Dear Everett:

Here are xerox copies of Mildred Adams Kenyon's memos and notes based on her interviews with Owen D. Young, you and your father. Also enclosed are her notes on papers in Mr. Young's files bearing on the Federal Reserve System.

I hope these will be helpful, but I suspect there is little here that you do not have from your files or recollections.

I've gone over Mildred's other notes. The occasional references to Mr. Young and Mr. Case refer briefly to their activities, and I found nothing substantive that would be helpful to you as to performance, or character, except respect.

I must add that it has been refreshing to read Mildred's notes. The towns, villages, and farms there produced more men of character than the suburbs do today.

In my previous letter I was wrong in one detail. The Glass papers were already at the University of Virginia. We merely supported a project to have Kincaid index them. That was done. Les Chandler's book on Benjamin Strong was also a product of this endeavor.
