OFFICE OF SOLID FUELS [COORDINATION] COORDINATOR FOR WAR

Salaries and Expenses, Office of Solid Fuels Coordinator for War—

For all expenses necessary to enable the Secretary of the Interior through such agencies within the Department of the Interior as he may designate to perform the functions with respect to the Office of Solid Fuels [Coordination] Coordinator for War as prescribed by the President (Fed. Reg., March 10 and July 25, 1942), including the employment without regard to civil-service and classification laws of an assistant at not to exceed \$10,000 per annum and not to exceed [eight] 18 technical employees; other personal services in the District of Columbia; printing and binding; traveling expenses, including attendance at meetings of organizations concerned with the purposes of this appropriation, and actual transportation and other necessary expenses and not to exceed \$10 per diem in lieu of subsistence of persons serving, while away from their homes, in an advisory capacity without other compensation from the United States, or at \$1 per annum; contract stenographic reporting services; books of reference, periodicals and newspapers; office supplies; furniture and equipment [including exchange and repair thereof]; purchase, [exchange,] maintenance, repair, and operation of passenger-carrying automobiles; [other miscellaneous services;] and the acceptance and utilization of voluntary and uncompensated services; [\$920,000] \$895,000: Provided, That section 3709, Revised Statutes, shall not apply to any purchase or service rendered under this appropriation when the aggregate amount involved does not exceed \$300 (56 Stat. 716).
