I have spent some time this afternoon with Mr. B. E. Kauffman, president of the Bankers Trust Company and of the Des Moines Clearing House, Des Moines, Iowa, whom Mr. McDonald and Mr. Catharine wished me to meet.

It is evident that Mr. Kauffman is an enthusiastic supporter, not only of Title II of the Housing Act, but also of Title II of the Banking Act. Moreover, he very much admires the work you are doing and the exposition of Title II that you have been giving in your addresses. He thinks that the bankers who are opposing Title II are "all wrong".
