

My dear Mr. President:

There has been somewhat of a change in my plans and schedule. I had a long talk with General Clay yesterday after he returned from Frankfurt where he took on his new responsibilities as Military Governor and Theater Commander. He left this morning for Moscow.

My present plans are to leave here with Morag and Anna by plane on Saturday, 5 April. We shall stay two (or three) weeks in England with Morag's Mother. Morag hasn't been well. We plan to leave England either on or about the 19th or 26th of April by ship. The only reservations we have now are on the Mauretania on 26 April which should bring us to New York in about five or six days - perhaps sooner.

I will keep Miss Newcome informed and she in turn can keep you informed as my schedule changes.

Have been very busy and will continue to be busy up to the last moment.

I will call the White House and make arrangements for an appointment immediately upon my arrival in Washington.
