The papers of Allan Sproul, central banker, in Federal Reserve service from 1920 to 1956 and President of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York from 1941 to 1956, are partly incorporated in the files of that Bank and partly in his own possession. A sizeable collection goes with him to his home in California when he retires in June 1956. Mr. Sproul's plan is that these important papers will ultimately be placed in a depository where they will be generally available to qualified students of monetary affairs.
