

Resampling of Industries

In July 1986 the Bureau of Labor Statistics published the first results of a systematic process, called recycling, for updating the Producer Price Index sample for the mining and manufacturing sectors on an industry-by-industry basis. Effective with this report, the second set of recycled industries is now being introduced.

Recycling will not automatically be carried out for every industry on a periodic basis; instead, industries will be re-sampled as needed. When the structure, membership, technology, or product mix of an industry has shifted significantly, the sample for that industry will be updated to reflect current conditions more accurately.

Thirty-five manufacturing and two mining industries that have been recycled are being introduced this month. Indexes for these industries and most of their products will continue to appear in table 5 of the detailed monthly report, *Producer Price Indexes*.

Resampling of Industries

In July 1986, the Bureau of Labor Statistics published the first results of a systematic process of resampling to update the Producer Price Index sample for the domestic mining and manufacturing sectors on an industry-by-industry basis. Subsequent efforts were completed in January 1987 and July 1987. Effective with this release, the fourth set of resampled industries is introduced. Under the resampling procedure, the sample for an industry is updated to reflect current conditions more accurately when the structure, membership, technology, or product mix of an industry has shifted significantly.

Thirty-six resampled manufacturing industries and one resampled mining industry are being introduced this month. Indexes for these industries and most of their products will continue to appear in table 5 of the monthly report, *Producer Price Indexes*.

In addition, the scheduled air cargo, air courier, and charter air transportation portions of the air transportation, certificated carriers index (SIC 4511) are being introduced into the PPI system this month. When the air passenger portion of the index is collected in the PPI, an overall 4-digit index covering scheduled air cargo and air passenger services will be published. At that time, the SIC coding will shift from the 1972 numbering (SIC 4511) to that of 1987 (SIC 4512).

Resampling of Industries

Effective with this issue of *Producer Price Indexes*, another set of resampled industries is introduced. Under the resampling procedure, the sample for an industry is updated to reflect current conditions more accurately when the structure, membership, technology, or product mix of an industry has shifted significantly. The Bureau of Labor Statistics published the first results of this systematic process in July 1986. Subsequent efforts have been completed at 6-month intervals.

Twenty-nine resampled manufacturing and 6 mining industries, along with 1 service industry, are being introduced this month. Indexes for these manufacturing and mining industries and most of their products will continue to appear in table 5 of this periodical. The United States Postal Service indexes, previously shown as table 10 of this periodical, have been rebased to June 1989=100 and will now be included in table 5, effective with this issue. A summary index for postal services appears in table 4 of this issue.
