The main body of the papers is available under library restrictions only. Kamarck; after the expiration of ten years this group will also be administered under library restrictions.

Literary rights in the unpublished writings of Emanuel Goldenweiser in this collection and in other collections of papers in the custody of the Library of Congress, have been dedicated to the public, except that those literary rights are reserved to Mrs. Goldenweiser during her lifetime.

Scope and Content Note

While the Goldenweiser Papers cover the years 1919 to 1952, they bulk largest from 1930-45. They relate almost wholly to financial and economic affairs with major emphasis on Federal Reserve Board matters. Correspondence is included with (among others) the following persons: Dean Acheson, Louis D. Brandeis, Paul H. Douglas, Marriner Eccles, Ralph A. Young, Carter Glass, John Maynard Keynes, Charles Rist, and Fred M. Vinson.
