Restrictive policy of 1928-29 was initiated nearly a year before Strong's death. Strong's didsatisfaction (and that of his successors in NY bank, involved solely a disagreement as to the technique of operation.

NY favored continued high rediscount rates and openmarket sales, while Washington favored "direct pressure" designed to keep money cheap for other purposes, while cutting it off from the stock exchange.
