At my request, the Board authorized the attached letter to the respective chairmen of the Senate and House committees now considering reorganization legislation. I thought you might be interested in noting it since it refers with approval to your endorsement of a bill which contains no exemptions of Government departments or agencies, excepting the Office of the Comptroller General.

Senator McCarran and Representative Manasco informally advised us that they had no objection to our giving the letter to the press, and I am accordingly releasing it today.
