

BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported by banks in leading cities for the week ending April 23, aggregated \$9,085,000,000 or about 11.8 per cent below the total of \$10,200,000,000 reported for the preceding week. Most of the latter centers reported smaller figures than for the previous week. New York City shows a decrease of \$120,000,000, Boston - a decrease of \$76,000,000, Cleveland - a decrease of \$100,000,000 and New Orleans - a decrease of \$23,000,000.

When compared with the corresponding period of 1923, debits for the week under review show a decrease of \$407,000,000 or about 4.3 per cent. New York City reports a decrease of \$424,000,000, Boston - a decrease of \$13,000,000 and Pittsburgh - a decrease of \$12,000,000. Philadelphia shows an increase of \$41,000,000, Cleveland an increase of \$22,000,000 and Los Angeles an increase of \$19,000,000.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly for January, 1919, were \$8,513,847,000 as compared with \$9,672,776,000 for the preceding week and \$8,923,380,000 for the week ending April 25, 1923.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for 254 centers, of which 247 are included in the summary by Federal Reserve
