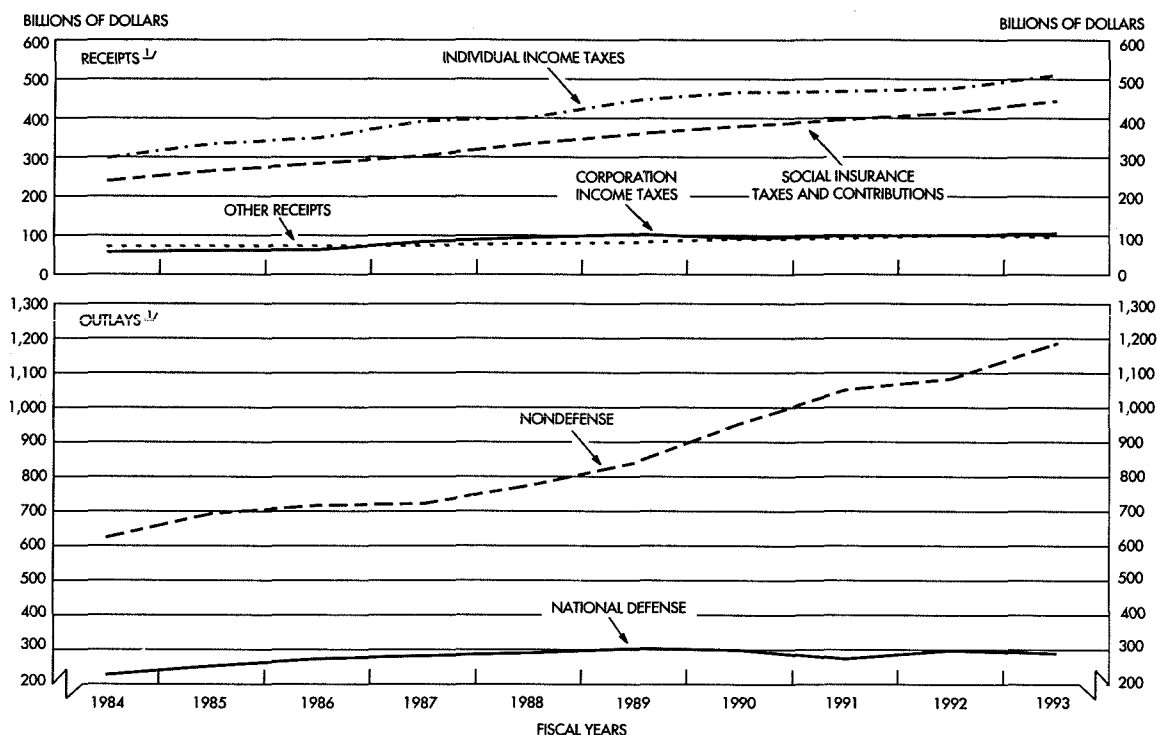

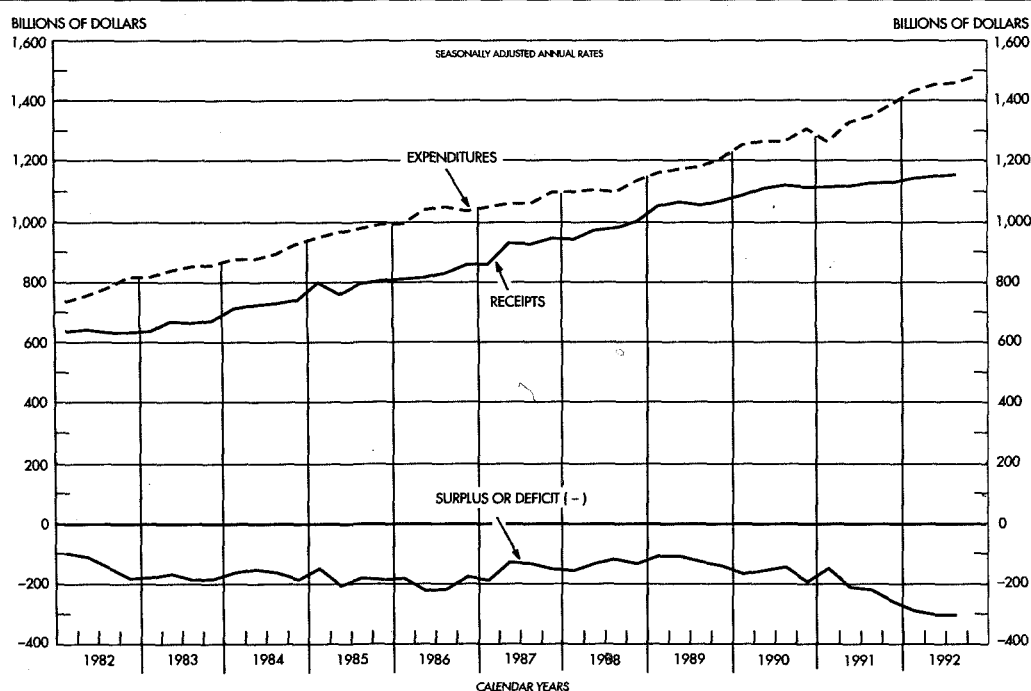

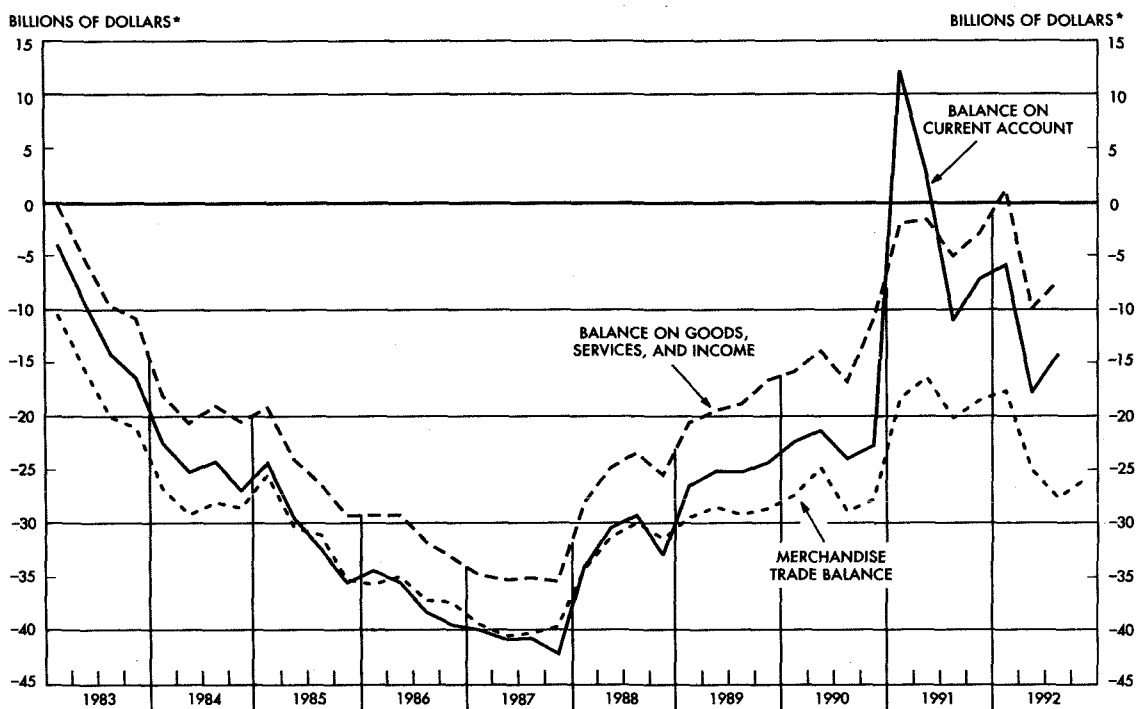
