## BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported by banks in leading cities for the week ending June 11, aggregated \$9,366,000,000 or 3.4 per cent above the total of \$9,000,000,000 reported for the preceding week, which was a five-day week in most reports. New York City shows an increase of \$229,000,000, and Los Angeles - an increase of \$18,000,000. Decreases of \$34,000,000, \$31,000,000 and \$15,000,000, respectively, are shown for St. Louis, Chicago and San Francisco.

As compared with the corresponding week of 1923, debits for the week under review show an increase of \$460,000,000 or 5.2 per cent. New York City reports an increase of \$605,000,000, and Pittsburgh - an increase of \$19,000,000. Declines of \$12,000,000 for Chicago, of \$23,000,000 for Philadelphia and of \$15,000,000 for St. Louis, are shown.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly since January, 1919, were \$8,802,347,000 as compared with \$8,518,399,000 for the preceding week and \$8,326,541,000 for the week ending June 13, 1923.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for 254 centers, of which 246 are included in the summary by Federal Reserve Districts.
