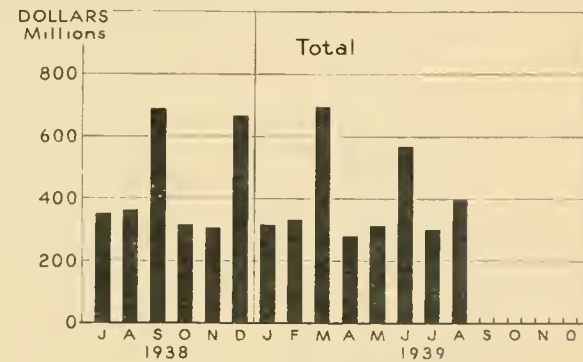

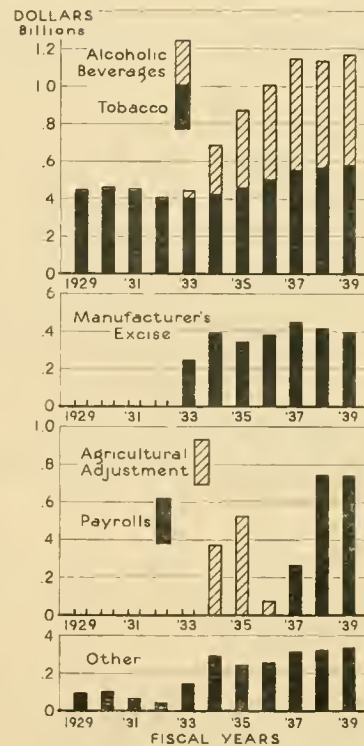
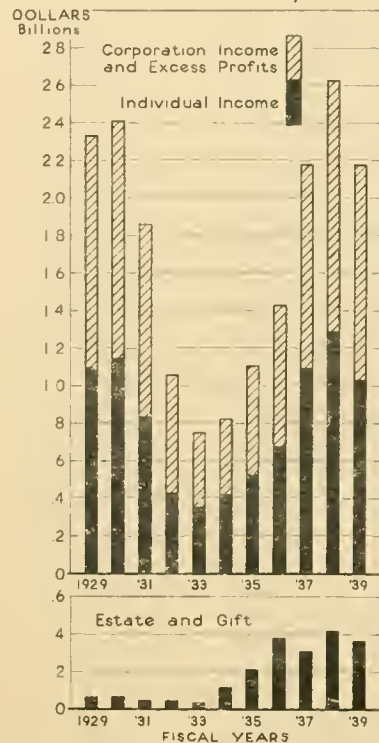
YEARLY, FISCAL YEARS 1929 TO 1939



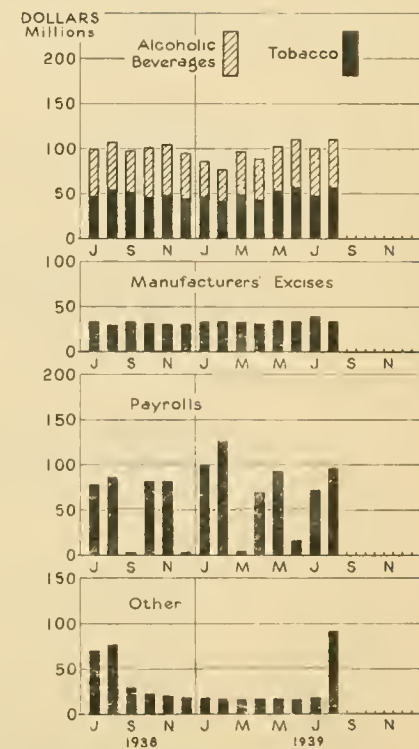
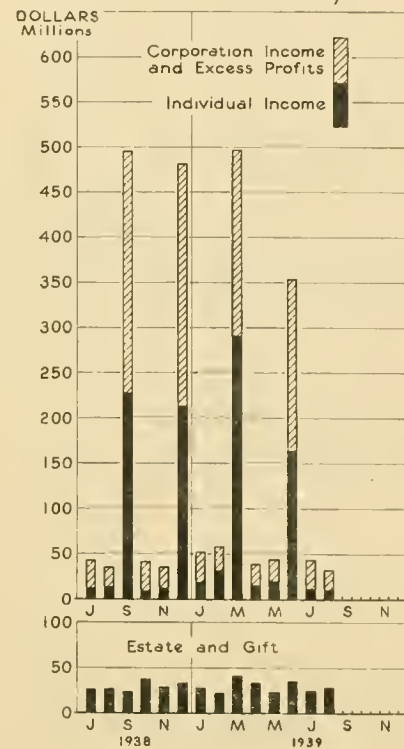
MONTHLY, JULY 1938 TO AUGUST 1939

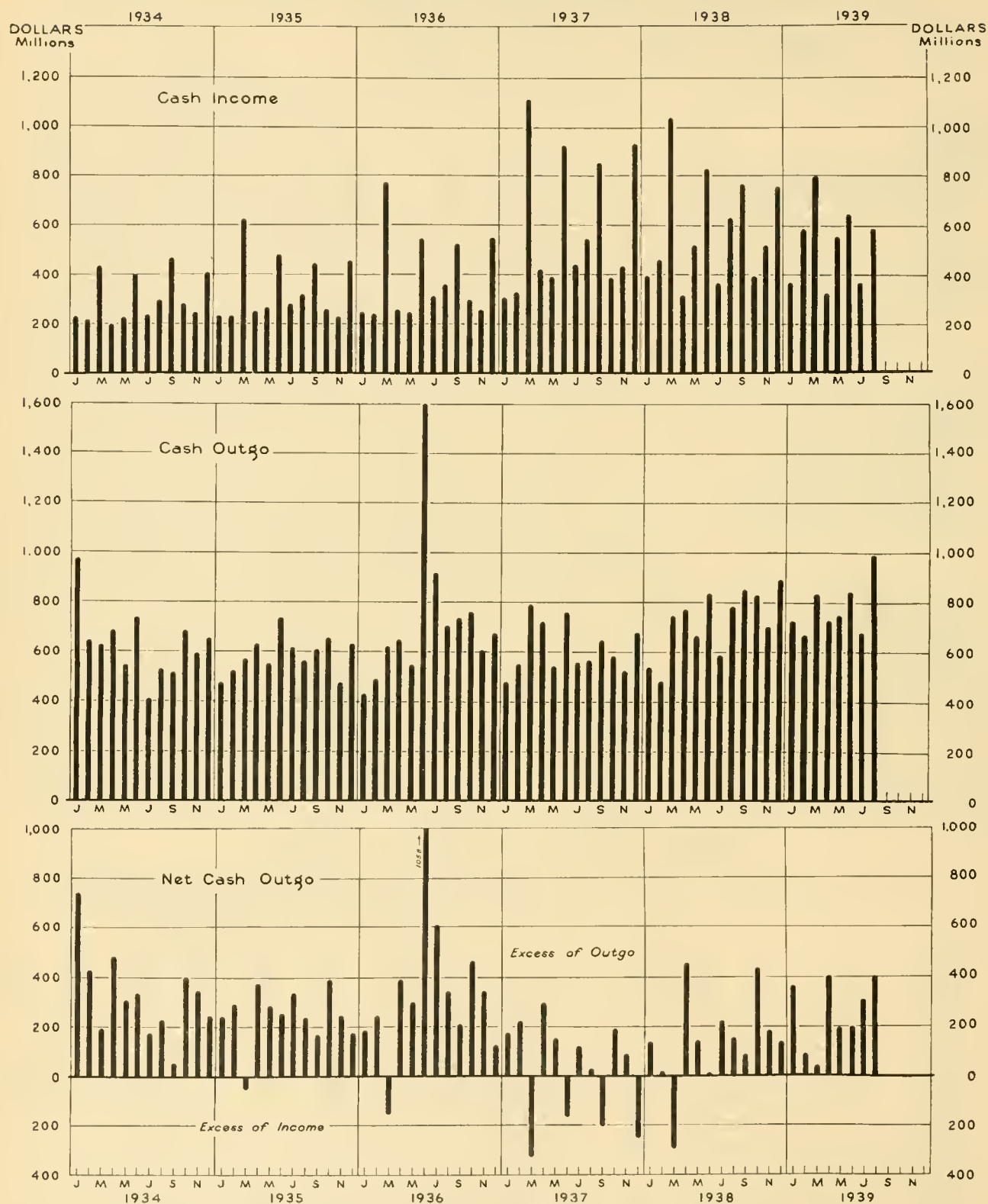

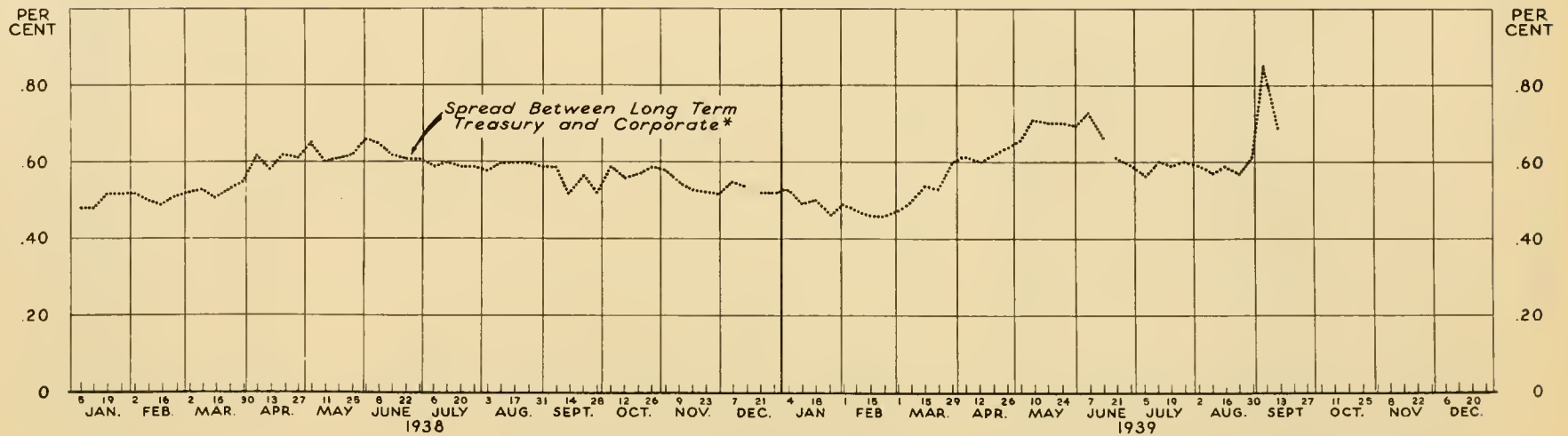
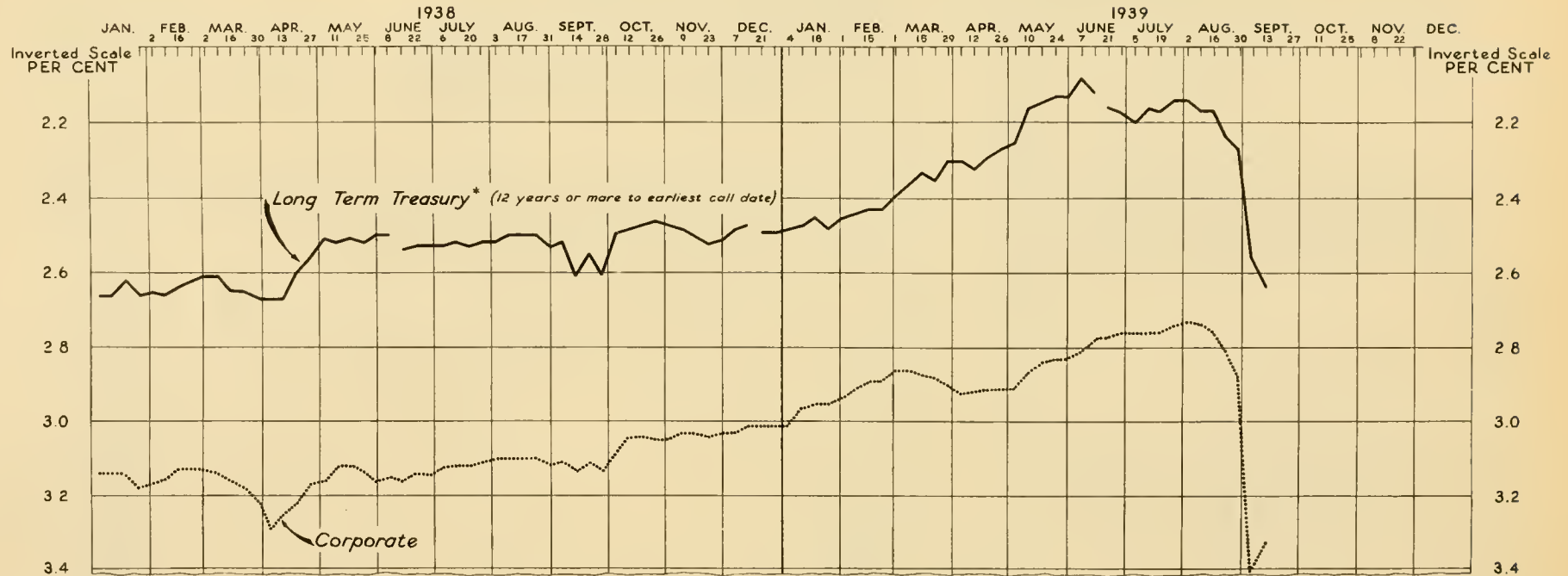

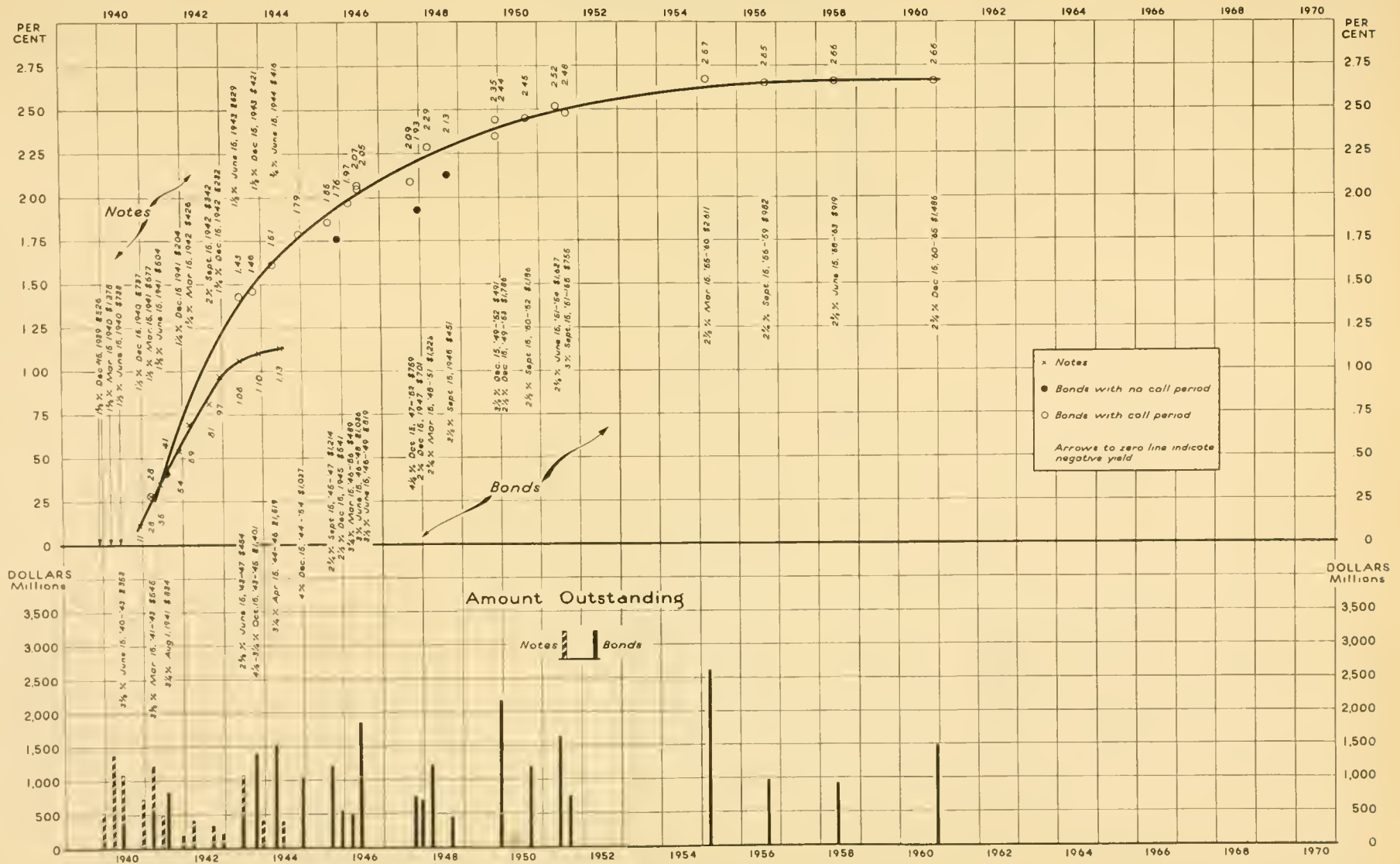
Yields Based on Wednesday Quotations

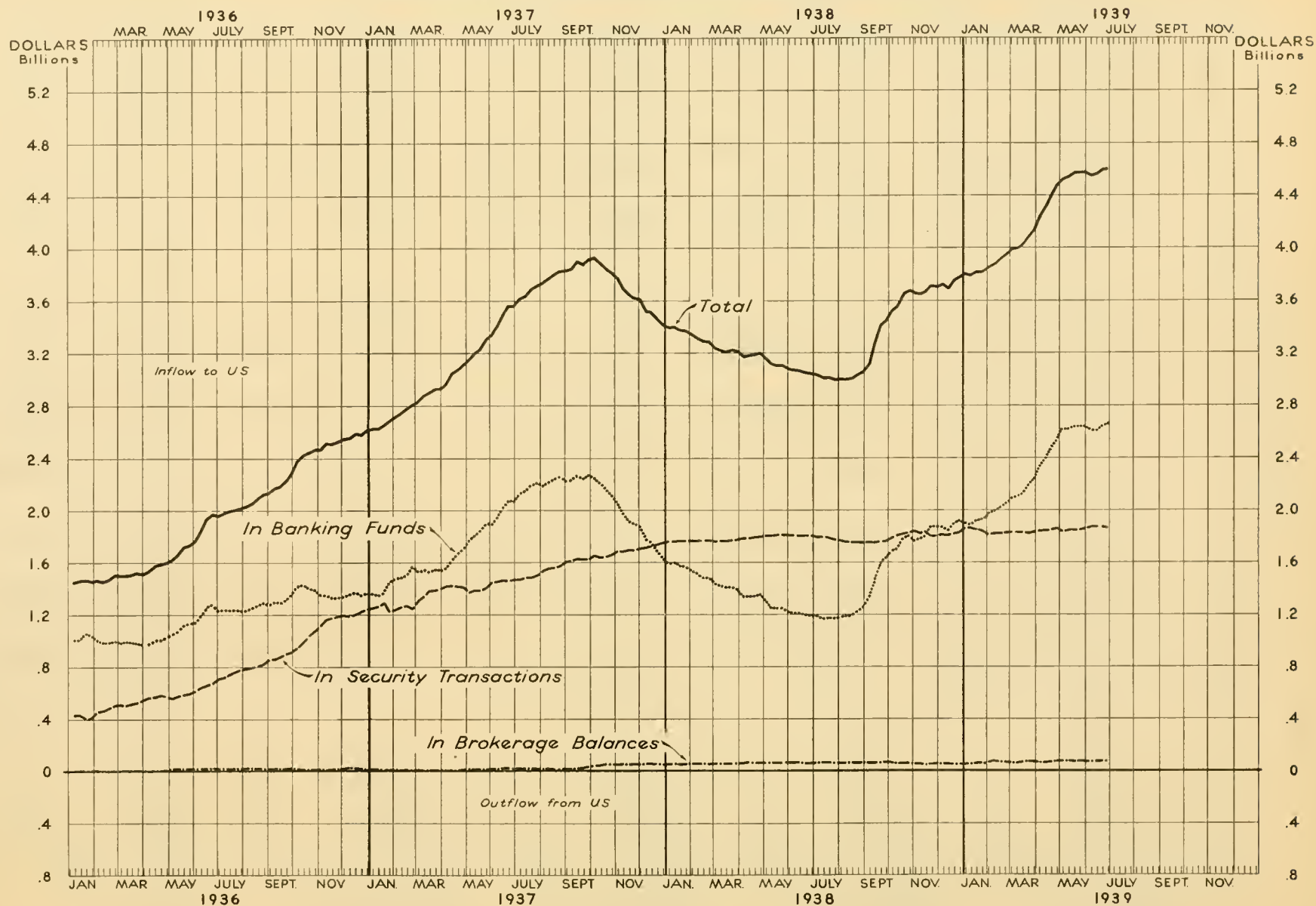

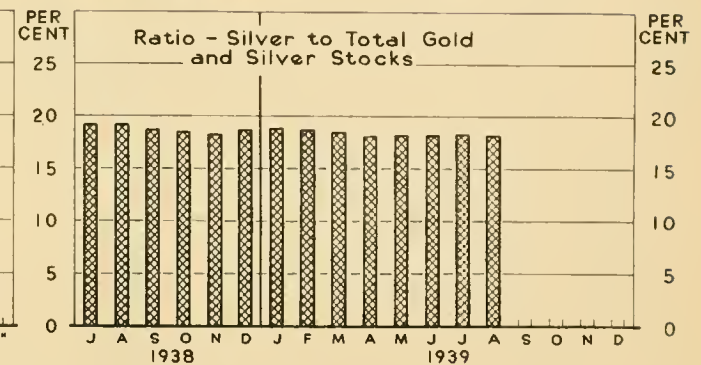
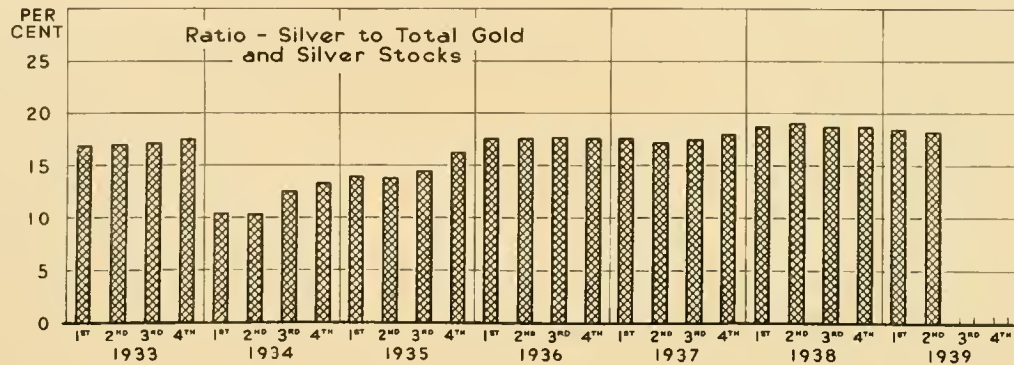
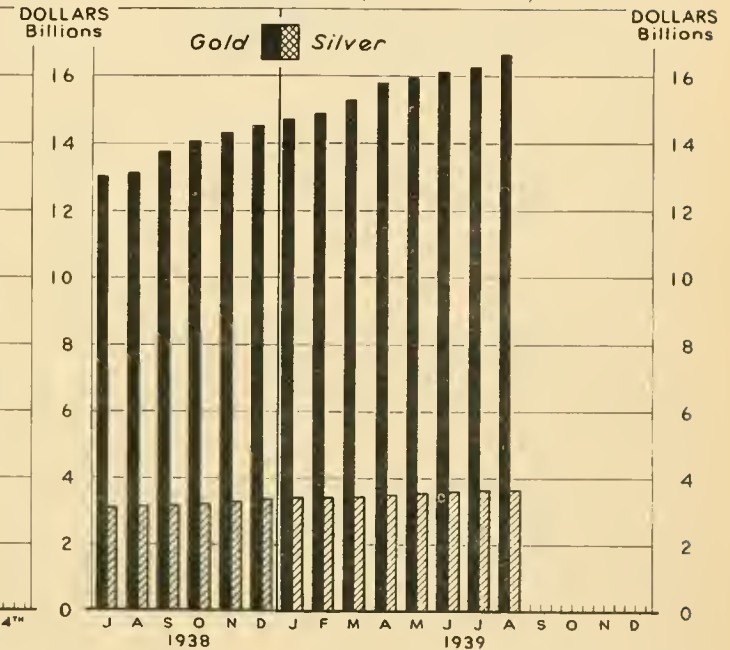
