BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported to the Federal Reserve Board by banks in leading cities for the week ending April 15, aggregated \$10,359,000,000 or 5.6 per cent below the total of \$10,975,000,000 reported for the preceding week. New York City reported a reduction of \$666,000,000, Chicago of \$35,000,000, and Philadelphia of \$22,000,000. Increases of \$80,000,000 and \$35,000,000 were reported by Cleveland and Detroit, respectively.

As compared with the week ending April 16, 1924, debits for the week under review show an increase of \$34,000,000. Decreases of \$182,000,000 and \$49,000,000 were reported by New York City and Philadelphia, respectively, while increases were shown by the following cities: Chicago \$47,000,000, St. Louis \$26,000,000, Pittsburgh \$25,000,000, and Cleveland and Baltimore \$23,000,000 each.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly since January, 1919, were \$9,690,630,000 as compared with \$10,290,229,000 for the preceding week and \$9,672,776,000 for the week ending April 16, 1924.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in 256 centers, of which 253 are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
