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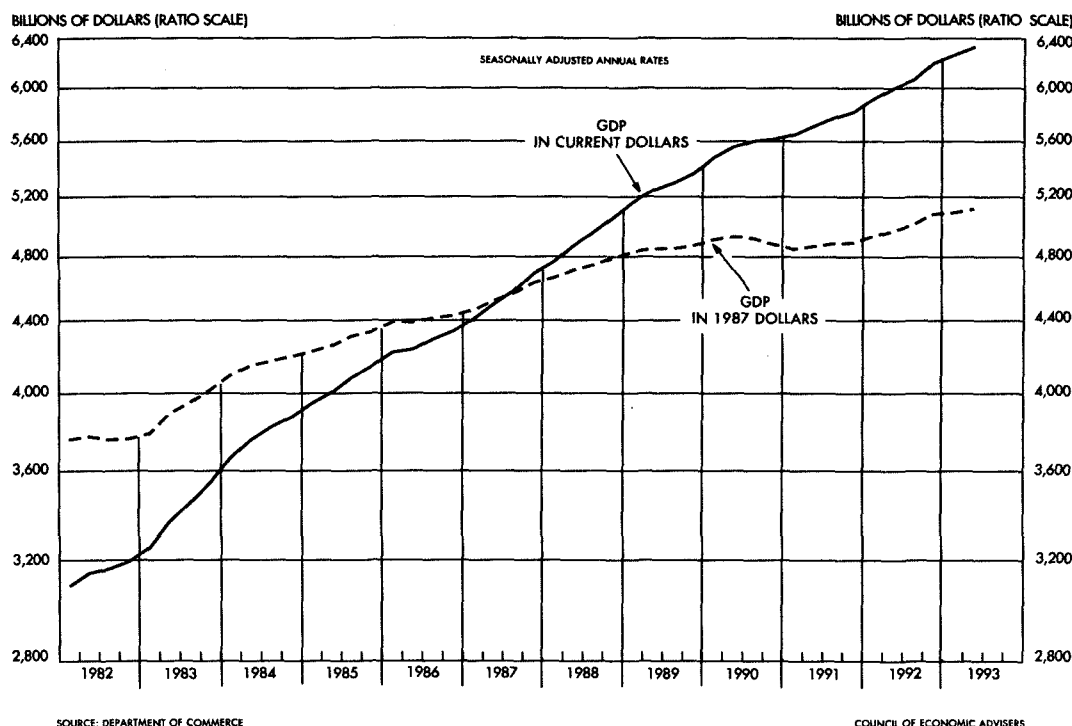
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TOTAL OUTPUT, INCOME, AND SPENDING

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

In the second quarter of 1993, according to revised estimates, current-dollar gross domestic product (GDP) rose 4.2 percent (annual rate), real GDP (GDP in 1987 dollars) rose 1.8 percent, and the implicit price deflator rose 2.3 percent. (Series revised.)

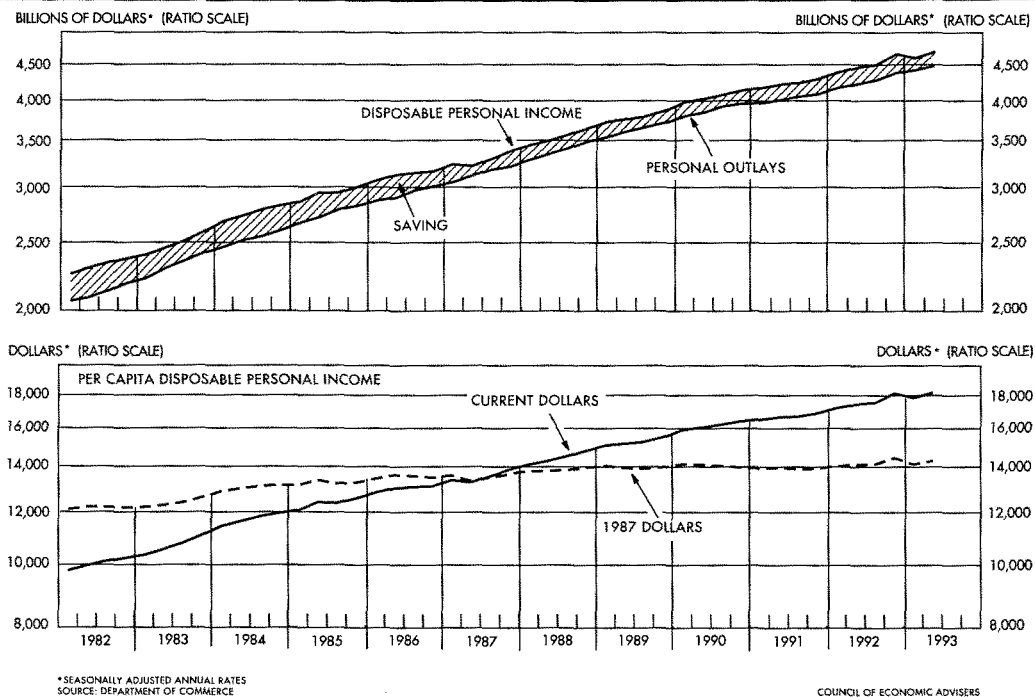

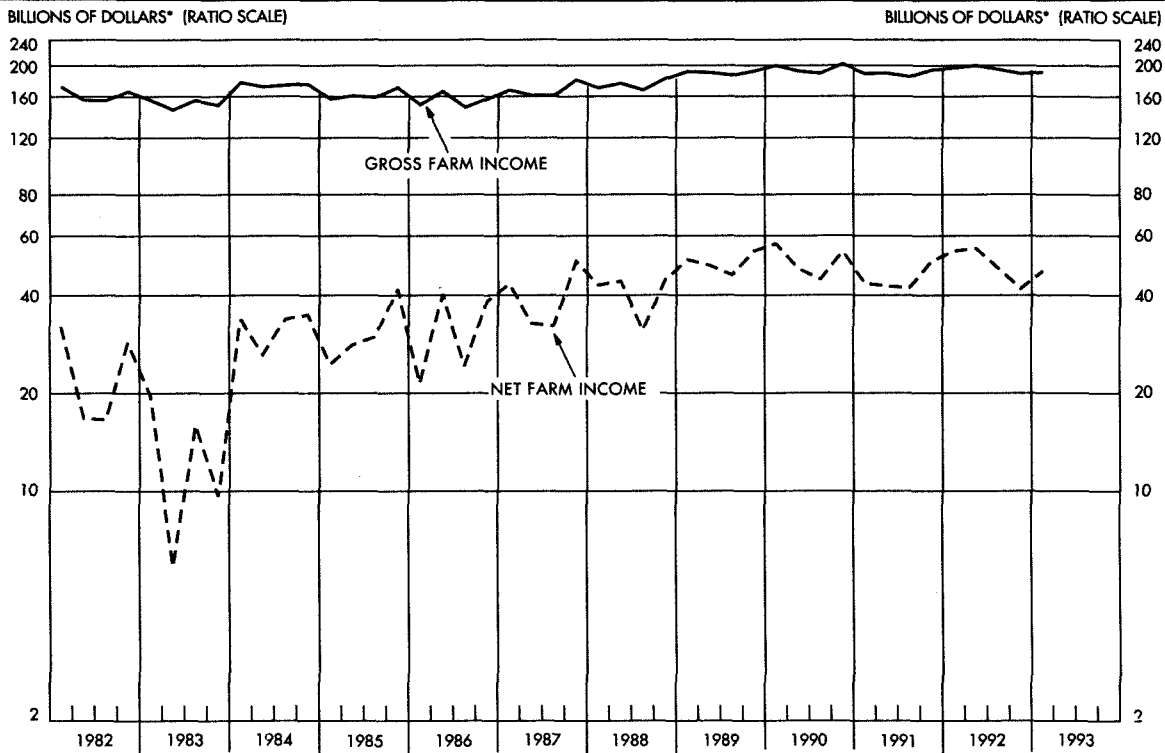

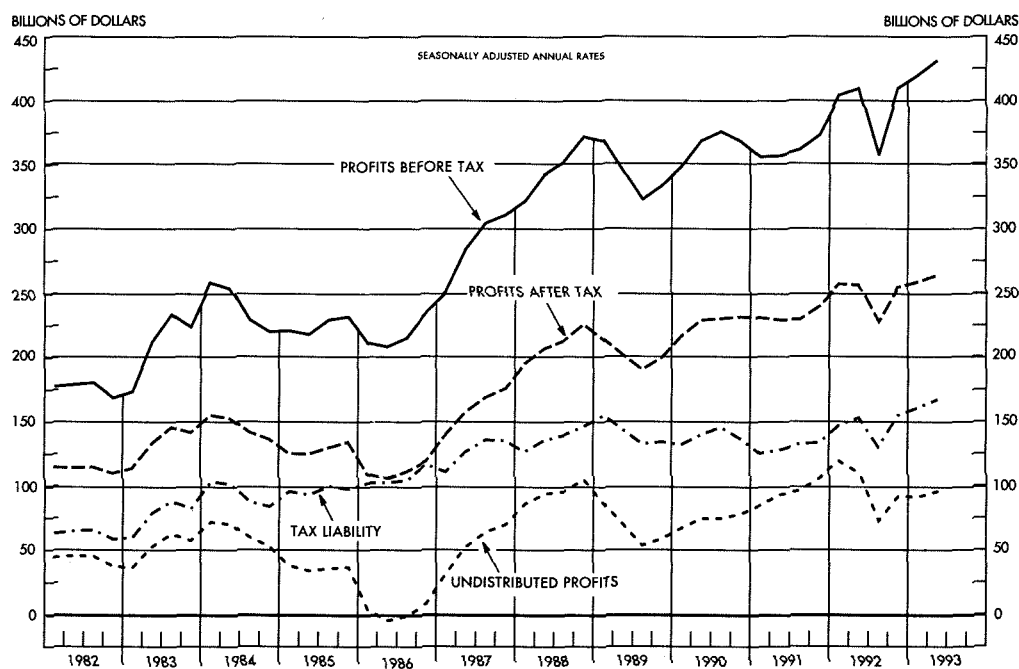

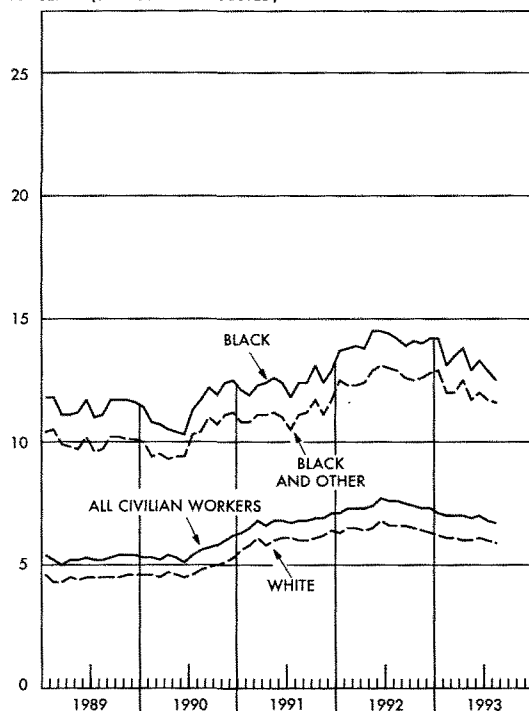

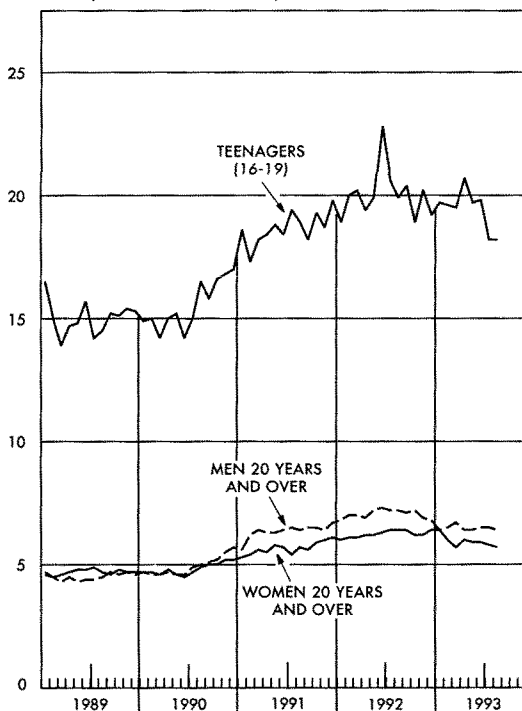

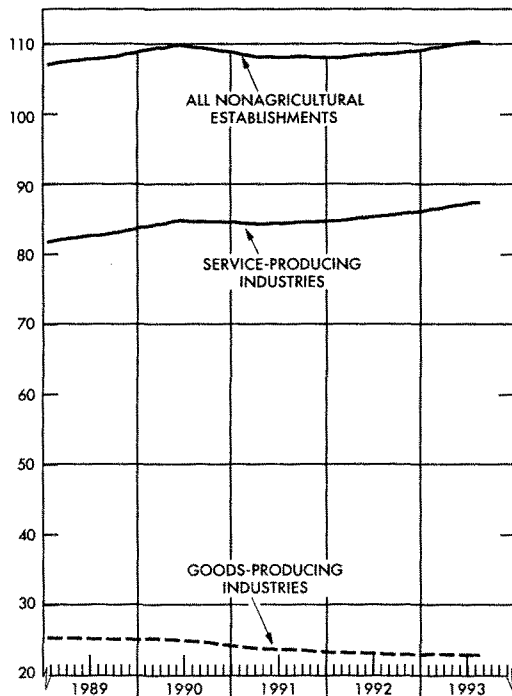

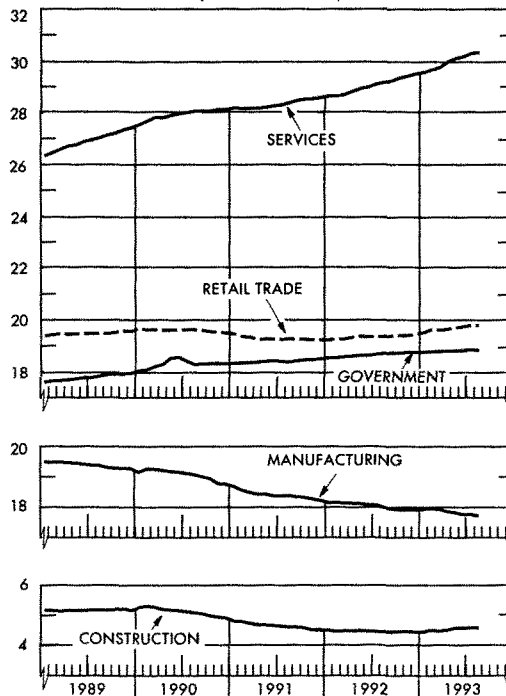

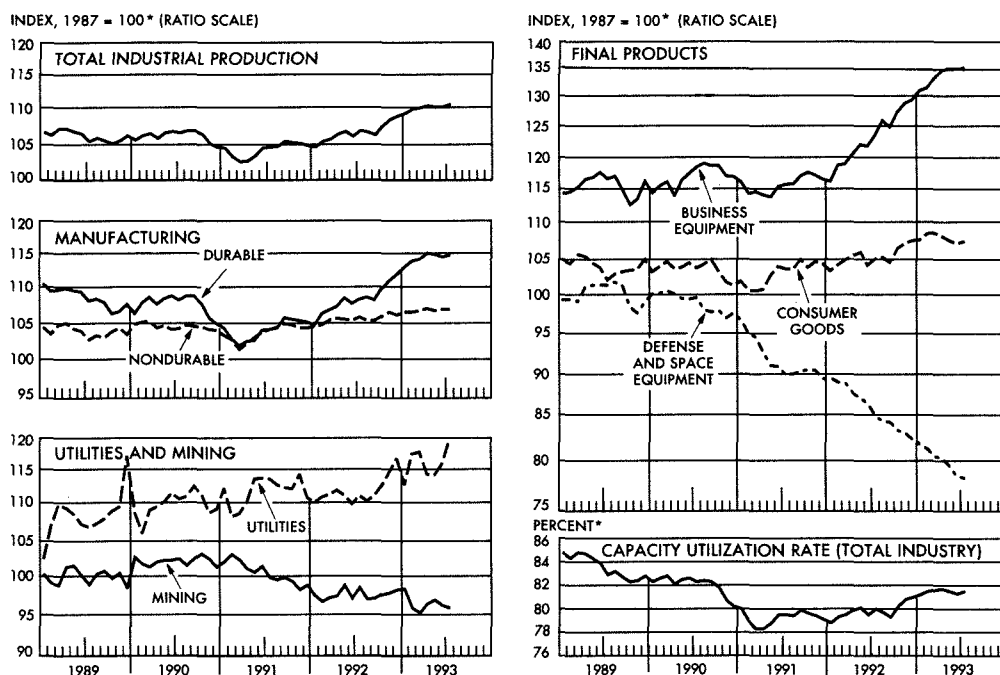

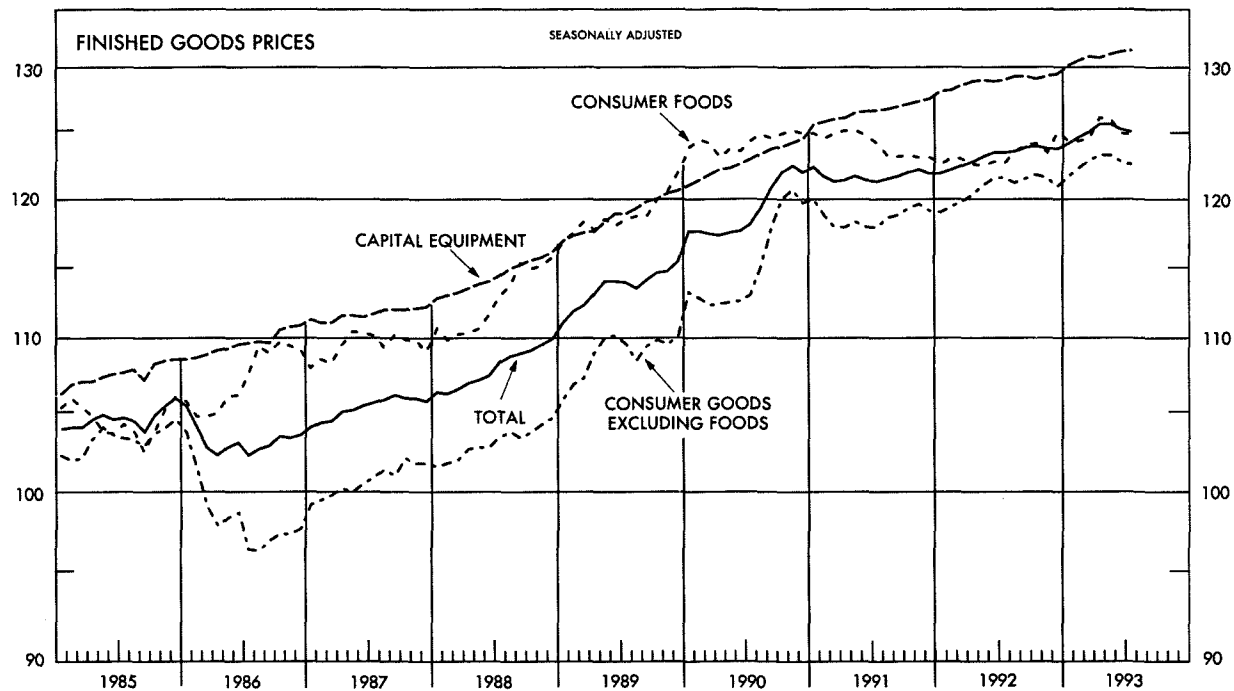

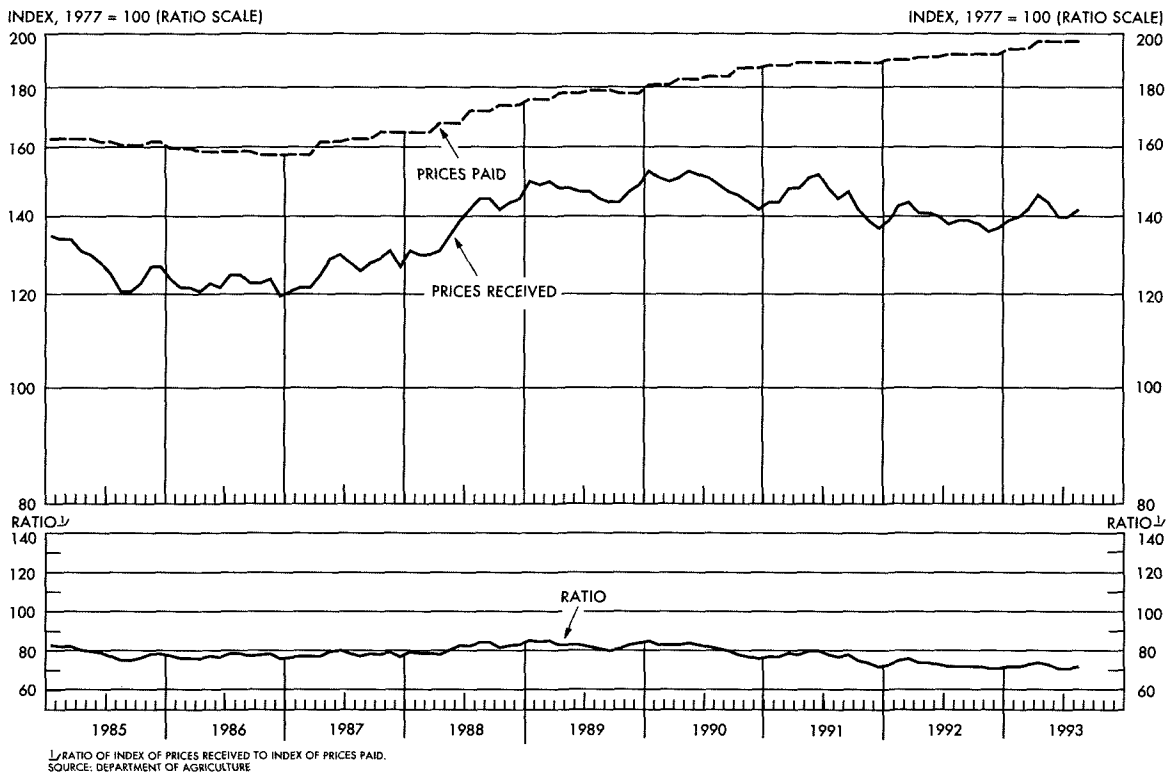

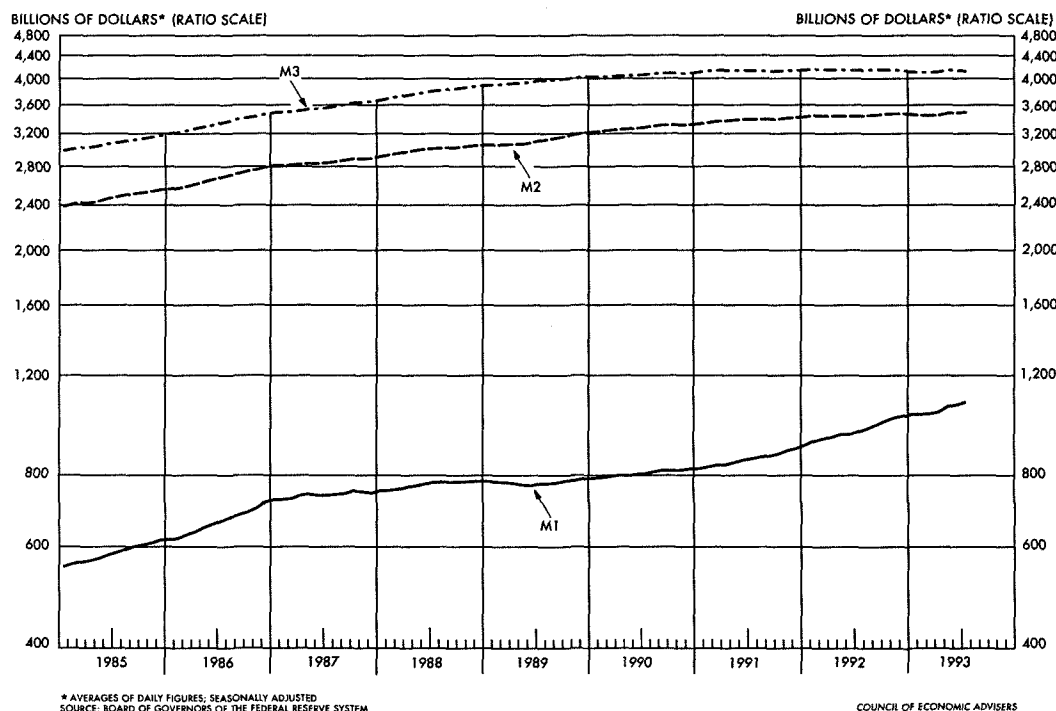

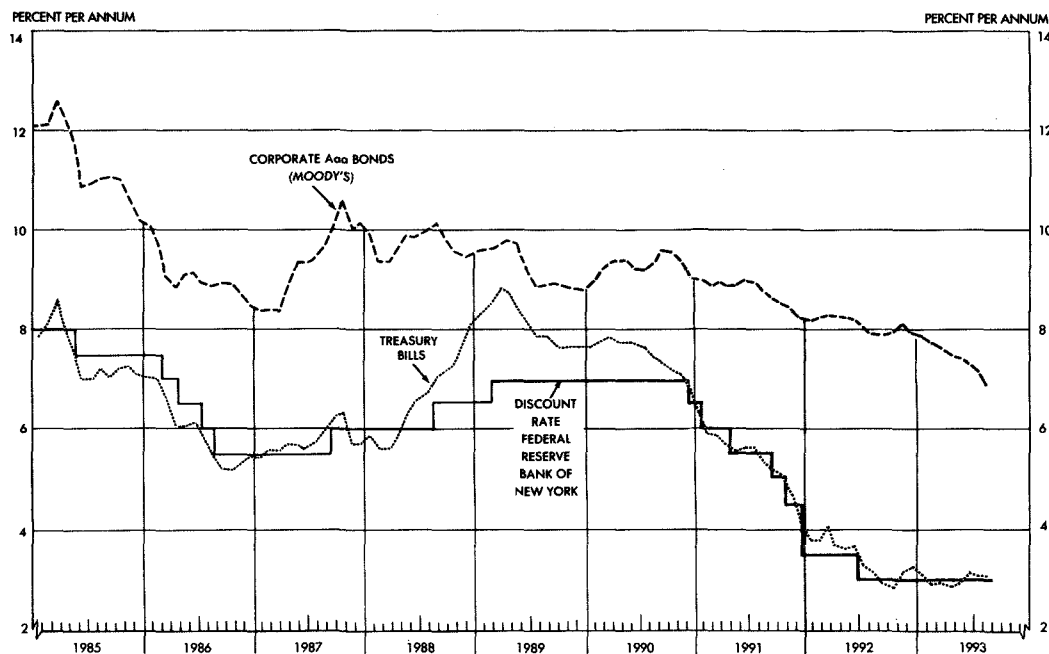

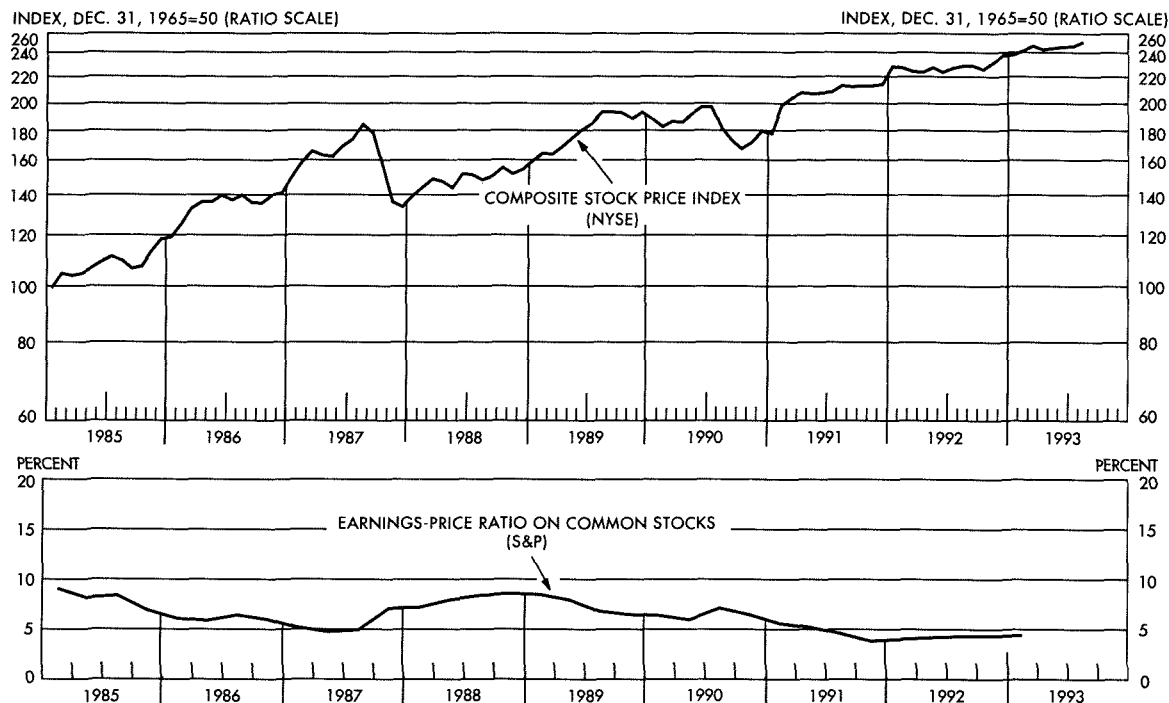

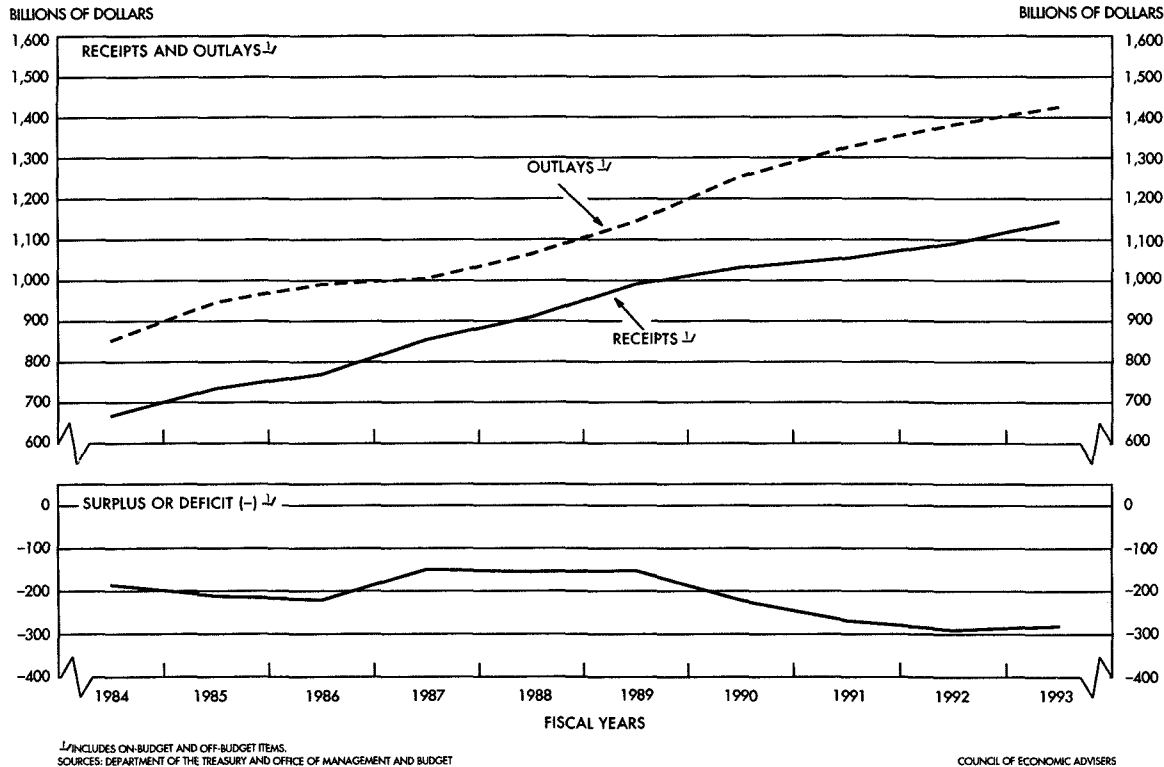

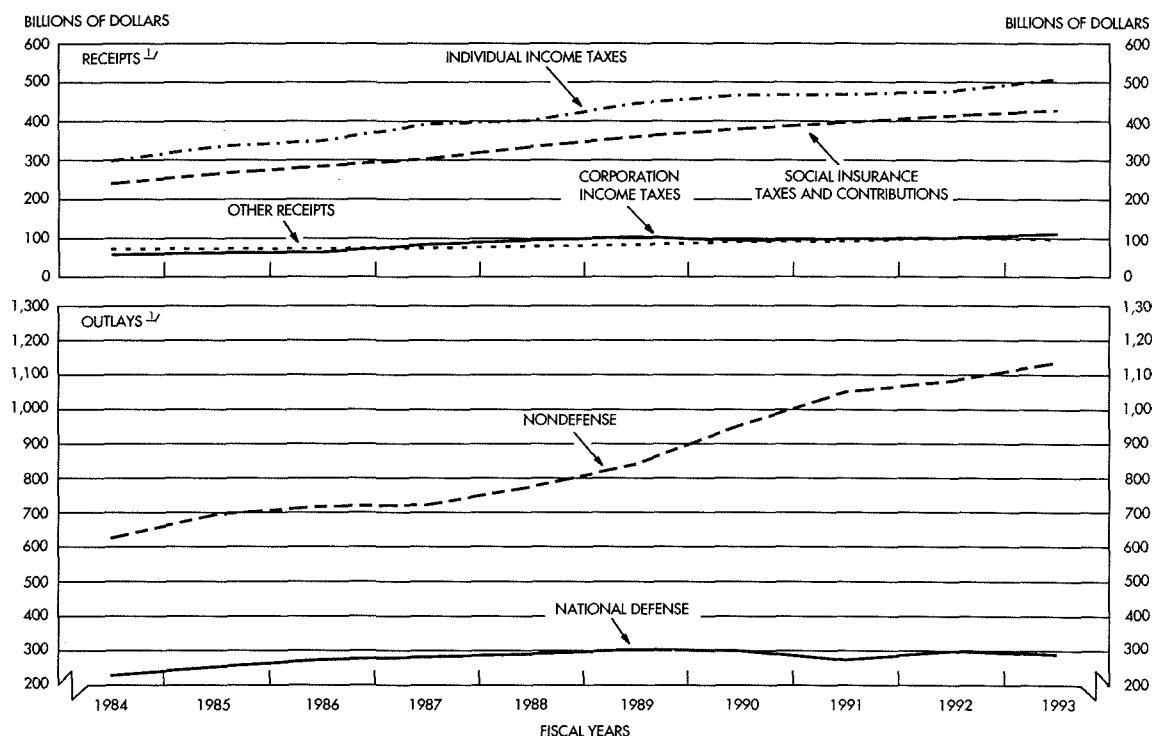

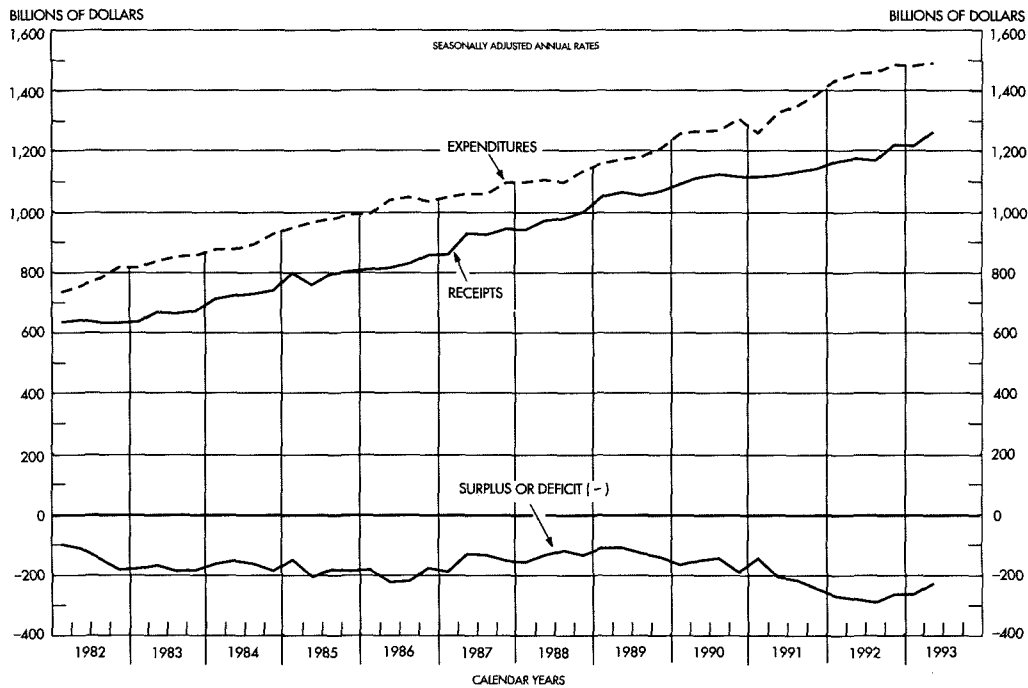

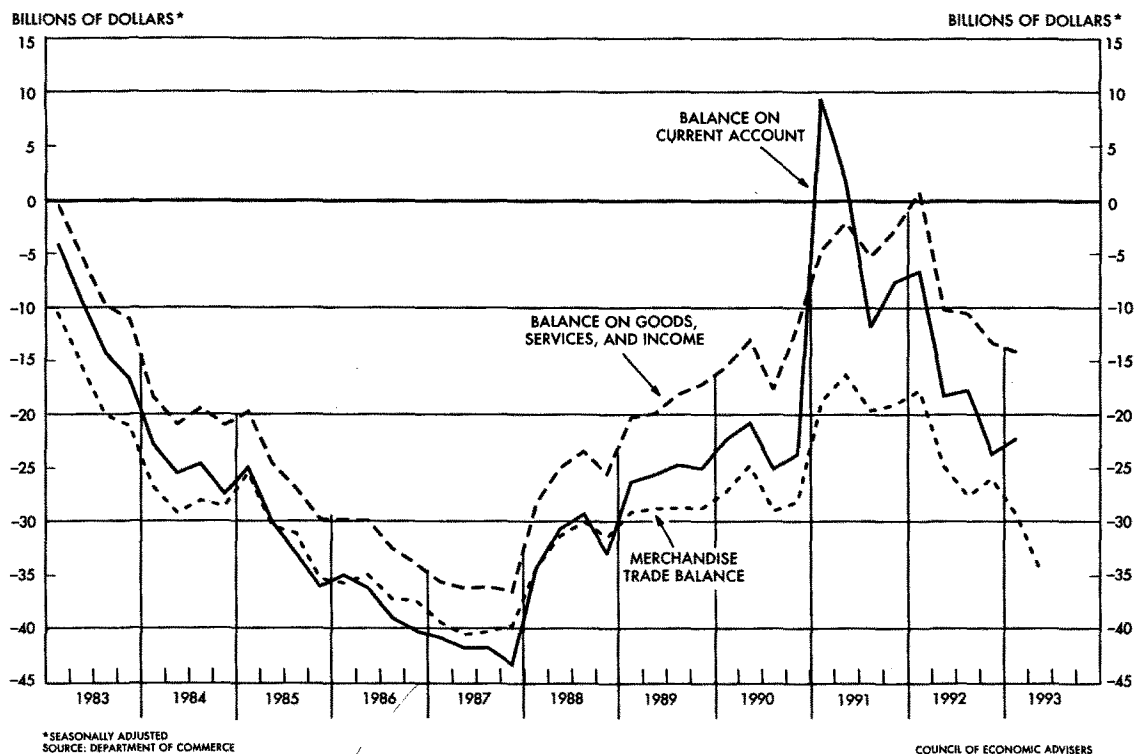

In the capital accounts, U.S. claims on foreigners reported by U.S. banks decreased \$33.9 billion in the first quarter of 1993, in contrast to an increase of \$3.5 billion in the fourth quarter of 1992. U.S. liabilities to private foreigners reported by U.S. banks, excluding Treasury securities, decreased \$22.0 billion in the first quarter, following a decrease of \$1.2 billion in the fourth quarter.
