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Section 24 of the Federal Reserve Act was amended so as to exempt loans made to established industrial or commercial businesses in which the RFC cooperates or purchases a participation, from the limitations with respect to the amounts and maturities of real estate loans which may be made by national banks. The purpose of this amendment was to continue in effect a similar exception previously provided in the law which had been eliminated when the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act was completely revised. Section 19 of the Federal Reserve Act was amended to authorize the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System to increase the reserves required to be maintained by member banks, during a period ending June 30, 1949, to a maximum of 7-1/2 per cent against time deposits, and to not more than 30 per cent for central reserve city banks, 24 per cent for reserve city banks, and 18 per cent for other member banks, against demand deposits. 4.305. Certification by Reserve Bank Not Reviewable by Vourt. The plaintiff imported hides from Brazil in 1935. In liquidating the entry, the Collector converted the currency of the invoice (Brazilian milreis) into United States dollars at a rate (\$.08374) which had been certified to the Secretary of the Treasury by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, acting under section 522(c) of the Tariff Act of 1930. The plaintiff protested, claiming that the rate was "erroneous and improper." The plaintiff served a subpoena duces tecum upon the Federal Reserve Bank, seeking production at the trial of the records upon which its certification had been based.

The court quashed the subpoena, on motion of the Federal Reserve Bank, on the ground that its action in certifying such rates is not subject to judicial review.
