The papers of Edward M. House, diplomat, representative of President Wilson to European countries, representative of the United States to Versailles War Council, are deposited in the Yale University Library at New Haven, Connecticut.

Approximate number of items: 150,000 manuscript correspondence sheets, apart from manuscripts of official records
