Restrictive policy of 1928-29 was initiated nearly a year before Strong's death. Strong's dissatisfaction (and that of his successors in NY bank, involved solely a disagreement as to the technique of operation.

NY favored continued high rediscount rates and open-market sales, while Washington favored "direct pressure" designed to keep money cheap for other purposes, while cutting it off from the stock exchange.
