H. R. 4425, which became the Reorganization Act of 1939, as originally introduced and as reported out by the House Committee excepted the following agencies:

General Accounting Office;

National Bituminous Coal Commission;

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When the bill was being debated in the House, the following agencies were suggested for exception:

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It was suggested that the following agencies be stricken from the list of those excepted:

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The bill was presented to the Senate and its Committee added the following agencies to those excepted, which was agreed to by the Senate:

The Committee also recommended that the following agencies be stricken from the list of those excepted, but this suggestion was not followed by the Senate:
