

[Public Law 438-78th Congress] [Chapter 425-2d Session] [S. 725] AN ACT

To provide for the punishment of persons conspiring to violate the laws relating to counterfeiting, and certain other laws.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That chapter 7 of the Criminal Code, as amended (U. S. C., 1940 edition, title 18, ch. 7), is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following section:

"SEC. 178a. If two or more persons conspire to violate any provision of this chapter, or of sections 205, 218, 219, or 220 of chapter 8 of the Criminal Code, as amended (U. S. C., 1940 edition, title 18, ch. 7, and secs. 328, 347, 348, and 349 of ch. 8), or of the Act of August 26, 1935 (49 Stat. 866; U. S. C., 1940 edition, title 18, sec. 349a), and one or more of such persons do any act to effect the object of the conspiracy, each of the parties to such conspiracy shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to the same fine or imprisonment, or both, as is applicable in the case of conviction for violating such provision."

[PUBLIC LAW 474-78TH CONGRESS] [CHAPTER 549-2D SESSION] [S. 2004]

AN ACT

To amend the Act entitled "An Act to mobilize the productive facilities of small business in the interests of successful prosecution of the war, and for other purposes", approved June 11, 1942.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That subsection (b) of section 4 of the Act entitled "An Act to mobilize the productive facilities of small business in the interests of successful prosecution of the war, and for other purposes", approved June 11, 1942 (56 Stat. 351-357), is hereby amended by substituting the figures "\$350,000,000" for the figures "\$150,000,000" wherever occurring in said subsection. Approved December 8, 1944.

[PUBLIC LAW 519-78TH CONGRESS] [CHAPTER 624-2D SESSION] [S. 1954]

AN ACT

To amend the Act entitled "An Act to authorize the use for war purposes of silver held or owned by the United States", approved July 12, 1943.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section 2 of the Act entitled "An Act to authorize the use for war purposes of silver held or owned by the United States", approved July 12, 1943 (Public Law 137, Seventy-eighth Congress), is amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2. This Act shall expire on December 31, 1945." Approved December 20, 1944.

9.185. Suit to Enjoin Enforcement of Membership Condition.--This was a suit by a member bank to annul and enjoin the enforcement of a condition of membership. The court dismissed the complaint (1) against the Federal Reserve Board because Congress had not given its consent to suits against the Board and befause the Board is not an "inhabitant" of the district where the suit was brought; (2) against the Federal Reserve Agent because he had no authority to enforce the condition; and (3) against the Federal Reserve Bank because the power to enforce the condition was vested in the Board only, with the result that a suit against the Bank was a suit "against a subaltern without authority," and was, therefore, not maintainable. The court also pointed out that the plaintiff had sustained no present injury and consequently there was no proper case for a declaratory judgment. Peoples Bank v. Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, 58 F. Supp. 25 (1944); appeal dismissed, 149 F 2d. 851.

9.186. <u>Same.</u>--Peoples Bank sought a declaratory judgment and decree invalidating and restraining enforcement by the Board of a condition of membership in the Federal Reserve System requiring plaintiff to withdraw from the System if (1) Transamerica Corporation acquired an interest in plaintiff and (2) if the Board required the withdrawal. The Supreme Court decided that, although such an interest had been acquired, the bank's grievance was too remote to justify an injunction or declaratory judgment, since the Board had formally disavowed any intention to invoke the condition in the absence of any indication of subversion of the bank's independence. (This, in effect, reversed <u>Peoples Bank</u> v. <u>Eccles et al.</u>, 64 F. Supp. 811 (Dis. of Col. 1946), holding the facts above to warrant adjudication in an action for declaratory judgment.) <u>Eccles v. Peoples Bank of Lakewood</u> Village, 333 U. S. 426 (1948).

M-601. Blocked Accounts of Foreign Nationals .-- The Reserve Bank. acting for the Secretary of the Treasury, advised the plaintiff and the bank where he kept his deposit that the Secretary of the Treasury had determined to "block" his account on the ground that he was a "national" of a foreign country within the meaning of the "freezing" regulations. Plaintiff filed suit to restrain the Federal Reserve Bank "either as agent or as principal" from interfering with his bank account. The court held (1) that the Secretary of the Treasury was an indispensable party. since the Reserve Bank was performing merely a ministerial function for him, and (2) that there was an administrative remedy under the regulations of the Secretary, which remedy plaintiff should have exhausted before coming into court. The court pointed out that only the Secretary could change the determination that plaintiff was a "national" of a foreign country and "unblock" his account. Hartman v. Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia, 55 F. Supp. 801 (1944).
