Size of tenders submitted for Treasury bills

Attached is a table furnished by the Treasury showing the number of tenders submitted for the issue of Treasury bills dated September 30, 1942, classified by size of tender and by Federal Reserve districts. Of the 703 tenders submitted for that issue one-third were for amounts of under \$50,000. Another third of the total number were for amounts of between \$50,000 and \$200,000. There are probably considerable duplications in the figures shown in the table, since some banks may submit several bids at various prices for their own account and for account of customers. It is probably a safe conclusion, nevertheless, that even under present arrangements a large number of bids are being submitted by small banks. Question may be raised as to whether it is necessary to provide any special facilities for small banks.
