The Williams' papers include a Presidential Series holding some correspondence with Warren G. Harding, but more with Woodrow Wilson to whom Williams was devoted. Letters concern the currency bill, trusts, Trade Commission, etc. No Federel Reserve material is specifically noted, but this may be only because the Library has no more then a two-page memorandum describing the collection. The period covered, and the interests of Mr. Williams, suggest that comment on the then new Federal Reserve System nould probably be included.
