I am most appreciative of the information you sent me regarding your statement before the senate committee on the banking bill. I think you did a wonderful job, as you did before the House committee, whose hearings I attended. I believe when this bill is passed you can be trusted not to throttle the intent of the law by unreasonable regulations and rules, as so many Washington bureaus have done. When this banking bill is passed, for the first time in the history of America, we will have a real banking system that can actually serve impartially the country at large. I think I can see how it will work a change in our system of financing industry so that the New York underwriting houses will not have ever again the opportunity to mistreat both our industries and investors. Good luck to you, I will do everything I can to help.
