- 3 That, except during the period of any war beginning after
- 4 the date of the enactment of this Act, the authority granted
- 5 by section 5 (b) of the Trading With the Enemy Act, as
- 6 amended (U.S.C., 1940 edition, Supp. V, title 50 Ap-
- 7 pendix, sec. 5), shall not be exercised for the purpose of
- 8 prohibiting or regulating any consumer-credit transaction
- 9 effected after the date of the enactment of this Act.
