BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported to the Federal Reserve Board for in leading cities for the week ending March 3, aggregated \$14,331,000,000 1.2 per cent above the total of \$10,150,000,000 reported for the preceding which included but five business days. New York City reported an increase \$2,487,000,000, while other large increases were as follows: Chicago \$2,000,000,000, San Francisco \$190,000,000, Los Angeles \$103,000,000, Boston \$100,000,000, Philadelphia \$84,000,000, Cleveland \$49,000,000, St. Louis \$40,000,000 and Baltimore \$40,000,000.

As compared with the week ending March 4, 1925, debits for the week under re- were larger by \$1,964,000,000 or 15.9 per cent. Increases were reported in most of the more important centers, the largest increases being as follows: New York City \$1,358,000,000, Chicago \$172,000,000, San Francisco \$76,000,000, Philadelphia \$64,000,000, Boston and Los Angeles \$26,000,000, each, and Baltimore \$20,000,000. The largest reduction, \$32,000,000, was reported by Philadelphia.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly since January, 1919, amounted to \$13,552,371,000 as compared with \$9,548,396,000 for the preceding week and \$11,653,540,000 for the week ending March 4, 1925.

Debits to individual accounts were reported to the Federal Reserve Board for in 258 centers, all of which are included in the summary by Federal reserve districts.
