BANK DEBITS

debits to individual accounts, as reported to the Federal Reserve Board in leading cities for the week ending April 6, 1927, aggregated \$13,228,000 or 13.6 per cent above the total of \$11,660,000 reported for the preceding week.

Total debits for the week under review are \$1,626,000,000 or 12.1 per cent above for the week ending April 7, 1926. New York City reported an increase of \$1,163,000,000, Chicago \$89,000,000, Philadelphia \$72,000,000, Pittsburgh \$67,000,000, San Francisco \$61,000,000, Newark \$45,000,000, Los Angeles \$30,000,000, and Cleveland \$21,000,000. Declines of \$26,000,000 were reported in St. Louis, and \$23,000,000 and \$21,000,000 by Detroit and St. Louis, respectively.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published since January 1919 amounted to \$14,145,836,000, as compared with \$13,355,000 for the preceding week and \$12,576,887,000 for the week ending April 7, 1926.
