This is to acknowledge with thanks your letter of December 3 enclosing the plot plans and pamphlet regarding Parkchester. I am glad to have these.








PARKCHESTER's landscaped areas provide quiet paths that are pleasantly suggestive of suburban residence.








Shopping facilities are complete. Highest-type stores, including restaurants, occupy the commercial areas. Macy's only New York branch is in this community.


