In the search for the papers of Frank A. Vanderlip I was referred by the librarian of the National City Bank to Mr. Hevener of the Bank's Public Relations Department. He reported after investigation that there were no papers of Mr. Vanderlip at the National City Bank. He suggested we call his son, Frank A. Vanderlip, Jr., at 52 Wall St. (DI 4- 3644).

Mr. Vanderlip said that there were papers in existence and he thought there would be no trouble about granting access to them for scholarly research purposes. His mother would have to give permission. She has already allowed a student from Chicago to consult them in connection with his thesis on Yerkes, a Chicago traction magnate. Mrs. Vanderlip's address is 405 Lexington Ave., N.Y.C. (MU 6- 6333). (According to Mr. Hevener, she is elderly but still active in charitable causes and I presume this is a business office address.)

However, Mr. Vanderlip said his sister was more familiar with the papers since she was his secretary for a number of years. She just arrived back from Europe on December 15, and he had not yet succeeded in reaching her by phone. The number is: Briarcliff 6- 2278. Her home address is:
