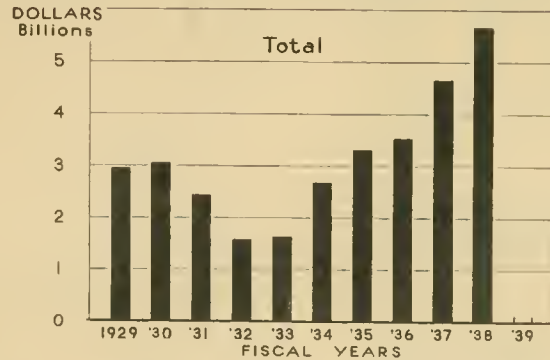

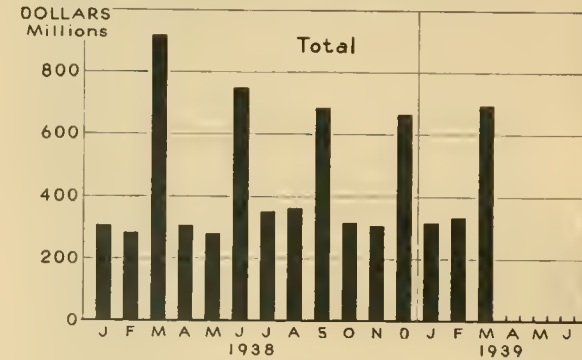


COLLECTIONS OF INTERNAL REVENUE

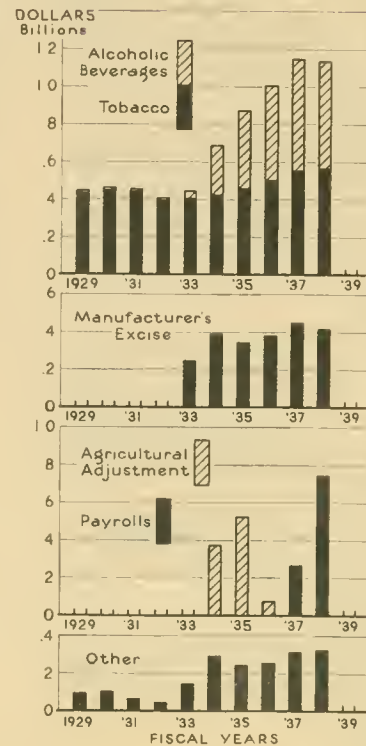
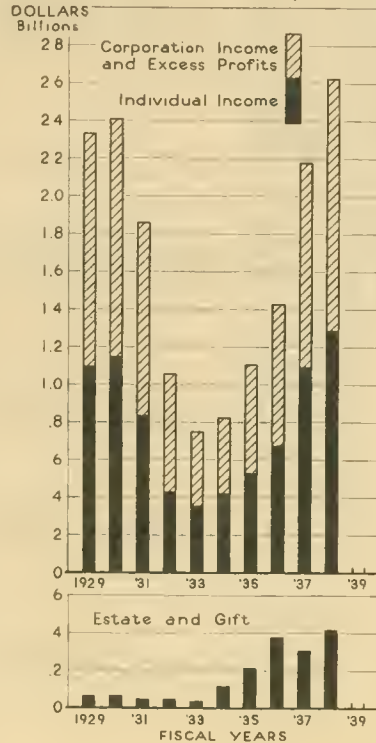
YEARLY, FISCAL YEARS 1929 TO 1938



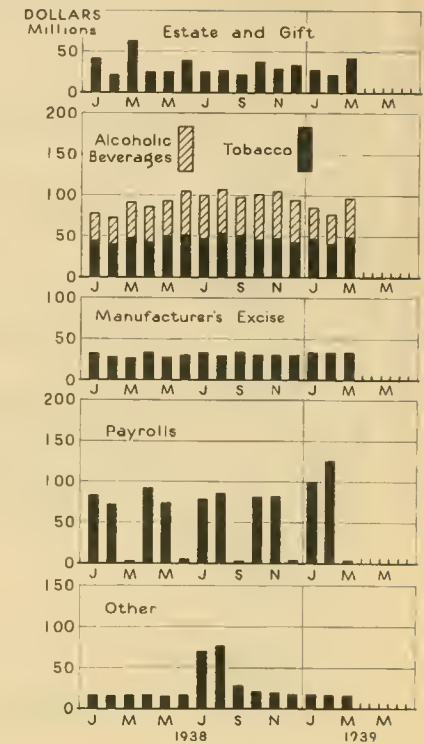
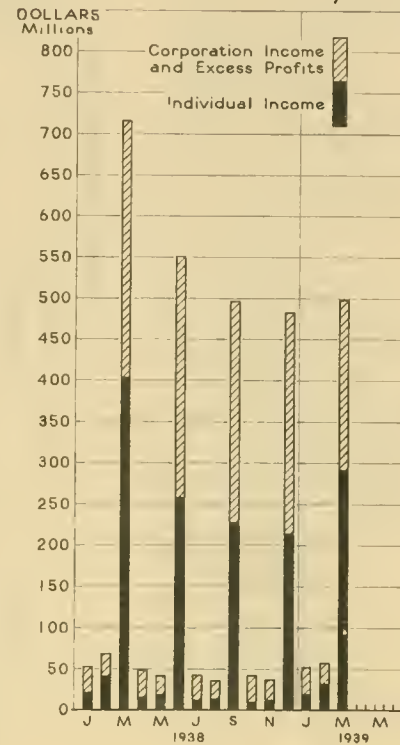
MONTHLY, JANUARY 1938 TO MARCH 1939

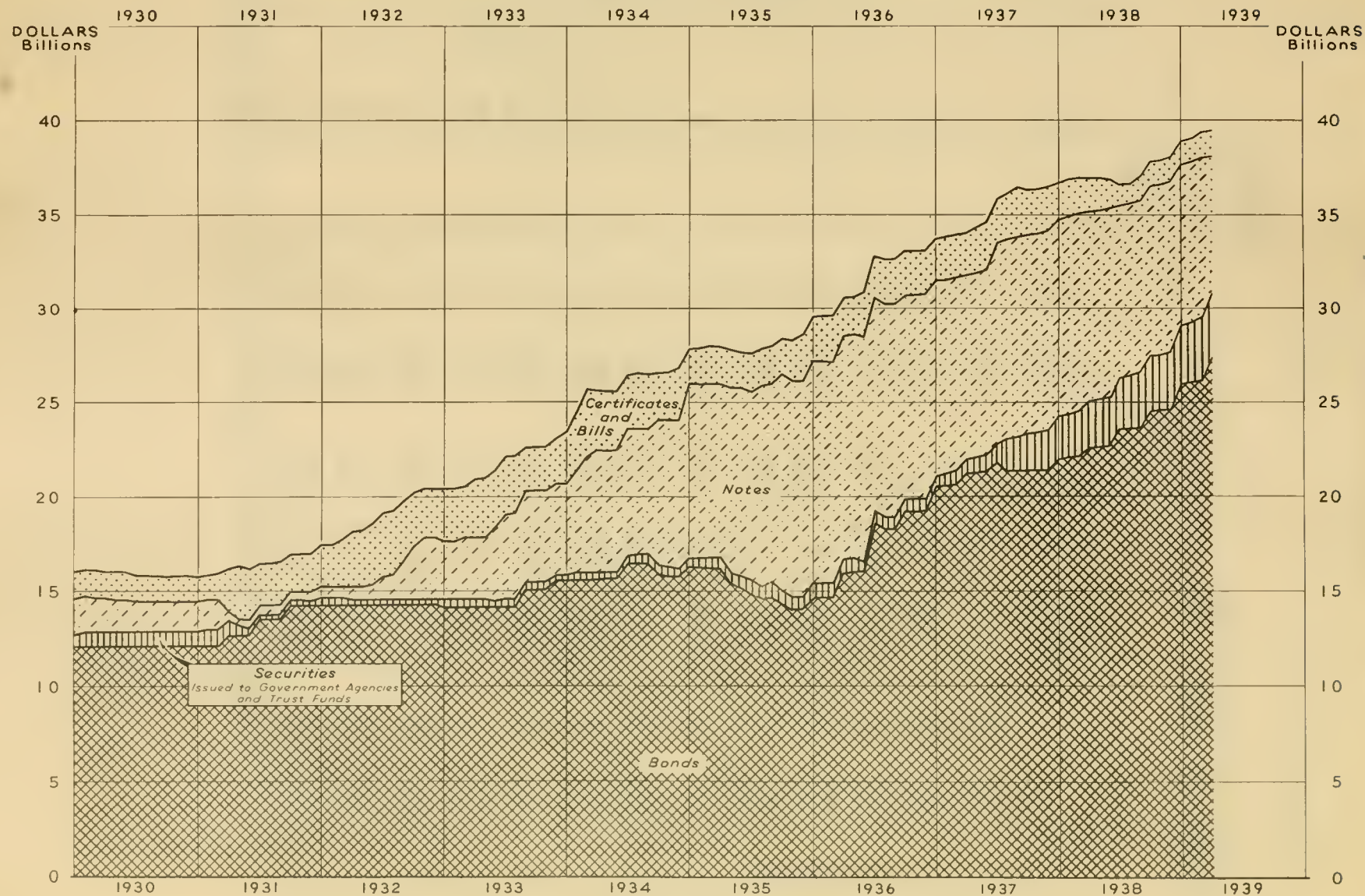

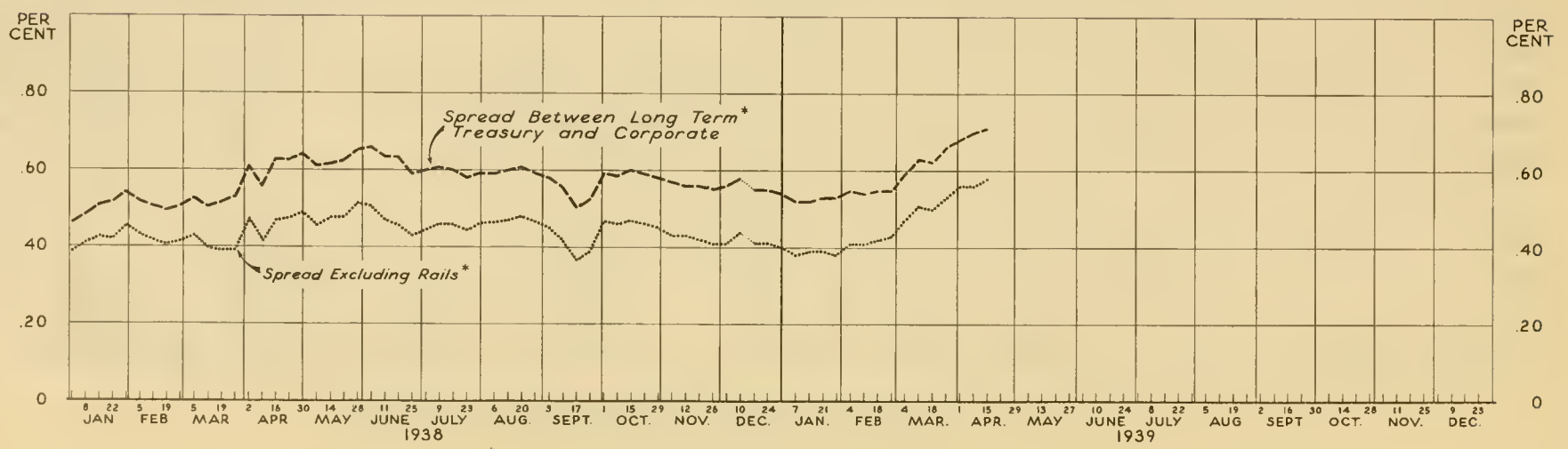
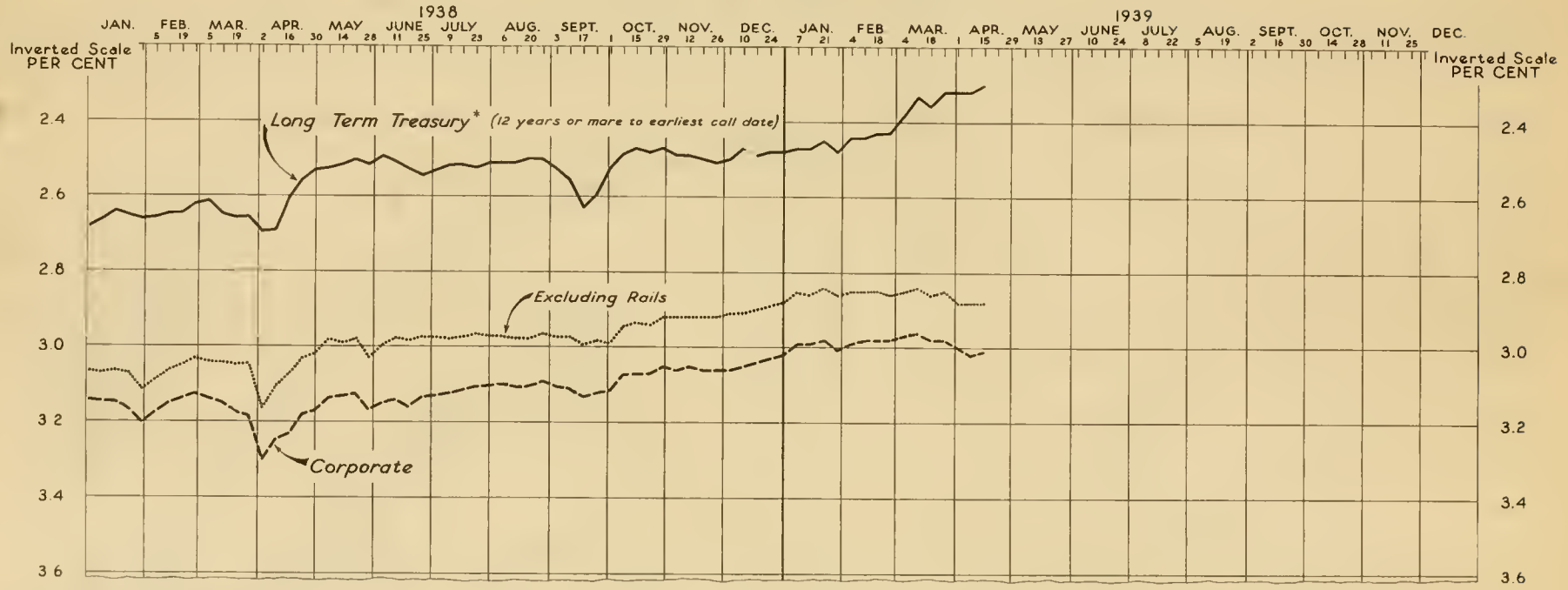

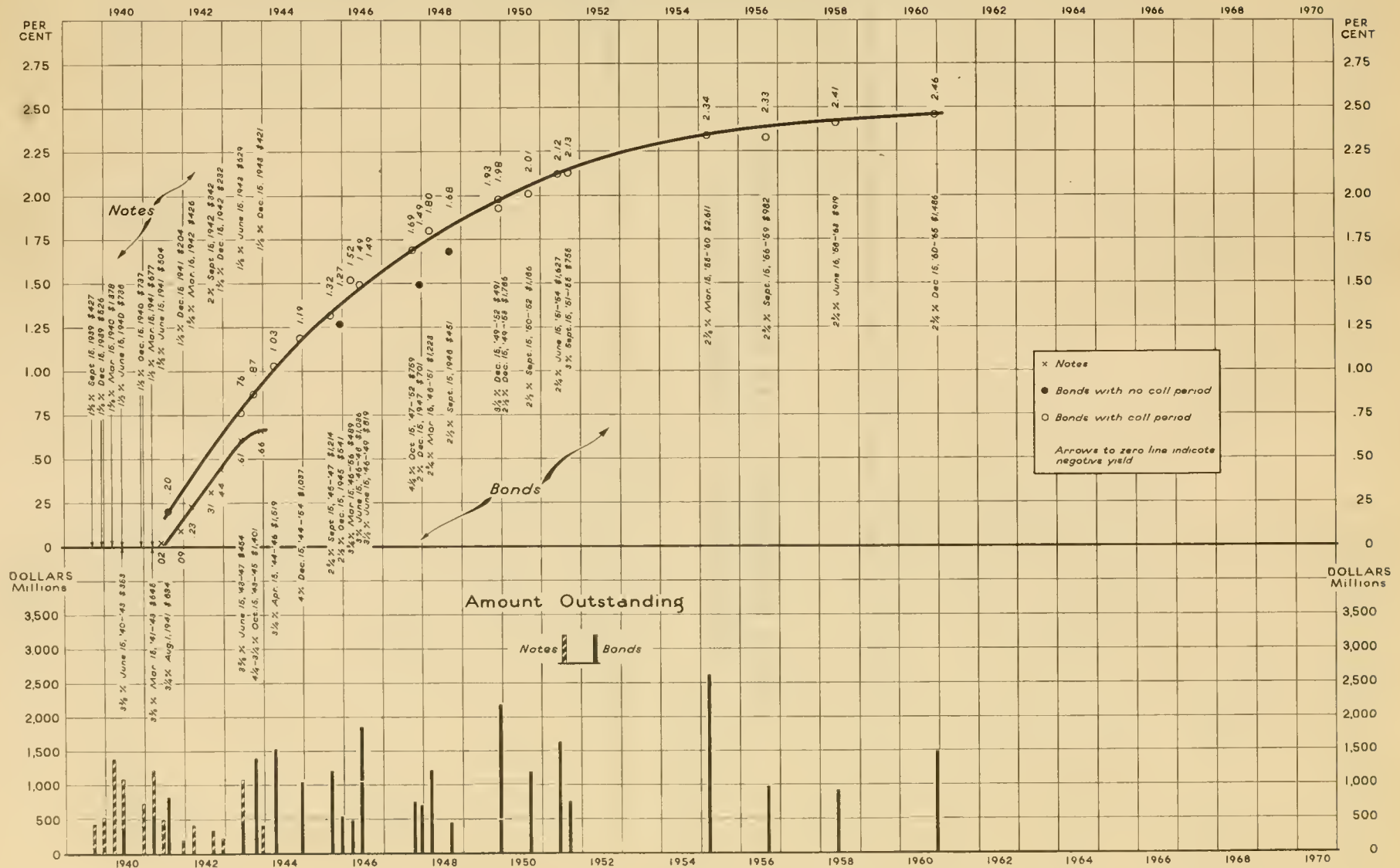

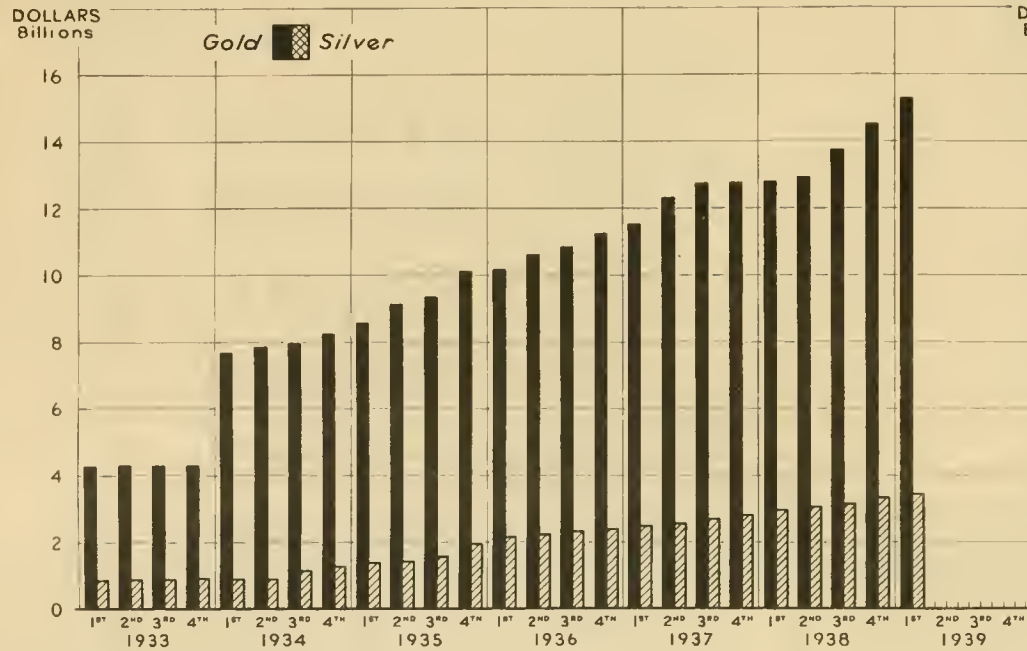

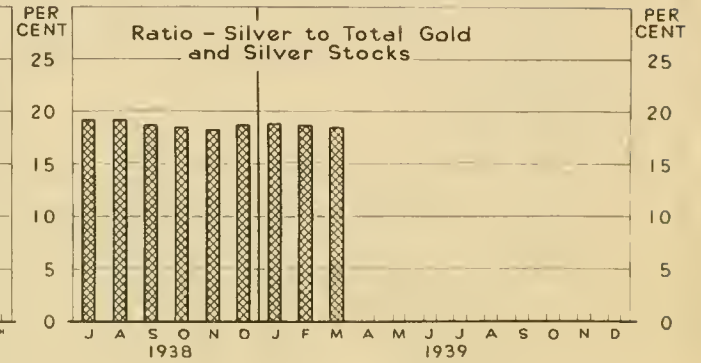
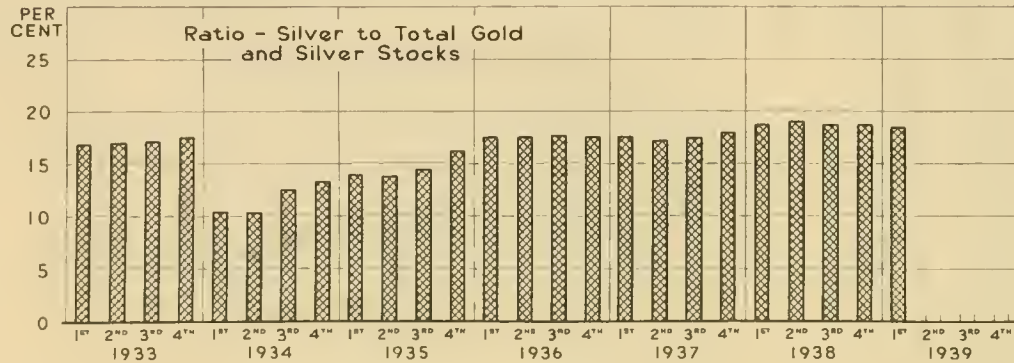
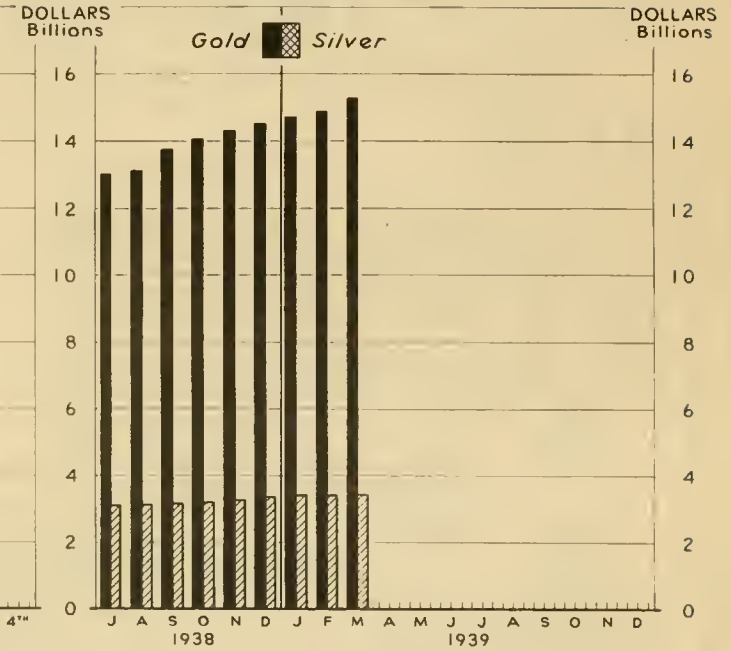
