OLIVER HOWARD WOLFE

The papers of O. Howard Wolfe, banker, lecturer, member of the preliminary organization committee for the Federal Reserve System, expert for Gold Settlement Fund, are in Mr. Wolfe's possession at his home in Milford, Pennsylvania. By and large they are filed as in the Philadelphia National Bank from whence they were trucked to Milford, but Mr. Wolfe has made sporadic attempts to sort and organize them.

The size of the collection has not been ascertained since all the papers were removed to Milford, but it probably does not exceed four file cabinets of the 4-drawer type.

Final place of deposit is still to be decided.
