## ROBERT HENRY TREMAN

(1858 - 1937)

A fragmentary collection of papers of Robert H. Treman, banker, director of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York from 1914 to 1929, Deputy Governor from 1916 - 1919, member of the Federal Advisory Council in 1931 and 1932, has been given to the Mann Library of Cornell University, Ithaca, N. Y. They were turned over to Cornell by Mrs. Robert Treman, Mr. Treman's daughter-in-law.

These are mostly family and business papers and of little value to a scholar. The library hopes that other papers of more importance may come from other sources; they have a collection of account books and business papers of earlier members of the Treman family, some of which date back to 1838.
