Dear John:

In the light of our conversations I felt that I ought to pass on to you two more typical clippings, one from Rube Lewis' magazine "Finance" in Chicago, and the other from the American Banker, and to tell you that I have had a talk with Jake but it was not at all satisfactory. He is very belligerent, critical and disparaging, not merely so far as the Board and I are concerned but also toward the Administration generally. I expect to talk with Jake again before he leaves town the early part of next week and I'll let you know what, if anything, comes of it.

If you think it advisable, you might pass this note and clippings on to the President.
