BANK DEBITS

Debits to individual accounts, as reported to the Federal Reserve Board by leading cities for the week ending June 1, 1927, which included Memorial observed as a holiday in most of the reporting centers, aggregated \$12,789,180 or 2.4 per cent below the total of \$13,106,612 reported for the preceding week.

Total debits for the week under review are \$1,406,000,000 or 12.4 per cent above those for the week ending June 2, 1926. New York City reported an increase of \$1,000,000, Chicago \$92,000,000, Pittsburgh \$50,000,000, San Francisco \$17,000,000 and Philadelphia \$26,000,000, while Cleveland and St. Louis reported decreases of \$38,000,000 and \$22,000,000, respectively.

Aggregate debits for 141 centers for which figures have been published weekly in January 1919 amounted to about \$12,100,000,000, as compared with \$12,950,000 for the preceding week and \$10,637,253,000 for the week ending June 2, 1926.
