BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported by banks in leading cities for the week ending April 30 aggregated \$9,852,000,000 or about 8 per cent above the total of \$9,081,000,000 reported for the preceding week.

New York City reports an increase of \$356,000,000 and Pittsburgh an increase of \$33,000,000, while smaller increases are shown for New Orleans and Chicago. Philadelphia shows a decrease of \$45,000,000, Detroit a decrease of \$44,000,000 and Cincinnati - a decrease of \$14,000,000.

As compared with the corresponding period ending May 2, 1923, debits for the week under review show a decrease of \$1,220,000,000 or 11.2 per cent. New York City reports a decrease of \$535,000,000, Chicago - a decrease of \$272,000,000, Philadelphia - a decrease of \$47,000,000 and San Francisco - a decrease of \$35,000,000. An increase of \$20,000,000 is shown for Pittsburgh, and smaller increases for New Orleans and Atlanta.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly since January, 1919, were \$9,298,732,000 as compared with \$8,513,847,000 for the preceding week and \$10,464,108,000 for the week ending May 2, 1923.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in 252 centers, of which 245 are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
