JOHN PIERPONT MORGAN

(1867 - 1943)

The papers of J. Pierpont Morgan the younger, private banker, member Federal Advisory Council, are in the custody of Morgan and Company, and Mr. Junius Morgan. Their exact whereabouts is not specified, but it is a safe assumption that the greater part of them are in the files and the storage space of Morgan and Co. at 23 Wall Street. They are said to have remained in the same state in which they were left when Mr. Morgan died in 1943.

Also there are numerous letters, both to and from Mr. Morgan, among the Willard Straight papers in the Cornell University Library. Correspondence with Mr. Benjamin Strong is in the files of the New York Federal Reserve Bank.
