BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in leading cities for the week ending February 3, aggregated \$13,386,000,000 or 8.1 per cent above the total of \$12,386,000,000 reported for the preceding week. New York City reported an increase of \$582,000,000, while other large increases were as follows: Boston \$83,000,000, San Francisco \$59,000,000, Philadelphia \$43,000,000, Baltimore \$21,000,000 and St. Louis \$20,000,000. The largest reductions, \$32,000,000 and \$28,000,000, were reported by Detroit and Chicago, respectively.

As compared with the week ending February 4, 1925, debits for the week under review are larger by \$1,596,000,000 or 13.5 per cent. Increases were reported for most of the more important centers, the largest increases being as follows: New York City \$931,000,000, Chicago \$94,000,000, Philadelphia \$65,000,000, Boston \$59,000,000, Detroit and San Francisco \$38,000,000 each, Los Angeles \$29,000,000, and Baltimore \$21,000,000.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly since January, 1919, amounted to \$12,640,197,000 as compared with \$11,692,851,000 for the preceding week and \$11,125,968,000 for the week ending February 4, 1925.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for banks in 258 centers, all of which are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
